



#### CHEAP CROSSES FOR SALE

"Whosoever doth not bear his cross, and come after me cannot be my disciple" (Luke 14:27).

But many are asking, "Isn't there an easier way?" This attitude demonstrates itself in many areas of Christian involvement and responsibility . . .

- 1) SOME ARE LOOKING FOR "CHEAP CROSSES" IN THE MATTER OF CHURCH ATTENDANCE. Many argue: "One service a week is enough. . . I don't see any need to go Sunday and Wednesday night. . . If I'm there on Sunday morning, the Lord ought to be satisfied with that." But Heb. 10:25 does not leave room for cheap crosses! Early Christians were commanded to attend even though it might mean persecution and hardship.
- 2) SOME ARE LOOKING FOR "CHEAP CROSSES" IN THE MATTER OF MORALITY. Many want to think of themselves as Christians but they do not want to live by Christian standards. The Christian life is a high and holy calling which demands disciplined, godly living. We must deny "ungodliness and worldly lusts" and live "soberly righteously, and godly in this present world" (Titus 2:12). Tragically, many are trying to live by a looser, more worldly, more careless standard! There is hardly any practice in the world which has not also found its way into the church today! Practices once forthrightly condemned---drinking, gambling, sexual misconduct, immodesty---are now considered acceptable conduct by the advocates of a cheaper cross!

Jesus did not teach that the way of the cross would be always pleasant and painless (Luke 9:23). He did teach that it is the only way that leads to heaven!



3) He gives freely. He does not give because he thinks it is expected of him or because he fears criticism. We are often amazed by his liberality and his knowledge of our needs even before we make them known to him.

4) He gives his best. Most of our giving is done with leftovers. If we have any left over, we tip God! This greatest giver does not think of how little he can give, but freely gives his best first.

5) He gives because of his conviction that right is right and deserves the best. He believes in men. He gives more when the church gives more. He believes true faith must show itself in action.

6) He gives to preserve. He cannot stand to see anything wasted; he realizes the most precious thing on earth is the soul of a man. Therefore, he gives and gives again.

7) He gives for eternity. He gives with full know-ledge of the eternal consequences of his gift. His gifts are designed to prepare people for eternity.

Now this verse tells us who he is: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish but have everlasting life" (John 3:16).

#### POSITIVE PREACHING!

In the abundance of terminology describing preaching, two words occur over and over again: "Positive" and "Negative." At the risk of adding only to confusion, may I offer some thoughts about positive and negative preaching.

First, any sermon that provides information needful for getting closer to the Lord may be classified as "Positive." This means that the emotions of the speaker and the listener do not determine the nature of the sermon, but that the sermon itself provides the positive or negative nature. If a sermon does not provide information needful for getting closer to the Lord, it would be a

negative sermon. A very entertaining sermon with laughter and cheer may be negative, for it may provide nothing whereby a person may grow closer to the Lord. Therefore, a positive sermon provides means of getting closer to the Lord, and a negative sermon does not. One's "feeling good" does not determine the positive or negative nature of a sermon.

Second, there is positive and negative listening. Positive listening is listening for things in a sermon which will help us grow closer to the Lord. This means that a sermon of "don'ts" is a positive sermon if avoiding the "don'ts" gets one drawn closer to the Lord. this is positive listening. Negative listening is listening in such a way that one is now drawn closer to the Lord. One may listen to a positive sermon (one, which if followed, will bring one closer to the Lord) or a negative sermon in a negative way, and be brought no closer to Jesus. If one listens to a positive sermon in a positive way, he will be drawn nearer to the Lord.

Third, there are positive and negative emotions. Positive emotions are pleasant and negative emotions are unpleasant. Emotions have never determined the value of a sermon, although they may determine the value to the one who entertains them. One can have positive emotions after a sermon which really offers no opportunity or information for a change in life. One can have positive emotions after a hell-fire-and-brimstone sermon which has offered them information for moving closer to the Lord. One can have positive emotions after hearing about how much the Lord loves His people, but it may produce no life-change. One can have negative emotions after a hell-fire-and-brimstone sermon, but by positive listening, can be drawn nearer to the Lord because it has contained information to help one draw nearer Jesus.

Positive emotions are the result of being right with God, not "Positive" preaching. Sermons are to change lives. Unpleasant motivation (Hell) which produces a life-change is positive. Pleasant motivation (Heaven) which produces a life-change is also positive.

Think about it. How can a sermon which provides information on growing nearer the Lord be anything but positive? How can positive listening affect my life? Do emotions come as a result of my relationship with God or my response to a sermon?

### WHAT IS THE DIVINE REMEDY FOR SIN?

The Bible teaches that "it is not in man that walketh to direct his steps" (Jer. 10:23). Yet man, with his ability of moral choice, usually chooses his own way even though the way that "seemeth right" may be the way "of death!" Men have various "solutions" to the problem of sin.

Some men think that time will remedy sin. Men here forget that God does NOT forget. (See II Pet. 3:8) Some remain out of duty for years and then drift back into "duty" without making confession. Time used in this sense only serves to sear the conscience. Time may "heal" some things, but it does not remove sin.

