From Tyler's Desk:

When Should Christians Fast?

In Matthew 9, Jesus was asked by the disciples of John why Jesus' disciples did not fast. Jesus answered with the following words: "Can the wedding guest mourn as long as the bridegroom is with them? The days will come when the bridegroom is taken away from them, and then they will fast." In this answer Jesus made two points about fasting.

Firstly, Jesus noted that his disciples did not fast when there was not an occasion to fast. This was unlike the Pharisees who treated fasting as merely a ritual. The Pharisees were known to fast twice a week, whether the occasion called for it or not (Luke 18:12). Earlier Jesus had taught that fasting should not be practiced to be seen by other men (Matthew 5:16-18). Therefore Christians should not just try fasting because it sounds like a neat thing to try. Fasting should only be practiced when the occasion calls for it.

Secondly, Jesus referred to a time in the future when His disciples would fast. This leads us to the question, "When should Christians fast?"

As seen in a study of fasting in the Old Testament, God's people fasted in times of physical or spiritual danger. It is appropriate to fast when we or our loved ones are facing serious illness or some other danger. It would also be appropriate to follow the example of Jesus and choose to fast when we are facing severe temptations (or spiritual danger). Fasting would also

be an appropriate response when our nation is facing impending danger (Judges 20:26).

In the New Testament we are given the example of the church at Antioch fasting and praying when they prepared to send out Paul and Barnabas to do mission work (Acts 13:1-3). We also read of the churches in Galatia fasting while they were undergoing the serious task of appointing elders (Acts 14:21-23).

Fasting seems to most always been used in close connection with prayer. Therefore, it seems that any occasion which may call for persistent prayer would also provide an appropriate time to fast.
