## Youth News

What makes a hero? When we think about the word hero, images of Superman, Batman, or Spiderman may come to your mind. For others it is those individuals who (in real life situations) risk injury and/or death to save others. Certainly the latter are worthy of our gratitude. Yet, do you ever consider people like Abel, Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, Rahab, Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, David, Samuel, or the prophets? If you haven't, then reconsider. Last week at **SHORT MOUNTAIN BIBLE CAMP** this is exactly what we did. We noticed exactly what those “cloud of witnesses” (Hebrews 12:1) mentioned above (along with others) did that was simply amazing. Still others had trial of mockings and scourgings, yes, and of chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, were tempted, were slain with the sword. They wandered about in sheepskins and goatskins, being destitute, afflicted, tormented—of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains, in dens and caves of the earth” (Hebrews 11:33-38.) Our Biblical heroes endured and prospered because of their faith in God! In other words, our heroes let everyone know that God was their hero. So the question remains, is God your hero? [We have six campers at SMBC this week.
