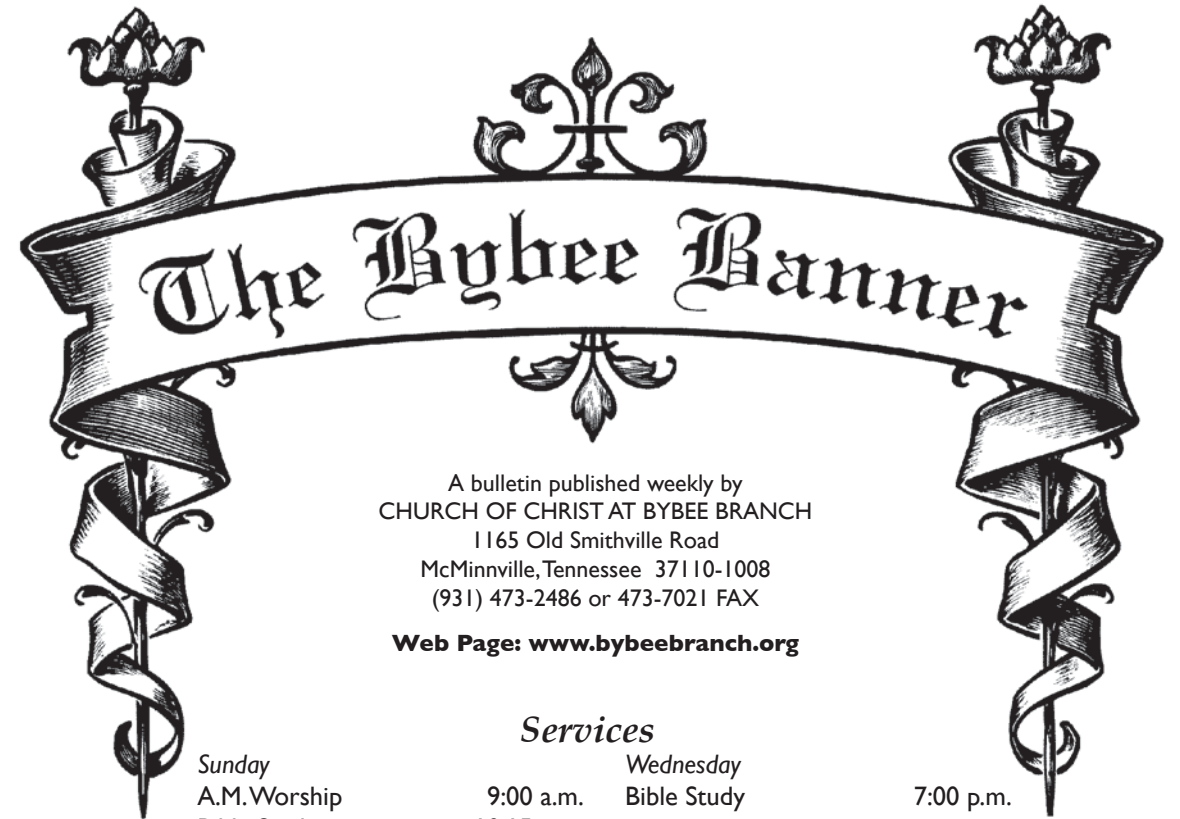

How Old Are You?

When asked about one's age, some people lie, some deny, and some camouflage the true number. But anyone who is living is getting older. What can my attitude be toward increasing age?

Appreciate Individuals, Not Age Groups

The Lord Waits

Jacob wrestled with God all night before getting a blessing from the angel. When the poor woman from Syrophencia cried out to Jesus on behalf of her daughter, she was at first not answered with a single word. Paul prayed three times that his thorn in the flesh would be removed, but instead of removing his

ailment, he was told "my grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."

There are multiple examples in scripture of God making people wait for the answers to their prayers. However, we don't always know or understand why God makes us wait. Perhaps God makes us wait so that we will cry out more fervently for God's deliverance, as in the case of Israel crying for freedom from Egyptian slavery. Perhaps God makes us wait so that we will better understand how to use our blessing to serve Him, as in the case of Hannah praying for a son. Perhaps God makes us wait so that we will have a greater appreciation for our blessings once we receive them. Maybe God makes us wait so that we will learn to "trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding."

So if it seems like God isn't answering your prayers, don't grow discouraged. Keep praying. Keep trusting. Keep serving. Keep waiting.

"Therefore the LORD waits to be gracious to you, and therefore he exalts himself to show mercy to you. For the LORD is a God of justice; blessed are all those who wait for him." – Isaiah 30:18
