The game was not even suppose to be close, but not only did Namath's New York Jet's win, they dominated the game. Supposedly the Colts were stronger, faster, and smarter than their upstart AFL counterpart, but in the end that did not matter.

The Preacher of Ecclesiastes wrote, "[T]he race is not to the swift, Nor the battle to the strong, Nor bread to the wise, Nor riches to men of understanding, Nor favor to men of skill; But time and chance happen to them all" (Ecclesiastes 9:11.)