Others think that good works remedy sin. Contrary to that the Bible teaches that we are saved by the mercy of God through our obedience and the washing of regeneration (Titus 3:3-5).

Money is not the remedy for sin. The acquisition of wealth often causes a greater love for wealth than God! (See 2 Kings 5:1-19).

Distance is not the remedy. Moving to another church does not remove sins! Remember, distance did not take? care of Jonah's rebellion (Jonah 1).

Only in Christ---by his cross, his blood---is the remedy to be found! (Matt.26:28; I Pet. 1:18-19). gbr







This is not exactly a comfortable sermon (to the preacher or hearers!). If you want to court the world and still claim God's favor, you might rather go "visiting" this Sunday!



### TRUTH FOR SALE

(by J. J. Turner; Gospel Advocate, Oct. 11, 1973, p. 647)

The Proverb writer said, "Buy the truth and sell it not" (Prov. 23:23). The writer is admonishing us to procure the truth at all cost, and after we have it, do not sell it at any price. Jesus said, "And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" (John 8:32). In this verse, Jesus makes it clear that man's freedom is dependent upon knowing the truth. How contrasting are these passages on the importance of truth to the attitudes held by many, even in the Lord's church, today toward truth. Some have gone so far as to say that we cannot really know the truth. It is not to this drastic indictment, which is held by only a few among us, (more among us in 1983!-gbr) that we want to direct our remarks, but to the many who are "selling" the truth.

Many today, especially preachers, are "selling" the truth because they won't stand for it. These men know most assuredly what the Bible teaches, but for some reason (maybe they fear the loss of their job) they will not take a stand on any controversial issue. The common cry is, "It's not time yet!" Elders and many other Christians are selling out with this attitude. All across the brotherhood sin of every description is being permitted by those who know the truth. MUM IS THE WORD!!!

Many today are selling the truth because they will not put it into practice. James condemns this attitude. He said, "But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves." (James 1:22). When we learn a truth from God's Word, we must put it into practice.

There are those today who are selling the truth because they will not defend it. Jude said, "I... exhort you that ye should earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints" (Jude 3). What do you do when you hear error taught today? Do you stand up and defend the truth, or keep silent and form a peaceful coalition with error? This is wrong! James said, "Therefore to him that knoweth d to do good, and doeth it not, to him it is sin." (James 4:17). The truth cost Jesus His life. We must not sell it at any cost. May God help us to continue "buying" the truth with diligent study, and never relinquish a precious word of it; . .





CHRISTIANS WHO CAN "KEEP RANK" WANTED:

by Bill Jackson

In the book of I Chronicles a good portion of scripture is given to the listing of David's mighty men.

Among those listed from the various tribes were men of Sebulun and Asher, etc., men expert in war and who "could

keep rank."

Here is an early reference to discipline and such dissipline as would insure success in combat (I Chr. 12: 33-38). meeping rank --- keeping order --- was essential, for failure to do so not only reflected upon the individual soldier's fidlity, but also had an adverse effect upon others, to say othing of providing the improper example.

Ultimately, the entire army's effectiveness would be

hindered. It was vital that men "keep rank."

Disorderly walking --- failing to "keep rank" --- hinders the church greatly today, and if we're going to face and deal with some of the problems facing us, we must close ranks and ;ive true allegiance to the captain of our salvation (Heb. 2: .0).

WE NEED:

(1) Elders who can "keep rank" behind the Christ, the thief Shepherd (I Pet. 5:4), and whose loyalty to God and the Word is such that they truly watch over the flock, faithfully using that Word to exhort and convict the man of the rooked part (Titus 1:9). Much of the liberalism now invading the church would never have become a problem, if more of our elders had "kept rank."

(2) Preachers who will "keep rank" and recognize a loyal-Jy to God and to the Word resulting in this charge ever before them: "PREACH THE WORD!" (II Tim. 4:2). We must dmit that in so many places today, preachers have broken ank and no longer give that certain Biblical sound, backing up their points with a "thus sayeth the Lord." In stating that the word is the basis of judgment (Jno. 12:48) and that the Word furnishes us completely unto every good work (II 'i'm. 3:16-17), God has prescribed the area of work for His preachers. There is only one authoritative message. Men who value souls --- their own and those of their hearers --- will Heep rank, being faithful to their Lord by faithfully proclaiming that message ONLY! There will be no interest in immickry, sectarian ideas and sectarian doctrine, when reachers put forth effort to keep rank!



- (3) Bible Class teachers who will "keep rank" in making their classes real BIBLE study classes rather than "playtime"! Elders are charged with feeding the flock of God (Acts 20:28), and the teachers selected for the classes must be those who expedite that feeding. Sadly, church history bears out that in several crises we've faced, error came into our midst through the Bible classes. We did not have teachers who were "keeping rank."
- (4) Finally, those who are the heart and core---the backbone---of the church: the members themselves. We need men and women, and young men and women, who will "keep rank". Members who rally behind Him who is the head of the church (Col. 1:18), members who will seek first the Kingdom of God and the righteousness of God (Matt. 6:33), members who prove in their lives what is well pleasing to Him (Rom. 12:1-2), and members who will see themselves as lights in a dark and sinful world and do their utmost to reflect the Christ (Matt. 5:16). How we need members who will "keep rank"!

