

Reaching Our Potentials

"Doing well is hard to beat !" How often have we heard this expression ! This statement is often made in order to hide the fact that we are no where near "doing well", and to cover up and justify our failings. Paul wrote to the Christians at Galatia, "And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not" (Gal.6:9)

"Doing well" by man's standard may not be "doing well" by God's standard. We may be giving ourselves a pat on the back when we do not deserve it. Some seem to think the minimum of our potentials is good enough, and that we should not be too concerned about the maximum potential. It could have very well been for this cause that the Lord said to the Church at Laodicea, "thou art lukewarm" (Rev.3:14-22)

- When a congregation has the potential of 350 to 400 for attendance, and only about 280 attend the morning service, 200 on Sunday and Wednesday nights, it is not reaching its full potential power.
- If a congregation has about 100 men and young boys, and it only has 12 or 15 that will attend a men's training class on a regular basis, it is no where near its potential
- When a congregation has about 125 to 150 women and only 20 or 25 will attend a Ladies Bible class, it is not showing its complete potential.
- A congregation that is capable of a contribution of from \$1,000.00 to \$1,200.00 per week, but only gives \$800.00, is not reaching its full potential.
- If a congregation is not able to produce a good and capable leadership from a membership of more than 200 it is not using its full potentials.
- When members of a congregation has to be visited, personally invited to its services, urged, begged, and overly persuaded to be faithful to their duty, they are not converted in the first place.

It has been estimated that about 10% of a congregation gives 90% of the contribution, and in general does most of the work. If this be true, a congregation of 200 members could do the same work and have the same contribution with only about 20 or 25 members. This would also mean that about 175 members are contributing very little to the potential of the congregation. If this does not alarm you, then I suggest it is because you have no interest in or concern for the Church that Christ loved and gave Himself for.

Some think of the Church as a "Social Club" and could care less if it grows or not. Just so long as we are "getting by" we can pat ourselves on the back and say, "Doing well is hard to beat" and can hope that this will excuse us from reaching our maximum potential.





Reverance For God

When we assemble to worship God, regardless of location, we should remember that we are in the presence of Deity and conduct ourselves accordingly. We often show more reverence for the dead, and for our country, than we do for the Lord. "Wherefore, we receiving a kingdom which cannot be moved, let us have grace whereby we may serve God acceptably with reverence and fear" (Heb.12:28) "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there I am in the midst of them" (Matt.18:20). Some are very careless about their conduct and behavior in worship services, but they may not be aware of this practice, but need to be reminded from time to time. Unnecessary noise, loud talking and laughing, and running in and out of the building is completely out of place in a worship service. Outsiders are given the impression that we have come together for a "good time" rather than to worship and serve God.

Such behavior in a funeral home would be frowned upon, and would be disrespectful not only for the dead but for the family as well. If one were to act with such conduct during the singing of the National Anthem he would be thought to be unpatriotic.

Our worship should be preceded with sober thinking, and conducted with deep respect for the presence of the Lord in our midst. There are some things of necessity that must be looked after and taken care of, but this should be kept at a minimum. Once we have entered the place where worship is to be conducted we should prepare our minds and hearts for that purpose. God desires that we worship Him "in spirit and in truth" (Jno.4:23-24) Not only to do the things which He has commanded, but to do it from the heart with sincerity of purpose.

The church building was erected for the assembling of the Saints together to worship God, and it, and the other properties, should be cared for. We do not let our children destroy the furniture at home, so why should we let them deface the song books, mark their names on the pews and scatter litter over the building?

Some without thought disturb and disrupt the worship service. I cannot believe that people would do this intentionally but every unnecessary move that is made, and every noise that is heard is bound to disturb someone who is trying to keep his mind upon spiritual things. Let it not be laid to our charge that we were responsible for disturbing the worship of the Saints which they offered to God.

Enter the building to worship God, but leave to serve Him more faithfully!



