

# Would It Be OK To Cancel Services for "Christmas?"

In the Tennessean last Thursday there was an article regarding how many churches were going to cancel their services on Sunday, December 25, for their families to celebrate "Christmas." It astounded even the non-religious person how blatantly contradictory was this decision. While this article will not address the fact that there is no Scriptural authority to religiously observe "Christmas," it will look at the idea that is being advanced by many, namely that one may cancel or alter the worship on the Lord's day in order to make it more convenient for the members."

How did some come to this decision? In an article in *CHRISTIANITY TODAY*, it was stated that several of the mega-churches got together and decided they would make a "family friendly" decision. Many of these churches have experienced a growth explosion because they have made their churches, x-friendly (where you fill in the X). This is just another attempt to accommodate the desires of the members of their churches. One church was just going to give their members a DVD so they could enjoy their services at home.

Perhaps one of the most telling comments was made by David Foster, pastor of the Bellevue Community church, "We're not legalists," "Most people will be there Saturday so why do they have to come back on Sunday? We do not think it is a sin to make church convenient to go to. An awful lot of people would go if they could." I would like for you to take notice of two things he said. "We're not legalists." What does that mean? The word "legalist" has been bantered around in the Lord's church for several years as if it were a bad term. Simply it means one who is legal and follows the law. However, it has come to characterize those who think it is not essential to obey God's law. Then he says, "we do not think it is a sin to make church convenient..." The question is: what does he mean by convenient? If one is discussing areas where God has allowed man to make his own choice then that would be acceptable, however, man does not have the choice to make things convenient contrary to God's law! To disobey is sin!

In the Old Testament, King Jeroboam sought to make worship "convenient" for the northern tribes by setting up centers of worship at Dan and Bethel. "Therefore the king asked advice, made two calves of gold, and said to the people, "It is too much for you to go up to Jerusalem. Here are your gods, O Israel, which brought you up from the land of Egypt!"" (1 Kings 12:28). God's response was, "Ephraim is oppressed and broken in judgment, Because he willingly walked by human precept." (Hosea 5:11). "And He will give Israel up because of the sins of Jeroboam, *who sinned and who made Israel sin.*" (1 Kings 14:16).

The Bible is abundantly clear that the church came together on the first day of the week (Sunday) to worship God (Acts 20:7; 1 Corinthians 16:1-2). For people to willingly miss this service when they are capable of attending is *forsaking*. Scripture says, "not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching." (Hebrews 10:25). The writer of the book of Hebrews was concerned about this "sin." "but exhort one another daily, while it is called "Today," lest any of you be hardened through the deceitfulness of sin." (Hebrews 3:13).

The choice of canceling services on Sunday, December 25, to celebrate a holiday only illustrates how far some religious people have gone. This does not shock me too much about the denominational world. They have been modifying and adapting the Bible to suit their own sinful desires for many years, but those of us to claim to serve the Lord must never follow their selfish example. Many forget, worship is not about us, but about God. He wants us to be in services that day and, Lord willing, that is where I will be!
