The Hebrew writer said, "Not forsaking our own assembling together, as the custom of some is, but exhorting one another; and so much the more, as ye see the day drawing nigh." (Heb. 10:25). And, Paul said, "Brethren, even if a man be overtaken in any trespass, ye who are spiritual, restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness; looking to thyself, lest thou also be tempted." (Gal. 6:1). We simply must try to help those who have dropped out of the Lord's service!

There is another way we might be able to help this problem. If it could be possible for people to see what the assembly does for them, that is, the value of attendance, then perhaps we would not have such an effort at trying to get them to come. Consider that when you assemble with the saints that you: (1) Associating with some of the wisest people on earth. They know were salvation is found! You too will learn from them *"He who walks with wise men will be wise, but the companion of fools will be destroyed."* (Prov. 13:20 NKJV). (2) Receive exhortation and encouragement not to sin. *"but exhort one another day by day, so long as it is called Today; lest any one of you be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin."* (Heb. 3:13). What a value it is to be encouraged to do what is right by our brethren who are pulling for us. (3) Most importantly we get to worship God with others of "like precious faith" (II Pet. 1:1). We should be most grateful for the priviledge of worshipping the Almighty God. These are just some of the great values in attending. See you in church Sunday...

From The Desk of Tony Lawrence

Of recent, I have been priviledged to talk with a several young missionaries of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. These men have been very kind and considerate. They are especially well groomed and exhibit some of the finest manners of any young people



I have had dealings with. They are in our area attempting to make "proselytes" to their religion. What I have to say is not about any of them personally, but about the doctrine which they teach. For, I sincerely believe that those with whom I have talked are fully convinced that they are serving the Lord correctly. We do not have a right to judge someone's motives but we certainly can discern if their doctrine is correct. The Bible says "Beloved, believe not every spirit, but prove the spirits, whether they are of God; because many false prophets are gone out into the world." (I In. 4:1). I have several reasons why I think that their doctrine is in error.

First, I question any religion which suggests that the Bible is an insufficient guide. The Book of Mormon says: "And because my words shall hiss forth-many Gentiles shall say: A Bible! A Bible! We have got a Bible, and there cannot be any more Bible. But thus saith the Lord God: O fools, they shall have a Bible and it shall proceed forth from the Jews, mine ancient covenant people... Wherefore, because that ye have a Bible ye need not suppose that it contains all my words; neither need ye suppose that I have not caused more to be written." (II Nephi 29:3,4,10). But, what about all of those Bible passages which say that the God's word is able to make a man perfect, "furnished completely unto every good work" (II Tim. 3:17), and give him "all things that pertain unto life and godliness" (II Pet. 1:3)? More importantly, what about Jude 3, where we learn that the faith was "once for all delivered unto the saints?" The Bible warns of those who will come and pervert the gospel of Christ (Gal. 1:6-9; Acts 20:28ff).

Second, I have full confidence in the teaching of Deut. 18:20-22. There, the Lord gives man the assurance that if a prophecy is made and the prophecy does not come true, then that man is a false prophet and there is no need to listen to him. Joseph Smith, the supposed Divinely appointed translator of the Book of Mormon and great Prophet of the Mormon church, either translated or recorded several errors in addition to his own false prophecies. The Book of Mormon says that Jesus was born in Jerusalem (Alma 7:10). The Bible clearly states that he was born in Bethlehem (Lk. 2:4) which was a city known to be the birth place of the Lord by prophecy (cf. Mic. 5:2; Matt. 2:4,5). The Bible teaches that disciples were called "Christians" at Antioch (Act 11:26), while the Book of Mormon has it somewhere else (Alma 46:15). In addition to these things, the writing of Joseph Smith, recorded in Doctrine and Covenants (one of their holy books), says that when David had plural marriages that he did not sin (D&C 132:38) when the Jesus says that "from the beginning" God intended that there be ONE man and ONE woman and that their marriage be for life! (Matt. 19:3-6). Joseph Smith prophecied that the Temple for the "gathering of the saints" would be built at Independence, Missouri in that generation (cf. D&C 57:1-3; 101:20; 84:4,5,31). It did not happen. From all of the above I conclude that sincere as one may be, Mormon doctrine is false. If someone comes to your door and wishes to study the Bible with you, be sure that you "prove" his doctrine from the Bible (I Jn. 4:1; II Thess. 5:21).

If your problem is your marriage, the Bible has the answer. In fact, whatever gets you down, the Bible has the answer. Man's problem is that often he does not like the answer. However, if you will let the Bible speak, and will listen, thenyou can overcome

your discouragement. Let us consider a couple of likely problems which men are likely to face.

We often get discouraged when we have material losses. Have your ever considered that Job lost practically everything? Yet, his response was, "The Lord gave, and the Lord hath taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord" (Job1:21 NKJV). Job's attitude toward his material possesions was that they were always subject to being taken away and he was glad to have them while he did. Often, those who suffer materially have not considered that material wealth is worth is not what life consists of (Lk. 12:15).

We also find ourselves becoming discouraged when someone close to us turns on us (either as a parent or as a friend). We wonder why we are so mistreated by our friends and family and question why we deserve such treatment. However, we must realize that we too, have been less than as we should from time to time. Even in the face of this, we have one friend who we can always count on who will never disappoint us. Jesus Christ will be our friend if we do as he has said (Jn. 15:14).

Discouragement robs us of the happiness which should be characteristic of those who are Christians. Likewise, it causes others who we come in contact with to be effected. We can impede the progress of the Lord's work when we are always "down." When our health fails us, when our aspirations are not reached, when we lose those whom we love, when things generally go wrong. Let us resolve to have a good spiritual attitude, looking to God's word for the answers. As the Hebrew writer said, "Therefore strengthen the hands which hang down, and the feeble knees, and make straight paths for your feet, so that what is lame may not be dislocated but rather be healed... lest any root of bitterness springing up cause trouble..." (Heb. 12:12,13, 15NKJV).

An Important Article From The Preacher's Files



Church Attendance-Lore In Action Guy N. Woods

The view, that there is but one essential service of the church—the meeting in which the Lord's supper is served—is a persistent and widespread one. Many thousands of disciples in congregations throughout the world regularly attend services on the Lords' day at the morning hour, but are never present at the evening service, or any other. Proceeding on the assumption that this meeting alone is obligatory, they attend it and do not bother to concern themselves with other activities of the church, with the satisfying feeling that they have rendered a sufficient measure of devotion to the Lord in this one hour for all the week following. Content to do only what is required, and under the impression that this meeting exhausts such requirements, they attend no other. This attitude, and the resulting disastrous effect on the church, is limited to no one section of the brotherhood. It is a problem of far-reaching proportions, a major obstacle in the progress of the church.

Were those thus influenced correct in the conclusion that the Lord's day morning service is really the only one that cannot be ignored with impunity, the disposition shown must be greatly displeasing to the Lord whose presence they disregard at all the other meetings of the church (Matt. 18:20). It is based on the willingness to do, and be satisified with less than what one can do, for the Lord! The fact that it is possible for one to plan a course in life that deliberately short changes the Creator reveals a worldly and hardened heart. In the parable of the Plowing Servant (Luke 17:7-10) the Lord taught us that when we have done what we ought to do we are still unprofitable servants. If, having rendered service in keeping with a designated obligation, we are still regarded as unprofitable servants, what may be saide of the individual who has not done as much as he could?

This parable is a striking and impressive reminder of the fact that we are not our own; we have been bought with a price. Of the legality of the Lord's title to us there can be no doubt. This right of ownership extends to the Christian, to what he is, and to what he has, and what he can do. The Lord is entitled to all the service we are capable of rendering, and it is the ultimate in presumption for any creature of His to question the fact.

The faithful servant does not ask, "What do I have to do?" With him the only question is, "What may I do?" He who seeks to put the kingdom of God first in heart and life will not advance fallacious arguments by which to justify indifference and little faith in God. To seek the kingdom of God first (Matt. 6:33), is not to seek it last, or for that matter, second. It requires one to give it top priority in all the affairs of life. When one's personal interests conflict with duty to God the former must always yield to the latter. To fail to follows such a course is to be guilty of the sin of the rich man in Luke 15.

