

Vote NOT TO PERMIT

There are times when people may not be able to
give money. There may be times when due to various
reasons one may not be able to make phone calls
or solicit others to vote on a moral issue. As Peter
said to the lame man in Acts 3, "Silver and gold I do
not have, but what I do have I give you..." (Acts 3:6
NKJV). If you live in the city and are registered to
vote, you ought to exercise your civic duty to vote.
And, spiritually you ought to vote NOT TO PERMIT
package liquor sales in the city.

Some want to make this simply a monetary issue.
Statistics have shown that the sale of liquor is a losing
proposition for revenue. Others want to make this
a safety issue. Drunk driving kills and maims. About
that there is simply no question. And even others
see this as a social issue. The effects of drunkenness
on children and families is atrocious. The physical
violence and depravation that result from those who
consume alcohol is well documented. But this is also
a spiritual issue. This is an issue that not only affects
one's pocketbook, one's safety, and one's family; it is
an issue that affects one's eternal destiny!

“Woe to him who gives drink to his neighbor, Pressing
him to your bottle, Even to make him drunk, That you may
look on his nakedness!” (Habakkuk 2:15 NKJV).

“Now the works of the flesh are evident, which are:
adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lewdness, idolatry,
sorcery, hatred, contentions, jealousies, outbursts of wrath,
selfish ambitions, dissensions, heresies, envy, murders,
drunkenness, revelries, and the like; of which I tell you
beforehand, just as I also told you in time past, that those
who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of
God.” (Galatians 5:19-21 NKJV).

The Greatest Call

Among the many memories of my childhood are the
various calls that came from Mamma. When it was time to
eat, she would call, “Dinner is ready,” or “It’s supper time.”
We would rush in to find food prepared on the table. If we
stayed outside too long, she would call out, “You boys come
on in it’s getting dark!” Then there was another call that I
didn’t like to here. Those times when she had asked me to
do something, but I got busy playing and neglected, I would
hear the call, “Benny Brook you get yourself in here!”

These calls were important when we are growing up,
but the calls of God are even more important. Let us at
this time; look at some of His calls.

The Call Of The Gospel

It is a fact, that all who live to the age of accountability
commit sins; therefore, the most important call in the word
of God, is the call of the gospel. The call of the gospel is the
call to obey the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ
(Rom. 6:1-4). Paul reminded the Christians at Thessalonica
how they had been called:

“to which He **called you by our gospel**, for the
obtaining of the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ” (2 Thes. 2:14,
NKJV).

When Jesus sent His apostles to the world, they were
to invite the lost to respond to the call of the gospel. He
told them:

“Go into all the world and preach **the gospel** to every
creature. “He who **believes** and is **baptized** will be saved;
but he who does not believe will be condemned” (Mk. 16:15,
16, NKJV).

Thus, the way they responded to the call, determined
whether they would be **saved** or be **lost!**

The Call Of Holiness

When we answer the call of obedience to the gospel,
we are also called to live a **life of holiness**. This is a call to
sanctify our hearts and lives to the Lord. Paul also reminded
the Christians at Thessalonica:

“For God did not call us to uncleanness, but in holiness”
(1 Thes. 4:7, NKJV).

This means that we have surrendered our hearts and
lives to live for the Lord. We have turned our backs on the
evil, lustful practices of the world, and with a renewed mind,
are living for His kingdom and righteousness (Mt. 6:33).

Have you faithfully answered these two calls from God?
If so, you have found “the peace of God, which surpasses all
understanding” (Php. 4:7, NKJV).

Tests of Right and Wrong

The standard of measurement of right living is not (1) How
many are doing this? (2) How does it make me feel? Or, (3)
Will it provide material blessings? Here are some beneficial
tests that should be used to determine right and wrong.

- (1) **The Spiritual Test.** Is this action or attitude
forbidden in the Word of God? Am I aware of what
the Bible teaches concerning this matter? Does my
attitude indicate a willingness to let the teaching of the
Bible be authoritative in determining my conduct?
- (2) **The Prayer Test.** Is this something concerning which
I can seek both the approval and blessings of God? For
example, drinking alcohol would fail this test for God
would not smile upon such a practice to bless it.
- (3) **The Personal Test.** Will doing this action make of
me a better Christian? Will it aid my spiritual growth
and development? Will it cause me to be more Christ
like?
- (4) **The Social Test.** Will my engaging in this activity
influence others to be better Christians or will it
provide a stumbling block before them? “Wherefore
if meat make my brother to offend, I will eat not flesh
while the world standeth, lest I make my brother to
offend.” (1 Cor. 8:13).
- (5) **The Practical Test.** What will the results be if I do
this particular thing? Would this result be desirable
or undesirable? Will this action produce happiness or
unhappiness for others?
- (6) **The Stewardship Test.** Will I be fulfilling God’s
design and purpose for my life or will I be wasting that
which God has entrusted into my care?
- (7) **The Universal Test.** If everyone I knew and
respected did this, would I be happy? Would our nation
and community be better or worse?
- (8) **The Publicity Test.** Is this practice one that I would
be willing for everyone to know about? Will it stand
the gaze of the public without causing me to blush?
- (9) **The Evangelistic Test.** Will this cause others to
want to know the Lord? Will my practice cause others
to lose confidence in Him whom I claim as my Savior
and Lord?
