What A Word This Is!

(LUKE 4:36)

Hosanna! — *hōsanna* — *ho-san-nah'* — Of Hebrew origin; *oh save!*; *hosanna* (that is, *hoshia-na*), an exclamation of adoration: - hosanna. (Strong's, #5614)

This word is used six times in the New Testament. It occurs in each of the records of the triumphant entrance by the Lord into the city of Jerusalem (Mt 21:1-17; Mk 11:1-19; Jn 12:12-19). When the people cried out "Hosanna!" it was a plea for salvation but more specifically it was an exclamation of praise to the one who could provide help in a time of need. In modern times the word "Hallelujah!" would express a similar sentiment.

Today we should proclaim "Hosanna!" to Christ because it is he who still offers salvation to all who obey him (Heb 5:8-9). As the angels proclaimed at his birth "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, and good will toward men." (Lk 2:14) so we should herald praises to God for having sent Christ to die for us (Rom 5). "Hosanna!" to the Holy Spirit who provided us with the knowledge of this great salvation (2 Tim 3:16-17).

"Hosanna!" What a word this is!

The Dart

A young lady named Sally relates an experience she had in a seminary class given by her teacher, Dr. Smith. She says that Dr. Smith was known for his elaborate object lessons.
