Bro. Charles Williamson, preacher for the Church Street congregation in Lewisburg, Tenn. will be preaching. Let's get ready!!! IS IT LAWFUL (RIGHT ACCORDING TO THE SCRIPTURES) FOR A MAN TO PUT AWAY (DIVORCE) HIS WIFE FOR EVERY (ANY) CAUSE?"

The above question appears in the context of Matthew 19:3-9 which reads:

"The Pharisees also came unto him, tempting him and saying unto him, Is it lawful for a man to put away his wife for every cause? And he answered them and said unto them, Have ye not read, that he which made them at the beginning made them male and female, And said, For this cause shall a man leave father and mother, and shall cleave to his wife: and they twain shall be one flesh? Wherefore they are no more twain, but one flesh. What therefore God hath joined together, let not man put asunder. They say unto him. Why did Moses then command to give a writing of divorcement, and to put her away? He saith unto them, Moses, because of the hardness of your hearts suffered you to put away your wives: but from the beginning it was not so. And I say unto you, Whosoever shall put away his wife, except it be for fornication, and shall marry another, committeth adultery: and whose marrieth her which is put away doth commit adultery."

So far as I know, everyone who believes the Bible will agree that if a man divorces his wife for any reason other than sexual infidelity and then marries another woman that he and the new partner are living in adultery (having committed it and continuing in it). This is the teaching of the text.

But there is another part of this text than many seem very willing to overlook. The very question that brought on this discussion was, 'Is it lawful for a man to put away his wife for every cause?' While some will argue that a man (or woman) may put away his mate for whatever reason (through divorce) and that he can still be acceptable to God just so long as he does not remarry, the Lord teaches just the opposite! It is a sin for a man to divorce his wife for just any cause! A man is allowed of God to divorce his wife ONLY if she is guilty of sexual unfaithfulness. If he does otherwise he is guilty of sin---breaking the covenant he made with God and her when he became "one flesh with her."

To argue otherwise is to represent that which our Lord did not authorize and is thus to be a false teacher.

SOME BASIC THOUGHTS

by Carrol Ellis Chapel Avenue Bulletin Nashville, TN

There is no way to understand the church of Christ without understanding our commitment to Restoration New Testament Christianity. We are different on purpose. We do have an unique religion. To today's divided religious world, we present a challenge. Most people laugh at religious beliefs. It is the only bizarre and way-out ones that are mentioned. Most people would say; "It doesn't make any difference what you believe as long as you are sincere." That is not right. It is not true in physics, in dealing with chemicals, in driving a car, in balancing your budget, or in how you will live and where you will spend eternity.

If the New Testament reveals what the church is to be in every age, then it does make a difference what we believe and how we serve the Lord.

For example, the Bible teaches baptism as immersion and only immersion and it is for the remission of sins. Most churches do not see it this way. They ask, "What difference does it make?" The answer from the Bible is the only baptism you can find in the New Testament is immersion. Look at the baptism of Jesus and the baptisms recorded in the book of Acts. Remember that New Testament baptism is a re-enactment of the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Paul made this clear in Romans 6:3-4:

"Know ye not, that so many of us as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death? Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death; that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life."

What was the purpose of baptism in New Testament times? It was for the remission of sins (Acts 2:38) so that sins would be washed away (Acts 22:16). Every time baptism and salvation are mentioned together in the same New Testament passage, baptism is mentioned first and salvation depends on baptism. There is no exception.... Only when we obey God do we exalt Him.

ATTITUDES AND THE BIBLE

Or hi: that ne im sse it len st ys the religious world today is the great divergence of practice of religion by various churches. One is then forced to wonder why such exists. Is the Bible or God to be faulted for such?

The real reason such a wide difference of practice is the attitude with which one approaches the Bible. For instance, if one approaches the Bible with the view that it is the very words of God, then, that person will likely be very careful to follow every detail in regards to worship and life. On the other hand, if one's view of the Bible is that it is a book from God but has the mistakes and imperfections of man in it, then, it is quite likely that such a person will not be nearly so careful in adherence to every detail. If one's attitude is that the Bible is but one book among many "inspired" books, then, it is likely that he will be quite open to practice many things in addition to what the Bible teaches.

