From Tyler's Desk:

Jesus Teaches About Finances

Matthew 6:34 is often considered one of the most difficult commandments in the Bible to follow. It reads, "Do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble."

This commandment was given by Jesus as a conclusion to a section written about money management. In the previous verses, Jesus compared two lifestyles: a life of worry and a life of trust. Jesus admonished us to consider the birds of the air, and the lilies and grass of the field. Since God takes care of these, we can know he will take care of us.

Although the logic is sound, practical application of this principle can be much more difficult. It can be difficult not to worry about money when friends are losing jobs, gas prices are increasing, the car is breaking down, and the kids want to go to the movies with their friends. However, if we can remember and apply the principles written in the previous verses, it can make "not worrying" a little easier to do.

Beginning in Matthew 6:19, Jesus made three comparisons (all of which are closely related). He compared two treasures, two sets of priorities, and two masters.

Two Treasures

"Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and dust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal." (Matt. 6:19-20)

The first principle is to remember what's really important. Money may come, and money may go, but heavenly treasure will last forever. If we are right in our relationship with God, we will have treasure and security which cannot be taken away from us.

Two Sets of Priorities

"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. The eye is the lamp of the body. So, if your eye is healthy, your whole body will be full of light, but if your eye is bad, the whole body will be full of darkness." (Matt. 6:21-23)

When taken in context, Jesus' second point is more clearly understood. If our eyes are focused on God, we will always be filled with the comfort of light. But if our eyes are focused on earthly wealth, we will be filled with the fear of darkness.

Two Masters

"No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate one and love the other, or he will be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money." (Matt. 6:24)

We must decide what is most important. Only when we have the right treasure, the right priorities, and the right master, can we truly avoid worrying about finances.
