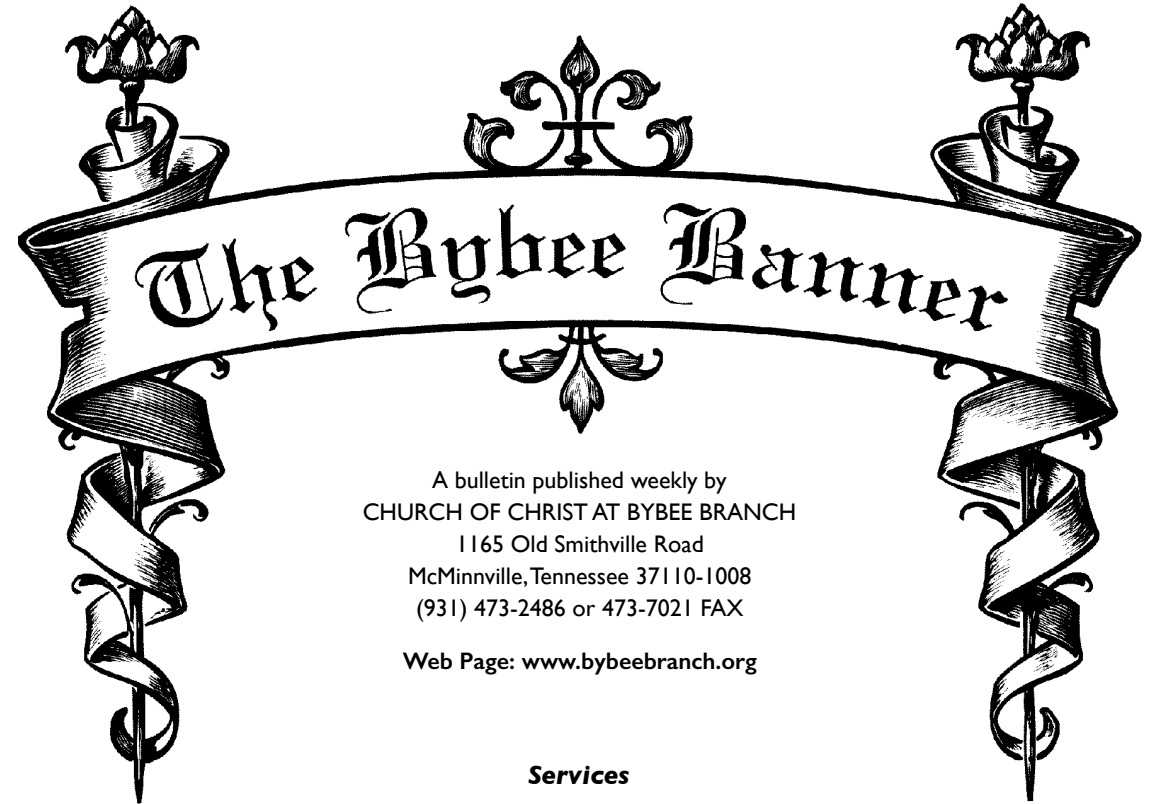

Tribute To A True Friend

A week ago I got a call which I sort of expected, a dear friend had passed from this life. I knew he was very sick and if he were to make it his life would be much different that it was previously.

Immediately upon hearing my mind went to John 11. Most people are aware of verse 35, "Jesus wept." However, there is so much more to that account. Jesus had three close friends that he visited when near Jerusalem. They lived in Bethany which was about two miles from Jerusalem (or as we would say in Alabama, "its just over the hill."). Mary, Martha and Lazarus became dear friends with Jesus. In verse 11, Jesus said, "our friend sleeps." When they arrived there was already a large crowd assembled to comfort Mary and Martha (Jn. 11:19).

While Jesus was nearing Martha went out to meet with Him. She said that had Jesus been there Lazarus would not have died. She was confident that Jesus could do something even then (Jn. 11:22). However, my mind gravitates to how Jesus responded. "Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again." Martha said to Him, "I know that he will rise again in the resurrection at the last day." Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?" She said to Him, "Yes, Lord, I believe that You are the Christ, the Son of God, who is to come into the world.'" (John 11:23-27). The Christian can have such great confidence in the promises of the Lord. Do I believe this? Absolutely!

Does knowledge that one's faithful friends and relatives will rise again to eternal life remove all the sting of death. Not at all. "Therefore, when Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her weeping, He groaned in the spirit and was troubled. And He said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to Him, "Lord, come and see." Jesus wept. Then the Jews said, "See how He loved him!" (John 11:33-36). Jesus knew Lazarus was going to be raised, even just minutes later but there is just something about death and the sadness that goes along with it. It is here when one realizes the Devil brought death, whereas Jesus brought life (2Tim. 1:10; Jn. 10:10).

Who was this dear friend of mine? His name was Randy Keith Reeves. He was a quiet and humble man who loved life, his family, his church family and his work family. He served faithfully as a deacon at the Fayette church of Christ in Fayette, AL. It was apparent how much the church there loved him. Hundreds lined up to pay respects and comfort his beloved wife Nancy, daughter Randi Kay, and granddaughter of just a couple months, Dani Kay. Many came from far away. He had co-workers that came from Ohio and Missouri. He had elders, deacons and preachers from the surrounding area. On Sunday morning there were four pews filled with family members at services.

Randy was not reared in the church, nor was his wife. He learned the Gospel through his girlfriend at the time in high school and became a member of the Mt. Olive church of Christ in Vernon, AL where he frequently led singing. Later he chose to attend Freed-Hardeman College where he grew and developed spiritually. In Vernon he met his future wife whom he taught and baptized. Randy could preach and teach but his passion was leading singing.

Our friendship goes back to Jr. High when we both played in the band. We roomed together at Freed-Hardeman. He was the best man at my wedding and me at his. Our families enjoyed so many joyous times together. He was a faithful man of God.
