

Bad Company

Earlier this week, I decided to eat a banana we had gotten from the grocery just a few days earlier. When I noticed that the banana had ripened quicker than expected, I realized that there were a couple older bananas at the bottom of the fruit bowl that needed to be thrown away. This reminded me of Paul's words in I Corinthians 15:33: "Do not be deceived: 'Bad company corrupts good morals.'"

In Galatians 2, Paul tells of a time he was forced to correct Peter for some sinful behavior. Peter was eating with Gentiles, and when some Jews arrived, Peter separated himself from the Gentiles out of fear of the Jews. Paul says that Peter's conduct "was not in step with the truth of the gospel" (Galatians 2:14), and he corrected Peter. While what Peter did was bad enough for himself, Paul also took issue with the effect that Peter's decision had on others. Verse 13 says, "And the rest of the Jews acted hypocritically along with him, so that even Barnabas was led astray by their hypocrisy."

It is interesting to me that Paul pointed specifically to how Barnabas was affected. While very little is provided in Scripture about Barnabas, we know that he is portrayed as a strong Christian and is often pointed to in teachings on godly encouragement, since his name means "son of encouragement" (Acts 4:36). When Paul began preaching following his conversion, some Christians in Jerusalem were understandably concerned that a man responsible for Christian persecution was now preaching the gospel. In Acts 10:27, we learn how Barnabas encouraged those Christians: "But Barnabas took him and brought him to the apostles and declared to them how on the road he had seen the Lord, who had spoken to him, and how at Damascus he had preached boldly in the name of Jesus." Later the text tells us that Barnabas "was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith" (Acts 11:24).

Considering Barnabas's reputation, it is clear why Paul would name Barnabas as one who was adversely affected by Peter's poor decision making. Even for the strongest Christians, who we surround ourselves with matters. If we surround ourselves with "bad company," we should not be surprised when our good morals become corrupted. In a world of sin, let us hold tight to the blessing of godly company. God loves you, and so do l.
