MY PLANS FOR THE NEW YEAR

Everyone should have plans. Unless one knows where he is going, he will not know it when he arrives. I suppose every preacher has some sort of most many times they term no one. I want the whole congregation to know where I would like for us to be and I hope that you will help me to see my plans realized.

The first thing I would like to see is a consistent level of attendance at all of the worship services. The fact that we generally have 60-70 people less at Bible Classes and close to 100 less at the Evening Worship is, in my opinion, an insult to the Lord. We, for the most part, do anything we want to do. I hope in the coming year to be able to convince at least part of our number how important it is for them to be in all of the services they possibly can. I realize that there will always be sick and visitors but we need to work on this!

The second thing I would like to see is a fervent evangelistic program which will see many non-christians baptized into Christ. Some wish to grow at the expense of drawing other Christians from other congregations of the Lord's church. It is my desire that we grow by converting the lost to Christ. We have great opportunity before us. There are many homes within literal sight of the building that need to hear the gospel for the first time. It is simply not enough to just say, "If they want to come they can." We must go out and invite them (cf. Matt. 22:10). I would like to see us have a consistent number of at least 400 during the next year and that growth to come primarily from new converts.

The third thing I would like to see is spiritual growth in individual members. I would like for the majority of the congregation stronger in the faith with greater Bible knowledge in the new year. This does not imply a lack of teaching before. It only says that I desire for us to grow, including myself!

Finally, I would like to see several things continue and even flourish. Sometimes when one or a group exceed in one areas they fall deficient in others. I would like to see our young people (men and women) continue to grow spiritually and become more involved. I would like to see our keen interest in mission work continue and each of us try to pray for and show interest in the works. There is definitely a spirit of unity and good will that exists in the congregation now, I strongly wish to see that continue.

These goals are rather general and broad but I believe that they are attainable. To accomplish them, however, it will take work and following the lead of our Elders.






NEWS AND NOTES

SHOW HIM HIS FAULT

Jesus said, "And if thy brother sin against thee, go, show him his fault between thee and him alone: if he hear thee, thou hast gained thy brother." (Matt. 18:15). There is much to be said about the instructions of Jesus in this passage (vss. 15-20) but one lesson is quite often overlooked, that one has the obligation to show a person wherein he has sinned against him and just exactly what that fault is.

Among our brethren there have always existed extremes. At times these extremes have been more pronounced than others. Today there are many who evidently wish to ignore the sins of others. This cannot be done with the approval of God! These brethren wish to emphasize the love and mercy of God to the exclusion of His truth and justice. True love for a soul will cause one to do as Jesus saro, "... if my mother sin, abunchin, and if he repent, forgive him" (Lk. 17:3). However, on the other extreme are some brethren who will make no effort to correct the situation but will it allied shi it! we intend to all yro Final the wicked Jezebel, who taught and seduced God's servants to commit fornication and eat things sacrificed to idols, was given "time that she should repent." (Rev. 2:21). One must be shown his sin, given time to understand that he has violated His laws, before any disciplinary action takes place. It is only when a person makes no effort to correct his life that further action must take place.

What, however, is involved in showing one his fault? First and foremost, the one doing the showing must know wherein that person has erred. It simply not enough to say, "I don't like what you are doing." If it is not a violation of God's law then there is no sin. Paul stated, "... but where there is no law, neither is there transgression." (Rom. 4:15). enemies of Jesus were constantly railing at him and inpugning him. His response was, "which of you convicteth me of sin? If I say the truth, why do ye not believe me?" (Jn. 8:46). To have the right to rebuke another one must have the scriptures to back him up. Second, one must be faithful to God. To the Galatians Paul said, "Brethren, even if a man be overtaken in a trespass, ye who are spiritual, restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness; looking to thyself, lest thou also be tempted." [Gal. 6:1]. The spiritual man of this passage is one who has the heavenly things in mind rather than the fleshly (cf. 1 Cor. 3:1; Eph. 1:3). The one trying to help a brother with a problem in his life is first to have taken care of the problems in his own life. Jesus taught, "Thou hypocrite, cast out first the beam out of thine own eye; and then shalt thou see clearly to cast out the mote out of the brother's eye." (Matt. 7:5). One must have truth and right in mind and have his affairs in order lest the person being shown his fault see the hypocrisy and reject all admonitions. Finally, there must be a patient, yet plain, presentation of the truth. In the previous reference to the Galatians Paul stated that it was to be in a "spirit of gentleness." It may be that the person who has erred has done so with intention and needs careful handling. Also, the rebuke of the erring one must be clear and plain. God told Habakkuk to make the vision so plain that the person who read it could run at the same time (Hab. 2:2).

