The preacher who prepares this sermon had better have his suitcase packed and his life insurance paid up.

## GENERAL PRACTITIONERS VERSUS SPECIALISTS

I suppose just about everyone has been frustrated of recent years when he went to someone for a service that could be expected from a particular person only to be turned away with the explanation that this person is now a specialist in a certain area of work and no longer does the service desired. So in the field of medicine, law, farming, auto mechanics, and even in the work of preaching the Gospel one may find that a service will be refused because the person has now "specialized." While this approach does seem to have merit in some areas, it hardly rings true with this writer that such should be the case with a preacher of the word.

Suppose this incident. There is death in a family. The family calls one of the "ministers" of the church only to hear him say, "My specialty is personal work, you need to contact Brother . . ., and he will help you." Or, "My specialty is radio work, but Brother . . . will confort you." Or, "My specialty is the ministry of song, but Bro. . . can assist you." Or, "My specialty is young people, Brother . . . will have to attend to those who die." And so on we could go!

Suppose Titus had replied to Paul's epistle to him with the excuse, "Brother Paul, I appreciate the fact that the older men and women must be taught (Titus 2:2-3) the way, but I'm a specialist with 'young people'." Then Titus might have gone on to say, "Paul, I suggest that you write Apollos. He's over 35 and he'll be able to relate to the older people better than I can!" What would the Great Apostle Paul have thought? What would the Holy Spirit who directed Paul in his writing of Titus have done?

Certainly each man has a certain area wherein he can do better, at least in his judgment, than in other areas. But who says that we are not obligated to God to do all we can in all areas? Why shouldn't a preacher feel an obligation to do personal work, teach in classes, lead in training classes, lead singing, or anything else wherein he had opportunity to serve? But then what other Christian is exempt from using his ability in all areas possible?

I, for one, am happy to be one who happily goes about doing any and everything I can to help His Cause! --gbr

In the course of the 1970 Freed-Hardeman College Lectureship, Bro. Thomas B. Warren gave a lecture on the "False Views of Truth". (Lectureship book of 1970, pp. 69-85.) He listed twelve false views of truth as follow:

1. It is a false view of truth that it can be diluted with the addition of mere human doctrine and still be acceptable to God.

2. It is a false view of truth to hold that men can "take away from" it and the result still be acceptable to God.

3. It is a false view of truth to hold that man can pervert it and still be pleasing to God.

4. It is a false view of truth to hold that it is not the exclusive means to salvation from sin.

5. It is a false view of truth to hold that a preacher can preach anything else and still be pleasing to God.

6. It is a false view of truth to hold that it can be rightly regarded as true by one person and as false by another.

7. It is a false view of truth to hold that truth is unattainable.

8. It is a false view of truth to hold that there is a middle ground between truth and error.

9. It is a false view of truth to hold that men have the right to be wrong about it.

10. It is a false view of truth to hold that it does not need to be defended.

11. It is a false view of truth to hold that it has nothing to do with logic.

12. It is a false view of truth to hold that truth cannot be a dynamic force in our world today.

It is observed that each of these views of truth is held to one degree or another by every denominational preacher that this writer knows anything about. It is a matter of concern that apparently many members of our Lord's church also hold views that are false in regard to the truth!

One who is more concerned, for instance, with whether or not a preacher "hurts somebody's feelings" than they are with whether he tells them the "whole truth" regardless of the results, is holding to a false view of truth.

Truth---Our Attitude Toward It (continued)

Christians, including some Elders in the church, who have never felt the responsibility to "tell the truth" to ungodly members, and non-Christians indicates that these have the false view of truth that people just may be saved without knowing the truth anyway.

Some have the idea that it is a sin to "argue" about the truth, and therefore any discussion of religious ideas in their mind is wrong---indicates a false view about the nature and importance of truth.

It is a false view of truth that many hold that will result in their refusal to be taught what is wrong about their particular pet sin by saying that this is a matter of opinion anyway---when in reality it is a matter of doctrinal judgment concerning Godly living!

A very bad attitude many Christians hold regarding the truth is that they (in their expression of it) do not know enough about it to teach anyone, therefore let someone else do it! It is my studied conviction that a Christian with good intentions, and God-given ability, cannot remain ignorant of the vital issues of doctrine, to the point he cannot teach them to others and contend for them, and still be acceptable to God. Isn't he like the one-talent man who buries his ability rather than using it to the fullest?

All Christians, and certainly all Gospel preachers and Elders of our Lord's Body, the church of Christ, should love the truth sufficiently to always let it be one of the first things on their minds, and the dearest thing to their heart.

Bro. Warren concluded his lecture by saying: "I repeat: the only really good reason why a religious doctrine should be accepted is that it is <u>true</u>! If a particular doctrine (proposition" is not true, then there is no really good reason why it should be accepted.

"God has given us the truth (the Bible). We can <u>learn</u> that truth. We can <u>obey</u> it. May the Lord help us all to love and obey the truth." AMEN.