"...The Truth Shall Make You Free"

If all the religious errors that are taught in the world today were collected and bound in one volume it would be so large that it could hardly be held. It is not necessary that we know all the error that is taught, but it is necessary that we know the Truth, (Jo.8:31-32) If we know the Truth, and are fully persuaded that it is the Truth we can refute any error that is taught. It is commonly believed by many religious people today that there is no absolute truth on any subject, but truth is so broad that it will include almost anything and everything. Some think that so long as a person is honest and sincere in his belief that no matter what he believes it is right to him. If this were true then we are left to do as we please, and there would be no purpose of Truth.

Men are chained to sin and error because of that which is false, but when the Truth is accepted and followed it frees us from these bonds. Some are held by traditions, some are content to follow the doctrines and commandments of men, and many do what seems right to them. The Bible teaches that there is a way that seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof is death (Prov.14:12) Honesty and sincerity are good traits, but a man can be honestly wrong and sincerely mistaken. Saul of Tarsus did what we believed he should do, but was wrong (Ac.23:1, 26:9)

If people are given the right to do what they believe to be right there would be no reason for a standard of Truth. We could worship an idol instead of God, we could deny the virgin birth of Christ instead of accepting it as a fact, we could reject the account of creation as told in Genesis 1 and 2, and we could believe the Bible to be the work of uninspired men instead of accepting it as God's Word. In other words, it would not make any difference what we believed or practiced, and in fact it would not make any difference if we believed anything or not. This would be completely without reason.

Before we accept anything as Truth we must first search the Bible to see if it be true (I Jo.4:1) People often offer a reason why they believe as they do, but consider some of the reasons: "My mother and father believed it", "Most of the people in my community believe it", "My preacher said it was right", or "It sounds good, and I think it is right"

It is evident that some do not want the Truth on any matter and will not accept it when it is offered. They would rather hear the things that "tickle their ears" rather than to hear the Truth. It is commanded that the Truth be preached, even if they will not endure sound doctrine, 2 Tim.4:1-4



"Rightly Dividing The Word Of Truth"

"Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of Truth" 2 Tim.2:15

The Bible is God's Word. He has given it to us for to study and to know; to believe and to obey. It is an evident fact that one cannot obey the Bible unless he first knows what it teaches, and he cannot know unless he studies it. Therefore, it is necessary for one to read and study the Scriptures. Jo.5:39, Ac.17:11, 2 Tim.2:15 Many have been neglectful of Bible study because they do not feel they can understand it. The reason some do not understand the Bible is they never study it. They read, but do not learn. Study requires more than mere reading, it includes a proper division of that which we read. Some have never learned HOW to study the Bible, and have become discouraged in doing so.

There are a lot of people who will not accept the plan of salvation, (1) Faith, (2) Repentance, (3) Confession, and (4) Baptism, because they cannot find one verse that show these commands in order. They feel that if God wanted them to do these things there should be one verse that commands them all. They do not want to take the time nor make the effort to study to learn them. For this reason some have concluded that man is saved by faith only. They have picked out certain verses that commands faith, but also have rejected the verses that command other things. What is the trouble? They have not "rightly divided the word of Truth".

Many people believe that we are still under the law of the Old Testament, and that the Ten Commandments are still binding today. They feel that since they are a part of the Bible then they must be kept. They have failed to note the passages that teach the Law was nailed to the cross of Christ, (Mt.5:17, Col.2:14, Eph.2:14-16, Rom.7:1-4,) and is no longer the Law for God's people. They have failed to "rightfully divide the word of Truth"

I am afraid that many times we are just as guilty as these people. It seems as though some have concluded that since they have obeyed the gospel (believed and were baptized) there is nothing else for them to do. They are unable to see the need of attending all the services of the Church, giving of their means to help spread the gospel, go out and invite others to come and hear the gospel, to teach and convert their families to Christ. They think they have already done all that is required of them. This shows a lack of Bible study, and a need for rightly dividing the word of Truth. The Bible contains all of the Truth, and we need to search for it.



