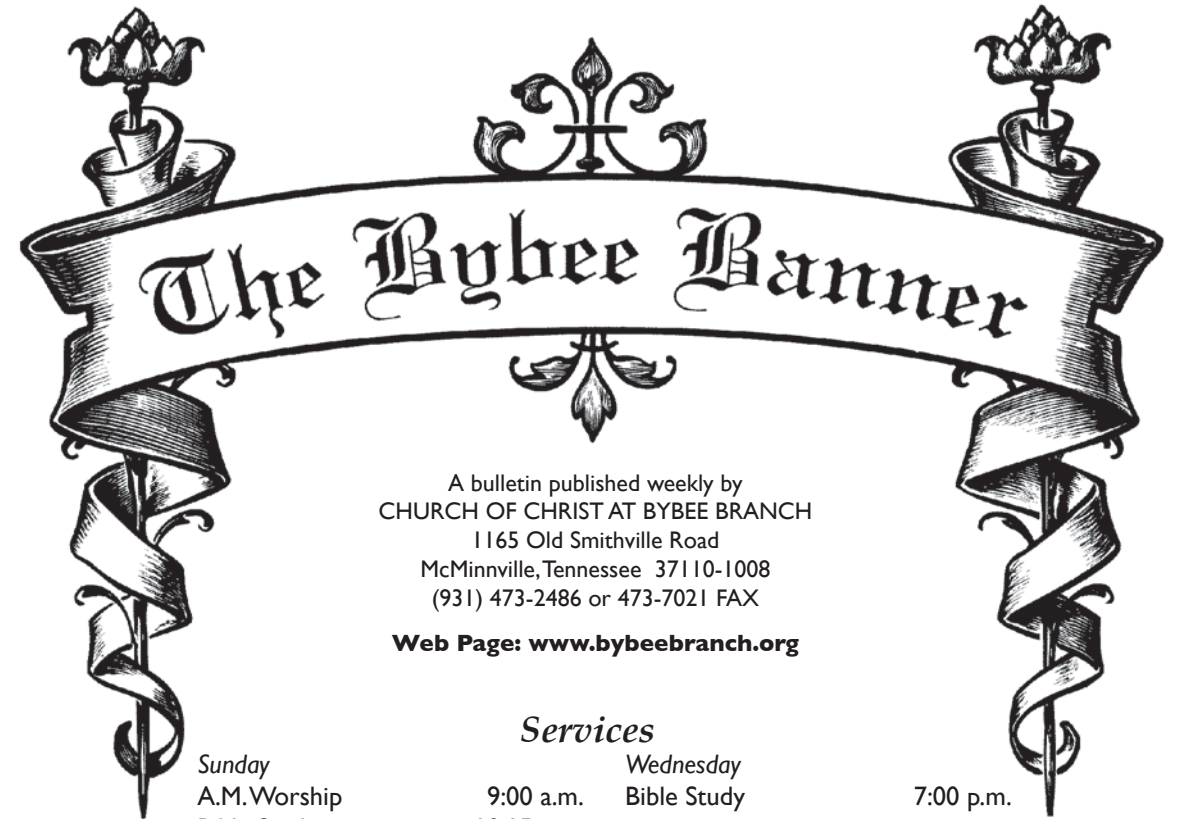

Do You Know Me?

A small town prosecuting attorney called his first witness to the stand in a trial -- a grandmotherly, elderly woman. He approached her and asked, "Mrs. Jones, do you know me?" She responded, "Why, yes, I do know you Mr. Williams. I've known you since you were a young boy. And frankly, you've been a big disappointment to me. You lie, you cheat on your wife, you manipulate people and talk about them behind their backs. You think you're a rising big shot when you haven't the brains to realize you never will amount to anything more than a two-bit paper pusher. Yes, I know you."

The lawyer was stunned. Not knowing what else to do, he pointed across the room and asked, "Mrs. Jones, do you know the defense attorney?" She again replied, "Why, yes I do. I've known Mr. Bradley since he was a youngster, too. I used to baby-sit him for his parents. And he, too, has been a real disappointment to me. He's lazy, bigoted, he has a drinking problem. The man can't build a normal relationship with anyone and his law practice is one of the shoddiest in the entire state. Yes, I know him."

At this point, the judge rapped the courtroom to silence and called both counselors to the bench. In a very quiet voice, he said with menace, "If either of you asks her if she knows me, you'll be in jail for contempt within 5 minutes!"

We chuckle at stories like this ... and hope that they are not true.

Sometimes we think that we hide our sins and faults in a safety deposit box where we have the only key. Wouldn't it be alarming to have them broadcast in public like this story?! The truth is, others do see our sins and weaknesses ... often better than we see them ourselves. Remember the illustration Jesus used about the log in your own eye and the speck in your brother's eye (Matthew 7:3)? If we can see the sawdust in another's eye, don't you know that the larger problems are even much more visible? In James 5:16 we are told to confess our sins to each other. Some have refrained from doing this because they did not want others to know just how sinful they are. Well, maybe they already know!!

It's for certain that God knows you inside and out. He knows what you do, what you don't do, what you think ... and He knows your motives for all of this. Nothing is hidden from God. So when He tells us to confess our sins, it is not to reveal information to Him; it is to acknowledge that we know how sinful we are. Is there something that you need to acknowledge to God and His people? If you do, Jesus will acknowledge you. If you don't, Jesus will say, "I never knew you." (Matthew 10:32-33; 7:21-23).