Those who attend church services irregularly evidence symptoms of lukewarmness, indifference, selfishness, and love of the world more than love of God. the practice is an exceedingly dangerous one because it leads to greater hardness of heart and further departures from the way of righteousness. He who resorts to fallacious and false reasoning to justify absence from the services of the church. or who attends out of an irksome sense of duty, and to still the voice of an accusing conscience, will soon have little difficulty in discovering (?) arguments which to him, at least, justify further neglect and unfaithfulness. "Take heed, brethren, lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief, in departing from the living God. But exhort one another daily, while it is called Today; lest any of you be hardened through the deceitfulness of sin" (Heb. 3:12,13).

CHURCH GROWTH-GROWING GOD'S WAY

(Observations from the Freed-Hardeman College Lectures)

One of the topics of prominence at this year's FHC Lectures was the subject of church growth. I was very impressed with the lectures presented by the Scyamore church from Cookeville along with others given by various speakers. What I heard was a very balanced approach to an often abused subject.

When one thinks about the message which is preached from the pulpit, brother Leroy Brownlow delivered an exceptional message on the subject of "Preach What You Practice." He noted that we believe in baptism, the Lord's Supper weekly, singing, other things and that we ought to unashamededly preach them. Too often today men are almost embarrassed to take a stand for that which they practice. More than one speaker dealt with the often made charge that the pulpit message often nothing more than a weekly "pep talk" or is at the other extreme and sees no good in anyone by a constant bombardment of "negative messages." People must be taught what is right and wrong and that explicitly, however, they must feel that they can accomplish it, or why try?

In several classes there was the strong concern shown for *teaching the Bible* to our neighbors. More often than not, in the past few years there has been the emphasis on "gimmicks," and I believe that more and more are recognizing that the power is in the gospel (Rom. 1:16). I heard a lot of *book*, *chapter*, and verse. Such was truly refreshing! The speakers talked about church growth, but they were concerned with doing it "God's Way!"

For those of you who might be interested, I brought back tapes of certain lectures and I would be glad to make you a copy if you wish one. I have: Church Growth by the Scyamore chuch (two tapes), Open Forum (mostly on the subject of church lawsuits-two days on one tape), and "Preach What You Practice" by Leroy Brownlow. The church also purchased the Video Tapes on this past Preacher's and Church Leader's Forum on Boston/Crossroads.

It has the involvement of numerous "youth sponsors," who help plan the activities and also help in actual work of the program.

Some question the need for the church to be involved in a program such as this. Please consider: first, the church does not pay for any of the entertainment activities, the kids do! Second, not all of the activities of the youth group are "entertainment oriented." They also have service projects such as the leaf raking in the fall, or as recently, the Valentine cards to the older members. Each month there is a devotional for each of the three age groups where the young people participate themselves.

A few month's ago I read an article in Christian Bible Teacher, which I believe stresses the point I want to make. Please read it...

Is A Youth Program Really Important?

O ver an eight-year period I have kept up with the number of young people who have and have not actively participated in the Youth Program of the local church and then noted the degree of faithfulness to God they demonstrated after graduation. Please note the following: When young people are uninvolved in youth activities 38% of them grow up to be unfaithful to God, 44% end up spasmodic in attendance, and only 19% of them grow to be faithful. On the other hand when young people are actively involved in youth activities while growing up 93% of them end up as faithful adults.

Before anyone starts to raise some objections, let me make clear what I am *not* saying: I am not saying participation in youth activities makes it impossible to fall from grace. I am not saying that only young people who worship at congregations that have a Youth Ministry will grow to be faithful. I am not necessarily saying these statistics *prove* anything. (Statistics can be presented in a variety of ways to prove a variety of often conflicting things.)

What I am saying is this, too often people look at youth

activities as "fun 'n games" that are really not important to the development of our youth. What these people fail to realize is that these activities are *designed* to help our youth grow as Jesus grew—socially, mentally, physically, and spiritually. Too many times parents do not take an active interest in the youth work and do not encourage their children to take part. This is an unfortunate attitude. We encourage (and sometimes insist) our kids participate in sports, band, school functions or scouts but we treat the youth activities of the Church as unimportant, optional. Somewhere along the line our priorities have gone haywire.

One more thought. I will be the first to admit that it is quite possible that those 93% who were active and grew up to be faithful Christians might have been faithful even if they had not participated in the youth activities. There is one way to find out. Keep your children from participating and check the results, if you want to take that risk.

Baker-Swaqqart Scandals



The recent news concerning the fall of T.V. Evangelist Jimmy Swaggart has left many people totally disheartened with the religious world. They reason that if those who claim to be so religious are such hypocrites, then why have anything to do with religion at all. How does all of this affect the church? It will likely cause many to "lump us all together," which is sad indeed. I recognize both of these men as *false teachers* who are to be marked and avoided. However, at the same time, I believe that there are some lessons which can be drawn from this sordid affair which can help us.

First, let us realize that God never intended that the man be worshipped or elevated as these men have. In Paul's second letter to the Corinthians he says: "But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the excellency of the power may be of God, and not of us." (II Cor. 4:7). God has never wanted the messenger to be elevated to the position that these men have attained in the eyes of many! The reaction of many to the recent scandal has just served to illustrate that some have forgotten their Bibles and started blindly following a man. As members of the church we must teach people to look to the Word and not to the man.

Second, as deplorable as the sins of these men are, they are still men and will sin, like all other people on this earth. Their sins were the type which destroy influence and respectability, but if we expect to find anyone who is without sin, then there will never be another preacher. This is not to say that a man who is a blatant sinner or one who has properly lost his influence should ever be allowed to occupy the pulpit, but it is to say that we must realize that *"it is impossible but that occasions of stumbling should come."* (Lk. 17:1) and that we must be careful not to expect perfect people.

Third, now that there are people who are disheartened with religiousleaders, let us take the time to show them a better way. A way which does not involve "denominational" names, titles, creeds, boards, and etc. Let us show them that they can be simple New Testament Christians without following any man. The only one we ask them to put their faith and trust in is Jesus Christ who never said a bad word, thought a bad thought, or never committed an evil deed. One who "was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin." (Heb. 4:15).

It is sad that all people who claim to be religious have to "answer" for the sins of some with whom they have no connection. However, if we are wise, we will take this bad thing and turn it into an occasion for good. Paul would say, "See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, Redeeming the time, because the days are evil." (Eph. 5:15,16). Certainly the days are evil, but we still have opportunities for good. Let us awake to these opportunities!

Let's Talk About Attending All Of The Church's Services!



It often happens that someone will come and ask, "Do you think that it is important for one to attend all of the services of the church?" First of all, it does not matter *what*I think! We must get away from the idea of "what do you think?" We should be asking the more important question of "what does the Bible teach?"

Those who usually ask the question regarding the necessity of attending all of the church's assemblies are generally looking for some excuse to salve a condemning conscience. Why would any faithful Christian ever *want* to miss a service of the church except in situations of absolute necessity. If the question is prompted by a desire to see how little we can get by without being condemned, then we already have a heart problem. If the Lord is not #1 in our lives, then we are unacceptable! Read Rev. 2:4,5 and Matt. 6:33.

However, the questions are generally stated something like this: "Doesn't Heb. 10:25 refer to the assembly on the Lord's day? Isn't that the one we are not to miss? You know, the one where the Lord's Supper is served?" The answer is simply, "Yes." Yet, simply because we are not to forsake the Lord's Day worship assembly in no way gives credence to the idea that the others are somehow "optional." Then one asks, "how then do you arrive at the conclusion that one should be present if at all possible?" I'm glad you asked...

