

Hearing the Gospel

From the beginning of God's redemptive plan, hearing the Gospel has been essential to man's salvation. The Lord's church has long emphasized that faith is not produced by feelings, personal experiences, or inherited belief, but by hearing the revealed word of God. The New Testament repeatedly affirms that hearing the Gospel is the first necessary step in coming to Christ and obeying Him.

The apostle Paul plainly states, "So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" (Romans 10:17). Faith does not originate within the human heart apart from revelation; it is the result of exposure to God's inspired message. Without hearing the Gospel, there can be no genuine faith, and without faith, it is impossible to please God (Hebrews 11:6).

The Gospel itself is clearly defined in Scripture. Paul writes, "Moreover, brethren, I declare to you the gospel which I preached to you... that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures" (I Corinthians 15:1–4). Hearing the Gospel means hearing these divinely revealed facts concerning Jesus Christ—His death, burial, and resurrection—and understanding their meaning for our salvation.

Jesus emphasized the necessity of hearing during His earthly ministry. In the parable of the sower, He described different responses to the word, but the seed was always the same—the word of God (Luke 8:11). The condition of the heart determined whether the hearer benefited. Christ often concluded His teaching by saying, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear!" (Matthew 11:15). This highlights that hearing involves more than sound waves reaching the ear; it involves attentive, receptive listening that leads to obedience.

The book of Acts provides inspired examples of how people were saved, and in every case, the Gospel was first heard. On the Day of Pentecost, the apostles preached Christ to the Jews in Jerusalem. Luke records, "Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart" (Acts 2:37). Their hearing produced

conviction, which led them to ask what they must do. The Ethiopian eunuch likewise heard the Gospel when Philip "preached Jesus to him" (Acts 8:35). Only after hearing could he believe and obey by being baptized.

The church of Christ stresses that hearing must come before belief, repentance, confession, and baptism. This divine order is not accidental. Jesus commanded, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15). Preaching is required because people cannot respond to a message they have never heard. Paul asked rhetorically, "How shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard?" (Romans 10:14). This underscores the urgency of evangelism and sound teaching.

Hearing the Gospel also requires respect for biblical authority. Not every religious message is the Gospel. Paul warned of those who would preach "another gospel" which is not truly good news (Galatians 1:6–9). Therefore, the church must be diligent to proclaim the pure word of God, "speaking the truth in love" (Ephesians 4:15), without addition or subtraction. Only the message revealed by the Holy Spirit has the power to save.

Furthermore, hearing is an ongoing responsibility for Christians. While initial hearing leads one into Christ, continual hearing sustains faith. The early church "continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine" (Acts 2:42). Regular exposure to God's word strengthens, corrects, and equips believers for every good work (2 Timothy 3:16–17).

In conclusion, hearing the Gospel is foundational to God's plan of salvation. It is through hearing that faith is produced, hearts are convicted, and souls are moved to obedient response. Christians must continue to emphasize clear, scriptural teaching so that men and women may hear, believe, and obey the saving message of Jesus Christ. As Jesus said, "Blessed are those who hear the word of God and keep it!" (Luke 11:28).
