

Things We Need To Do:


1. Our Elders recently requested that members of the congregation suggest names to them of men that they think could serve as Elders and Deacons for this church. Have you done this?


2. With several young men who are Christians and with others who have placed membership recently we need to study again how to improve our work in the public worship services. We are planning a four-week training class to be announced soon.

LESSONS FROM A FLOCK OF GEESE

Scientists have discovered the secret of the great strength of the Canadian geese in their long flights. Some flocks fly from the Hudson Bay to the Midwest at a powerful 70 miles per hour, nonstop. Together, co-operating as a flock in a V-shape formation, wingtip to wingtip, none misses a stroke. They are able to fly a 71% longer range than when a solitary goose tries to make it. 
It is quite easy for the preacher and Elders of a local church to become so busy in their work that they do not pause often enough in thanksgiving and commendation to God and to members of the congregation. Maybe we just need to give a "state of the church" speech!

We fully realize that all blessings and success are because of God's work through us. All glory and honor must be given Him, and that continually. Yet we must point out that He uses each of us as instruments to accomplish His will. Let us give Him thanks and praise!

Halfway through my third year as preacher with this congregation there are so very many things that should be said. (1) The tremendous SPIRITUAL growth that we observe is heartening. Truly most are learning to "putaway 'childish things'". (2) The numerical growth is a measure of the blessings we are receiving from our God. (3) the growth in FINANCIAL resources is most encouraging. (our average contribution is almost twice what it was in the fall of 1976!) (4) the ATTITUDE OF FRIEND-LINESS among our number is fantastic! A PREACHER YOU WOULD NOT TOLERATE

He consistently arrives a few minutes late for worship, disturbing others as he enters. He and his wife sit on the back seat. They sit stoically through the songs of praise, never opening their mouths. He lets his young children sit where they please and behave as they wish.

He doesn't always arrive in time for Bible class period. Sometimes he stays out so late Saturday night "doing the town" that he just doesn't feel like getting up in time for his class.

He attends on Wednesday night only occasionally. Sometimes he "has a headache" or is "just too tired." On other occasions there is a movie in town that he wants to see, so he goes to see it.

He has missed a few times on Sunday evening when friends or relatives "dropped in" a short while before the worship hour.


He drives a very expensive car, owns a summer home in the mountains, provides a fashionable wardrobe for his family, eats fine food, and spends a minimum of \$500 on the family vacation each year. However, he gives only \$10 a week to the Lord and he does that only when it is convenient. He sometimes purposely withholds his contribution because "he doesn't like the way the money is spent."

Such a preacher should not be tolerated. He could only have a depressing influence on the church. Any spiritual growth would be in spite of his influence instead of because of it, regardless of his power in the pulpit.

While we could not begin to tolerate a preacher of this sort, churches find it rather easy to tolerate other members of this sort. When the preacher becomes discouraged at such materialism in the brethren as described above and tries to root it out, the brethren sometimes think he should be more tolerant.

Preachers have a tolerance level too! The Bible doesn't teach a double standard! The "convenience controlled" Christian should not be tolerated indefinitely, be he a preacher or any other saint. ----Dub McClish

WHAT DO YOU CONTRIBUTE? by Ron Harper



TO GET MORE FROM A SERMON

"One of the great failings in the church today is that most people do not get much from a sermon. I recognize that we often preach sermons that may not contain much for the listener to get. But, we know that the majority of these sermons have something that everyone of us can use that would really help our Christian living.

"Probably the main deterrent of getting something out of the sermon is the wandering of the mind. We hear a thought and immediately launch out in another direction on our own. Psychologists tell us that we hear about 125 words per minute and that the mind can think about 450 words per minute. We can easily race ahead of any speaker with our own thoughts.

"It would help each listener if he or she brought a pad or a note card and took notes on the sermon. Try to outline the lesson. Put down scripture references and look them up later. Notice how many scriptures are in the lesson. I wonder what this would do for us as preachers if we knew that our audience was taking notes that would show how much preparation we had made and how easily our sermon could be outlines.