The Elders of the church have been charged by the Word of God to "feed" the church of the Lord which he purchased with his own blood. " (Acts 20:28). It is their job to see that the congregation is fed and that none die of spiritual malnutrition. In their wisdom, they have deemed it necessary to have services on Sunday evening and Wednesday evening for this purpose. It is necessary that they be vigilant that this since they must give account for the souls in their care (Heb. 13:17). It then becomes our responsibility, as faithful followers to "come to the spiritual feeding table to be fed." If we blatantly refuse then we reject the authority of the Elders which God has given them. We may feel that it is not big issue since they are "only men just like us." However, let me remind you that such insurrection results in the condemnation of God! In reference to the civil authorities (another God designed/approved authority), Paul said, "Let every soul be in subjection to the higher powers. For there is no power but of God; and the powers that be are ordained of God. Therefore he that resisteth the power, withstandeth the ordinance of God: and they that withstand shall receive to themselves judgement." (Rom. 13:1,2). To reject attendance is to reject the wisdom and authority of the Elders, which is to reject the ordinance of God! Yes, we must attend ALL OF THE SERVICES...

The next lesson in our series *Difficult Texts of The Bible Explained* will be from I Corinthians 6:1-8 and 15:29. We will look at lawsuits among Christians and also the idea of "baptism for the dead."

IT IS A MATTER OF RESPECT

In the book of Numbers, chapter 12, Aaron and Miriam criticized Moses for marrying an Ethiopian woman. They began to reason among themselves and suggest that perhaps Moses wasn't that great after all. Had God not spoken with and through them also? The Lord heard their disrespectful speech and knew the attitude of their heart. And, as a result, the Lord called them out and let them know that no one had stood before Him like Moses and they should have been afraid to speak of him in such a fashion. Immediately thereafter, Miriam was smitten with leprosy. Both Aaron and Moses felt compassion for her and asked the Lord to heal her. But, the Lord commanded that she be put out of the camp for seven days and then they could be receive her back again.

One might wonder why the reaction of the Lord was so severe against Miriam and Aaron for simply criticizing their brother. The reason is quite clear. When they questioned Moses, position and authority, they were in reality questioning God. For, after all, it was God who had chosen Moses for the position. So often men do not realize the seriousness of questioning God. When they do so, they are speaking from a position of ignorance.

Both Peter and Jude characterize such people in a bad light: "Daring, self-willed, they tremble not to rail at dignities: whereas angels, though greater in might and power, bring not a railing judgment against them before the Lord." (II Pet. 2:10,11). "Yet in like manner these also in their dreamings defile the flesh, and set at nought dominion, and rail at dignities. But Michael the archangel, when contending with the devil he disputed about the body of Moses, durst not bring against him a railing judgment, but said, The Lord rebuke thee. But these rail at whatsoever things they know not: and what they understand naturally, like the creatures without reason, in these things are they destroyed." (Jude 8-10). These fail, due to ignorance, to fail to show proper respect.

Let us be careful that we always show the proper respect to those to whom it is due!

🛉 The Value Of A Christian Education 🕺

I honestly believe that the members of the Lord's church in Warren County do not realize the enormous blessing they enjoy by having a Christian school here. Certainly there is the advantage of the children having a Christian education, which is the sole purpose of the school existing anyway. However, there are benefits for the Lord's church also.

Where a good Christian school exists, the Lord's church is always stronger. The next generation of church leaders are in the schools now. The children which receive a daily Bible instruction will be much more grounded in the faith, and as a result can do a better job of leading the church. Those who have been exposed to the daily training in the Word are much more aware of the need to get the Gospel message into all of the world. They will be more evangelistic! While Boyd has not been here long enough to see dramatic results in a second generation, the impact will be inevitable. Too, one must not overlook the fact that many children who have been raised in homes where the parents attend a denominational church are students at the school. One of the greatest difficulties in trying to convert people today is to get them to overcome a prejudice against the church. These children, rather than having a prejudice against the church will be already aware of its importance and teachings by virtue of the fact that they have been taught in the school.

For my children, I believe that there is no better alternative than a Christian education. I went to public school through the 12th grade and attended both a Christian college and a state college. There were good and bad at both. There were good and bad teachers at both. However, in the public school and the state college, one had to tolerate sinful behavior on the part of both the students and teachers. In the Christian schools if such is known it will not be allowed. Children are given a positive example for good. The existence of a Christian school at McMinnville was part of the reason for my coming here. I want my children raised to respect the Bible and God's word! I believe that there is no better way to do this than in a good Christian school.

I would encourage you to consider helping support the school regularly on an individual basis.

The Drinking Of Alcohol A Disease Or Is It Sin?

This past week on the national news of one of the networks there was a discussion which I think is significant. The news reporter was discussing with one of the "experts" in the field and he said that there was a dramatic change occurring within the medical community. Rather than believing that "alcoholism" is a disease, they now are coming to the conclusion that it is a learned and chosen behavior. To further confirm this point, the reporter went to Europe where the prevailing opinion is that one who is addicted to alcohol is no different than the person who is addicted to tobacco, marijuana, or any other drug. The reporter also interviewed people who did not want this new opinion to be spread any further. This person suggested that many of the alcoholic centers would have to close since they are primarily funded by insurance money. A final point which I thought was truly insightful was a comparison made between Alcoholics Anonymous and some of the newly formed groups like Gamblers Anonymous. The person interviewed asked the question, "Are we now going to view gambling as a disease?"

You might ask, "What does all of this have to do with a Christian?" There have been some in recent years who have tried to find a sort of cop-out by calling one who has chosen to drink only "sick" and truly "cannot help himself." The view which suggests that God has made man defective and that he cannot chose right is one which cannot be held consistently from the Bible. It was the Apostle Paul who said, "There hath no temptation taken you but such as man can bear: but God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation make also the way of escape, that ye may be able to endure it. "(I Cor. 10:13). Sin is a choice which man makes! Drunkenness is a sin (Gal. 5:19-21; Eph. 5:18: Rom. 13:13). Therefore, drunkenness is a choice which man makes. The Bible teaches that man may be tempted by alcohol, but if he so chooses, he can resist that temptation. Calling drunkenness a disease is an attempt to shift the blame for the weakness of man to someone or something else.

The only kind of sickness that drunkenness is—— is sin-sickness which needs the Great Physician to cure by means of his cleansing blood.

What I have tried to convey in this article is what the Bible has taught all along—alcoholism is a chosen behavior, not something which a person cannot help because his body makes him do it. We must let the world know that they are responsible for their own behavior! If I lie, gamble, smoke, drink alcohol, take drugs, over-eat, or get involved in illicit sex, I do so of my own free choosing. What may be a temptation to one person may not be to another, but everyone has the ability to say NOI As James puts it: "Let no man say when he is tempted, I am tempted of God: for God cannot be tempted with evil, neither tempteth he any man: But every man is tempted, when he is drawn away of his own lust, and enticed. Then when lust hath conceived, it bringeth forth sin: and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death." (Jas. 1:13-15). Yes, sin is a chosen behavior!

Our Great Cloud Of Witnesses

"Therefore let us also, seeing we are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race is set before us, looking unto Jesus the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and hath sat down at the right hand of the throne of God." (Heb. 12:1-2)

In the above passage from the book of Hebrews we find great encouragement in our struggle in the Christian life. We all know that the struggle against sin and temptation is a difficult one. Often we are prone to want to give upbecause we think that the way is just too difficult. However, we have assurance from God's word that there are those who can testify to the fact that whatever your temptation might be, that have been those whose great faith in God helped them to overcome.

One might ask, "Who are these witnesses?" In the context, the writer has just given a description of the HALL OF FAME of the faithful in chapter 11. Men like Abraham and Moses are proof that one can overcome in spite of difficult circumstances. How many of us have been called upon to offer up a child of ours as a sacrifice? Or how many of us have been called upon to give up great wealth and power to suffer with our own people? Yet, there was nothing special about Abraham and Moses except their great faith in God. They knew that there was something better at the end!

The motivation mentioned by the Hebrew writer is that we should concentrate on the finish line. Jesus, because of the "joy that was set before him" was willing to undergo the most cruel of deaths. We too, following the pattern of our Master, can look at the finish line of heaven and take heart that the journey may seem tough now, there is a grand prize waiting upon us.

