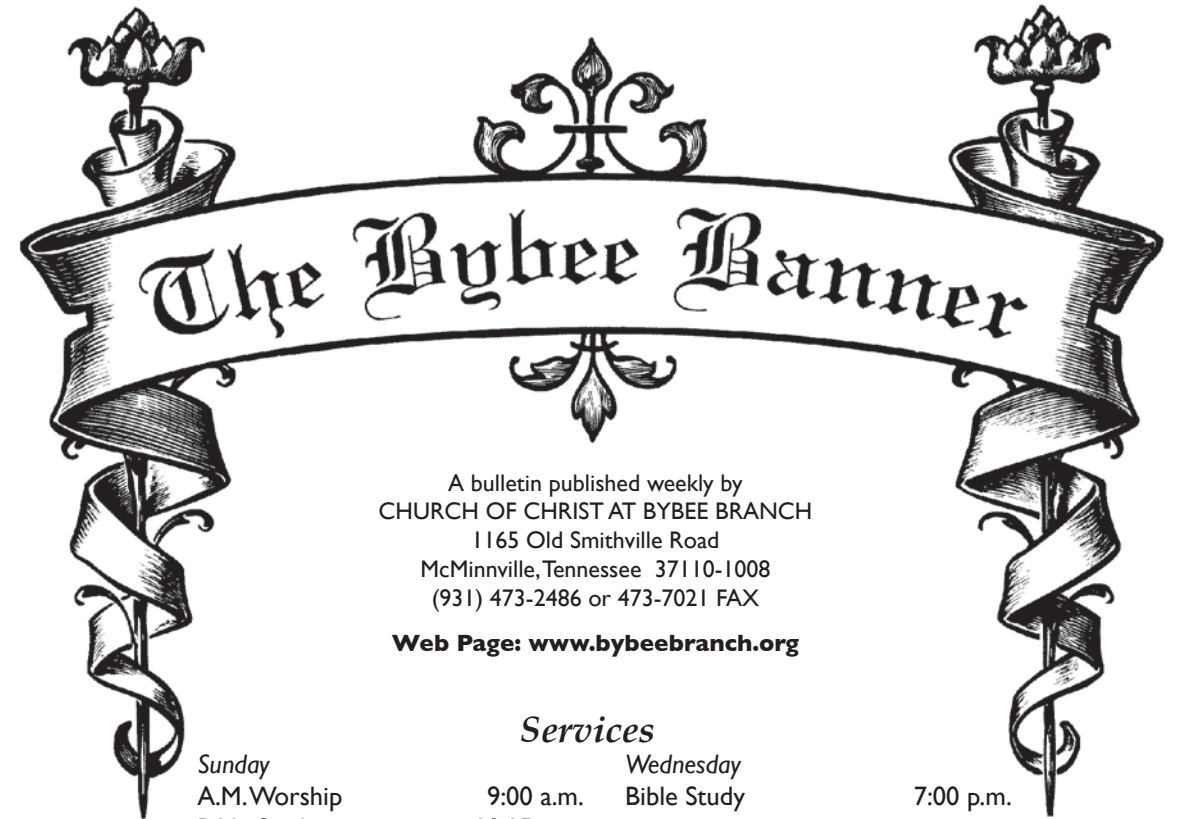

From Tyler's Desk:

When He Was In The Wilderness of Judah...

According to the subtitle, Psalm 63 was written by
David "when he was in the wilderness of Judah." David
was not just gone to the wilderness for the pleasure of
"getting away for while". The king of Israel was chased into
the wilderness by his son Absalom, who was seeking to
usurp his father's throne. Being forced into the wilderness,
and being unable to return to the city, it wouldn't have
taken David and his men long to run out of food. David
was hungry, thirsty, exhausted, and running for his life when
he wrote this prayer.

But his prayer was not a prayer for food. It was not
a prayer for water. It was not even a prayer begging God
for safe deliverance. David prayed, "O God, you are my
God; earnestly I seek you; my soul thirsts for you; my flesh
faints for you, as in a dry and weary land where there is
no water." (vs. 1)

Even when David was completely deprived of all the
necessities and comforts in this life, he prayed as though
he desired nothing more than to be with God.

As the Psalm progressed, David expressed his
confidence that his prayer would be answered. "For you
have been my help, and in the shadow of your wings I will
sing for joy. My soul clings to you; your right hand holds
me up." (vss. 7-8)

The psalm progresses from "My soul thirsts for you"
to "my soul clings to you." Above all else, we must seek
God. Whoever seeks God's way, follows his path, trusts
his salvation, obeys his word, and rejoices in his comfort,
will find the comfort of God's salvation.

Be An Example

A number of years ago in a conversation with Jule
Miller (yes there really was a Jule Miller and his filmstrips
have probably been used to teach the plan of salvation to
more people than any other medium) he mentioned to me
that as part of his ministry, he reconditioned old projectors
and gave them to missionaries to use. I told him I would
love to take one down to Guyana on my next trip and
leave it with the natives there. Sometime later this sturdy
projector arrived with a set of the filmstrips. I purchased a
tape recorder and a generator and was all set to show the
films when I arrived in Guyana. During the trip I showed
the series over five nights at two remote locations. The
first we had to go by boat at night for about 1 ½ hours
to a school building where the people were gathered. The
boat leaked and we usually had four or five inches of water
in the boat by the time we arrived. The second location
after traveling for some distance by boat we walked for
a couple of miles into a village. I hung a bed sheet up and
we would project the film on it. We stayed the five days
& nights in the village. I don't remember the number of
responses we had from those two weeks.

This past trip to Guyana began with a visit to the
school of preaching located in Georgetown. As I was
meeting the students, one young man said, "Brother Cook
I remember you showing the film strips on salvation"
Then he went on in some detail telling about what was
in the film strips.

I tell you all this to make the following point. We never
know when we do something how that will have a lasting
impression on someone else. I had forgotten all about that
trip, but to this young man it had completely reshaped his
life so that now he is training to spread God's word to
others. What are your family, friends, fellow workers, and
others seeing in your everyday life? As Paul told Timothy
"...but be an example to the believers in word, in conduct, in
love, in spirit, in faith, in purity." 1 Timothy 4:12