The result of this action should result in gaining one's brother. And, after all, that was the intention in the first place. We should desire to be right with all our brethren. If we are not, show him his fault. Or perhaps, are we the ones at fault?

SOME SUGGESTIONS FOR TEACHING THE GOSPEL

When we approach someone to teach

them the Gospel how are we to proceed?



When one considers what the Bible has said he sees that the Gospel was taught to different people with different types of methods but some things are common.

1. <u>leach with respect to your hearer.</u>

No true salesman would ever insult his

- No true salesman would ever insult his prospective client. Christians cannot afford to be arrogant nor disrespectful.
- 2. Teach with a knowledge of your hearer and his background. Such was the key to Paul's lesson in Acts 17. He knew that the men of Athens were not knowledgeable concerning the Old Test-

ament neither did they believe in it. Thus, Paul spoke with an understanding of their background.

- 3. <u>Begin to teach your prospect at the point where he is</u>. If the prospect already believes in the existence of God, the inspiration of the Bible, and the deity of Jesus Christ one should begin to show that the Bible teaches the one church. However, if one does not accept one of the previous points he would begin there. Too many times teachers either wear out their prospects with information which they already accept or they begin too far down the line. Philip and the Eunuch are a good example. Philip began at the scripture where the Eunuch had a problem and explained the truth about Jesus Christ and then the church.
- 4. <u>Do your best and leave God the rest</u>. We can only plant and water, God gives the increase. When we have made an earnest effort to teach and it has been rejected, we should realize that the blood is off our hands and that we have fulfilled our mission for God. It is the job of a teacher to be a watchman. He is to warn of impending disaster to those who do not obey. If they do not heed the warning, it is their own fault! Many of the greatest men of God were unsuccessful in their attempts to get men to change their sinful ways, in the same way many of us may be unsuccessful in getting men today to turn from their sinful ways. We can only do our best and leave the rest to God. However, we should make sure we are doing our best!



Someone has said, "If the shoe fits, wear it!" We sometimes say, "I'd hate to be in his shoes." I think everyone of us will fit into one of these styles of shoes. Which?

LOAFER - "Thou wicked and slothful servant" (Matt. 25:26). "Be not slothful in business" (Rom. 12:11).

OVERSHOES - Puts on Christianity only when the going gets rough. Wants the prayers and visits of the preacher only when in trouble.

HOUSESHOES - This person wants things easy, comfortable. He is scared off by a building program, mission work, benevolent work, etc. He can't worship in bad weather. "Woe unto them that are at ease in Zion." (Amos 6:1).

SANDALS - Just a skeleton of a Christian; didn't grow into well-nounded service. "As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby." (I Pet. 2:2).

SUNDAY SHOES - Once-a-week Christians. "If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me." (Lk. 9:23).

WORK SHOES - The active Christian who is always on the job for the Lord. "I must work the works of him that sent me while it is day: the night cometh when no man can work" (In. 9:4). "Son, go work today in my vineyard" (Matt. 21:28).

We should all remember: "Today (NOW) is the day of salvation..." (2 Con. 6:2). Pay I ask again, "What Kind of Shoe Best Describes You?"

THE ANOINTED ELBOW

"He hath showed strength with his arm..." (Lk.1:51)

A few centuries ago, the ordination of a king was a thorough affair. When Charles II was crowned, not only was he anointed on the head, but also on the palms of his hands, on his chest, and on each elbow.

Now I think the anointing of the elbow was a wonderful concept because the elbow is the symbol of action. We talk about "elbow grease" when we're describing the need to get something done with all urgency. We mean by it, to put every ounce of energy and force behind a project. Often our minds and hearts are set on doing God's will, yet our elbows have never truly been anointed. Maybe we have a mind to work but we've never shifted out of idle. The fellow was right who said: "Some people fail to recognize opportunity because it so often comes to them in overalls and looks like work."