When we think about our striving in this life, it is as if these great ones of the Bible are on the side line cheering us on saying, "I made it by faith in God, so can you!" When we read about the strengths and weaknesses of the the Bible characters who served God well, they serve to remind us that we have a GREAT CLOUD OF WITNESSES who are telling us "you can do it."

It is just as easy to for a good habit as it is a bad one, and it is just as hard to break a good habit as a bad one. So get a good habit and keep it.

The Christian And Tobacco

This past week while I was in the Gospel Meeting at Carrollton, I tried to listen in to the news programs regularly in an effort to learn more about the tragic bus accident just outside of the city. And, while I listened to the news I heard the report of the Surgeon General C. Everett Koop on the Tobacco and Addiction. His report drew the following conclusions: (1) Tobacco (in all forms, cigarette, chewing, and snuff) contains the narcotic drug nicotine. (2) Nicotine is an addictive substance (drug) just like cocaine and heroin. (3) Tobacco users should own up to the fact that they are addicted to this substance and seek help to get off of it. Dr. Koop went on to emphasize several other important points which I found astounding: (1) 300,000 people a year die from tobacco use. (2) 16% of all of the deaths in this country can be attributed to the use of tobacco. (3) 75-80% of all tobacco users wish they could quit, but can't.

What does all of this information have to do with the Christian. We have

(Here is an article which I strongly encourage you to read!) Accappella In Retrospect

Six months ago, the singing group ACAPPELLA made their presentation in Cookeville, TN. This group advertises themselves as, "full-time ministers of music." Don Deffenbaugh, in his "News and Views" makes this report of their activities:

One news item that will be of interest to our readers is that Ozark Christian College of Joplin, MO, formerly known as Ozark Bible College (a Christian Church school) has been celebrating their 45th birthday this year. A part of that celebration was their annual preaching and teaching convention and homecoming which took place the week of February 22-28. Their preaching and teaching convention is equal to our college lectureships. Among the featured participants in the 1987 convention were the singing group, ACAPPELLA of Paris, TN, and Jeff Walling, Mission Viejo, CA. Jeff spoke four times: at chapel, at a dinner meeting, in a class, and at the general session on Tuesday, February 24.

In the June-August 1987 issue of *Group, The Youth Ministry Magazine* (an interdenominational youth ministry magazine), there is a section titled, "Christian Concert Talent Scout Booking Directory." In this section several individuals and groups are advertised. Included are: Brian Becker, Larry Bryant, D.O.X., The Cutting Edge, Dual Edge, and ACAPPELLA. The section makes it clear that these groups can be used in Revivals, Outreach, etc. The opening paragraph states:

Looking for someone to provide that extra zing for your special concert, retreat, or outreach event? How about using these Christian artists? *They want to be partners in your ministry*. (Emphasis mine, TFE). They'll help you bring new enthusiasm to your group. Use this handy directory to find just the right artist. Here's how.

A unique characteristic of these "full-time ministers of music" is that they record the sounds of instruments of music with their voices and use these as backup tapes for their vocal presentations. The objections this "ministry" are many.

1) Fellowshipping those who have apostasized from "the faith which was once for all delivered unto the saints."

2) Bidding God's speed to those who do not hold the doctrine of the Lord Jesus Christ (II John 9) by being "partners in your ministry." While any faithful Gospel preacher would be willing to preach the Gospel to any group, none would be willing to participate in such as way as to support error.
3) Using the sounds of instrumental music in *worship*. Brother Bill Jackson writing in his bulletin, *The Southwesterner* (October 21, 1987) makes this comment concerning ACAPPELLA, the "vocal band."

Are we dumb enough to fall for it, brethren? Do we really think that, in keeping with the demands of the New Testament to sing (Eph. 5:19; Col. 3:16), the objection was to the wooden frame, or the metal envelopment that the instrumental music came from? Do we think that just any "noise" is acceptable, provided it doesn't come from a man-made instrument? The demand from God is to sing! Making a sound like a guitar isn't singing; humming isn't singing; whistling isn't singing; and the sustained Ah... during a chorus of a song isn't singing!

This practice is a clear violation of Ephesians 5:19; and Colossians 3:16 because it is an addition

to what God commanded, even if the sounds of the instruments are made with the vocal cords. 4) A part of the "worship service" in the Cookeville was applause by hand clapping. Webster's New Universal Unabridged Dictionary defines applause as, 1. The act of applauding; approval or praise, acclamation; approbation publicly expressed. 2. Demonstration of approval by hand clapping, cheering, shouting, etc.

The first question which comes to my mind is who or what was being approved? Was it the God of the universe, who is Spirit and whom we are to worship in Spirit and truth (John 4:24), and decently and in order (I Cor. 14:40)? Or was the approval for the singers, or their music which motivated some to sway in their seats, and one worshipper to boogie (sway and shuffle his feet to the music)? One Gospel preacher in Arkansas said that the performance of the ACAPPELLA group reminded him of a rock-and-roll concert. Who was the applause for? Some have defended the applause by saying that it is nothing more than saying, "Amen." The Greek term $\alpha\mu\eta\nu$ is defined by Arndt and Gingrich's *Greek-EnglishLexicon* as, "so let it be, truly, amen." (2nd edition, p. 45), and approval is directed to God. Alvin Leach in his article "Applauding, Amen" *Firm Foundation*, July 28, 1987, makes this excellent statement,

Whereas, in the AMEN approval is pointed directly to what the speaker has said (GOD'S WORD)... For example, in I Chronicles 16:36, David ends his praise and thanksgiving with "blessed be the Lord God of Israel for ever and ever." Because he spoke truth and they agreed, they showed their agreement, "all the people said, Amen, and praised the Lord." AMEN was their way of agreeing with David's statement. Paul had the same understanding of AMEN in I Cor. 14:15,16 when he talks of worshipping God with the Spirit and understanding and says those who do not understand cannot say AMEN. In Deut. 28:14-26 "And all the people said, Amen," following the Levites reading of God's curses. Here AMEN showed they understood God's word and was willing to submit to it.

Faithful Gospel preachers will not oppose a good work nor will they destroy the influence of a faithful brother, but when men are in clear violation of God's word and are leading God's people astray—the faithful of God must speak out.

ACAPPELLA, "the full-time ministers of music" are violating the following passages in God's word:

1) They are not setting the proper example (Matt. 5:16) in that they are fellowshipping those who have been marked for they false practices in harmony with Romans 16:17.

2) They are bidding God's speed to those who teach denominationalism (II John 9).

3) They are in violation of Ephesians 5:19 and Colossians 3:16.

4) They are in disobedience of God's instruction in I Cor. 14:40.

5) They are leading some of God's people into error by they sinful activities.

Faithful brethren everywhere should know the truth, teach it, stand with it, defend it, and stop trying to defend the undefendable.

In the past few years and months there has arisen a favorite ploy by many. It reasons something like this:

The Corinthians had many problems as is evidenced by Paul's letters to them. In these letters he refers to these people as his "brethren" and the "church of God." If Paul accepted these brethren in spite of their evident problems then we ought to accept one another upon the same basis.

If such a teaching were not so popular and so serious, it would not be worthy of our consideration. Men have always expended every effort to find a teaching which will let them hold on to their pet sin and still keep some sort of "respectability" with regard to their religion. This is not new, and we should not be surprised that men twist the scriptures to make them fit their own sinful ways. The Pharisees of old did this in many ways (cf. Matt. 5:20-48). It is a shame, though, that the epistles of Paul to the Corinthians have been so abused to justify this.

The purpose for Pauls letters to the Corinthians was to correct the problems, not to whitewash them! Why did Paul write the first letter? Let him answer: "For to this end also did I write, that I might know the proof of you, whether ye are obedient in all things." (II Cor. 2:9) They were called upon to correct their sinful ways. They did in many ways as he said in II Cor. 7:11, "For behold, this self-same thing, that ye were made sorry after a godly sort, what earnest care it wrought in you, yea what clearing of yourselves, yea what indignation, yea what fear, year what longing, yea what zeal, yea what avenging! In everything ye approved yourselves to be pure in the matter." Paul wrote them to bring about repentance. Lest anyone get the wrong idea, listen to Paul: "I have said beforehand, and I do say beforehand, as when I was present the second time, so now, being absent, to them that have sinned heretofore, and to all the rest, that, if I come again, I will not spare." (II Cor. 13:2). I shudder to think of how great of a rebuke the apostle would give the ones of our day who are totally misapplying his letters.

