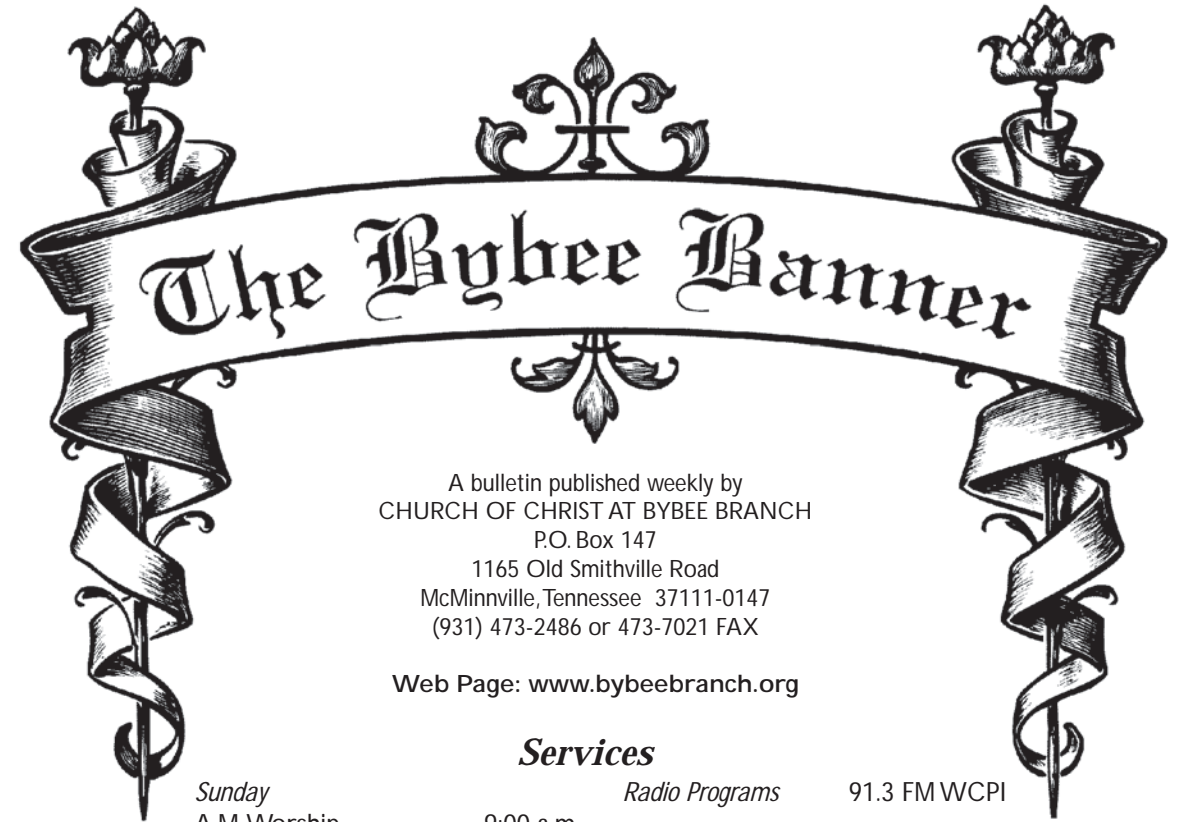

WEEKLY TIME EVALUATION

There are 168 hours in a week. If we calculate, conservatively, the following estimation may constitute a regular 7-day week.

SLEEP 56 Hours

We know the answer is yes.

The responsibility of Christians is enormous in that every hour, minute, and second counts for something. We are to use our time wisely. God's chosen has a message that must be spoken to the masses, but it starts with one single conversation. Let us have the same mindset that Isaiah had. **"Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying: 'Whom shall I send, And who will go for Us?' Then I said, 'Here am I! Send me.'"** (Isaiah 6:8) To build this confidence that Isaiah had, we must find time (everyday) to pray without ceasing (I Thessalonians 5:17), study to know what we are talking about (II Timothy 2:15), and then we will be ready to begin in earnest the commission that is so great for the Lord's cause. **"Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature."** (Mark 16:15)
