Lessons From Steve

"And the disciples were called Christians first in Antioch" Acts 11:26. A great debate is going on in the Hillis household these days. The debate centers on the question, what are we going to name the baby due in January? We had several good ideas IF it had been a boy, but that was not to be. I thought of having a "Name the Baby Contest" for the BBYG, until I came to my senses. So, Sharla, Terann, and I are left with the task of choosing a name that we can all come to some type of agreement on. However, an interesting question comes from this. Why all the fuss? It's only a name, for crying out loud, so what's the big deal.

Yet, it is a big deal! We want to give our child a name that we and someday she will not be ashamed of. A name is a big deal! On the day that disciples were first called Christians, it had huge repercussions, involving the past, present and the future. Isaiah had prophesied that God would give a name that was everlasting (56:5) and new, straight from the mouth of God Himself (62:2.) Obviously, this name is Christian. The disciples were first called Christians in Antioch for a reason. What is your reason for wearing a

name other than what has been providentially prescribed?