The churches that are growing today are more than talkers - they are doers. They dream their plan, plan their work, and work their plan. Too often, we downplay the success of vibrant congregations by saying, "They were just lucky to be in the right place at the right time!" But great churches aren't built on luck, they're built on labor.

I like the words of Gobden in Link: "Luck is waiting for something to turn up. Labor, with keen eyes and strong will, will turn up something. Luck lies in bed, and wishes the postman would bring him news of a legacy. Labor turns out at six o'clock and with busy pen or ringing hammer lays the foundation of a competence. Luck whines. Labor whistles. Luck relies on chance. Labor depends on character. Luck slips down to indigence. Labor strives upward to independence."

Let's admit it, great things seldom happen by chance. We make things happen when we're willing to apply the "elbow grease" and roll up the sleeves. The time has arrived to engage the Lord's work joyously and wholeheartedly as a mighty army. "Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do it with thy might" (Ecclesiastes 9:10).



pologize if this title seems out of place or a bit inappropriate. But this is exactly how many in the church view this great memorial supper - as if it were a "take out orc 7." It seems as if there are some in the Lord's church toc y that are again seeking the convenient "altars of Dan anu Bethel" as an alternative to that which pleases God.

What I am referring to specifically is the partaking of the Lor-'s Supper "on the run." That is, coming to worship wil the willful intentions of only to partake of the Lord's Surper and then slipping out, or in some cases, boldly walking out to go about their implied - more important business of the day. I realize this has been occurring for sor by time; however, many are now more boldly letting it be lown. It is almost reminiscent of the days of Jeremiah. "were they ashamed when they had committed abomination? nay, they were not at all ashamed, neither could they blu 1..." (Jer. 6:15). On one occasion I personally wil essed a man who came early, before services, walked down the aisle, served himself of the bread and cup, walked back to the door, greeted me, then climbed into a big nic truck with a trailer on the back and went on his way.

those who find nothing wrong with such a practice, I

would like to ask a few questions.

1) What scripture is being used to show the importance of the Lord's Supper above and beyond the importance of ass inbling together?

Where in scripture is it stated or implied that the sole purpose of coming together on the first day of the week

was to eat the Lord's Supper?

Does Hebrews 10:25 speak to those who were forsak g the assembling together or to those who were forsaking only to eat the Lord's Supper?

4) How can one logically reason that if I come at the becinning of the services and leave I have assembled with

the aints?

Since we are also commanded to give on the first day of the week (1 Cor. 16:1, 2), then why could not one just come by and drop off their contribution and then leave? If

one command can be emphasized more than the other, certainly the Lord's church would benefit more from a strict adherence to this command than the others.

6) Does one honestly believe that as long as one partakes of the Lord's Supper faithfully he (or she) will be saved, even though they failed to attend faithfully, exhort faithfully, admonish faithfully, and fellowship faithfully each Lord's day and times of assembling?

7) How does rushing in to eat the Lord's Supper and then rushing out to enjoy the day tend to set an example for our

children to seek first the kingdom of God?

The Bible tells us that the Lord's church "continued stedfastly in the apostle's doctrine and fellowship, and in breaking of bread, and in prayers" (Acts 2:42, emphasis mine, ib). The Lord's church assembled to give on the first day of the week (1 Cor. 16:2). The Lord's church was commanded to exhort one another by assembling (Heb. 10:25), and by singing that taught and admonished each other (Col. 3:16). How can we continue to neglect these commands and feel good about keeping just one? James says, "For whosoever shall keep the whole law, and yet offend in one point, he is guilty of all" (James 1:10). Jesus revealed to the church at Smyrna "be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life." Was Christ just referring to eating the Lord's Supper?

If we are "on the run" maybe we need to slow down and decide who we are running for. Jesus said "No man can serve two masters...ye cannot serve God and mam-

mon" (Matt. 6:24).



THE SHROUD OF TURIN

Many Christians have been made to wonder about the famed "Shroud of Turin." In the past few years this famous cloth, reported to be the burial cloth of Jesus, has been discussed on such programs as 20/20 and "That's Incredible." Many famous scientists have staked their reputation on the authenticity of the cloth. On the T.V. programs computers were used to enhance the image. Expert photographers were employed to reverse the image to give a exact reproduction as to what Jesus would have actually looked like. Chemists have

explained how the image was made by the sweat and blood of Christ. The exact location of the wounds would indicate that the burial cloth covered one who had been crucified and who had wounds on both hands, feet, head, and side. Thus, it has been concluded that this MUST have been the burial cloth of Christ.

