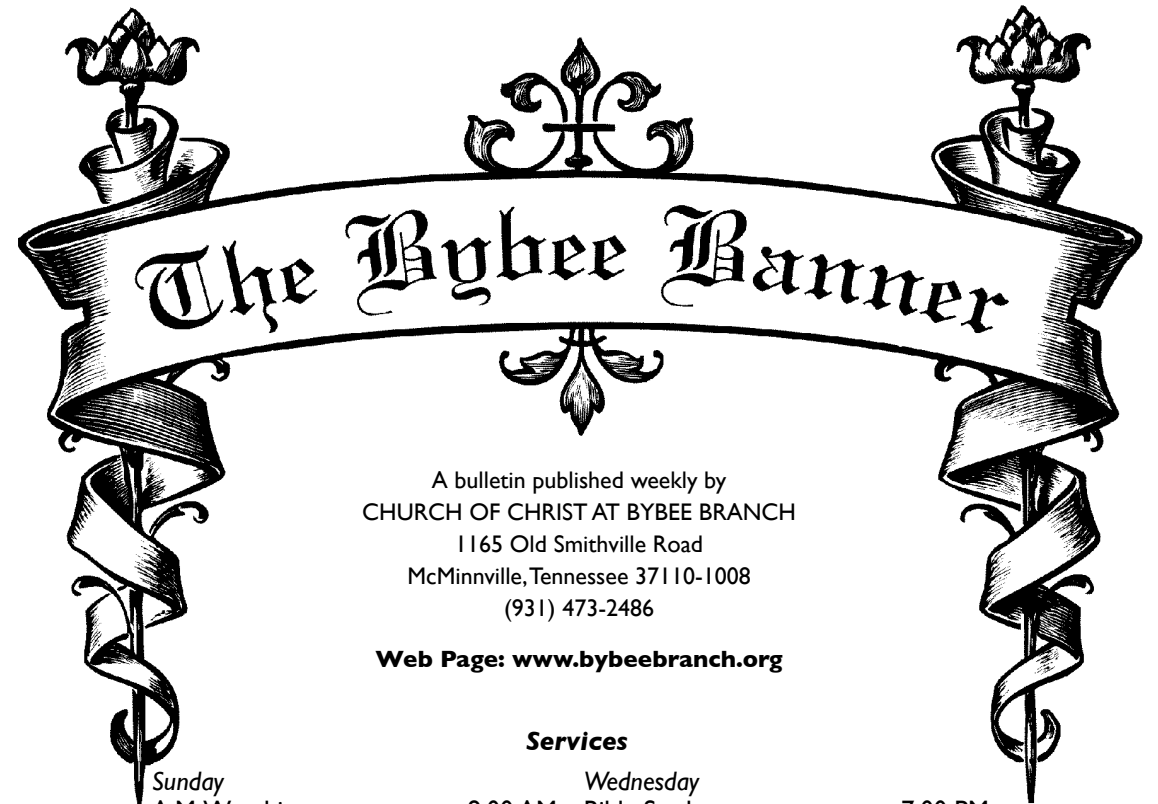

Sweet Peas In Psalms 23

For many centuries, millions have found comfort in reading and studying the 23rd Psalm, and who can deny its greatness! Please notice some of the "sweet Peas" in this Psalm:

1. P-ossession —"The Lord is my Shepherd." Of all the things one may possess, this is the greatest of all. If you cannot say that the Lord belongs to you since you have accepted Him in obedience, your soul faces eternal dangers daily. When health is good or bad, when the sun is shining or clouds dark, or when we must give in to death, to have the Lord is our greatest possession.

2. P-rovision —"I shall not want." When one becomes a Christian, he has every need of a Spiritual nature filled. We need light —Jesus says, "I am the Light of the world!" We need truth, Jesus says, "I am the way and the truth!" We need Spiritual food, Jesus says, "I am the bread of life!" We need consideration and Jesus says, "Come unto me and I will give you rest."

3. P-osition —"He maketh me to lie down in green pastures." There is contentment in Christ. Paul looked death in the face daily and suffered persecutions continually, and yet, he could say that he was content.

4. P-rogress —"He leadeth me beside the still waters." We are Pilgrims moving through this life toward eternity, and Jesus leads us in the right way. In the midst of a rushing, sinful world. He offers the tranquility of still waters.

5. P-ersonal —"He restoreth my soul." Jesus is concerned on an individual basis.

6. P-urpose —He leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake." How powerful is the name of Jesus. He has a name above all other names. He has a name of authority, therefore, I should do all in the name of the Lord!

7. P-arting —"Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death." Even in the most difficult time of our lives, our Lord will walk with us. For this great and last enemy will not stop our Lord. Since the bars of death could not hold him, we have the promise that they will not hold us. We will be resurrected to eternal life. Would you add these "Sweet Peas" to your Spiritual diet? And this is something to think about!

God Of The Second Mile

"Whoever forces you to go one mile, go with him two" (Matthew 5:41 NAU).

Jesus exhorts those who might be conscripted to serve the military for one mile to offer to go farther, even two miles. The purpose for conscripting a Jew might be to carry a load, or provide water, or lead a horse, or carry a cross for a condemned criminal as Simon did for Jesus. Jesus realizes the impact the second mile mentality would have on others. Going beyond the call of duty has always been a mark of greatness. But to do that to the glory of the Lord is even more impactful for good.

I titled this "God of the Second Mile" because Jesus never asked anyone to do anything He would not do Himself. Did He need to be baptized because He had sinned? No, of course not. He never sinned, but He did it because God commanded it, regardless of its purpose. Was He morally obligated to die for us on the cross? No, He voluntarily gave Himself up for us.

Jesus said the blessings of heaven will be like a master blessing his faithful servant. "His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful slave. You were faithful with a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master'" (Matthew 25:21). When Jesus stalled His trip to Bethany when Lazarus was ill, Lazarus died, and when Jesus arrived, Martha, in a disappointing tone, said that had Jesus been there her brother would not have died (John 11:21). She believed He could heal him. But Jesus wanted her to see He was willing to do far more than that for which she had hoped. He raised him from the dead.

Paul burst forth in exaltation of God and said, "Now to Him who is able to do far more abundantly beyond all that we ask or think, according to the power that works within us" (Ephesians 3:20). Our God is a God of the second mile. Someone said, "Grace is getting what we don't deserve, and mercy is not getting what we deserve." Someone added, "Blessings is when He is generous with both." Praise be to our Lord for His grace and mercy!
