Take Heart!

After being battered and tossed two solid weeks in a fierce storm at sea, "all hope that we should be saved was finally given up" (Acts 27:20). Who can blame them? They had done everything humanly possible to keep the ship from disintegrating; but nothing seemed to help. Imagine the seasickness, discouragement, and exhaustion!

Then Paul spoke up: "I urge you to take heart" (27:22). What?! Are you some kind of Pollyanna?

No, Paul wasn't an irrepressible optimist! He had good reason for what he said. God had sent an angel to assure him that all 276 people aboard the ship would survive. Paul set forth three crucial reasons for his confidence:

1. I belong to this God (27:23a).
2. I serve this God (27:23b).
3. I believe this God (27:25).

Christians can face the best and worst of times when we keep these critical points in mind. We belong to God. He values us and watches over us in all circumstances.

We serve God. He is worthy of our service whether our conditions are pleasant or dreadful.

We believe God. Our confidence in Him must not wane when severe trials come upon us.

Our God has communicated with us. No, He hasn't sent an angel to you or me as He did to Paul. But He has and still does speak by means of His inspired word. He has assured us that "all things work together for God to those who love God, who are the called according to His purpose" (Romans 8:28).

Trouble At The Gate

This week continues the series of articles taken from sheet sermons from a previous generation. I encourage you to take time to consider the powerful lessons contained in it.

One may ask why would some have trouble at the gate? Jesus said, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I say to you, will seek to enter and will not be able. When once the Master of the house has risen up and shut the door, and you begin to stand outside and knock at the door, saying, 'Lord, Lord, open for us,' and He will answer and say to you, 'I do not know you, where you are from,' then you will begin to say, 'We ate and drank in Your presence, and You taught in our streets.' But He will say, 'I tell you I do not know you, where you are from. Depart from Me, all you workers of iniquity.'" (Luke 13:24-27). Such is a sad picture of what will happen on Judgment day. Just picture people banging on the door, "let me in!"

The chart below focuses on several areas of concern that may keep one out. The religious world seems to think God will accept any type of worship offered or doctrine taught. The "doctrines of men" are specifically condemned. Likewise, the chart addresses unfaithfulness within the church as well, including those who fail to provide for their own. How can one be sure that he won't have "trouble at the gate?" One must take the whole counsel of God and be faithful to it.