### About the BIBLE SCHOOL TEACHER . . . . .

"The curriculum is 90% teacher." "The most dynamic force in Christian education is the teacher." Teacher preparation is one of the most important factors in Christian education. The Christian teacher has the double necessity of meeting both religious and secular requirements. He must have both spirit and skill, and must know God as well as books and people.

## Role of Teachers

1. Be an ever improving student of the Bible.

2. Know the characteristics, interests, capabilities, etc., of your students.

- 3. Be well acquainted with the parents of your students.
- 4. Be informed on supplementary materials.
- 5. Use a variety of methods in lesson preparation.

6. Challenge the students to think, use imagination, be serious and concerned about spiritual matters.

7. Keep accurate records on attendance, birthdays, new members, visitors.

8. Keep supervisor informed at least two weeks ahead when possible if you are to be absent. Notify at earliest opportunity if emergency will cause you to be absent at the last minute.

9. Give at least three weeks notice if you decide to give up the class.

10. Attend all services of the church and special meetings of teachers.

- 11. Be an example of faithfulness to your students.
- 12. Always maintain a truly Christian attitude.

13. Be prompt and on time. Be in the classroom at least 10 minutes before the class begins.

14. Make arrangements ahead of time for audio-visual aids to be checked out of materials center. Be prompt to return such materials to the center when they are no longer needed. Be sure to follow all check out procedures with regard to audio-visuals.

15. Remember that the New Testament Church is a great TEACHING FORCE. You are a part of it. You are responsible! "...now unto the principalities and powers in heavenly places might be made known by the church the manifold wisdom of God." (Ephesians 3:10.)

## NON-ATTENDANCE A SIN

"... if one member of the local church ... " can ignore that church and treat it as of the devil, refuse to assemble and work with the members for its edification and good and not be guilty of willful and fatal sin which if not repented of, confessed and forgiven, could lead to eternal destruction, then all the members of the congregation could abandon such a church and its work and worship, destroy it off the face of the earth and not sin in so doing.

And if all the members of one local church could so abandon and neglect the work and worship of that one church and not sin, then all members of all "the churches of Christ" on earth could abandon all of them, destroy all churches of Christ and not sin, and this would destroy CHRISTIANITY off the face of the earth.

Therefore, it is a willful sin, which if not confessed and forgiven will cause one to lose his soul in eternal perdition, to willfully ignore and abandon the work and worship of the church for one year, and if for one year, then for one month, etc. For if one member could ignore the church and still be a Christian, then all could, and the doors would be closed for a year.

Therefore, all members who have quit attending the service and worship of the church, have quit the church unless the absence is unavoidable. Such backsliders should be restored if at all possible. They are God's children, but sure to be disinherited and lost if they die in their sins. "Unto him that knoweth to do good, and doeth it not, to him it is sin." (James 4:17) And "How shall we escape if we neglect so great salvation." (Hebrews 2:3)

Those who cannot be taught and restored should be excluded from the fellowship of the church. (2 Thess. 3:6, 15; 1 Cor. 5:1-13.) No one can be a Christian while ignoring the church which cost the blood of Christ. (Acts 20: 28.) A fish could as easily live out of the water as a child of God could live the Christian life apart from the worship and service of the church. Almost all apostasy and backsliding begins in a neglect of the worship of the church (Hebrews 10:25,26.) ---Gus Nichols

"Let your speech be alway with grace, seasoned with salt, that ye may know how ye ought to answer every man." (Col. 4:6.) "Sound speech, that cannot be condemned; that he that is of the contrary part may be ashamed, having no evil thing to say of you." (Titus 2:8.) "A good man out of the good treasure of his heart bringeth forth that which is good; and an evil man out of the evil treasure of his heart bringeth forth that which is evil: for out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh." (Luke 6:45.)

Some time ago I heard an individual engaged in what amounted to gossip of a very vile sort. The individual justified this by saying that it was the truth! Regardless of whether it was true, this individual was engaged in a sin that was obviously much greater than the one he was condemning. I have heard the remark, "I like that person, he speaks his mind." To this we would add, "That's all right if his mind is worth anything to begin with!"

## "REPENT OF THIS THY WICKEDNESS."

"Repent therefore of this thy wickedness; and pray God, if perhaps the thought of thine heart may be forgiven thee." (Acts 8:22.)

Restoration of a member of the church who is guilty of sin, cannot be accomplished without the desire of the guilty person desiring to be restored. Many wayward members see no need for their restoration because they do not recognize the sins that are in their lives. Simon heard the gospel preached by Philip; believed that which he heard; and was baptized. He was a member of the church, a child of God, a Christian; yet he sinned. Peter recognized the sin, and admonished Simon to repent of his wickedness.