What is the solution? Must one throw up his hands in hopeless despair? Not at all! If one uses the Bible he must do so as the Bible presents itself. The Bible does not present itself as a book as a product of men who were subject to mistake in its production. The words that they wrote are claimed to have been produced through the influence and direction of the Holy Spirit (1 Cor. 2:10-16; 2 Tim. 3:16,17; 2 Pet. 1:20,21). Neither is the Bible presented as "a" book among many books but is presented as "the" Book. It claims to be all that is needed to live holy and godly lives (2 Pet. 1:3)

God is not to be faulted with the great confusion which exists in the religious world today. "For God is not a God of confusion, but of peace." (1 Cor. 14:33). The fault lies with man who had brought all of his foreign attitudes with him as he has approached the Bible.

FROM THE PREACHER'S PEN

The Example of Paul

(II Tim. 3:10-13)

Tony Lawrence

The third chapter of Second Timothy is a contrast veen icker s of god the y example of Paul. The verses under consideration in this article will concentrate on the example of Paul.

First, Paul stated to Timothy, "thou didst follow my..."
These words come from an original word which indicate to "follow closely as in an investigation." Luke used the same word to indicate his research about the life of Christ (cf. Lk. 1:3). Thus, Timothy was a student, not only of the sacred writings, but also of the life of Paul.

Second, in the remainder of verse 10, Paul lists seven items in his life which Timothy had closely followed. These items could and did make Timothy a better servant of the Lord and can do the same for any Christian today. It was Paul himself who said that we should pattern our lives after his as he patterned his life after the Lord (cf. I Cor. 11:1). Consider then the following items which Paul enjoined:

Teaching — Timothy had carefully followed the teaching of Paul as is evident by many verses. Perhaps the clearest statement is found in verses 14-17. There Paul enjoins the inspired Scriptures for teaching. Without doubt there are no other New Testament books which emphasize the necessity of avoiding false standards of truth such as fables, genealogies, and old wives' fables as do the letters to the young preacher Timothy. It is not insignificant that this appears first in Paul's list!

Conduct — Just one example will show that the conduct of Paul was above reproach. When funds were being collected for the needy saints at Jerusalem, Paul had several brethren travel with him in the administration of collecting and protecting the funds. In this regard he said, "for we take thought for things honorable, not only in the sight of the Lord, but also in the sight of men" (II Cor. 8:21).

Purpose — Paul had clearly lived his life with a single minded purpose (cf. I Cor. 2:2; Phil. 3:13, 14). Paul's single purpose in life was the salvation of souls. He said, "...I am become all things to all men, that I may by all means save some. And I do all things for the gospel's sake..." (1 Cor. 9:22b, 23).

The above article was printed in the FIRM FOUNDATION ON Feb. 7, 1984 on pages 5 & 6.

Faith — In the very next chapter (4:7), Paul tells Timothy

the "kep faith oppo osc ke

Hymenaeus and Alexander who "made shipwreck
concerning the faith" or those ungodly men whom Paul

I jus tion bein "robe neer he
faith." Sadly, but today many do not see the necessity of
remaining true to THE FAITH. Paul's trust was in God,
a confidence which could not be shaken by the world of
man.

Longsuffering — In his epistles, Paul uses this word at least ten times. In several instances it refers to the act of God putting up with man. When it refers to man it means patience in trying circumstances. When looking at the conduct of Paul with such churches as those of Corinth and Galatia, one can truly see the longsuffering of Paul.

Love — The characteristic sign of Christians is their love one for another (Jn. 13:35). The great love chapter of the Bible, I Cor. 13, was penned by Paul himself.

