

The Fallacy of Inherited Sin

There is nothing in the Bible which teaches that men inherit the sin of Adam, or that men are born in a state of sin. A person becomes a sinner when he commits sin, and he commits sin when he transgresses Gods' law."Whosoever commits sin transgresses also the law: for sin is the transgression of the law." (I John 3:4) A baby cannot be a sinner because he or she has not transgressed God's law. The prophet Ezekiel said, "The soul that sins shall die. The son shall not suffer for the iniquity of the father, nor the father suffer for the iniquity of the son; the righteousness of the righteous shall be upon himself, and the wickedness of the wicked shall be upon himself." (Ezekiel 18:20) Hence, sin is not transferred from one generation or person to another. All men are sinners, not because they have inherited sin, but because "...all have sinned..." (Romans 3:23). And since we stand or fall based upon our actions, we are not responsible for others. As Paul said, "...each of us shall give account of himself to God." (Romans 14:12)

An infant is completely innocent. God says in Ezekiel 28:15, "You were perfect in your ways from the day you were created, till iniquity was found in you." So we see that an infant is born perfect and without sin until he becomes of an accountable age and then begins to sin.

The doctrine that teaches that infants are born sinners and must be baptized in order to be saved is a perversion of God's word because it contradicts God's word. In Ezekiel 18:4 the word of God says, "Behold, all souls are Mine; the soul of the father as well as the soul of the son is mine: the soul that sins shall die." So we see from this passage that God is telling us that children do not inherit sin from their parents, their grandparents, or any of their forefathers, all the way back to Adam. God's word says, "The son shall not bear the guilt of the father." Each person is responsible for his or her own sins. According to this verse, it is "The soul who sins shall die." Does it say that the soul that inherits sin, it shall die? No. It says the soul who sins.

So what is sin? I John 3:4 says, "Whoever commits sin also commits lawlessness: and sin is lawlessness." We do not inherit sin; we commit sin; and we commit sin when we commit lawlessness. An infant has not broken any law of God and thus has not committed any sin. One who has not committed sin is not separated from God, for it is our sins that cause us to be separated from the Father in the first place, not our birth: "Behold, the Lord's hand is not shortened, that it cannot save, or His ear dull, that it cannot hear; but your iniquities have made a separation between you and your God, and your sins have hid His face from you so that He does not hear." (Isaiah 59:1-2)

From Tyler's Desk:

Jesus Teaches About Judging Others

Matthew 7:1 is one of the most frequently used (and misused) Bible verses. It quotes Jesus as having said, "Judge not, that you be not judged." However, this verse is most often quoted to suggest that we should never judge anyone. Is someone living in sin? "Judge not!" Is someone teaching something contrary to the Bible? "Judge not!"

Was Jesus suggesting that no man EVER has any right to pass any sort of judgment on anyone else? For just a moment, lets examine what Jesus was not teaching, followed by understanding what Jesus was teaching.

What Jesus Was Not Teaching:

Jesus was not making a blanket statement that we should never judge another person. Consider the

context of Matthew chapter 7. In verse 6 Jesus said, "Do not give dogs what is holy, and do not throw your pearls before pigs." Does this not imply a judgment? We must be first judge to discern who are the dogs and pigs.

A few verses later, Jesus warned "Beware of false prophets!... you will recognize them by their fruits" (vs. 15-16). Again, Jesus instructs us to be wise enough to judge who is teaching what is true and who is teaching what is false. He continues to explain that their "fruits" are whether or not they are doing the will of their Father (v. 21).

The logical conclusion is we are permitted and instructed to judge others in comparison to God's word. This principle is taught in various other scriptures as well (John 7:24; I Corinthians 5:9-13; I John I:4)

What Jesus Was Teaching:

Although the verse is often used to defend teachings Jesus never intended, we must not miss the important point Jesus was making.

First of all, Jesus instructed, "With the measure you use, it will be measured to you." Do you want others to be loving, forgiving, patient, and merciful with you? If so, you must be forgiving, patient and merciful in your judgments of others.

Secondly, Jesus condemned the judgment of others without first examining ourselves. "Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye?" (v. 3). It is so easy to study the Bible or listen to a sermon and think, "I really wish 'so-and-so' would listen to this!" As we study God's word, our primary concern should be our own lives and our own improvements.

To say we should never pass judgment is an abuse of Jesus' teachings. However, a failure to apply the truth Jesus was teaching would be equally sinful.
