

On the back of this bulletin you will observe the averages in attendance and contribution for the year just ending. While these figures show a 7% increase Sunday morning Bible Study and Worship and Sunday evening worship, a 6% increase in contribution and a 5% increase in Wednesday evening attendance, they are not realy spectacular, but do show a steady growth.

Our Lord said, "A prophet is not without honor, save in his own country, and in his own house " (Matt. 13:57). But woe unto those who do thus!

It has been my rather disappointing lot to be told that I will not be invited to preach at a certain place(s) because of a stand against such things as adultery, immodesty, lodges, and worldliness in general! But be that as it may, my directions come from my Lord Jesus Christ, the Captain of our salvation. My preaching must be truth from His direct revelation by way of His Word. This truth cannot be neutralized by fair words to please family or friends—or members of the church at Bybee Branch or anywhere else that I may work.

May I say that the Elders under whom I have had the proper opportunity and privilege of serving as an evangelist have always held up my hands in my effort to preach the word without favor or exception. I pray that such will always be the case. The reward of preaching is the crown awaiting——given by the promise of God. (2 Tim. 4:8). My encouragement to all men who preach, especially younger men who begin the great work of proclaiming the Word, is to simply preach the word as it is written, making sure that your life is in conformity with the Word's teaching. God will bless your efforts——regardless of how some react to the truth. God's blessings——it is this we seek!

BETTER

by Owen G. Solomon

A key word to the book of Hebrews is the word <u>better</u>. The Hebrew writer shows, among other things, that the law of Christ is better than the law of Moses (Heb. 7:19. See also Heb. 8:6; 9:23). There are many other matters about which the Bible teaches the better of two choices that man might have. This article gives attention to a few of them.

Samuel told King Saul, "Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to hearken than the fat of rams (I Sam. 15: 22). Obedience is better than a sacrifice that is according to man's will and as a substitute for obeying the commands of God. Nadab and Abihu "offered strange fire before the Lord which he commanded them not." They died because of this disobedience (Lev. 10:1-2).

Jesus said, "This people draweth nigh unto me with their mouth, and honoreth me with their lips, but their heart is far from me. But in vain they do worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men," (Matt. 15:8-9). Obedience to God is better than following men's commandments.

Solomon said, "A good name is better than precious ointment, and the day of death than the day of one's birth." Indeed, a good name---reputation---is better than precious ointment---material gain. A further indication of this fact is found in the writer's statement, "Better is little with the fear of the Lord than great treasure and trouble therewith. Better is a dinner of herbs where love is than a stalled ox and hatred therewith" (Prov. 15:16).

For the faithful Christian, the day of death is better than the day of birth. Paul said, "For I am in a strait betwixt two, having a desire to depart and be with Christ which is far better" (Phil. 1:23). This is true because "Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his saints" (Psa. 116:16).

In summary, the Law of Christ is better than was the law of Moses. A good name is better than ointment, and death is better than birth. Mourning and sorrow are better than feasting and laughter. WRESTING SCRIPTURE by Joe David Neely

The idea of wresting scripture comes from II Peter 3:16. Peter is writing concerning what some men did to what Paul wrote as well as other scriptures. Peter said that some of what is written is hard for us to understand. This does not give anyone the right to "wrest" or give it his own meaning. Man must apply himself to understanding.

Who will "wrest" the scriptures? Peter names two classes. The unlearned (ignorant, ASV) and the unstable (unsteadfast) are those named. There are people who know better (learned people) who will not hold fast the truth. They will twist it to suit their own purpose. Men need to learn that God's word cannot be successfully altered. The warning is clear. (Galatians 1:8). Man destroys himself in this attempt, not God's word!

Men "wrest" the scripture in an effort to prove many ideas. An attempt is made to prove baptism is not essential to salvation; but Acts 2:38 and I Peter 3:21 still stand. Attempts are made to try to prove the Holy Spirit works apart from scripture in conviction, conversion and indwelling. Romans 8:14 says men are "led by the Spirit." Some assume that this is done directly. I Corinthians 3:16 says the Holy Spirit dwells in us who are Christians. Some assume this is direct and/or personal. When they have finished assuming and want some support for these positions the "wresting" begins. You see, the only way any support can be found (for such, gbr) is to "wrest the scriptures." Peter warns those who do such that they do it to their "own destruction." Let us be careful how we treat the word of God.

THE PURSUIT OF HAPPINESS

Written in our Declaration of Independence are these words: "We hold these truths to be self evident that all men are created equal; that they are endowed by their Creator with certain inalienable rights; that among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness." Note some dictionary definitions of "happiness" and its synonyms: 1) happiness—good luck, good fortune, prosperity, a state of well being and pleasurable satisfaction; 2) blessed——to wish well, to make happy, to make and be prosperous; 3) joy——a state of happiness, bliss; 4) rejoice——to feel joy or have great delight.



LOYALTY TO THE SCRIPTURES by John Waddey

God has spoken to us in the pages of our Bible (Heb. 1: 1-2). To be loyal to the Father we must be loyal to his divine book. Loyalty suggests that one is "unswerving in allegiance, faithful to a cause, ideal or custon" (Webster). Because one is loyal he will "buy the truth and sell it not" (Prov. 23:23). He will honor God by speaking his Word faithfully (Jer. 23:28). A loyal saint will contend for the faith (Jude 3) and defend the gospel (Phil. 1:16). Being loyal, we will pledge ourselves to God's Word as did David. (cf Psalms 119:97; 119:93; 119:34, 46.)

