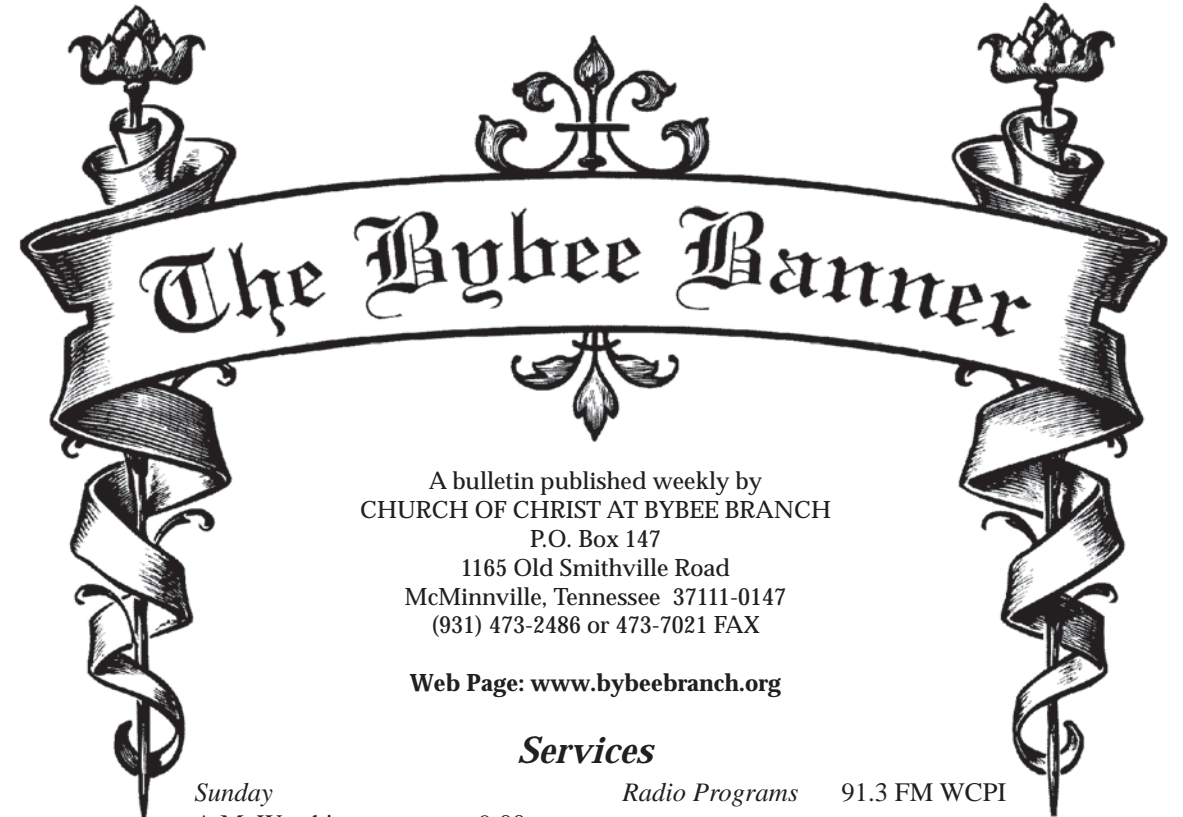

Lesson From Steve

"And beginning at Moses and the Prophets, He expounded to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself" Luke 24:27. Some times as I am reading the Bible, I come across passages such as the one above and wonder what it would have been like to hear this conversation. Jesus vividly explaining to the apostles (whom he had just called foolish and slow of heart to believe) all the things that He fulfilled that was written about the Messiah. Our Junior High and High School students just concluded a six-month study of the book of Acts. Time and again God's faithful preachers and teachers did the very same thing in using God's Holy Word to teach people that Jesus of Nazareth was truly the Christ!

The day the church began (Acts 2) the Apostles summoned back to Joel and the Psalms to confirm Jesus as the Christ. Peter quoted Moses from Deuteronomy and alluded to the prophets and Samuel in teaching that Jesus was the promise fulfilled. Stephen, with great courage, rebuked the "stiff-necked and uncircumcised in heart and ears" for resisting the Holy Spirit and refusing to hear the prophets (Acts 7.) Philip, reading from Isaiah, taught the Ethiopian that who the prophet was talking about was none other than Jesus (Acts 8.)

And then there is Paul. Luke records that Paul "confounded the Jews in Damascus, proving that this Jesus is the Christ" Acts 9:22. Proved? How did Paul do this? By the same method he always used - taking the Law of Moses and the prophets and showing how Jesus fulfilled all things pertaining to the Christ. Paul appealed to King Agrippa's "expert" knowledge in all customs and questions of the Jews. Paul would ask Agrippa if he believed in the prophets and then answered the question for him - yes! Paul is stating to Agrippa to look at the evidence and he too will be convinced Jesus is the Christ (Acts 26:3, 22-28.) Finally, in Rome, Paul called the chief Jews together and again persuaded them "concerning Jesus from both the Law of Moses and the Prophets... Acts 28:23.)

The evidence is in and the verdict is clear - Jesus of Nazareth is "guilty" of being the Messiah! Even if he had wanted to, he could not deny Himself (as Paul alluded to in II Timothy 2:11-13.) Salvation, hope, grace, eternity is found ONLY in Jesus the Christ. Look at the evidence (with an open heart and open mind) and let it speak for itself.

BIBLE BOWL NEWS

Another successful Bible Bowl season is in the books! The Book of Acts taught the kids spiritual and historical lessons concerning the birth and growth of the church of Christ. Also, each student was introduced or reminded of the great men and women that served God faithfully during the thirty plus years Luke records by inspiration.