Did Paul consider the people at Corinth his brethren? Certainly, but brethren who needed to repent. Did he consider them a "church" of the Lord? Of course, but one which had many things which needed and required correction. If one wants to keep following a sinful path, the books to the Corinthians are not the books to hide behind!

The Plazue of Self-Pity

It is possible for one to be too hard on oneself, unnecessarily reproaching and condemning oneself. However, it is also possible to be too easy oneself. This often takes the form of self-pity. People who are constantly dripping with self-sympathy are at the same time to be pitied and shunned. They not only ruin life for themselves, but they spoil it for others upon whom they descend with their tales of woe, if they are allowed to. Are you struggling under the plague of self-pity? If so, consider the following facts about it:

- 1. IT IS A MARK OF IMMATURITY. Babies are notoriously self-sympathetic. If they are hungry or uncomfortable, it matters not to them that it is 2:00A.M.! In their self-pity they holler until somebody comes. They don't give a thought to the fact that Mother and Daddy need their rest for the coming day. A person who is mature has learned to take some lumps, suffer some discomforts and walk through some valleys, without becoming an embittered, long-faced complainer.
- 2. IT MAKES ONE INSENSITIVE TO OTHERS. If one is constantly focusing only on his own trouble and problems, he can hardly be understanding and sympathetic toward others. Such a person is constantly seeking sympathy and murmuring about being neglected and having no one who loves him or cares for him. "I have more problems than anyone else," he wails; but how does he know? He doesn't know or care about the sufferings of others.
- 3. IT MAKES ONE MISERABLE. None are more unhappy on this earth than those who are completely wrapped up in themselves. The more they think only of themselves the worse it makes them feel, and the worse they feel the more they pity themselves!
- 4. IT ROBS US OF FRIENDS. The chronic self-pitier will always be a grouchy, pessimistic fusser who has forgotten how to talk without a certain whine in the voice. Who likes to be around that sort of person?
- 5. IT CAN MAKE ONE PHYSICALLY AND EMOTIONALLY ILL. The selfpitier needs to grow up: "Be not children in mind..., but in mind be men" (I Cor. 14:20). It is right to love oneself, but we are also taught to love our neighbors as ourselves (Matt. 22:39).

Balance!

One of the greatest problems that men have is maintaining a proper balance. Too often men will place a great priority on one thing while almost ignoring another. This happens in life, and it happens in the church! This was the problem that many of the scribes and Pharisees had. Jesus said, "Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for yetithe mint and anise and cummin, and have let undone the weightier matters of the law, justice, and mercy and faith: but these ye ought to have done, and not to left the other undone." (Matt. 23:23). The challenge for us all is to be sure that we strive for a proper balance in all that we do. Consider some of these areas.

Zeal: Paul wrote of some who had zeal but it was not balanced with knowledge (Rom. 10:1-3). But, how many have the knowledge and have no zeal at all?

Compassion: We all know today of those whose "compassion" and "love" for their fellow man cause them to tolerate almost anything they do. This is not real love at all. True love will cause one to try to correct and restore those who have gone astray. However, there certainly are those who, in their attempt to correct those who have gone astray, have needed to follow the biblical admonition *"restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness; looking to thyself, lest thou also be tempted."* (Gal. 6:1).

The church has seemingly always had those given to extremes. That is the reason why we hear about "liberals" on the left and "antis" on the right. We need to follow the teaching of Solomon: *"Ponder the path of your feet, and let all your ways be established. Do not turn to the right or left; remove your feet from evil."* (Prov. 4:26,27 NKJV). Let us strive for a biblical balance in our lives.

Admonish The Disorderly

In Paul's final admonitions to the church at Thessalonica, he wrote: "And we exhort you, brethren, admonish the disorderly, encourage the fainthearted, support the weak, be longsuffering to all." (I Thess. 5:14). The church there was excelling in the virtue of loving one another, yet, at the same time they needed to be reminded of the responsibility which they had toward one another. True love expresses itself in concern and action. There are numerous lessons which could come from this, but the passage can be better understood and applied when one considers how else the words "admonish" and "disorderly are used.

Paul used the word "admonish" on several occasions with differing purposes in mind. But consider Romans 15:14, "And I myself also am persuaded of you, my brethren, that ye yourselves are full of goodness, filled with all knowledge, able also to admonish one another." It should be noted that for one to be able to (with value) to admonish another that two prerequisites exists: (1) goodness of heart, and (2) knowledge. Or consider Paul statement to the Corinthians, "I write not these things to shame you, but to admonish you as my beloved children." (I Cor. 4:14). Admonishing is not scolding or condescending; admonishing is warning and encouragement. The Bible does teach that those who are in error must be rebuked, but it also teaches that certain ones, whose attitude otherwise is right, may be encouraged back to faithful service if such is done with a proper attitude and in a caring manner.

The "disorderly" of which Paul speaks must refer to a certain class of individuals. It is very important that these people be identified. Given the context of I Thessalonians, it is likely that these are people who have allowed themselves to get an inaccurate view of the Lord's return, and have ceased all productive work. These individuals are in error. Later on, Paul taught if they did not repent they were to be disfellowshipped (II Thess. 3:6,14). We learn from Paul that from their idleness came the sin of being a busybody (II Thess. 3:11). Herein is the wisdom of admonishing the disorderly: if one is encouraged to get back to doing what is right, then further sins can be averted.

Of what meaning is this for us today? We perhaps do not have the problem of people ceasing work due to belief that the Lord's coming is imminent, but we do have a problem with those who have fallen out of the Lord's service. These people need to be admonished to "get back to work," their soul depends upon it!

Standing Up and Speaking Out

Holy Bible

I recently read an article which, in my opinion, left the impression that there was something unrespectable to be attached with *standing up for the truth.* It may be that the writer had some other intent, for I cannot judge motives. However, by what was said, I have difficulty drawing any other conclusion. I would like to look at this view from a biblical perspective, which after all is the only one that really counts.

I must ask the question, did the great men of the Bible consider standing up for what they knew to be true some worthy of disrespect? The answer is a resounding NO! They expected that the world would not respect them (cf. I Pet. 4:4), but that was only because they did not live like them. The disrespect for standing for the truth will only come from those who hate the light. Paul's treatise on light and darkness in Ephesians 5:7-14 reveals that not only did he expect them to refrain from participating in the darkness, he expected them to "reprove" or "expose" them (vs. 11). And, Paul practiced what he preached. In Philippians 1:16 he said that he was "set for the defence of the gospel." He said that he was "not ashamed of the gospel" (Rom. 1:16). Evidently many are. One must never be ashamed of being a Christian and standing up for what he believe (I Pet. 4:16; 3:15).

But some might argue, I am not as concerned with what one believes and says as what one does. Such is a foolish argument. Here's why: though one may verbally say differently (and is a hypocrite), we really do and practice what we believe. Doctrine and practice cannot be separated! It was Paul who told the young evangelist Timothy "Take heed to thyself, and to thy teaching. Continue in these things; for in doing this thou shalt save both thyself and them that hear thee." (I Tim. 4:16). This is the very reason why in the Bible we have so much said about the Truth. This is the reason it must be contended for (Jude 3). Stand up and speak up for the truth, then practice it and others will also.

Why So Many Warnings?

I can remember a few years ago wondering why certain preachers and elders were so "concerned" about trends among our brethren. I wondered why did they seemingly bombarded us with warnings. I think I now understand why — they were men of the Book. They knew the nature of God. He is loving and kind, but is also a just and severe God (Rom. 11:22). They loved the souls of men and knew the danger. They knew that whenever man gets complacent, he is ripe for a fall. It was Paul who said that one who "thinketh he standeth take heed lest he fall." (I Cor 10:12). We who are alive today, for the most part, have not been those who have had to "fight the battles" for the faith. We have, so to speak, inherited our faith.

