Something To Think About

Sound Doctrine

As many of you can attest, being sick is no fun. It always seems more debilitating when it is you who has the illness and the symptoms seem magnified. One begins the process of trying to ascertain where he got the illness and what might have been done to prevent it. Sometimes one begins to try to figure out how to get relief from the symptoms but its only when one attacks the disease that the symptoms will begin to disappear.

Spiritual sickness is much like physical sickness, much of it is preventable. Like physical sickness the symptoms often draw more attention than the source of the illness. Thus, what will follow are some ideas that are taken from approaches to physical illness that can be applied to spiritual illnesses. It is not insignificant that the term "sound doctrine" literally means "healthy teaching." (cf. 1 Tim 1:10; 2 Tim 4:3; Titus 1:9; 2:1)

Inoculation – One of the most effective means of preventing diseases has been the discovery of immunizations. Vaccines usually the method involves introduction of a very small amount of the illness in a controlled environment to allow the body to develop a resistance. In the Bible often false teachings are discussed in a controlled event in order to prevent future acceptance. "104 Through Your precepts I get understanding; Therefore I hate every false way. 11 Your word I have hidden in my heart, That I might not sin against You." Psalms 119:104, 11 NKJV. Preachers will often preach against false teaching (or any sin) so that when presented with the temptation they may be able to resist it.

Isolation – It seems only logical that once one identifies the source of a communicable illness to isolate it/them so it/they do not contaminate the others. This explains why the local school officials called of school for a couple days to prevent further spread of an illness. False teachers and false teaching must be contained lest they infect others with their false teaching. When speaking about the role of elders, Paul said, "10 For there are many insubordinate, both idle talkers and deceivers, especially those of the circumcision, 11 whose mouths must be stopped, who subvert whole households, teaching things which they ought not, for the sake of dishonest gain." Titus 1:10–11 NKJV. John went on to say, "9 Whosoever goeth onward and abideth not in the teaching of Christ, hath not God: he that abideth in the teaching, the same hath both the Father and the Son. 10 If any one cometh unto you, and bringeth not this teaching, receive him not into your house, and give him no greeting: 11 for he that giveth him greeting partaketh in his evil works." 2 John 1:9-11 ASV.

Eradication – The only permanent solution is to eradicate the source of the illness. The two previous approaches focused on *prevention* but how must one respond after the disease has taken hold? Many think the proper approach is to just treat the symptoms. The truth is that one often has to take medicine (e.g. an antibiotic) to kill the infection. "9 holding fast the faithful word as he has been taught, that he may be able, by sound doctrine, both to exhort and convict those who contradict. 13 This testimony is true. Therefore rebuke them sharply, that they may be sound in the faith," Titus 1:9, 13 NKJV. There can be no compromise with sin. "And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather expose them." Ephesians 5:11 NKJV.

I want to be healthy and presume so does everyone else. This illness will pass (I only wish sooner rather than later). I am so thankful for the existence of medicines that help me overcome the illness. I am thankful for the Sound Doctrine and what it can do in preventing spiritual sickness and for the healing my soul.