Patience — This word means, as is indicated by the ASV margin, stedfastness. The Hebrew writer taught that in running the race of life, patience/stedfastness is a necessary quality (Heb. 12:1). In the next chapter, Paul considered that in the race of life, he himself had "finished the course" (4:7).

Third, after listing the seven items of imitation, Paul proceeded to discuss his example in persecution. [The record of these persecutions may be found in Acts 13:45, 50; 14:15, 19.] The subject of faithful service under persecution is prevalent in this whole letter (cf. 1:8; 2:3; 4:5; et. al.). Paul goes on to remind Timothy that all who live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution. This is not just a situational statement, but one that applies to all ages and generations. The persecution may come in various forms and on more intense levels but "all that would live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution." If one is not suffering for his faith and life, then perhaps he should take a careful look at his life to make sure that he is not compromising with the world! This would be especially true for preachers.

Finally, Timothy and we too are to be reminded that the evil and imposters are always with us. They grow worse every day deceiving those whom they can and then finally being deceived themselves. However, take heart, God delivered Paul and he will deliver us one day (II Tim. 4:18)!

THOUGHTS ON HITCH-HIKING

Have you ever been driving along the road when suddenly you saw a hitch-hiker ahead? His thumb-signal is giving a message loud and clear, you furnish the car, the gasoline, the time and do the driving, I'll ride with you, but, you're nuts if you think that I'm gonna chip in with any gas money; bu the way, if you have an accident and I'm injured, I'll sue you for everthing you have."

In just about every congregation you'll find this very same kind of attitude. Yes, there are hitch-hikers in the Lord's church! They say in one way or another, "If you supply and attractive building, lights, heat and air conditioning, so that I will be comfortable as I listen to the preacher, I'll ride along with you for a while. But you're crazy if you think I'm gonna chip in with any real financial support. Nor will I be involved with personal work, visitation, benevolence, etc. By the way, if anything happens that irritates me, you'll hear from me! So on my own term, I'll ride along with you."

FALSE PROPHETS

by Benny Bristow

William Barclay tells the story of an old man who, when facing death, was very troubled. When asked what it was that was disturbing him he replied, "One day when I was young I was playing with some other boys at a crossroad. We reversed a signpost so that its arms were pointing in the wrong direction, and I've never ceased to wonder how many people were sent in the wrong direction by what we did."

We can appreciate this man's concern about the wrong he did while young, but even more serious would be those that do wrong in leading souls away from God. In all ages there have been false prophets — those who claim to speak God's truth, but are speaking lies. Jesus referred to false teachers as blind guides and said: "Leave them; they are blind guides. If a blind man lead a blind man, both will fall into a pit" (Matt. 15:14).

There are two major responsibilities placed upon all in regard to teaching and preaching the word. First of all, a great responsibility is placed upon a speaker. This is why James wrote: "Not many of you should presume to be teachers, my brothers, because you know that we who teach will be judged more strictly" (James 3:1). Only God's word in its purity leads souls to Christ for salvation, thus false teaching leads one away from Christ. Jesus said of Himself: "I am the way, and the truth, and the life: no one cometh unto the Father but by me" (John 14:6). Thus, those who stand before you to teach or preach, have an obligation to speak the truth. Paul felt this responsibility to the point that he said: "For if I preach the Gospel, I have nothing to glory of; for necessity is laid upon me; yea, woe is unto me, if I preach not the gospel" (I Cor. 9:16). To the Galatians He warned: "But though we, or an angel from heaven, preach any other gospel other than that which we have preached unto you, let him be accursed" (Gal. 1:8). Therefore, it is plain to see that God places a great burden upon those that proclaim His word.

However, let me remind you that the responsibility does not begin and end with the speaker. God places a responsibility upon the hearer! Jesus taught: "Take heed what ye hear" (Mark 4:24). As Paul and company traveled on the second missionary journey, Luke praised the Bereans in the following way: "These were more noble than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the word with all readiness of mind, searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so" (Acts 17:11). We must not accept everything that is said in religion without study. Since our eternal souls are at stake, shouldn't we accept the truth from God's word? And this is something to think about!