Consider the book of Hebrews. The writer was dealing with a situation to too foreign to ours. They were not "first generation" Christians (cf. Heb. 2:1-3; 13:7). They needed to be reminded of:

(1) Do not neglect the Word-Heb. 2:1-3.

- (2) Do not allow yourself to become hardened by sin-Heb. 3:13.
- (3) Do not allow yourself to miss heaven by disbelief-Heb. 4:11.
- (4) Make sure you grow so you can teach-Heb. 5:12.
- (5) Do not fall away and crucify Christ all over again-Heb. 6:4-6.
- (6) Remember the faithfuls of history-Heb. 11:1-40.
- (7) Do not become discouraged when you are disciplined-Heb. 12:3-11.

Our Sunday evening lessons have generally been those in a series so that we can keep some continuity with our lessons from week to week. We have studied lessons from the *Teachings of Christ* and from the *Difficult Texts Of The New Testament*, and the plan is for us to begin a series starting the first Sunday evening in August on Outstanding Bible Characters. We will begin with the Old Testament characters first. If there is a particular Bible character that you would like for me to make sure that I deal with, then please let me know.

Perhaps something should be said initially regarding the value of studying Bible characters. They were real people, just like you and me. In one area or another they excelled and that is the reason for their inclusion in the Bible, however, they each had their *besetting sin* which had to be overcomed. We often do not think of ourselves as being able to accomplish the same feats and exemplify the same traits as the faithfuls of the Bible, yet, they were just like us.

Another value of studying Bible characters is the insight we are given into the nature of the God we serve. We learn from Bible characters that God means exactly what He has said. God does not lie (Heb. 6:18; Tit. 1:2). If God makes promises to me through His word they are every bit as sure as those He made to Moses.

Finally, while we get interested in the Bible characters and their lives, we learn more about the Bible and the saving message. The characters of the Bible can make the message "live" for us. Try to be present on Sunday evenings for this study.

The Crisis of Bereavement

Hardeman Nichols

Since the pale horse, (Reve. 6:8), visits every home, pierces every mortal, it is necessary for all of us to learn how to handle bereavement. I have watched with great admiration and respect the courage that has borne many a saint through hours of sorrow. Here is some practical advice I have seen others use in dealing with grief:

1. EXPRESS YOUR EMOTIONS. Since Jesus wept, it should not be considered a Christian to be totally unmoved by the loss of a loved one. There is a difference in expressing one's emotions and in losing self-control. The Bible does not say "sorrow not," but is says, "sorrow not as others who have no hope." (I Thess. 4:13).

2. SEEK THE AID OF YOUR FRIENDS. The very presence of friends is an encouragement. When Paul neared Rome the brethren came to meet him, and he "thanked God and took courage." (Acts 28:15).

3. COMPEL YOURSELF TO BE WITH PEOPLE. Your inclination may be to retreat into the refuge of privacy, but there is greater need than one realizes to associate with others. David did (II Sam. 12:19-23).

4. EXPRESS YOUR FEELINGS IN WORDS. Talking about it will help you to accept it. If this is done at the outset of bereavement, one will sooner be able to stabilize his life.

5. AVIAL YOURSELF OF SPIRITUAL RESOURCES. Even though you may not have realized the importance of the Scriptures and their comfort, now these can help in building your faith. The power of prayer and peace of God are very precious possessions.

6. DON'T BROOD OVER WHAT MIGHT HAVE BEEN. Both Mary and Martha said, "IF thou hadst been here my brother had not died." (Jn. 11:21,32). Neither of them knew that something far more glorious was just ahead.

7. ACTIVELY PURSUE WORTHWHILE TASKS. Once the initial shock has been dealt with, gut busy at other things. Resolve like Paul to "reach forth unto things that are before." (Phil. 3:13,14).

8. MAKE CAREFUL AND THOUGHTFUL DECISIONS. Many an individual jumps hastily into deciding the full scope of the future rather than waiting until he has regained a proper perspective of life. Don't get in a hurry. Make prayerful decisions.

9. INCREASE YOUR TRUST IN GOD. Those who have come through their sorrows with a deeper faith can verify that God, who rules over all, truly does make all things work together for good. (Rom. 8:28).

After the crisis of grief, you can serve more fully and sympathize more completely with men of like frailties. With Paul you too can thank God for the comfort received, knowing that it has now given you the ability to comfort others who are in in trouble (II Cor. 1:4).

Since the church has lost so many in the recent past, I thought this was a timely article. TL.

Some More Thoughts On "The Last Temptation of Christ"



There is no doubt but the sermon of August 14, "If Jesus Were Not Deity." touched a responsive chord of those within the congregation. Those who had already heard of the movie in the news media were appreciative that the subject was being dealt with. Those who were unaware of the sickening script of the movie were shocked by the level of blasphemy that the movie reached. The movie is nothing more than an attack on the divine nature of our Lord! And, it is a shame but its promoters will likely profit from its controversial nature.

After a second thought, however, I have decided that in effect the movie might be good for us. Do I approve of it, NO! Might it bring good, YES! How could this be? It has been a long time since I have seen so many Christians outraged enough to speak out on anything! The doctrinal whims of almost everything seems to be tolerated in these days. Yet, this movie has caused even some of the most passive of Christians to get upset. It has mobilized more people to action that a 1000 preachers ever could. For that I am thankful! It was a persecution of the church in Acts 8 which caused the church to spread the gospel throughout the world. "And there arose on that day a great persecution against the church which was at Jerusalem; and they were all scattered abroad throughout the regions of Judeaea and Samaria, except the apostles...They therefore that were scattered abroad went about preaching the word." (Acts 8:1,4). The church was moved by persecution. It is possible that it will require a persecution before we will get moving again.

Someone might say, well if you say that the movie might bring good, then you are somehow justifying them in their action. Not at all! Paul dealt with this very question in Romans 3:5,6 "But if our unrighteousness commendeth the righteousness of God, what shall we say? Is God unrighteous who visiteth with wrath (I speak after the manner of men.) God forbid: for then how shall God judge the world?" Paul was saving that even our wickedness sometimes brings about good results. Yet, we cannot plead that we are righteous, because we serve before a just God who will judge all of the world with righteousness.

How do I feel about the "Last Temptation Of Christ"? I am appalled by the slander of our Lord. I know that the producers and all involved will have to give an account for this in the day of judgement. However, I want to take advantage of the opportunity to get greater involvement by the saints. Will I go to see the movie? NO!!! Preview it, maybe? NO!!! Boston/Crossroads Type Churches Come To Middle Tennessee

Holy Bible

For many of you the above title may mean very little. There may be a question in your mind, just what are "Boston/Crossroads" churches. They are congregations of the Lord's people who have gone astray. They use methods of evangelism which involve coercion and mind control. Places where they have been families have been split, and friendships broken. They have perverted the Lord's plan for church organization as well. The Boston church has placed itself as the "mother church" with certain other planted churches being referred to as "pillar churches." And, all of this ungodly heresy has come to middle Tennessee.

According to the Nashville Banner (August 29, 1988), on the front page, the church started with 576 worshipers and gave a contribution of \$58,678. They will be known as the Central Nashville Church of Christ and meet in the Tennessee Performing Arts Center. To some this may appear as a harmless, perverted group of people which will have little impact. I would like for you to consider some very important implications regarding this new group:

(1) Souls will be lost! The Bible clearly teaches that to teach a perverted gospel will condemn its messengers (Gal. 1:6-9), but those who obey a perverted gospel stand condemned as well (Matt. 23:15). These people are preaching a perverted doctrine!

(2) People will associate us with those who are using these unscriptural methods. In cities where these "Boston/Crossroad" type churches have flourished, people have picketed the church buildings as cults. We cannot help but be associated with them when they call themselves by the same name. When we go to people's homes and talk with them about the gospel, many will immediately be wary of us because of the association of us with the cult like group. This can only get worse as the group in Nashville makes headlines.