I recently received a letter from the congregation in Obion, Tennessee and it is dated January 23, 1974 and signed by one of the elders. The letter is as follows:

"With your help we have a state law regarding the subject of origins. That subject will no longer be biased in favor of evolution in science text books. Please inform the church and ask that they phone, write or in some way contact their senator and representatives and ask them to oppose H-1395 in the House and S-1257 in the senate."



How Far Will We Drift ?

"Therefore we ought to give the more earnest heed to the things which we have heard, lest at any time we should let them slip."- Hebrews 2:1

To say there has been a drifting away from the Bible, and away from God, would be a mild statement indeed. "None are so blind as they who will not see!" If we cannot see that there has been a drifting away, and the danger is still before us, then we are blind. Paul predicted there would be a "falling away"- 2 Thess. 2:1-12, 1 Tim. 4:1-4, 2 Tim. 4:1-4. What happened once CAN happen again. Jesus said, "But as in the days of Noah were, so shall also the coming of the Son of man be. For as in the days that were before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day that Noah entered into the Ark, and knew not until the flood came, and took them all away; so shall also the coming of the Son of man be" - Matt. 24:37-39

Unprepared

The opportunities we have today will never be ours again; we may have others like them, but those today will soon pass. If we fail to use them wisely we cannot go back and reclaim them. Excuses in that day will count. I am speaking of the Judgment Day. (1) All the dead, both good and bad, will be raised Jo.5:28-29 (2) All will stand before the Great Judge (the Son of God) Rom.14:11-12, 2 Cor.5:10, Rev.20:11-15 (3) We will be separated like a shepherd divides his sheep for the goats, Matt.25:31-46 (4) Some will enter into "life eternal" and some into "everlasting punishment", Mt.25:46

The main factor that will determine our destiny is if we are prepared or unprepared. The Lord's parable of the ten virgins (Matt.25:1-13) proves this point beyond a doubt. Those who were wise (prepared) entered into the marriage, but the foolish (unprepared) were shut out. Some will try to offer excuses (Matt.7:22-23) but to no avail. They will be turned away into a lake of fire.

Life, at it's best, is very short (Job 14:1, Jas.4:13-14, I Pet.1:24) but it is during life that we must work and prepare for the life yet to come (Jo.9:4) "Now is the day of salvation" (2 Cor.6:2) If we let today pass without making preparation what assurance do we have that we will have another day? or opportunity? The condition in which we die will be the condition in which we will be judged. What about YOU? "ARE YOU READY FOR THE JUDGMENT DAY?"

MORALITY

The man who makes misuse of his tongue and the man who makes misuse of his body (I Thessalonians 4: 3,4) are alike immoral. The covetous man as well as the drunkard is immoral. The whisperer (talebearer) as well as the adulterer is immoral.

There are sins of the body--fornication, drunkenness, gluttony, etc. And there are sins of the disposition--anger, wrath, envy, jealousy, snobbishness, selfishness, etc. The sins of the disposition are as vile as the sins of the body.

Before we make any attempt to classify sins, we should sit down and make a careful study of God's Word. We should not say that any specific sin is the greatest of all sins, unless the Word of God says so. We should not say that any specific sin is the least of all sins unless the Word of God says so. The Bible and the Bible alone should be our guide. God's Word should become our word.

Every sin is vile and, for this reason, should be avoided.

THE BIBLE AND PRAYER

"These were more noble than those in Thessalonica; in that they received the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so." (Acts 17:11). Every Christian is to read the Bible as a matter of spiritual diet (I Peter 2:2, Hebrews 5:12-14). Whenever Bible reading is preceded and followed by earnest prayer then results of a spiritual nature always follow. God has promised that His Word would not return void (Isaiah 55:11) and the Lord preached that "Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away." (Matthew 24:35). Real growth for the spirit depends upon Bible reading and prayer.

To a great many Christians, Bible reading is not a regular practice. Those Christians at Berea (Acts 17) had a practice of daily searching the scriptures. The Holy Word of God says of them, that they were "more noble" in their habits than those of Thessalonica that had no such practice. The Thessalonians had received the Word originally in a commendable manner (I Thess. 2:13) but they did not continue to gladly accept it. Let it always be a practice among us at Bybee's that we daily search the Bible for real spiritual benefit.

