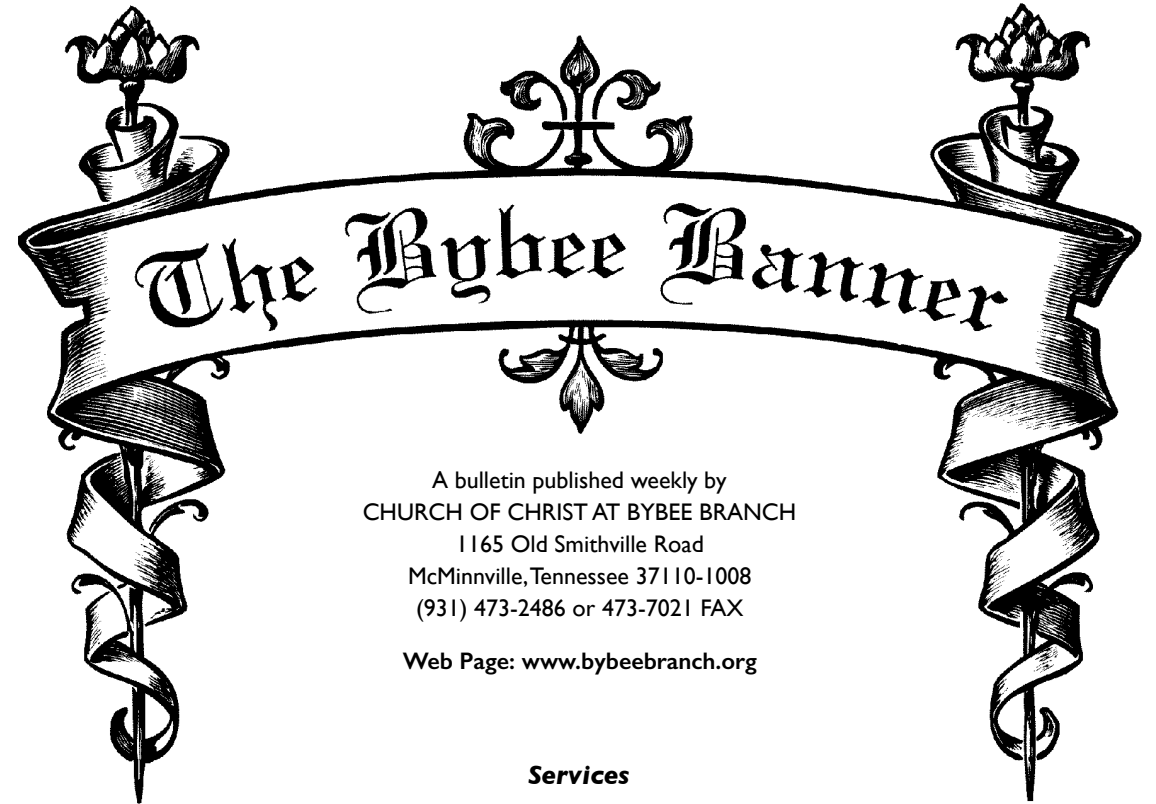

What to Do with the Bible

Elders, preachers, teachers, parents, and other concerned Christians frequently encourage us to read our Bibles regularly. Why? What should we do with what we read? Let's take some pointers from Psalm 119:

Learn it. "Give me understanding, that I may learn Your commandments" (v.73). Understanding God's word takes study, prayer, and determination. You will not grasp everything the first time you read it. Read passages over and over; look at similar passages; ask questions, pray for wisdom.

Hope in it. "Those who fear You will be glad when they see me, because I have hoped in Your word" (v.74). Hope is the combination of strong desire and confident expectation. We certainly desire the good things God has promised; and we are confident that we will receive them, not because we are perfect, but because God is faithful. He keeps His word.

Affirm it. "I know, O Lord, that Your judgments are right" (v.75). God's word is not to be strained through the filter of our personal desires or opinions. If God and I disagree on something, guess who needs to change!

Delight in it. "For Your law is my delight" (v.77). How sad, that Bible reading and study would ever be boring or tedious! What could be more delightful to a child of God than to read the words of God Himself?

Meditate on it. "But I will meditate on Your precepts" (v.78). Meditation is simply deliberate and prolonged thought; it is not some strange mystical alteration of consciousness. What occupies your mind as you go through the day? Be sure to take time each day to reflect and consider what God has said in His word.

Know it. "Let those who fear You turn to me, those who know your testimonies" (v.79). Mathematicians know math; scientists know science; and Christians certainly ought to know the Scriptures! Such knowledge will help you resist temptation and be able to teach others.

Do it. "Let my heart be blameless regarding Your statutes, that I may not be ashamed" (v.80). Sin is the only thing that can keep the heart from being blameless. Doing what is contrary to God's word is sin (1 John 3:4 & 5:17), but so is failure to do what is right (James 4:17). God's word tells us how to be saved by His grace and how to live so as to please Him.

May I invite and encourage you to read your Bible!

Greet By Name

In the last chapter of the book of Romans, Paul sends greetings to the brethren. This was a common practice in Paul's letters, and it was common in personal messages of that day. But Romans 16 is unique in this way-- Paul had never been to Rome, but he greets 27 brethren by name. Then, he mentions eight people by name who were with him while writing. Paul did not just greet a group of brethren in general, but he called them by name. Do you know how meaningful that must have been, to hear your own name called?

The last sentence of the book of Third John reads, "Greet the friends by name" (3 John 14). By name! There is something about calling someone by their name! We see its significance when Jesus, the Good Shepherd, "calls his own sheep by name" (John 10:3).

Try calling people by name. Call brethren by name. Notice the name of people who serve you or call you on the phone. Call people by name. It will open hearts and impact lives.