(3) People will be influenced by the "success rate" of the group and be attracted to their unscriptural methods. There is always the tendency to look at the success or others and say, "they must be doing something right, their growing." The pragmatic philosophy is not right! If we get where we follow anything just because it works, we will bow to the whims of every wind of doctrine. Seriously, no one who really thinks about it would ever want to suggest that we follow the methods of some **just because it "works."**

We must oppose this group and let others know that we have no fellowship with them. They may have went out from us, but they are not of us (I Jn. 2:19). They are different, and we must let it be known!

A Word About Gambling...

The error is not in where or how much, but in the principles involved. Solomon was quite explict about **how** a man should acquire his substance. He should get it by diligent **labor** and not by stealing, oppression, begging, or other unrighteous means. In fact, Solomon teaches that the wise man will work for what he gets, then he will carefully guard and protect that which he has gotten. (cf. Prov. 13:7; 12:10-12; 15:27; et. al.). Gambling involves illicit desire for which we want to get. If we need (or even want) what they have to offer, then why gamble for it? Just go buy it.

Next week, when you pass by some of the hustlers who want you to gamble your money with them, why not just say, "I don't gamble, its wrong." If enough said so, maybe they would get the message!

What Is More Important, Truth Or Attitude?



Attitudes are very important, they will ultimately manifest themselves in our behavior. The wise Solomon said long ago, *"For as he thinketh in his heart, so is he."* (Prov. 23:7). It was our Lord who said that *"out of the heart come forth evil thoughts, murders, adulteries, fornications, thefts, false witnesses, railings."* (Matt. 15:9). Whatever attitude we have, it will soon come out in the way we act. It we hate someone we will, sooner or later, mistreat that person in some way. For this and other reasons there are many people today who feel that the greatest sins are those of attitude. And, often these people teach that if they had to make a choice, they would rather have the "right attitude" than to be "correct" in everything they teach. In other words, to them attitude is more important that truth.

It would be interesting and even enlightening to see if the Bible addresses this subject. When Paul was imprisoned in Rome, he faced numerous trials. One of the trials was that there were people who were jealous of Paul. As a result of their jealousy, they preached Christ of *"envy and strife."* (Phil. 1:15). They want to cause problems for Paul. No one can doubt that their attitude was wrong. They sinned! However, it is surprising to note what he said about it: *"What then? only that in every way, whether in pretence or in truth, Christ is proclaimed; and therein I rejoice, yea, and will rejoice."* (Phil. 1:18). To the Apostle, even though the attitude was wrong, he was glad that the truth was being preached. On the other hand, Paul had no tolerance for those who preached error. Read what he said about Hymenaeus and Alexander (I Tim. 1:20), then about Hymenaeus and Philetus (II Tim. 2:17,18). Timothy was to *"Hold the pattern of sound words."* (II Tim. 1:13). Or, to put it in simple words, Paul placed greater emphasis on Truth, rather than attitude.

The question must be asked, "Why?" The Truth saves (Jas. 1:21), attitudes don't! What does this mean for us? Though the preacher and/or teacher exhibits an attitude which appears bad or is bad, we must do what is true and right regardless. And, all of the "love" in the world, if not properly directed, will not save a soul.

Is it the intent of this article to defend those who do things through a bad attitude? Not at all. If they do not repent of it, they will be lost. And it certainly is possible for one to be lost after preaching to others (cf. I Cor. 9:27). What we are saying is essentially what Jesus said in Matthew 23:3 *"all things therefore whatsoever they bid you, these do and observe: but do not ye after their works; for they say, and do not."*

# Steadfast In Times Of Difficulty

There is always significance in the careful study of Bible verses, but some take on added power in view of the circumstances present at a certain time and place. The words of Paul, *"Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmoveable..."* (I Corinthians 15:58), seem particularly to be of such power and relevance today.

There are circumstances which tend to disturb even frighten brethren as the swirling events around us are observed. The rising tide of drug abuse, the dramatic increase in violent crimes, the erosion of moral values, etc., stir our concern. Within the body of Christ, in this country, there is a disturbing trend toward compromise on instrumental music and fellowship with those who have divided the church with additions to the teaching of God; there is a strong evangelistic movement centered in a northeastern city which would install evangelistic oversight, pillar churches, and authoritative rule by a newborn hierarchy. These trends and others, which not of immediate threat, are still present and troubling. What is to be done by the workers of God in a given locale? Some insights may be drawn from this verse which is so well known:

1. There must be steadfast loyalty to the Bible as God's word, known and applied as the only standard of guidance for the church. This may seem trite, but it is ever needed and relevant.

2. There must be a willingness to stand for purity in the life, doctrine and practice of God's people. There is no doubt of the presence of denominational doctrine, of teaching which is less than or more than the truth in Scripture; those who love truth must renew their determination to speak the truth in love.

3. There must be a resolve to worship and serve in the church as the Lord has directed. Elders, deacons, members, teachers and preachers need to conscientiously reaffirm this determination; the church should resolve that this will be uppermost in its life.

4. There must be a dedication to the conversion of the lost to the way of Christ. This means evangelism, support, and related activities will be a part of each Christian life.

5. There must be an unshakeable allegiance to and trust in God and His Son. The destiny of God's people is in His hand; our task is to be steadfast, unmoveable, always abounding in His work.

Can You Recommend Your Religion?

Many times we talk with our friends and neighbors regarding specific products which we are "sold" on. We prefer this kind of shampoo, that kind of automobile, and we want others to make the same choice we have because we feel that the product is superior than others in the same category. I personally have found myself wanting to recommend my type of computer because of the benefits which I believe that it has over its competitors. Along these lines, I would like to ask, "Can you recommend your religion?" Do you feel that you have the best, yea the "only." If not, then perhaps a closer look would help.

When Paul argued his case before King Agrippa he said, "I would to God, that whether with little or with much, not thou only, but also all that hear me this day, might become such as I am, except these bonds." (Acts 26:29) He wanted Festus, King Agrippa, and anyone else who heard his message to be obedient to the Lord, just like he had been. He felt that he could recommend his religion! He had no doubt but that his investment into the Lord's service was a worthy one and would pay off. He told Timothy, "For which cause I suffer also these things: yet I am not ashamed; for I know him whom I have believed, and I am persuaded that he is able to guard that which I have committed unto him against that day." (II Tim. 1:12). He "trusted the product," "knew its value" to himself and others, and was ready to recommend it to others.

Why would a person not recommend their religion? Perhaps they feel that they are not doctrinally correct. They may feel that their faith is unfounded. It just may be that they feel that they do not have the "best" of the options. In material matters, though one automobile may actually be better than another, to choose an inferior car will not be earth-shaking. If one has a preference for one type of computer over another, to choose another is not a catastrophe. However, in religion we either have it right or we don't. Choosing a religion is not in the same category as choosing a brand of shirt. We must be certain that we have the "right" one. We must look at the matter from the perspective of who offers the product (God or some man), who has the best product support (eternal or temporal), and does it live up to its advertisement? Then, when we become convinced that we have the right product/religion, then we will be glad to recommend it to our friends and neighbors.

Why not start now to speak with your friends and neighbors and invite them to "come and see." Ask them to come and see Christians worshipping God together each Lord's day. Tell them of the values and promises of being just a Christian. Can you recommend your religion? If not, why not? *T.L.*

What Would You Think Sf...

If a PREACHER, motivated by love for the souls of those to whom he is speaking, points out the way that an individual is following is not according to the will of the Father, as found in the Bible — he is often charged with being judgmental, harsh, abusive, and even unloving. Is that as it should be? Consider the following thoughts:

### LAWYER---

If your lawyer became aware of a major flaw in the deed to your property—but for fear that you might become upset, maybe at him, chose to keep it a secret, would you appreciate him for putting you in a position (or keeping you there) that potentially could cause you to lose your property? Would you want to keep using his services? Would he be fulfilling his duties by such action?

### PHYSICIAN-

Or consider the medical doctor that, after examining you (or a member of your family) realized that you had a terminal condition (maybe with a few days at most left to live). But he made the decision to tell no one. As the two of you talked before you left, you spoke of sports, the weather, etc.—and he allowed you to leave thinking that you were in good health. What would you think of a doctor like that? Would he command your respect, when you found out the truth—but too late to even discuss with your family, final plans and thoughts. He would have failed miserably to fulfill his responsibilities and that which he has pledged to do as a physician.