Acceptable Bible reading depends not only upon regular sessions of reading, but also on the state of mind of the reader. The Bereans "with all readiness of mind" searched the scriptures. A young man was dying of some disease and began to diligently read scripture and also he enjoyed reading the songbook. To a friend he explained that never before had these words held such meaning to him. Well the truth is the young man had never before with readiness of mind accepted the Word nor the songs either as he should have. The Word of God means the same now and always--let us accept it as we know we ought.

Be a daily Bible reader: by reading five chapters on Sunday and three chapters daily one can read the Bible completely through every year of his life!

SPIRITUALLY UNFIT

The apostle in his second letter to Timothy wrote: "Thou therefore endure hardness as a good soldier of Jesus Christ." (2 Timothy 2:3). In this suggestion Paul reminds every Child of God of his duty to fight militantly the old spiritual battle against Satan and his forces. The Church is then the great force of God for good and righteousness in a world lost in iniquity (I John 5:19).

Sometimes a great nation cannot send all of its men into battle because they are unfit physically. Many have problems that make their ability to fight undesirable. They are rejected by the military. The United States in every war has had to decide which men will go into battle and which men would not be sent to fight. Those that were rejected for military duty were classed 4-F. In the army of God unfortunately many are unfit spiritually for the great conflict.

Some are unfit for battle because their feet are not capable to stand the endurance of battle. Ezekiel 2:1-2 says, "Son of man, stand upon thy feet, and I will speak unto thee. And the spirit entered into me when he spake unto me, and set me upon my feet, that I heard him that spake unto me." God expects men to use their feet in his service. Romans 10:15 reminds us ". . . How beautiful are the feet of them that preach the gospel of peace, and bring glad tidings of good things!" Are your feet instruments in His service?

Some are unfit for battle and cannot be used because of family dependency. Jesus our Lord invited a man to follow him and because he had married a wife the invitation was rejected. Marriage and/or home duties need not conflict with the responsibilities enjoined upon God's people.

As soldiers of Christ, many cannot be used in the battle because of their being spiritually unfit. Let each one examine himself to see if his feet, hands, back, teeth, and family demands and privileges are being used in the service of God as He expects. ". . . endure hardness as a good soldier of Jesus Christ."







ANOTHER WORD ABOUT OUR OBLIGATION TO EDUCATE

God's Word obligates the Christian parents to educate their children. Much has been written and said about this responsibility. Much more encouragement is needed in this area. Note these scriptures dealing with this most vital responsibility:

Ephesians 6:4

Matthew 28:18--20

A SPIRITUAL HOUSE

The Holy Spirit has described the church in I Corinthians 3:9 as ". . . God's husbandry, . . . God's building." And again in Ephesians 2:21--22 the Spirit inspired the writer to say "In whom all the building fitly framed together groweth unto an holy temple in the Lord: In whom ye also are builded together for an habitation of God through the Spirit."

The description of the church then is one of a spiritual building instead of a physical structure. The members of the church make up the spiritual building. In Acts 8:3 Saul ". . . made havock of the church, entering into every house, and haling men and women committed them to prison." The men and women were the church, the ones suffering the havock.

Our thinking must be construed so as to conceive of the church as aspiritual thing made up of spiritual beings destined to dwell eternally with a spiritual Maker.

It is refreshing to hear brethren and sisters in the church refer to each other as "brother and sister Brown," or "brother and sister Smith", etc. Such a reference helps to develop and keep that understanding between Christians. The members of the church are more than just "Mr. and Mrs. Smith," etc., but they are related to each other spiritually. Jesus said ". . . all ye are brethren." (Matthew 23). While the Lord would not be pleased with His people seeking and desiring honors and titles, He is pleased with them when they understand their proper relation to each other.

The church is lead by men who are spiritually minded. Elders must be men who retain this spiritual outlook for the flock, and the congregation must remember to esteem their leaders for the spiritual work that they do (I Thess. 5:12--13).