Pope Paul VI stated that it was "the most important relic in the history of Christianity." (U.S. Catholic, May 1978). Pope Sixtus IV stated, "men may look upon the true blood and portrait of Jesus Christ Himself." (The Catholic Encyclopedia, Vol. XIII, 1912, p. 762).

However, it is remarkable to what extent that man will go to find a relic and prove it authenticity without checking out the most accurate source, the Bible! Untold thousands and possibly millions have been spent to prove that this was the burial cloth of Christ when a simple consideration of what the Bible teaches would prove that it simply cannot be. It cannot be the burial cloth of Christ for two reasons: [1] The shroud is a single piece of cloth, 14 feet long by 4 feet wide. Yet, the Bible says, "and the napkin, that was upon his head, not lying with the linen cloths, but rolled up in a place by itself." (Jn. 20:7) There was more than one cloth and the head had a separate cloth by itself. [2] The body of Jesus was buried according to "the custom of the Jews" (Jn. 19:40) which would mean that the body of Jesus would have been washed prior to the application of the spices. (Note that Dorcas was washed after her death, Acts 9:37). No sweat, no picture!

All of this goes to show that some men would rather worship a mere cloth more than to follow the Truth!

The Christian and Dancing

Just what should be the Christian's reaction to dancing? It is a problem for today's young person. On the one hand, they are confronted with their peers who ridicule them for not attending a dance because their parents say that it isn't right, and they are not fully convince just exactly what is wrong with dancing. On the other hand, they are bombarded with many who say, "you should not dance" but give them no good reason. May I suggest that you consider:

- (1) In Bible times there were dances that were right and there were dances that were wrong. David danced before the Lord in II Sam. 6:14,16. However, in Matt. 14:6, the dancing of Herodias' daughter aroused Herod so that he did that which he otherwise would not have done.
- (2) When one considers the difference between the two types of dancing he notes that one expresses joy, while the other is done for the gratification of the physical desires. By all means Christians should avoid those things which entice, But put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make not provision for the flesh, to fulfill the lusts thereof. (Rom. 13:14).
- (3) Many will say, "well, it is just for one time" referring to the proms or special dances. Sin is a transgression of God's Law (I Jn. 3:4). To purposefully entice someone else, or to put yourself in a position to be enticed is certainly not in keeping with God's law. Sin is sin, and whether one time or one thousand, it will have to be repented of before one can stand clean and whole in God's sight. ...walk in the ways of thy heart, and in the sight of thine eyes; but know thou, that for all these things God will bring thee into judgement. (Ecc. 11:9). (TL)



A Time for Self-Apprecial

What is your view of yourself? Do you view yourself as being righteous and with little need for forgiveness? So often men find themselves thinking that everything is fine when all is not fine. In the wisdom of the book of Proverbs we find, "There is a generation that are pure in their own eyes, and yet are not washed from their filthiness." (Prov. 30:12). Paul spoke of the folly of comparing oneself with himself or other sinful creatures round about when he wrote the Corinthians, "For we are not bold to number or compare ourselves with certain of them that commend themselves: but they themselves, measuring themselves by themselves, and comparing themselves with themselves are without understanding." (II Cor. 10:12). Even Paul himself confessed, "For I know nothing against myself; yet am I not hereby justified: but he that judgeth me is the Lord" (I Cor. 4:4). All of these verse emphasize the important lesson that one must be careful in his assessment of his life.

What the Bible enjoins is that Christian take careful stock of his life to be sure that he is in the faith. "Try your own selves, whether ye are in the faith; prove your own selves." (II Cor. 13:5). One of the greatest problems that men have is this idea of, "I think." It matter little what we think; it matters greatly what the Bible says and how our lives agree with it. As Paul said, "For not he that commendeth himself is approved, but whom the Lord commendeth." (II Cor. 10:18). Take time daily to look at your life seriously and see if you are in heart and practice following the Lord.

Let us not be like the sinful people to whom Hosea prophesied, "...yea, gray hairs are here and there upon him, and he knoweth it not." (Hos. 6:9). Too many never take the time to look into the mirror of God's word and see how sinful there lives are while others fail to correct what they see (Jas. 1:22-25).