### Mechanic-

Or think about the automobile mechanic, while possibly just changing the oil in your car noticed that the main front end parts (ball joints, idler arms, etc.) were severely worn, to the point that it would be extremely dangerous to drive the care even to your house, for fear the front tire(s) would literally fall off. Would he do you a favor to merely just keep it to himself, and decide that since it would maybe upset you, plus cost you considerably, that he would just be quiet. Would he be your friend? Has he done you a favor? Would you keep going back for additional service work on your car? Surely not! we can easily and quickly see that he surely did not care about us at all.

### WEATHERMAN-

Or dwell for a few moments on the newsperson or weather forecaster that is aware of an extremely dangerous condition (maybe a tornado) that has already touched down just a short distance away and is headed in your direction—but does not feel that it is worth mentioning, that it might alarm some unnecessarily—so no report or bulletin was given. Would you not be reacting reasonably to cry out asking WHY? Especially if you lost a loved one or friend in death—whose life might have been spared had you been warned.

### PREACHER-

The point is quite obvious. The Preacher that warns others (Ezk. 3:141) is merely fulfilling the requirement that Jehovah placed upon them. While it is not the preacher's desire to upset, to alarm and certainly not to make angry—still the truth is the truth and it is the truth that will make us free. Paul asked (as recorded in the Galatian letter) "Am I become your enemy because I tell you the truth?"

Holv Bible

In the New Testament the word *mystery* is quiet common. Paul said to the Corinthians, "*let a man so account of us, as ministers of Christ, and stewards of the mysteries of God.*" (I Cor. 4:1). It was the job of the New Testament writers to reveal what had been concealed. The mystery was not meant to have some sort of mystical concept which man could wish to know, but could never find out. Rather, it refers to the plan of God, revealed partially through the prophets, but fully revealed by the New Testament writers.

This thesis is well demonstrated in the writings of the Apostles. Paul told the Ephesians, "how that by revelation was made know unto me the mystery, as I wrote before in a few words, whereby, when ye read, ye can perceive my understanding in the mystery of Christ; which in other generations was not made known unto the sons of men, as it hath now been revealed unto his holy apostles and prophets in the Spirit." (Eph. 3:3-5). John writes further, "He said, but in the days of the voice of the seventh angel, when he is about to sound, then is finished the mystery of God, according to the good tidings which he declared to his servants the prophets." (Rev. 10:7). Therefore, we conclude that the mystery is the revelation of God's divine plan to man.

Even more enlightening is the fact that this mystery relates to the kingdom or church. As mentioned above, the seventh angel was about to sound and to complete the "mystery of God." The record states "And the seventh angel sounded; and there followed great voices in heaven, and they said, The kingdom of the world is become the kingdom of our Lord, and his Christ: and he shall reign forever and ever." (Rev. 11:15). This is evidently exactly what Daniel was referring to in the Old Testament when he made the prophecy that during the days of the Roman kings that God would establish a kingdom which would "break in pieces and consume all these kingdoms, and it shall stand for ever." (Dan. 2:44). Thus, the revelation of the mystery relates to salvation, the church, and all things related to it. In fact, Paul explicitly states, "this mystery is great: but I speak in regard of Christ and of the church." (Eph. 5:32).

Many people today take great pleasure inreading a good mystery novel. They love to get entangled in the plot, see the mystery unfold, and finally see the outcome. Why not consider God's great book, the Bible? Why not begin in the Old Testament and see the mystery presented, then move to the New Testament and see the mystery unfold and find fulfillment in Jesus and his church.

A brother who serves as an usher in a church of a thousand members in another state recently made the comment, "*If we were to lock the doors at the hour of worship, one-third would be inside and two-thirds outside.*" Inasmuch as it appears to be such a prevalent problem, let's ask the question, "What's wrong with being tardy?"



(1) It's Disruptive. One teacher stated that when the bell rang, one student was in the classroom. It was not until twenty minutes later that the last of the students finally arrived. How can effective teaching take place in such a setting???

(2) It Indicates Wronge Priorities. How many of us would be late responding to a dinner invitation to the White House? How often do we allow children to be tardy at school? Or at ballgames in which they are playing? How would it have gone over with your husband or wife for you to have been late to your wedding? Are you late to work (in which case, you may be docked)? The point is: we are on time to the events or occasions which are important to us. Since corporate worship should be the most important time in our week, shouldn't we be on time???

(3) It is Just Plain Sloppy. Being tardy falls in the same category with the unprepared Bible class lesson or the unfulfilled assignment. It is demoralizing to those who are on time. Being tardy is just not consistent with the urgency of discipleship under the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

Being on time costs something. In the long ago it was David who said, "I will not offer burnt offerings to the Lord my God which cost me nothing." (II Sam. 24:24). It takes time to be punctual. It was the Preacher of Ecclesiastes who admonished, "Whatsoever your hand finds to do, do it with your might." (Ecc. 9:10). As a hymn puts it, "Give of your best to the Master." Let's all make the commitment and put forth the effort to be on time for every occasion of the work and worship of the church.

While everyone understands an occasional delay beyond one's control, a consistent pattern of tardiness indicates that one already knows that he is going to be late and doesn't care. If you plan to serve the church on the program, you should be here no later than 15 minutes before the services begin.

# Can A Child Of God Sin?

There are some religious groups which teach that a person who is a child of God cannot sin. They draw this from a misunderstanding of I John 3:9. John writes: "Whosoever is begotten of God doeth no sin, because his seed abideth in him: and he cannot sin, because he is begotten of God." Upon first reading, and without any further consideration, one might could draw such a conclusion. However, such an interpretation is not what the passage conveys, and is out of harmony with what the rest of the Bible teaches.

When one looks at the passage itself, the phrases, "doeth no sin" and "cannot sin," are both in the present tense. The present tense in the Greek language means more than it does in our English. It carries with it the idea of continual action. Hence, a better translation would say "does not practice sin" and "cannot keep on sinning." The emphasis of the passage is to stress the nature of the child of God versus the nature of the child of the devil.

The rest of the Bible is equally clear that the child of God can sin. A vast array of passages could be listed, but just consider some of the passages in the book of Hebrews that stress careful vigilance (Heb. 2:1; 3:12-14; 4:1; 6:4-6; 10:26; 10:36-39; et. al.). Even in I John we have a John writing: "My little children, these things write I unto you that ye may not sin. And if any man sin, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous." Can a child of God sin? Yes! The faithful child, however, will resist as much as possible.

# Campbellite Or Christian?

There are several people who struggle with the query of others if we are "Campbellites. To the informed mind this should be no problem at all. Many who make this charge d not know what they are speaking about, nor do they understand the nature of the church of the Lord.

First, it was a long time after I became a Christian that I even learned of Thomas and Alexander Campbell. If one were converted to a man, you would think that you would hear his name often. When I obeyed the Gospel, it was in the name of Jesus Christ. The only name under which a person can be saved (Acts 4:12). When one obeys the Gospel he becomes a Christian, nothing more and nothing less. The Bible alone will make only a Christian.

Second, the church was in existence a long time before Thomas and Alexander Campbel were ever born. There were churches of Christ in the New Testament (Rom. 16:16). In fact the Bible only knows of ONE TRUE CHURCH, and it belonged to Christ because he built it (Matt. 16:18) and he purchased it with his own blood (Acts 20:28). And, there were even churches of Christ in Warren County before Thomas and Alexander Campbell came to America and left their denominational ties. Thomas Campbell came to America in 1807 Alexander in 1809, and did not leave all of their denominational ties until 1927, yet the church at Old Philadelphia was known to be in existence in 1810.



To my knowledge, I have never known a member of the Lord's church who worshipped Thomas or Alexander Campbell, nor even placed their writings on par with the Bible They were men who were honest in character and who willingly left their denominational ties to be "just Christians," and they were successful in getting others to see that this was biblical teaching. It was not their intention to make a new church, but to call people back to being the true church of Christ. T.L.