Let each member of the Bybee Branch congregation grow to appreciate the church as a spiritual construction made up of spiritual members destined for eternity with God. Whenever we retain this insight into our nature, we will become more and more as He intended for us to be.





ARE YOU GUILTY?

When a wife saw here husband trying to sew on a button, she told him the thimble was on the wrong finger. "I know," he answered, "it should be on yours."

This funny little story makes a point that is worth consideration. Many times we find ourselves being very critical of someone else doing some particular job. He doesn't do it like we would if the task was ours to do, so we begin to point the finger of criticism in his direction. Perhaps the answer to the problem would be found if we would do our fair share of the work and take some of the burden from our brother's shoulders. 
The church historian McNeill wrote of Zwingli the reformer in his book History and Character of Calvinism, page 73 this statement:

This is good advice. If we fail to understand any portion of scripture, allow another portion of the Bible to instruct us in it.



WHAT I OWE THE LOCAL CHURCH . . .

Every citizen of the United States owes the country something by way of taxes, defense, etc. In the same manner every citizen of the Lord's Kingdom owes something to that Kingdom (Matt. 22:21, ". . .Render therefore unto Caesar the things which are Caesar's; and unto God the things that are God's.") The civil government provides the citizen with protection, conveniences, etc. and as a result taxes are paid. God in His great love and mercy has provided the Christian with protection, promise, forgiveness, and many many more "unspeakable" gifts. Therefore, with this understanding the following things are suggested as to what each Christian owes the local church:

1. I want the strangers who enter the door of the meeting house to feel at home, to learn to love us, and to return from time to time. They are our guests; I owe it to them and to the church to show myself friendly.
2. No church or congregation can make progress without faithful and efficient leaders. To a certain extent, members of the church make or break their leaders. To the end that our leaders may be stronger and more efficient, I must give them my support.
3. My home church has financial obligations, which are due at regular intervals. Whether I give or do not give, these obligations must be met. If it is right for my congregation to pay its obligations each week, it is right for me to give each week. Thou circumstances may force me to be absent, my contributions should find their way to the treasury (I Cor. 16:1-2).
4. I know that the existence of any church depends upon the attendance of its members. In fact, attendance is the life of a church! For this reason, I must attend the services--all the services I can. For all that I have, I would not have it said that my church at home perished because I would not attend the meetings (Hebrews 10:25).



In the United States there has never been a Chinese conviction for rape, burglary, bank robbery, or desertion.

In the half-century of Chinese Chicago (Chinatown) there has been only one arrest for breaking and entering.

Despite this generation of western influence, this race has somehow neckreined the impulse of its vigorous younfarwea.

Albert K. Leong, President of the Chinese Consolidated Benevolent Association of Chicago says, "We keep a tight rein on our children until they are turvy responsible."

Editor Thomas y Fu of the "China Town Times" in Chicago says, "Our children just naturally respect and obey their parents. A boy or girl would not bring shame on his famiely or on his family name."

However circuitous the line of questioning (in a research I made) became, it always seemed to lead back to a simple formula so logical, so impertinently simple, "our children are always at home at mealtime."

Most Chinese--Americans, no matter how wealthy or poor, maintain a strict family styled home. Meal times are ceremonious affairs which must be attended by every member of the family.

Could such a simple, home remedy as this help explain why not one of New York's 10,000 Chinese--American schoolagers has ever been brought to court for narcotics, speeding, burglary, vandalism, stick--ups, purse snatching, or jugging? Not even speeding.

Apparently this commendable and enviable record has been achieved by family togetherness at mealtime, and perpetuating family oneness.





CAN ONE BE AN UNDEMINOMINATIONAL CHRISTIAN?

