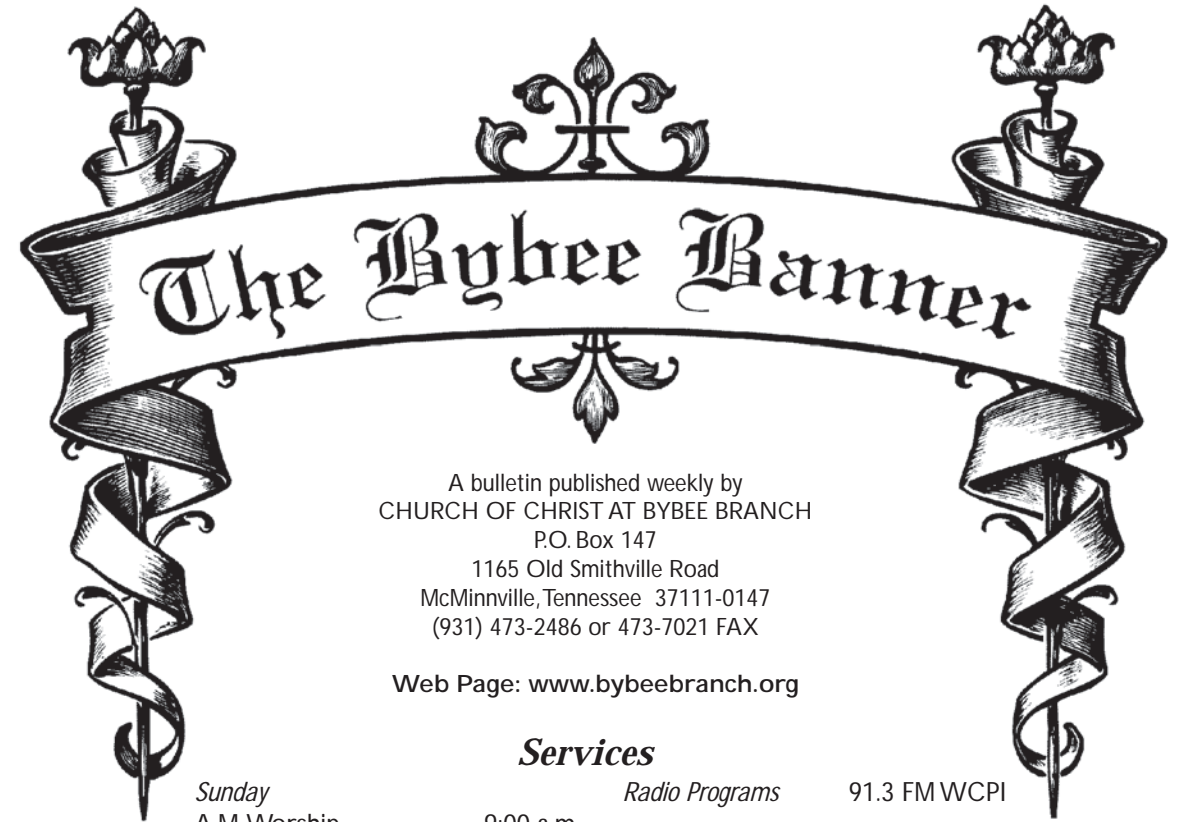

Notes From Steve

From time to time it is productive to get an objective, truthful analysis of one's life. My experience with this has not always been pleasant. Finding out that I may not be the greatest thing since sliced bologna is a real jolt to the ego. Nonetheless, I eat my humble pie and try to learn and grow from the diagnosis. The reason this is productive is because I may not realize how far I have drifted from reality.

Spiritually speaking this is vitally important! All of us should never shy away from an honest observation, so long as God's Word is the evaluation basis. The Bible is the standard. The Hebrew writer would state that, "**For the word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart**" (Hebrews 4:12.) Also, Paul told Timothy, "**All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work**" (II Timothy 3:16-17.)

King David would state it this way, "**Search me, O God, and know my heart; Try me, and know my anxieties; And see if there is any wicked way in me, And lead me in the way everlasting**" (Psalm 139:23-24.) David seemingly was not reluctant for God to look inside and see who he really was. Jesus once made the statement, "**For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also**" (Matthew 6:21; Luke 12:34.) God knows our heart and our thoughts. He knows what is truly important to us (or what is our real treasure). The question is, are we strong enough to ask God to search and try us? David's attitude seemed to be that it was necessary for God to search and try him so wickedness could be exposed and destroyed.

When we request God to look into our very being (which He is doing anyway!) to reveal if anything is separating us from Him, then we can begin to have a stronger relationship with our heavenly Father. Then, we can ask God to take our hand and lead us to the way that is everlasting.