"I also wonder if we would put in more scripture if we knew that people could see just how much there was from their own notes. I have listened to sermons that I outlined and found not one verse of scripture. That was no sermon; a nice lecture, maybe, but no sermon!

"To get more out of a sermon we should bring our own Bible or New Testament. We should feel free to write in it and make notes. If the preacher brings home the truth of a certain passage that we had not learned before, this would be the time to make a note in the margin beside the passage.


"We ought to come with the determination that we are going to get something out of the lesson. Attitude is very important here. Come with disinterest and you will not leave with anything. Come hungering and thirsting, and you will be filled.

Little Lynn Cantrell has the chicken pox.



OUR NEGLECTED STEPCHILD (Singing)

One of the worst abuses practiced among brethren today, with almost a "neglected stepchild syndrome," is that of worship in song. It is pitiful to watch some churches in their approach to singing the praises of God. The carelessness, thoughtlessness, unconcern, disinterest, laziness and jest with which we approach this important act is outrageous!

When I was a boy it was not uncommon to hear some song leader arise when it was time to begin and say, "Well, it's time to start so let's sing a song or two to let them all get in!"

Then, today, there are still song leaders who will say, when preparations are being made for a baptism, "Let's sing a song or two."

Further downgrading this sacred act of worship, some song leaders will still say carelessly, "Now to prepare our minds for the Lord's Supper, let's sing song number..."

How ridiculous this is! Jesus teaches that singing is an act of worship worthy of its own dignity, not just something to get another thing accomplished. It is not to get the men outside the building to throw away their last cigarette and come in, it is not to fill time till a baptism takes place; it is not just to be a preparation for the Lord's Supper; singing is a grand act of worship all its own!

We need to remember that the Lord instructed us to do several things:

1. Speak to one another as we sing.

2. Sing to one another as we speak.

3. Make melody in our hearts unto God. (Eph. 5:19.) Colossians 3:15-16 gives more insight into this precious act of worship. There we are instructed to:

1. Let Christ's word dwell in us richly.

2. Let this dwelling of the word be in all wisdom.

3. Teach one another as we sing.

4. Admonish one another as we sing.

5. Sing with grace in our hearts unto the Lord.

Does this sound as though we should use singing as a filler?

How often do we come to worship and find no consistent planning or preparation by the song leader? This causes the music worship to have no theme, no thread of thought, no consistency of counsel. It misses an exciting opportun ity to blend and build a beautiful lesson together with other features of that moment's worship. Who practices singing anymore? Who plans for each moment of music worship? Who has the patience anymore to help train boys to lead these songs? Who spends time preparing adequately for our singing?

Yes, you will find a few bright spots across our brotherhood, but just a few. And these poor souls are almost discouraged too, because of the negligible concern evidenced by so many brethren. There is no excuse for this callousness and carelessness. We must make singing a beloved member of the worship family, not a neglected stepchild. -----Roy H. Lanier, Jr.



"HE THOUGHT THEY SHOULD NOT SING!"


One Sunday morning a preacher stood before a congregation silently glaring at each individual present, and then in a voice that sounded like the crack of doom, he exclaimed, "If I had my way I would completely eliminate the singing from this assembly because it makes liars out of each of you!"

"Take that last hymn, for example, you all said, 'I want to be a worker for the Lord' at the top of your voices, and yet we have to beg people to teach the Bible classes and visit the sick.

"Oh, you sang, 'I surrender all.' Ah, when the offering plate went by you scarcely gave 3% of your income to the Lord.

"Many times you have sung, 'I'll go where you want me to go,' but you were too busy to visit the sick sister last week who was in need.






1. Speak to people. There is nothing as nice as a cheerful word of greeting.


To accomplish the goals the Elders set for 1980, each Christian at Bybee Branch will have to make a genuine sacrifice in order to successfully carry out the work.
