Lessons from Steve

When we say our final goodbye to this life it has always been said about death that we cannot take anything with us. However, we can leave behind things that people will remember. For instance notice what the Preacher stated in Ecclesiastes 7:1, "A good name is better than precious ointment, And the day of death than the day of one's birth."

This one verse has two great lessons. The first part of the verse states one should try hard not to dirty the family name or one's own reputation. If someone talks about us, we should strive to maintain a name that cannot be soiled with mud or viewed in a negative light. The second half of the verse is very interesting. We all have milestone birthdays we celebrate such as 1st, 16th, 29th, and (I guess that's it!) However, the Preacher is telling us from his observations that the death day is better! From the time we are born to the time we die, life has moments of joy, yet also sorrows and grief. But the death day, eternally speaking, is better. Read Revelation 21 and 22 to get a picture of how life will be for the saved after this earthly life is over. No more sorrows, pains, or anguish, but an eternal life in the very presence of God and the Lamb.

Finally, how can we connect the two thoughts into one? Simply by stating that if we work hard to keep our name as clean as possible, that is part of what is left behind when we enter eternity. In my short stint as a minister, I have assisted at three funerals and every one of them were "easy" in the sense that they all had a good name and from my vantage point their death day was better. Let's work to keep our name intact and leave behind a blessing for our loved ones.

"Then I heard a voice from heaven saying to me, 'Write: Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on. Yes, says the Spirit, that they may rest from their labors, and their works follow them.'"
