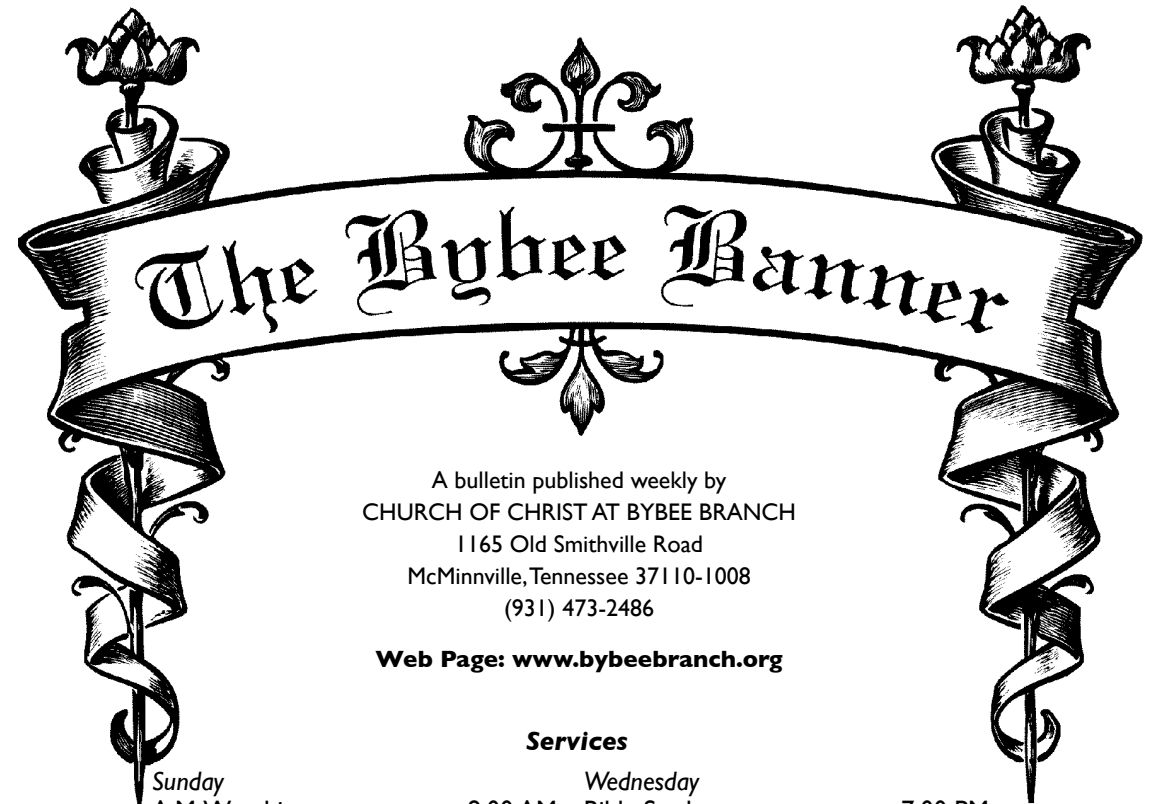

I Am One of Them (and So Are You)

If you were to look up the word "missionary" in a dictionary, the definition you would likely find right at the outset would be one that we all need to consider. According to Merriam-Webster, the very first definition is "a person undertaking a mission and especially a religious mission."

Now, if you were to keep reading definitions, you would come to a little more technical meaning of the word, and it would be more in line with what we typically think of when we use the term "missionary," especially in a church setting. Typically, we think of a missionary in a more limited or technical sense to mean a person who is sent by a congregation to a location or a group of people to seek to spread the Gospel.

But a missionary is simply, by definition, one who is on a mission. Is that not what each of us is supposed to be about? Do you not have a mission? It may not be to Fiji or India or even a state on the other side of our own country. Your mission might be your own children. It might be your neighborhood. It might be your place of business. It might be a local nursing home. It might be a civic club. The fact of the matter is, whatever we choose can be our mission field.

It is more than that, though. It really is that those places we go not only can be our mission field, it is that they must be! If we are followers of Jesus, He has sent us into the world to make disciples. We have a mission and our area of work is wherever our feet are currently touching the ground. The only question is whether or not we will choose to actually be on mission.

Today, where will you go? Will it be to a restaurant? A nursing home? A neighbor's house? Online? Expand that to more than just this one day. Where might you go during the course of a week? For most of us, that list will get quite lengthy, especially when we consider the possibility of "going," not just in person, but also through digital technology or via a phone call.

As you go, no matter to what location and no matter who you might be around, will you be on mission? Will you be looking for an opportunity to encourage someone? To comfort someone? To invite someone? Even to teach someone?

I am a missionary, and you are, too. Let's never forget to be on mission for the Lord.