SHOULD A CHRISTIAN CELEBRATE "CHRISTMAS?"

The question asked in the title of this article is usually of some concern to many about this time of the year. Many wish to participate in the rio est lies at en wor if y a rig! in sping To answer this question correctly we will have to approach it on two levels.

rirst may the church set aside a day in which to celebrate the birth of christ? No! we have no biblical authority for 30 dc.mg. '... Biblicell us that "whatsoever ye do, in word or in deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus..." (Col. 3:17). This means for everything we do we need a "thus saith the Lord." If we may celebrate the birth of Christ without Bible authority the flood gate for anything and everything is open.

Second, on a personal level may one choose to decorate his house, give gifts to his family and friends, and even personally remember and give thanks that the Lord was born? Most certainly. Some would question the distinction between what an individual may do and what the church may do but the home is quite different from the church. In my home I may choose various forms of wholesome entertainment but which would be sinful if introduced into the church. But some may object that the use of trees and ornaments can be traced back to pagan of years ago. In Paul's day there were some who had questions about meat which had been sacrificed to an idol. Paul said, "But food will not commend us to God: neither, if we eat not, are we the worse; nor, if we eat, are we the better." (1 Cor. 8:8). The idol did not affect it. The problem came in when the person who ate it attached some significance to it and violated his conscience. For, says Paul, "All things indeed are clean; howbeit it is evil for that man who eateth with offence." (Rom. 14:20). There is nothing in a tree or the decorating of it. It is only when one falls prey to some pagan doctrine or violates his conscience that it becomes wrong. And, surely no one would question the giving of gifts, for even the Lord himself said, "It is more blessed to give than receive." (Acts 20:35). But, someone might say, "I agree with you except you said that one may remember the Lord's birth on that day and we do not know when the Lord was born." Yes we do not know when the Lord was born. However, the Bible does not forbid Christians, on an individual basis, exalting a day for special significance for himself. Some of the Jews evidently felt strong about certain "holy days" to which they had become accustomed. To which Paul said, "One man esteemeth one day above another: another esteemeth every day alike. Let each man be fully assured in his own mind. He that regardeth the day, regardeth it unto the Lord." (Rom. 14:5,6). The problem came about when they were judging one another bec

What has been the point of this article? To emphasize strongly that the introduction of a "Christmas" service into the church would definitely be sinful because it would be unauthorized by scripture. On the other hand, Christians should not feel guilty if they wish to be kind and benevolent at this time of the year nor should they shun thinking about the Lord's birth at this time of the year. A word of caution is in order. In all areas of personal liberty we must be careful not to cause others to stumble. We should be willing to limit our liberty at such time that it may cause others to sin.





CONGRATULATIONS: Richard and Gennean Black became the proud parents of 8 pound baby girl last Thursday. Here name is Angela Suzanne.


RESPONSES: Brother and Sister Bill Biles came forward last Sunday A.M. confessing fault. Let's all encourage them and one another to live faithful lives.

..... SOME SURPRIZING NEWS ...

I quite often am kidded about how little a preacher works. It was the same when I worked at a bank. Not too long ago I came across this article which surprized even me.

The average sermon contains 5,000 words. Most preachers deliver at least 90 sermons per year. This totals 450,000 word per year. An average full-length novel contains 50,000 words, so this means that a preacher is producing the equivalent of nine full-length novel each year. Whew! No wonder I feel so tired! In twent years a preacher produces the equivalent of 180 full-length novels. In fifty years that would be a whopping 450! How many authors do you suppose could produce nine full-length novels each year for twenty (or forty) years, using the same basic theme or "plot," without sinking to the depths of repetition and boredom even if he could do it at all? can you imagine the study, preparation, research, time and effort that would go into such a project? Neither can I! But it does answer a question that sometimes bemuses brethren concerning what preachers do. One thing for sure, preaching is no place for the lazy unmotivated person who is looking for a soft way to make a living.
