

Discipleship in Christ

Discipleship is at the very heart of Christianity. Jesus' call to His followers was not simply to believe in Him, but to follow Him. In Matthew 16:24 (NKJV), He declared, "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me." To be a disciple of Christ means to live in complete devotion and obedience to His teachings. Within the Church of Christ, discipleship is viewed as a lifelong commitment to learning from Jesus, imitating His example, and helping others do the same.

The Call to Follow Christ

From the beginning, Jesus invited men and women into a relationship defined by obedience and transformation. When He called Peter, Andrew, James, and John, He said, "Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men" (Matthew 4:19). They left their nets immediately and followed Him. Their example shows that discipleship requires sacrifice and a willingness to leave behind worldly priorities. A disciple is one who puts Christ first in every area of life (Luke 14:33).

Discipleship begins with hearing and obeying the gospel. Faith comes by hearing the Word of God (Romans 10:17). That faith leads a person to repent of sin, confess Jesus as Lord, and be baptized for the forgiveness of sins (Acts 2:38; 22:16). Through baptism, one is united with Christ and begins a new life of following Him (Romans 6:3-4). Discipleship does not end at conversion—it begins there.

Learning and Living the Word

A true disciple of Christ is a continual learner. Jesus said, "If you abide in My word, you are My disciples indeed" (John 8:31). Discipleship means more than simply attending worship; it means allowing the Word of God to shape one's heart, mind, and actions. The early Christians in Acts 2:42 "continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers." They were dedicated students of the gospel and examples of what it means to live out faith daily. Members of the body of Christ are encouraged to study Scripture diligently, not to follow human creeds or traditions, but to follow the pure Word

of God. As Paul wrote to Timothy, "Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth" (2 Timothy 2:15). Through continual study, prayer, and obedience, disciples grow in the likeness of Christ.

Serving and Sharing

Discipleship also involves serving others. Jesus said, "The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve" (Matthew 20:28). Every disciple is called to follow this example of humble service. In the Lord's Church, believers are encouraged to use their abilities for the good of others—teaching, encouraging, helping the needy, and strengthening the church. True discipleship is seen in love and service.

Furthermore, disciples make other disciples. Jesus commanded, "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations" (Matthew 28:19). This Great Commission is central to the mission of the Church. Each member has the responsibility to share the gospel and help others come to know Christ. Discipleship, therefore, is both personal growth and active evangelism.

The Cost and the Reward

Discipleship requires commitment, endurance, and sometimes sacrifice. Jesus never promised that following Him would be easy, but He did promise that it would be worth it. "Be faithful until death," He said, "and I will give you the crown of life" (Revelation 2:10). The Church of Christ teaches that faithful discipleship leads to eternal reward—a home in heaven with the Lord.

In conclusion, Discipleship in Christ is more than a title; it is a way of life. It is a continual walk of faith, obedience, service, and love. A true disciple listens to Christ, learns from His Word, lives according to His will, and leads others to Him. As Jesus said in John 13:35, "By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another." May every member of the Lord's church strive daily to follow in His steps, growing in faith and devotion, and reflecting the light of Christ to a world in need of His truth and grace.