The Christians in the New Testament were neither Catholic, Protestant, nor Jewish in religion--they were simply Christians, disciples of Jesus Christ. They never referred to themselves as Protestant or Catholic. They were not members of denominations, but members of Jesus Christ (I Cor. 12). Their congregations were not called Baptist; Lutheran, Methodist, Presbyterian, Berean Fundamental, Episcopalian; Open Bible, "Jehovah's Witnesses," Pentecostal, Adventist, Unitarian, Trinitarian, etc., etc. No church was ever named after Mary or Joseph or Peter or Paul or John or Mark or Luther, but after their Divine Founder, the Lord Jesus Christ (Matthew 16:18). The Christians in that good day were united in Christ alone and were content to wear His holy name. The Holy Spirit referred to assemblies of Christians as churches of Christ (Romans 16:16) and churches of God (II Thess 1:4) and churches of the saints (I Cor. 14:33). These are not titles, but descriptive phrases inspired of God and acceptable for Christians' use today. The disciples of that first Christian century were neither Catholic nor Protestant--they were Christians only and only Christians.

They were just Christians then, and we can be such today. You can be a Christian, a member of the body of Christ, without ever joining any denomination. It is our plea that all who sincerely trust in Christ for salvation cast off sectarian names and affiliations, and become and remain simply Christians. You can enter the kingdom of God now and be free of denominationalism. You can be active in the church of Christ and never be a member of a denomination, either Catholic or Protestant. You can be just a Christian. We plead with all to do this. Obey the gospel and let the Lord add you to his church. (Acts 2:36--47, 8:26--40.).

WHAT I WANT IN A TRANSLATION OF THE BIBLE

There are certain things that I want in a translation of the Scriptures. It is upon these Scriptures that the welfare of my eternal soul rests (Matthew 7:21).

FIRST, I want the translation to be done by more than one or even a few men. This will provide a check and balance effect, and it will assure me that it is not colored by the special prejudices of any.

It is of interest that the Septuagint takes that number (70) from the number of men involved in the work of translations.

SECOND, I want those who are working on the translation to be men who believe in the uniqueness of this volume; men who believe in the inspiration of every part; men who will handle each and every word with tender loving care. I want men who believe in the supernatural so that when they have a choice of words will pick the one which more nearly gives the sense of the overall view of the Bible.

In this regard, there was simply no sense of the RSV rendering the Hebrew word almah in Isaiah 7:14 as "maiden". The argument goes the almah can be either maiden or virgin. There was a choice, which shall be used? Matthew forever settled that when he used the Greek word "parthenos" which is always virgin--thus, leaving no choice. Thus, with an overall view of the Bible, men should have no problem with Isaiah 7:14!

THIRD, I want a literal word for word translation, not simply a paraphrased version. I can paraphrase for myself. A paraphrase is a commentary, and a poor one at that, and certainly no translation.

FOURTH, I am not interested in the translation being in storybook form (I have some Bible story books which I have outgrown). The New English Bible used the phrase "Once upon a time." That does not translate as I want it. There isn't anything wrong with having to study and dig a little: (2 Tim 2:15, 2 Peter 3:15-16).

HOW SIMPLE BAPTISM IS TO UNDERSTAND

When Jesus began His earthly ministry, he came unto John to be baptized by him in Jordan, Matthew 3. At the close of His earthly ministry, Jesus gave the commission to Go into all the world and to make disciples of all of the nations, baptizing them into the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit for the remission of their sins, Matthew 28:18--20 and Acts 2:38. Baptism was preached and practiced by the apostles and in the book of Acts all that obeyed God were baptized.

Baptism is simple to understand. Taking all of the references to the act in the Gospels and also the book of Acts, we understand that the action in every case was immersion. It is called a burial and a planting (Col. 2:12, and Romans 6:1--6). It is for the repentant and in order for their forgiveness (Acts 2:38).

When Jesus came unto John requesting baptism, He said unto John, ". . . for thus it becometh us to fulfill all righteousness." This has reference to Psalm 119:172 ". . . for all thy commandments are righteousness."

Jesus knew that John had authority from God to baptize. It was a command of God (baptism); thus He complied with it.

That is really how simple baptism is. I Peter 3:21 ". . . the answer of a good conscience toward God."




