What makes a hero? When we think about the word hero, images of Superman, Batman, or Spiderman may come to your mind. Yet, do you ever consider people like Abel, Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, Rahab, Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, David, Samuel, or the prophets? If you haven't, then reconsider. Last week at SHORT **MOUNTAIN BIBLE CAMP** this is exactly what we did.
