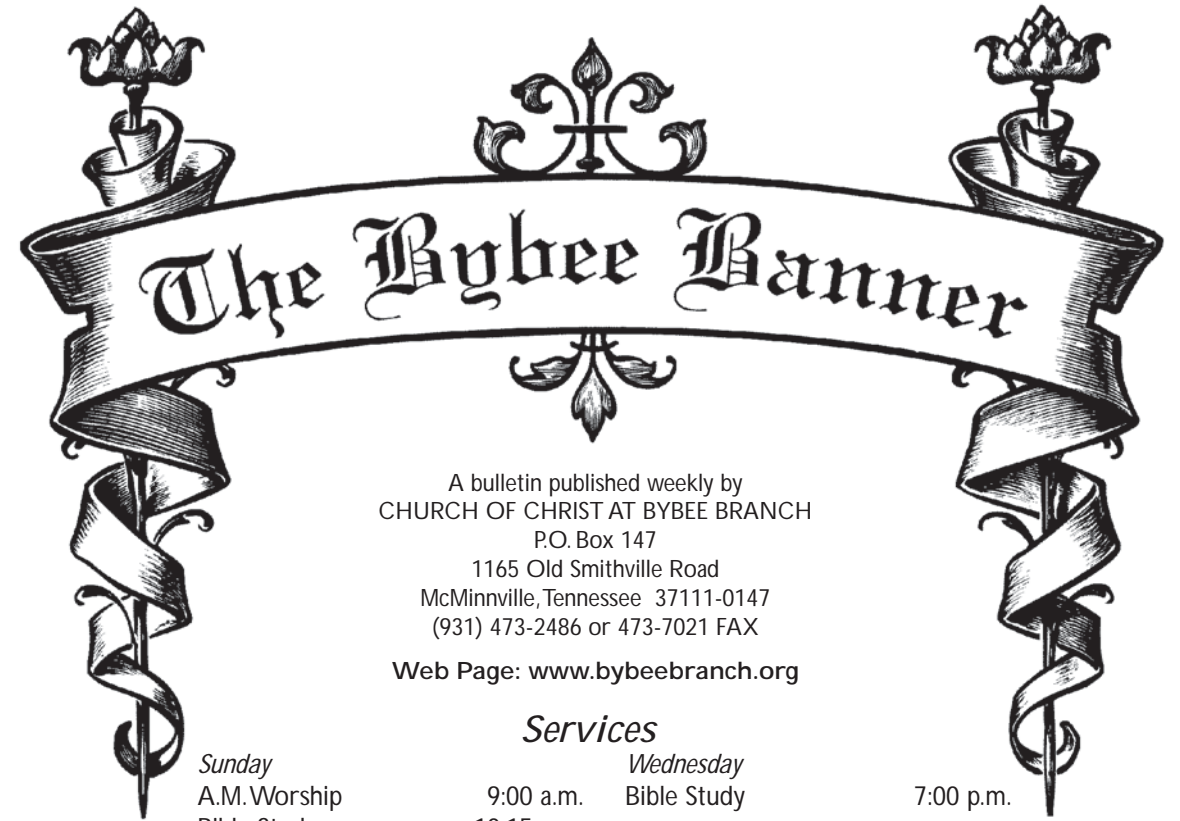

Miracles in Mark: Saved to Serve

I hate getting sick! A few months ago I remember getting sick. It was a Wednesday. During the day I felt a little achy. By that evening, when it was time for Wednesday evening devotional, I felt horrible. I suffered through my Bible class. After the devotional was over, I didn't hang around to visit with people. I left as quickly as I could. When I got home, I had just enough energy to collapse on my bed. I was in bed with a fever for about 12 hours that night.

Lucky for me, the sickness was only a 24 hour bug. The next morning my fever was gone, and I was feeling much better. But I was still completely exhausted. It took all the energy I had just to get out of bed and brush my teeth. It took another day or two to regain my full strength.

In Mark chapter one we read about Jesus casting a demon out of a man who was part of the synagogue. Through this miracle, Jesus proved he was somebody special. He proved He had authority. He proved he was more powerful than even Satan's demons.

The events of that day did not end in the synagogue. After Jesus left the Synagogue, he went to the home of Peter and Andrew. Upon arrival, Jesus was immediately made aware that there was a problem. Peter's mother-in-law was ill with a fever. We don't know how serious her fever was, but we do know that it was bad enough to leave her depleted of the energy needed to get up

and serve the guests.

Jesus once again showed His power and authority when He came to Peter's mother-in-law, took her by the hand, and lifted her up. The text informs us that "immediately the fever left her, and she began to serve them" (Mark 1:31).

Did you catch that? When Jesus healed Peter's mother-in-law, her fever *immediately* left her. Her temperature did not just begin to drop back to normal; it was immediately back to normal. And that's not all. When Peter's mother-in-law was healed, she began to serve them. She did not have to wait around for two or three days for her strength to return. She was immediately and completely healed, and therefore she chose to respond by service.

When a person is saved by Jesus, they are completely saved. Psalm 103:3 informs us that the LORD "forgives all your iniquity." Ephesians 1:7 teaches that it is through the blood of Christ that our trespasses are forgiven. When we are baptized into Christ's death, burial, and resurrection, we receive immediate and complete healing from our sins.

It does not take God several months or years to save a person of their sins; therefore Christians should not wait several months or years to begin serving. Although more mature Christians may have developed more talents, Christians should find ways to serve the church just as soon as they are healed of their sins. Peter's mother-in-law immediately began serving when she was healed. She did not wait to serve, and neither should Christians today.
