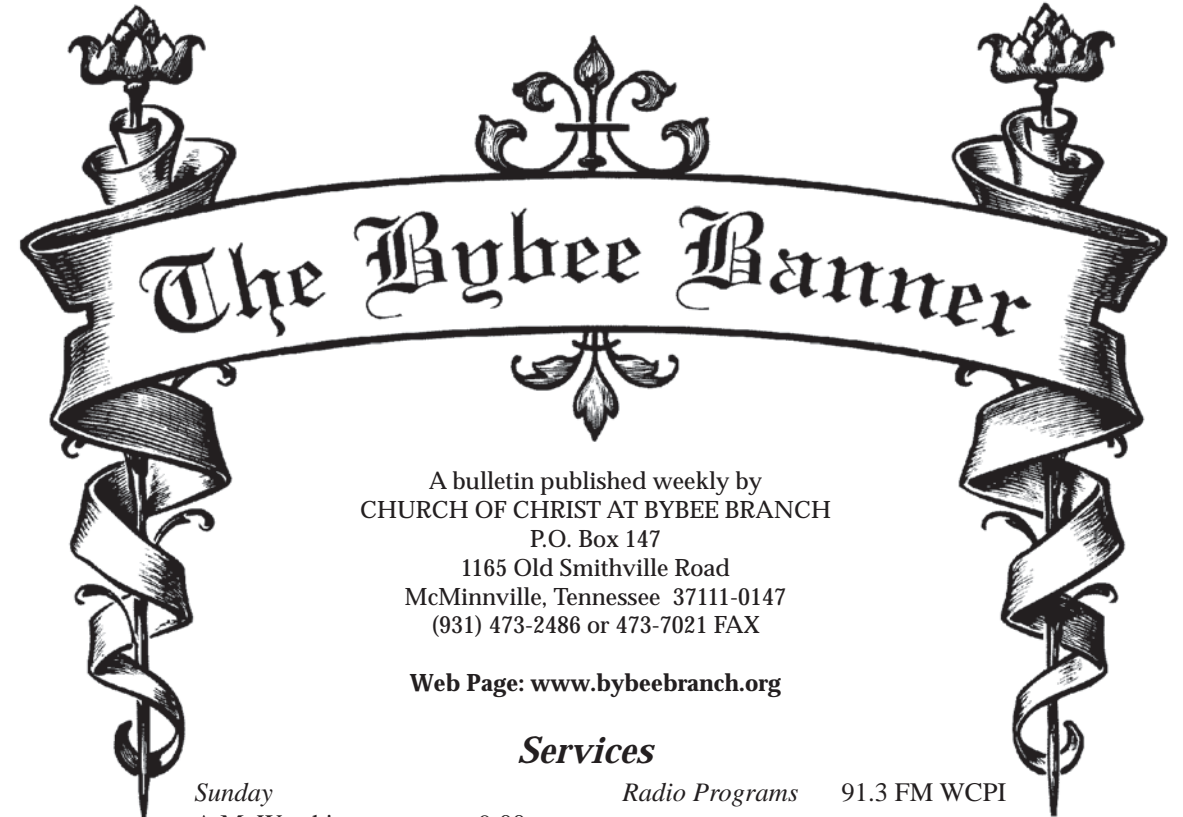

Notes From Steve

God commanded Joshua to be strong, courageous, and not be afraid of the daunting task that were before he and the Israelites (Joshua 1:9.) The reason for this is that the Israelites were going into hostile territory carrying the banner of the true God, bringing a different law, and upsetting the normal routine of that day. Fast-forward to the first century and a certain man named Stephen.

Stephen was one of the seven appointed by the church and approved by the apostles to make sure the Grecian (Hellenist) widows were not being neglected in the daily distribution (Acts 6:1-5.) Eventually, however, Stephen would have to conger up the courage and boldness that served Joshua well. Stephen was preaching the gospel and people were accepting the liberty found in Christ, but as there always seems to be, some opposed the Good Word and set out to stop the message. In face to face debate, the synagogue of the Libertines (Freedmen) were no match for the wisdom and Spirit that led Stephen. So, if you can't stop the message – STOP THE MESSENGER, and this is exactly what transpired. False accusers were set up (does this all sound eerily familiar) that claimed Stephen was using blasphemous words against Moses, God, and the temple (this holy place.) (Acts 6:8-15)

When called upon to defend his stance, Stephen did so with conviction, knowledge, and courage. Stephen would go on to logically prove that it was not he who had turned his back on God and blasphemed, but rather his audience, the Jews who had done so! He proves this by using the Israelites own history against his accusers! They had constantly blasphemed against the Holy Spirit, had constantly killed the prophets would foretold of the "Just One," who Stephen states his countrymen had become "betrayers

and murderers" (Acts 7:1-50.)

Stephen entered a hostile environment that opposed Jesus. He carried the blood stained banner of the true and righteous God, delivered the gospel of Jesus Christ, and truly upset some of the people's lives of that day. Stephen was strong, courageous, and not afraid to stand up and be counted under tremendous pressure. Stephen lost his physical life that day, but look at what he gained – eternal freedom.

As the stones pounded away at his body, he eventually fell to his knees and then he "fell asleep" (Acts 7:60.) Stephen died a martyrs death, yet did so with such strength and dignity that it might be confusing to some who are reading this. However, remember this, Stephen was given a glimpse of what awaited him (Acts 7:55-56.) He knew everything that he had believed and taught concerning Jesus, was true so no doubt, Stephen is still "sleeping" well to this very day.
