We Need More Christians!

The other day I was mowing my yard. Seeing that my neighbor was working in his yard, I killed the engine and walked over to introduce myself. He is a kind, elderly soul that enjoys doing yard work alongside his wife. Nothing, however, could have prepared me for his closing statement before we returned to work in our yards. After finding out that I am a minister, he said, "Keep up the good work. We need more people like you to remind us about religion and what we should be doing."

My first thoughts were, What makes me so special? It was not me personally, but what I represented to this elderly gentleman. Then it dawned on me, He is right. We need more people in this world that properly represent Christ.

We need more Christians! We need more Christians, because Jesus told us to grow our numbers. "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." (Matthew 28:18-20). Jesus wanted us to be fruitful and multiply.

Counting The Cost

Becoming a Christian and living the Christian life is demanding. Those who would suggest that such is simple or easy have not read the Scriptures. Jesus said, "And whoever does not bear his cross and come after Me cannot be My disciple." ... "So likewise, whoever of you does not forsake all that he has cannot be My disciple." Luke 14:27, 33.

Imagine a teenager who says, "I want to be a doctor..." That teenager will have to make good grades to get into a good university. That same student will then have to take very hard classes in college while making good grades. After graduation from the university level the demands only increase. One must pass entrance exams to be admitted to medical school. Then after years of schooling, numerous hours of clinical training will one graduate only to have to do an internship before being allowed to take their licensing board examination. Many give up along the way thinking the demands simply too great. Those who persevere are rewarded with well-deserved respect and financial reward.

Jesus used two illustrations relevant to His time. One was a person who intended to build a tower. Jesus said that such a person had to count the cost if he had enough financial resources to finish or else set himself up to be mocked. The other illustration was a king encountering another in battle. Would it be wise to engage in war with that king if he were outnumbered two-to-one? In doing so Jesus was expressly teaching the importance of one not only counting the cost now, but the value at the end.

Given the demands of discipleship does it make good sense for one to become a Christian? Is it worth it for one to give up earthly pleasures to be faithful to God? The writer of Hebrews said regarding Moses, "choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God than to enjoy the passing pleasures of sin, esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt; for he looked to the reward." Hebrews 11:25-26. But is it worth it? "For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us." Romans 8:18.
