

How To Un-Complicate Your Life

Life is busy! James asked the question, "...For what is your life? It is even a vapour, that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away" (James 4:14).

Paul writes to the Philippians, "Be careful for nothing; but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God" (Phil. 4:6). Another translation uses the words, "Be anxious for nothing..." (NKJV). Jesus also taught this message in the Sermon on the Mount (Mt. 5-7). However, man seems to find a way to complicate life. I found a list of things by a writer, Richard Foster, who suggested these principles for a more simplistic life:

- "Buy things for their usefulness not their status."
- "Reject anything that is producing an addiction in you."
- "Develop a habit of giving things away."
- "Learn to enjoy things without owning them."
- "Develop a deeper appreciation for the creation."
- "Look with a healthy skepticism at all 'buy now, pay later' schemes"
- "Shun anything that distracts you from seeking first the kingdom of God."

It is sad that parents in an effort to produce popular, well accepted children by society, will run their children from one activity to another and then leave out the most important thing, which is spending time with God and time with parents.

Un-complicate your life. Spend more time with God. Spend more time with family. Spend more time in prayer and study of the Holy Scriptures. Spend more time in worship. Remember the words of the Lord Jesus, "But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you" (Mt. 6:33).

The Positive Pull

When you dip a porous paper towel or a newspaper into water, you can see the water resist gravity and creep upward in the paper. This upward movement is known as "capillary action." It is caused by the attraction of water molecules to those in other materials and to one another.

As a water molecule is attracted to the drier paper, it creeps in that direction. As it moves, it pulls along other water molecules to which it is attracted.

It is capillary action which lifts water from the ground upward into stems and leaves of trees.

It occurs to me that each of us is involved in some kind of spiritual capillary action: Whenever we are attracted to something, we pull with us others with whom we have a mutual attraction. Unfortunately, that to which we are drawn (and into which we draw others) is not always something good.

Any Christian who pulls another into frequent absence from the assembly, into carping criticism of the brethren, into a sulking neglect of talents has pulled in the wrong direction!

Every Christian is to build up his brother in the faith (Romans 15:2). Through the years, this congregation has grown because you have practiced the **POSITIVE PULL** instead of the **DOWNWARD DRAG**.