Drawing again on the military background of our expression, an army either has those who "keep rank", or it is not really an army; it is a mob! Discipline is the key. Whatever our place and our work in the kingdom, let us all do all we can in every way that we can to insure that we "keep rank" behind our Saviour. Then, and only then, will we be pleasing to Him who one day will judge us. How thankful we are for those, in this time of apostasy, who have not yet bowed the knee to Baal. Yea, bless those, Father, who "keep rank!" ----Bill Jackson







### Children Going To Heaven?

Elders nationwide are concerned about the dropout rate of our young people. And well they ought to be. It is tragic to see these precious boys and girls who are so thrilled with the Bible study as little people, grow cold and uninterested in the Lord's work as they grow older.

Lately, several congregations have had in-depth studies of all the factors available concerning their young people with an eye to learning what might be done to help solve this problem. What do we need? More youth programs? More rallies, special teachers?

From the material that has been published on these studies, it seems that one great general truth has begun to emerge. Faithfulness of the young person to Jesus doesn't have anything to do with special programs or teachers. It is not dependent on whether they are members of a large congregation or a small one. The single most important value is their own immediate family.

One congregation found that where both parents were faithful to the Lord, and that includes active interest in the local congregation's programs, 93% of the kids were and remained faithful. On the other hand, if only one of the parents was faithful, that figure dropped to 73%. Where the parents were what we would call only reasonably active in the Lord's work only 53% of the young people maintained their faith.

Now here comes the shocker. In those cases where both parents attended only infrequently, the percentage of their children who remained faithful to the Lord dropped to 6%!

Do you want your children to go to heaven? Then make certain you are leading them. That's the only way they're going!





Whatever may be in our future we may be sure that the Lord is on our side when we seek to "put first his kingdom and his righteousness." Let's all not seek just to be religious, but also righteous in our daily lives and in our work together in His Kingdom. May our Lord's will be done as we work together in his Kingdom.

### THE ONLY CHRISTIANS

Lately, it seems to have become a problem with some as to whether members of the church of Christ are the ONLY CHRISTIANS. I have no hesit-Dismiss: ation in saying that the Bible teaches that EVERY ONE who is a Christian is a member of the church of Christ. The Bible teaches that salvation is in Christ (II Tim. 2:10). To be in Christ is to Sermon: be in His church (Gal. 3:26-27; I Cor. 12:13; Mk. 16:15-16; Acts 20:28; Acts 2:38; Dismiss: Eph. 1:7; et al.). The Bible teaches that it is impossible for one to "cross the line" into salvation without "crossAnnounce: ing the line" into Christ. The Bible also teaches that it is impossible for one to "cross the line" into Christ without "crossing the line" into the church.

In short, the Bible teaches that there are NO Christians outside the church for which Jesus Died. When one obeys the gospel, being baptized (as a penitent believer) in the name of Christ (that is, by His authority), the Lord adds him to the church. He never fails to do this (Cf.: Acts 2:41,47; I Cor. 12:13).



### Essentials for Acceptable Church Growth

Everyone desires to see the church grow numerically. Some are not concerned as they should be with its growth spiritually. Acceptable church growth must first be acceptable in the eyes of God. While numbers are impressive to the human mind, they do not impress God! The majority of humankind has always followed the evil ways---not God's Way. But just what is essential for a church to grow in a proper way as far as God is concerned?

- 1) Everything must be according to the Scriptures and must be done decently and in order (Col. 3:17; I Pet. 4:11; I Cor. 14:40). If this is the priority of the Elders, Preacher, Every Member, the numerical growth will take care of itself. For it is GOD who gives the increase! (Cf. I Cor. 3:6, 7).
- 2) A love of the truth must prevail among all people of the church. This is paramount to church growth that is pleasing to God. The Word is truth (John 17:17). It is this truth that makes one free (John 8:32) and keeps one acceptable to God (Cf. 1 John 1:7-9).
- 3) A diligent study of truth will be forthcoming if and when people really love truth. We must all study to show ourselves approved to God (2 Tim. 2:15). One is never too old nor too smart to need this diligent study! An index to the heart of a child of God is his/her diligence in the study of the revelation of God---the Bible. One who has to be prodded or begged to attend the opportunities of study is something less than what he ought to be!
- 4) It is no sin to be poor and humble, but it is a sin to be proud and worldly. To grow acceptably with God there are some things we must do; some things we must not do.

Our family was saddened when Bro. Arnold Thomas, Judy's Uncle, died suddenly last Wednesday. He conducted a singing school for us about two years ago. He had served as an Elder of the church in several places where he had lived. He was one of the most faithful and dedicated Christian men that I have ever known, or expect to know. We can take the burden of sorrow more easily because of the hope we have in our Lord Jesus.
