### From Tyler's Desk:

*Don't You Wish VBS Lasted All Year Long?*

Ok, so unless you're the seven year old boy who's darting to the front of the line downstairs to be the first to get a cookie, I would imagine most of you glanced at the above question, and answered to yourself with an emphatic "NO!" And well, after dealing with well over a hundred kids, and all the noise and excitement that goes along with it, I too would have to agree with you. When VBS comes to an end, most of us are in no hurry to rush through the next 360 days until next summer's VBS. But hey, the title got your attention, right?

Although I am in no way stating that I wish to spend every night for the entire year leading kids in "BOOSTER!" there are several very encouraging things about VBS, which I would love to see continue during every week.

One thing about VBS which we should strive to continue for the entire year is huge amount of involvement. During VBS and the weeks preceding, there are LOTS of people who dedicate their time and energy to making VBS as success. Ever since Wednesday evening Bible study last week, people have been at the building working on their rooms everyday, for hours at a time. Others helped those leading the learning centers. Others helped each night as "City Leaders". Others baked cookies, made costumes, or helped clean. There's probably jobs which people have done which most of us don't even know about! People of all ages have dedicated themselves to serving the LORD.

Paul, one of the great characters of the New Testament, didn't just dedicate himself to the LORD's work for one week during the summer. In 1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians 15:31, Paul wrote, "...by my pride in you, which I have in

Christ Jesus our Lord, I die every day!" He wrote again in Romans 12:1, "Present your bodies a living sacrifice." Sacrificing our time, our money, and our energy for the cause of Christ should be done every day, all year long. Here's a suggestion: make a list of specific ways in which you can serve the church throughout the year, and then do it!

Another great thing about VBS is that it seems to be a time in which the congregation gets busy inviting friends (especially the kids!). I've seen so many faces during VBS, which I have never seen before!

Matthew, another great character of the New Testament, did not keep the good news of Christ to himself. After Matthew found Christ, he planned a great feast, and invited a large company of others to come and meet Jesus (Luke 5:29). He continued his service as an apostle, and even wrote one of the accounts of the gospel of Christ, which was written for the purpose of showing Jews that Jesus was the Messiah of the Old Testament. Matthew never stopped inviting people to Jesus. Here's another challenge: make a list of 5 people who you would like to see come to Christ. Now throughout the rest of the year, make weekly efforts to engage these individuals in conversations about Christ.

Finally, VBS is a great time to teach our kids about the Bible! Some of my earliest memories of Bible stories come from VBS. Lets keep this going every day throughout the year!

In 2<sup>nd</sup> Timothy 1:5, Paul wrote concerning Timothy, "I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, dwells in you as well." Timothy was another great influential character in the New Testament. His strong faith was accredited to his mother and grandmother. Parents, Grandparents, do you want to see your children and grandchildren grow into faithful and influential Christians? Share your faith with them daily through your example and through your words!

Although we're all going to be glad when VBS is over, lets remember to continue to be active in the Lord's service, invite others to serve God, and bring our young people up to do the same... all year long.