While every brother would loudly "Amen" the above sentiments, observation tells us that not all mean the same

thing when they speak of loyalty to the Word.

Some are loyal to the black, leather-bound book in a blind, emotional way. This loyalty is "fighting strong," yet fuzzy and nebulous in content. For in addition to the divine truths recorded in the book, they are fiercely loyal to their opinions about the Bible. They are loyal to interpretations of the Scriptures hallowed by long use even though incorrect. Even if it means denying obvious context or lexical meaning of a word, they will be loyal to the traditional view of a verse.

While loyalty is a commendable virtue and essential to salvation, blind loyalty is like blind faith. Only truth can make one free from error (John 8:32). Even as zeal without knowledge led the Jews into opposition to the faith of Jesus (Romans 10:2-3), so loyalty without proper knowledge will often set a man at variance with the truth of the gospel.

....God's great doctrines do not need irrational, unsound faulty interpretations or arguments to defend them. They have a more noble strength and foundation than that. The apostles never stopped to use "cunningly devised fables when (they) made known...the power and coming of our Lord Jesus" (2 Pet. 1:16), nor should we.

. . . Let each of God's children "give diligence to present (himself) approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, handling aright the word of truth" (2 Tim. 2:15).





The burial detail at Bataan found this poem on a 19-year-old lad from Indiana who lost his life in a bloody battle:

"And if our lines should sag and break, Because of things you failed to make--That extra tank, that ship, that plane
For which we waited all in vain;
Will you then come to take the blame?
For we, not you, must pay the cost
Of battles you, not we, have lost."

This is a burning indictment of industrial absenteeism---and how right was that lad! Bataan and many lives were lost for failure on the home front.

But we are concerned with the Army of the Lord. Around about us, millions die without hope because we do not furnish the means of their salvation. We haphazardly study God's word. We miss Bible Study and Worship. We half-heartedly work at our jobs. We give too little. Our vision is limited; and this neglect, this absenteeism, this idleness causes a dark blot on the church. "And Hilkiah the high priest said unto Shaphan the scribe, I have found the book of the law in the house of the Lord. And Hilkiah gave the book to Shaphan and he read it. . . . And Shaphan the scribe shewed the king, saying, Hilkiah the priest hath delivered me a book. And Shaphan read it before the king. And it came to pass, when the king had heard the words of the book of the law, that he rent his clothes. . . . and he read in their ears all the words of the book of the covenant which was found in the house of the Lord" (II Kings 22:8, 10,11; 23:2b).

The above is a part of the amazing story of the discovery of the book of the law, discovered in the house of the Lord, during the reign of the "boy-king" Josiah. It seems there are several pertinent observations and applications to our day.

Of all places to lose the book of the law---in the house (temple) of the Lord! Yet it happened. It still is happening! Of course we do now worship in a temple such as the temple at Jerusalem, yet we must worship God---and we do serve Him in His church! Is is possible that many have lost the book of the law in the house of the Lord today?

What of churches that are more interested in entertainment of young and old than they are in instructing them in the truths of Inspiration? What of people who must be prodded to even read the Scripture? What of sermons that deal with about everything except a "thus saith the Lord"? What of Bible class teachers that complain about the litterature they are using---as though they had to have such to teach (even the little ones) the Bible! Do we have to have something else <u>besides</u> the book of the law today?

Why do we hear questions asked by young and older alike which indicate a very superficial or shallow knowledge of the teachings of God's Way? In the very young in Christ this can be excused because they are babes---but inthose who are older---WHY?

Study the context of II Kings in the days of Josiah and note the corruption in their religion——all because they had forgotten for a couple of generations that the book of the law IS IN THE HOUSE OF THE LORD and that that book must be read and followed. Then follow this admonition!



David said, "Teach me thy way, O Lord, and lead me in a plain path . . . " (Ps. 27:11). He also said, "Order my steps in thy Word" (Ps. 119:133). That plain path is (continued on p. 3)

THE PLAIN PATH (continued from p. 2)

God's Word. "The entrance of thy words giveth light; it... giveth understanding unto the simple" (Psa. 119:130). The truth is plain to him that understandeth (Prov. 8:9).

While there are some things hard to understand, Jesus and the Apostles spoke plainly about:

- 1) Salvation from sin. It is plain. Believe in Jesus or die in your sins (John 8:24). Repent or perish (Luke 13:3). Confess His name or be denied by Him (Matt. 10:32-33). Be buried into His death by baptism or be condemned (Mark 16:16; Acts 2:38; Rom. 6:3-4).
- 2) The Church. "... upon this rock I will build my church" (Matt. 16:18). "There is one body.." (Eph. 4:4). That one body is the church (Col. 1:18).
- 3) Heaven. Jesus said, "In my Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also. And whither I go ye know, and the way ye know." (John 14:2-4).
- 4) Hell. "And fear not them which kill the body, but are not able to kill the soul: but rather fear him which is able to destroy both body and soul in hell" (Matt. 10:28). "And in hell he lifted up his eyes, being in torments. . ."(Luke 16:23). Hell is everlasting. . . forever (Matt. 25:46).

Take any subject, find what the Word of God says and you will have the plain truth. The ways of men are not the ways of God (Isa. 55:8-9). That plain path that the Lord leads one in is His Word. The question is: Are You Walking In That Plain Path? (Jeremiah 6:16).




