How Hungry Are We?

I remember Larry Acuff often saying that people of his generation were known for quoting the Bible, because they always toted the Bible. It was once said during a court session, when the person was about to swear in. Where you put one hand on the Bible and raise the other and promise to tell the truth. Well during this process someone had taken the Bible out of the courtroom. The judge quickly asked, is there a member of the Church of Christ in here? A gentleman said yes, and the judge said come here and place your hand on him, because the member of the Church of Christ know the Bible and this will have to do for today.

The point I am trying to make is, are we still people of the Book? Can our generation be called the Bible quoting and Bible toting generation? I will leave that answer up to you. I fear that we have become lazy or complacent and or too busy. We are no longer having family Bible time at our homes. We are no longer reading our Bible's at home. I fear my generation is not hungry enough. "Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled." (Matt 5:6 KJV). Are we studying the Bible as if we are hungry?

Are we doing the same spiritually? Are we following the commandment to "Study to shew thyself approved unto God... (2 Tim 2:15 KJV)? We are quick to eat and drink physical food when we need it or want it. But we put off our own personal study. Why? I believe the world in which we live in is so fast paced and we have so many things pulling our attention away from the one who allowed all of these things to be created, God.

I know your probably thinking, well Aaron I am not a preacher like you or have time to study like you. Let me be honest with you. My biggest struggle is personal study. I am blessed to be able to study all day, to help the youth with Bible bowl, and HEY and other classes which is great. But what about me? What about my personal study? I need to become a more knowledgeable Christian also. That is where I slack off, in my mind I say things like, " God knows I just studied Matthew for Bible bowl. So I am fulfilling 2 Tim 2:15. That is the wrong attitude.

Recently Lindsay and I ordered a book that breaks the entire Bible down in to daily readings. We have just started reading a section a night and it takes about 5-10 minutes. After the first night I felt like Jacob didn't pay attention at all. He was jumping on the couch hanging all over me while I was reading etc. But the next night before we begin our nightly study, Lindsay asked him some questions about what we studied last night. He shocked me, he knew almost every answer that she asked him. I doubted teaching God's word to my own son because he didn't pay attention how I wanted him to. When Jacob knew the answers I was encouraged and it fueled my fire to continue reading each night.

I have several resources that can help you and your family have daily or weekly Bible time. What ever works best for you. It can be a book like Lindsay and I have, or Family Devotionals. The Family Devotionals I have are pretty neat. It gives you items that you probably have in your home and tells you how to make a spiritual application at home. It will give you the scripture to use and a song to sing to tie it all together. Let me know if you would like any of these or please let me know if you have suggestions on good material.

"And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not. As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith." (Gal 6:9-10 KJV). I am here to help you as I know I will need help from you one day. Our goal should be to help each other hear our lord said unto him, Well done, thou good and faithful servant: thou hast been faithful..." (Matt 25:21 KJV) Being a Christian is hard but has the greatest reward. Keep up the great work and try to work in family Bible time as often as you can. Don't be like the snickers commercial and be a diva when your hungry, likewise don't be a spiritually malnourished due to laziness or to busy. Strive to make God your top priority every day.