Meet Our New Missionary Family:

"The Church of Tomorrow?"

All of us, at one time or another, have heard our young people referred to as the "church of tomorrow". While there is appreciation for the intent of that statement, there is feared a programing of young minds contrary to scripture. People have the uncanny ability to act as they are programed, or expected, to act. This includes all of us, young and old alike.

ARE WE STEALING PART OF THE ZEAL, VITALITY, AND POTENTIAL OF THE LORD'S ARMY WITH THE WISDOM OF MAN?

By planting in these young minds the idea that they are the "church of tomorrow", are we programing them to behave as though they are not an active, essential, and important part of the body today? Sadly, this is often the case.

Consider the God-breathed words of the apostle Paul to the young man, Timothy.

"LET NO MAN DESPISE THY YOUTH: BUT BE THOU AN ENSAMPLE TO THEM THAT BELIEVE, IN WORD, IN MANNER OF LIFE, IN LOVE, IN FAITH, IN PURITY"

Does this admonition to the young man Timothy sound like words written to part of the "church in waiting"? Certainly not! Not only was the young man Timothy to be active, he was to "be an ensample;" he was to lead.

This is how Paul describes that leadership: "Be thou an ensample to them that believe" (to the church, the body):

- "IN WORD." Our words become an index to our character (Matthew 12:34,35). Christians are often encouraged in the New Testament to be pure in speech (Ephesians 4:29; 5:3,4; Colossians 4:6). When those redeemed by the blood of the Lamb speak with a lack of self-control, participate in shaded humor, or use vulgarity, what do you think their influence says?
- "IN MANNER OF LIFE." Nothing influences others lives greater than the way we conduct our lives (Philippians 1:27). Our lives are watched constantly by those with whom we come in contact, and we are thereby making impressions on them, either for good or bad (II Corinthians 3:2).
- "IN LOVE." If this attribute were throughly shown in the Lord's body, the world would beat a path to become part of such a caring group, but when members of the body tear each other apart through envy, jealousy, and slander, the influence of the church is severely damaged, if not wrecked, in the community. Consider Jesus' words in John 13: 34, 35.
- "IN FAITH." That means, faithful in all areas of service to God. Our faith is something that is seen by others (James 2:18).
- "IN PURITY." A Christian should be pure because he has been washed in the blood of the Lamb (Revelation.1:5). John wrote, "If we walk in the light, as he is in the light; we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ cleanses us of all sin" I John 1:7.

Our young cannot fulfill these obligations without being an active, vibrant part of the Lord's body today. Our young in age, are as greatly an important part of the church today as those wise with the passing of time. Let us never diminish in their minds their great role in the church.



Can You Take Behake?

One of the problems that we all struggle with is how to react when someone points out to us that we are wrong. We all err in varying ways and in varying degrees, but we all err. Solomon stressed that a wise man would accept rebuke where a scoffer would not.

He who reproves a scoffer gets shame for himself, and he who rebukes a wicked man gets himself a blemish. Do not reprove a scoffer, lest he hate you; rebuke a wise man, and he will be still wiser; teach a just man, and he will increase in learning. (Prov. 9:8,9 NKJV).

Perhaps our problem is pride. We do not want to admit that we are ever in the wrong about something. Certainly, we ought never compromise what we feel to be the truth but we must guard, lest in our personal lives, we let pride become our ruling decision-maker.

What are we suggesting? That we study the Bible with an open mind, searching the scriptures to find out God's will. Let us do as Paul told the Thessalonians: Finally, brethren, pray for us, that the word of the Lord may have free course, and be glorified, even as it is with you. (II Thess. 3:1 KJV) What was great about these Christians? They had let the Word of God guide them rather than them trying to force God's Word to fit their lives. We want to be like Apollos who, after have the word of God shown to him more perfectly, followed the Bible where it led and started teaching the whole truth (cf. Acts 18:24-28). We want to be open to learn and ready to change when we see that we are in error. Can you take rebuke? If not, perhaps your heart has become hardened and is in need of some stronger rebuke.



DO YOU KNOW WHERE YOUR CHILDREN ARE?

