From Tyler's Desk:

How David Covered Up His Sin

David knew the shame of sin. He had stolen another man's wife, and was personally responsible for the death of his innocent child. He was also guilty of the murder of Uriah. As David looked back on his sins, he saw himself as a man worthy of death (2 Samuel 12:5). No matter how badly David may have wanted to change the past, he knew he it was too late. What was done was done.

Although his past could not be changed, David greatly desired to have his sin covered up so that he could once again live free of guilt. So David did what most people would do; he decided to keep quiet about his past, in hopes that his mistakes would not find him out.

In Psalm 32, David looks back on his effort to cover up his past. In verses 3-4, David wrote, "For when I kept silent, my bones wasted away through my groaning all day long. For day and night your hand was heavy upon me; my strength was dried up as by the heat of summer."

David's attempt to cover up his past with silence was a complete failure. In fact, the more he held his sin in silence, the more he experienced the pain of his guilt. He was in pain all the day long, until his strength was completely dried up!

Finally, in his exhaustion and pain of keeping his secret, David gave up on the idea of keeping his past covered. In verse 5, David writes, "I acknowledged my sin to you, and I did not cover my iniquity; I said,

'I will confess my transgressions to the LORD,' and you forgave the iniquity of my sin."

David finally had the peace he longed for. David's sin was only forgiven, and covered up, when David decided to have it uncovered. Having confessed his sins, and experienced the peace of forgiveness, David wrote in verse 1, "Blessed is the man whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sin is covered."

Confession, or the uncovering of sins, is the only way to really have our sins covered. God cares for the broken hearted. Christ's blood is always there to wash away our sins. God's people should not be people who try to cover their own pasts in order to appear righteous once again. Rather, God's people should readily acknowledge their own shortcomings, and shout for joy because their sins are really covered.
