Lessons From Steve

In the world of superstition, the number thirteen is considered an unlucky number. However, I believe we proved that wrong last Sunday night as thirteen young men took the stage and led us in worshipping the Lord. As Leonard and I fell in behind our boys as they made that long trek down the center aisle to the front pew, I was literally overwhelmed with pride and was tremendously impressed. I honestly believe I was more nervous than they were (although some of the kids and their mamas may disagree), but they all did a fantastic job.

Hao, Ethan, and Daniel used Noah as the emphasis for teaching about faith. From God announcing His creation as "**very good**" (Gen. 1:31) to the total collapse of mankind's heart, which was continual wickedness (Gen. 6:5), one man was fortunately found righteous in his generation – Noah (Gen. 7:1; 6:8.) Noah's faith, as Ethan pointed out, was exactly how the Bible defines faith. James stated, "**What does it profit, my brethren, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can faith**

save him? James would continue to show that faith is manifested by the obedience of the believer (James 2:14-20.) This goes hand in hand with the faith of Noah as he did everything that God commanded (Gen. 6:22; 7:5.) That is true faith in God!

What about us today? Daniel brought this point up during his time behind the pulpit. Are we exemplary of the faith Noah possessed? The Hebrew writer penned, "**By faith Noah, being divinely warned of things not yet seen, moved with godly fear, prepared an ark for the saving of his household, by which he condemned the world and became heir of the righteousness which is according to faith**" (Hebrews 11:7.) By all accounts, there had never been a flood or even rain (Gen. 2:6) on the earth. One can almost here the laughter as Noah preached that God was going to bring a flood on the earth. Even louder was the probably ridicule of this behemoth of a vessel being built! But God assured Noah His word was true and by faith Noah obeyed God.

We now have God's mind in written dried ink as delivered by the Holy Spirit (I Corinthians 2:1-16.) God has carefully articulated what He expects of us. This begs the question, how does our faith stand up beside Noah's? Do we find grace in the eyes of the Lord? Is God watching and acknowledging that we are righteous in our generation? If not, then maybe we should look to the rainbow and remember who was and was not inside the safety of the ark.

I would like to personally thank all those who helped with the Bible Bowl activities. I believe the final tally was an even 400 people. The pressure and the work to host an event like this is strenuous, at best, and requires a lot of people. Not because of a score they attained, but for participating and wanting to be a part of the team. The adage is true about the Bible Bowl: THERE ARE NO LOSERS!! The program is a win-win situation for everyone.
