Monday Morning Bible Class

Every second and fourth Mondays at 9 am is the Monday Morning Bible Class. Everyone is invited, young or old. The class is a simple Bible study. The class for next Monday starts with 1 Timothy 5.

Sentence Sermons

"When you were born, you were crying and everyone around you was smiling. Live your life so at the end, you're the one who is smiling and everyone around you is crying."

"Change of self is needed more often than a change of scene."

Five Powerful Phrases

I like power phrases. The Bible is full of them, some of which we will examine. Phrases outside the Bible catch my attention. Here are a few (I do not know the author of all these):

"If you shoot yourself in the foot, you're going to walk with a limp"

"Anything the mind of man can conceive and believe he can achieve"

"All things come to him who waiteth as long as he who waiteth worketh hard while he waiteth"

More important are those from the Bible. Here are five powerful phrases:

1. **I AM SORRY.** "The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit: a broken and a contrite heart, O God, thou wilt not despise" (Ps. 51:17). Numerous examples in the Bible help us to understand the need of recognizing there is a time to say, "I'm sorry." The penitent thief, the prodigal son, David the adulterer.
2. **I NEED HELP.** The Bible example of Philip and the Eunuch. Remember when Philip ask him if he understood what he read? His reply was, "...How can I, except some man should guide me" (Acts 8:31)? Cornelius sent to Joppa because he needed help. He wanted Peter to tell him what to do to be saved (Acts 10:6, 33). The woman of Canaan said, "Lord, help me" (Mt. 15:25). Remember the folks of Macedonia. Paul had a vision, "Come over into Macedonia, and help us" (Acts 16:9). All of us need help in many ways. However, the arrogant and independent person will, because of pride, refuse the help of others.
3. **I NEED YOU.** God saw that it wasn't good for the man to be alone. "I will make him a help meet for him" (Gen. 2:18). "For

none of us liveth to himself, and man dieth to himself" (Rom. 14:7).

4. **I DON'T KNOW.** Wow, that is hard for us brilliant people to say. The Rich Young Ruler ask, "What lack I yet" (Mt. 19:20). When studying the Bible it would be great to simply say, "I don't know."
5. **I LOVE YOU.** Paul's description of love in 1 Corinthians 13 leads us to the conclusion that these words are powerful. Jesus is our great example. It was said of Jesus regarding Lazarus, "Behold how he loved Him" (John 11:36). Jesus said, "This is my commandment, that ye love one another, as I have loved you" (John 15:12).

Powerful phrases!