Simon was wicked because he thought the gift of God could be bought with money. His heart was not right in the sight of God. This emphasizes the fact that <u>sin is</u> <u>wickedness</u>. Men have the idea today that wickedness is murder, or rape, or vile language, or some other vicious sin; and these things are wickedness, but so are other things as well. The servant who hid the talent of money given him by his master and did nothing was called: "Thou wicked and slothful servant." (Matt. 25:26.) This is an amazing scriptural truth: <u>he who does nothing is wicked</u> in the sight of Christ 1 ! !

Repentance is a change of will. (Matt. 21:28-29.) This change of will results in a change of conduct. And all of this is necessary if the wayward member is to obtain the forgiveness of the Father. Simon repented because he asked Peter to pray for him along with his own prayers to God for forgiveness.

But suppose Simon had not repented. Suppose he had continued his sinful conduct, and had never changed. Then his money would have perished with him. (Acts 8:20.) He would have been a lost member of the church, and would have been a detriment to the cause of Christ in the community where his life was known.

The same thing is true today. If a member of the church who is guilty of sin will not repent, then that person is lost now, and will be lost eternally because of a refusal to repent. Additionally, that person will be detrimental to the progress of the church unless something is done to change the relationship of that person to the church. ----Foster L. Ramsey

Jehovah has made us in a fearful and wonderful way. We are responsible to Him in every respect of our nature. We must obey from the heart the doctrine of God in order to be freed from sins. (Romans 6:16-18.) We must then live faithful unto death to receive the crown of life. (Revelation 2:10.)

We are a people with an intellect that thinks (Gen. 6:5), believes (Romans 10:10), understands (Matthew 13:15), and is converted by faith (2 Cor. 10:5; Romans 10:17; Romans 1:16; Acts 15:9).

We are a people with affection made up of desires (Romans 10:1-3) which must be converted by repentance (John 14:15, Jas. 4:8; 2 Cor. 7:10). Our nature is made up of the things we love and trust (Mark 12:30; Phil. 1:7; and Proverbs 3:5). All these are converted by repentance.

We are a people with a will that intends (Heb. 4:12), purposes (2 Cor. 9:7), and obeys (Romans 6:16-18). This will is converted by baptism (Acts 2:38; 3:19; Romans 6: 17-18; Romans 6:1-5; 1 Peter 1:22).

As intelligent people we are responsible for the care of ourselves as to our life and thoughts, and are also to be servants of all men. As long as one is in full control of his ability to think and reason, he must stand answerable to God for his actions. If one plans to sin against himself (suicide is an example) or against others he is sinning against God. If one actually, for example, planned to kill himself---he presumes to do that for which he cannot ask forgiveness---if he goes through with it, and which consequently, condemns him forever. This is not to say that one who is mentally deranged is held responsible by God for his actions. We should be careful here, however, not to confuse mental illness with just plain pre-meditated meanness---an excuse to sin!!!

We are to obey God "unto death". (Rev. 2:10) There is no problem that cannot be solved to our good if we allow God's Word to direct us. Let us "bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ." (Gal. 6:2.)

# SIGNS OF SPIRITUAL DECLINE

There is a disease that has attacked our beautiful nwtive oak trees in the past few years called "live oak decline." It is identifiable by branches that gradually lose their leaves and die. Many trees have died.

There is a disease that destroys Christians that could well be called "spiritual decline." Its symptoms are very evident and if the disease is not stopped, the loss of eternal souls results. What are some of the telltale symptoms?

1. CARELESSNESS IN ATTENDANCE. Admittedly, there is more to being a strong, faithful servant of Christ than faithful class and worship attendance. However, even the infidel knows that it is impossible to be a faithful Christian without faithfully assembling with the saints. (Heb. 10:25). Think about the finest, most spiritual people you know and among their many qualities will be their consistent class and worship attendance. When someone begins missing for no real reason, whether on Wednesday night, Sunday morning classes or Sunday night, "spiritual decline" has set in. Such will soon become careless about Sunday morning too.

2. TOO BUSY. One who says, "I'm just too busy to come on Wednesday night or to do this or that work in the church," has just advertised his or her case of "spiritual decline." The Lord never gave anybody so much to do that he couldn't seek the Kingdom first (Matt. 6:33). The strange thing about the person "too busy" to serve Christ through His church is that <u>about nine times out of ten he</u> or she is a ringleader in a civic club, sports organization, or some other secular organization! What one is really trying to say is that their club or whatever is more important than participation in the visitation program or teaching a class. Otherwise they would say, "I am too busy,"to club work. Such a person is teetering on the edge of total apostasy.

3. WORLDLY FRIENDS. We all have friends who are not Christians, but when we choose our closest and most constant associates among non-Christians we show signs of "spiritual decline." All could name some who have become involved in drinking, dancing and other worldly practices and have completely deserted the Lord because of evil companions. (1 Cor. 15:33). We should be vigilant to signs of "spiritual decline" in our lives! ---Dub McClish via THE BEAM OF LIGHT
