Rabboni!

Mary Magdalene was weeping. Her friend, and Lord Jesus had been crucified. And to make matters worse, his body was no longer in the tomb. She did not know Jesus was risen from the dead. She was weeping because she thought someone had taken Jesus away, and she did not know where they had taken his body.

While she was standing there at the tomb, perplexed, she heard a "gardener" ask her to question "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you seeking?" In response, Mary asked the gardener if he knew where they had taken the body of Jesus.

Then she heard the gardener's response. He responded by simply stating her name: "Mary." Mary then realized she was mistaken. This was no gardener! As she realized the gardener was actually Jesus, she turned and said "Rabboni!"

In his commentary on the book of John, Guy N. Woods explains the title "Rabboni." He explains that it literally means "MY GREAT TEACHER." "It was a title of Jewish teachers," Woods writes. "There were three degrees: (1) *Rab*, teacher; (2) *Rabbi*, my teacher; (3) *Rabboni*, my great teacher."

If you are like me, you have probably had many teachers over the years. You probably remember some teachers better than others. While I would struggle to even remember the names and faces of some teachers, there are other's whom I remember with much more detail. And there are a few teachers who I remember as "great teachers." My "great teachers" are the ones I remember the best. I still remember the lessons they taught and the advice they gave. In fact, there are a few teachers I continue to go to for advice, even long after taking their classes.

As a Christian, one teacher should rank far above any others. Is Jesus your greatest teacher? Do you love the lessons he has taught? Do you study his teaching daily? Does his teachings influence you more than anything else in this life? Do you continue to go to him for advice?

One day, like Mary, we will turn and see Jesus face to face. When you see him on that day, will you be able to call him "Rabboni"?

Complaining

A group of alumni, highly established in their careers, got together to visit their old university professor. The conversation soon turned into complaints about stress in work and life. Offering his guests coffee, the professor went to the kitchen and returned with a large pot of coffee and an assortment of cups—porcelain, plastic, glass, crystal, some plain-looking, some expensive, and some exquisite—telling them to help themselves to the coffee.

After all the former students had a cup of coffee in hand, the professor said: "If you noticed, all the nice looking expensive cups were taken up, leaving behind the plain and cheap ones. While it is but normal for you to want only the best for yourselves, that is the source of your problems and stress. Be assured that the cup itself adds no quality to the drink. What all of you really wanted was coffee, not the cup, but you consciously went for the best cups and then began eyeing each other's cups."

Now consider this: Life is the coffee, and the jobs, houses, cars, things, money and position in society are the cups. They are just tools to hold and contain life, and the type of cup we have does not define nor change the quality of life we live. Sometimes, by concentrating only on the cup, we fail to enjoy the coffee.

Enjoy your coffee. Being happy doesn't mean everything's perfect. It means you've decided to see beyond the imperfections.