Most of us have seen this question asked on late night television, but consider it now with an altogether different emphasis. Many youth programs are built around an electric personality and an equally electric emotional atmosphere which is ONLY positive and allows no criticism of the youth. We are told that in order to reach them, we must participate with them on their level; listen to their music, act, look, and dress as they do, and avoid discussions of truth that may "run them off." Others have maintained that we put out every fire immediately and always condemn them for activities engaged in which are improper, without regard for anything else. These are extremes, but are the rule, in our youth programs throughout the brotherhood. There is a middle ground to these extremes that involves no compromise of truth.

WE MUST KNOW AND ADMIT WHERE OUR YOUTH ARE! When an individual defends truth in debate, he must know the opposing position well to effectively defend truth. This means he can anticipate the opposing position because he knows and understands it as well as his opponent. He has not accepted the opposing error, simply made himself aware of it thoroughly. This is the middle ground that is often missing in our youth works. By knowing their interests and the things that heavily influence their thinking, we can successfully fight the workings of the devil without being challenged to compromise or lower Christian standards. Parents must be willing to admit that all the problems do not lie with the Sunday school teacher or those involved in the youth activities; that their children are subject to, and entrapped by temptation as well as "somebody elses kids."

60% of all teens drink alcoholic beverages weekly

50% of all college couples live together
Over 50% of all parents have one parent homes
#1 Album - HIGH INFIDELITY, By REO Speedwagon
23,000 teenagers committed suicide
There were 1.1 million teen-age abortions
We (the Church) lose 70% of our High School graduates within
5 years
Only 10-15% of our Christians enter marriage a virgin

Some of the items listed are not of themselves bad, but many are. Why so many alcoholics, drug users, abortions, and so much materialism? Perhaps some of the following 1981 statistics will help answer.

60% of all marriages end in divorce *Oklahoma and Arkansas were the states with the highest divorce rate

*Dallas and Houston were the cities with the highest divorce rate *Humphreys County, Tennessee had the highest divorce rate per capita in the U.S.

The average family watches TV 7 hours and 18 minutes per day
The average parent spends 7 minutes of UNDIVIDED attention each
week with each child

54% of all mothers work outside the home

*These places are all in the Bible Belt, not Hollywood.

Youth programs are not the answer to these problems nor should they be. They do not take the place of the home and seldom can straighten out the shortcomings of the home. They can, however, encourage the development of spiritual kinship, which is the only cternal kinship, and help encourage spiritual growth and maturity. To simply entertain and babysit our youth is to fail miserably. To bring them from where they are to a stable Christian growth pattern is our best hope. Children are like their models. What is the dominant model in your child's life?



d Coptist's Impression Of The Church.

{Edward T. Dalhbert, minister of the Delar Baptist Church of St. Louis, MO, recently visited the Central church of Christ in that city and gave his impression of the visit over the radio, "Protestant Hour." He mailed copies of his impression to all those interested in the radio and T.V. audience. Here in part is his letter.}

I had a very interesting experience on Sunday, when I was not preaching myself. I walked over to the nearest neighboring church close to my home. Now this church is very different to my church. It does not believe in any instrumental music...there was not an organ or plano in the entire building. Now, you might say when you hear about a church like that, "Well, they must be gueer... to introduce old fashioned ideas like that into the middle of the 20th century." But to the contrary, that was one of the most inspiring services I ever attended. The church was crowded to the doors with a youthful congregation and the singing was led by a well-mannered young man, with quietness and dignity the singing was of superb volume and praise to God, and until the time of the sermon, the minister took no part in the service. Eight capable young laymen, fine looking, read the scriptures, offered prayer, gathered the contribution, and even administered the Lord's Supper. It was a perfect demonstration of the priesthood of believers, and I felt myself virtually in the fellowship of the 1st Century Church. I went home inspired, saying, "It was good to be in the house of the Lord today."





SUN. SAND, AND SIN!



Some years ago I saw this little illustration. I don't know who thought of it or where I saw it, but it made an impression on my mind that I've never forgotten.

In Colossians 3:8, Paul said, "But now ye also put off all these: anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy communication from your mouth." Will someone please show me the verse that says "put off your clothes!!" Yes, friends, it's about that time of year again. Time for sunshine, sand and sin!! We may have put off our clothes all of our life during the summer months, but now that we consider ourselves mature Christians, let us be grown up enough to obey what Cod says about it.

In the beginning there was nothing shameful about nakedness (Genesis 2:25). But after sin, it took on a completely different meaning. Adam and Eve realized their nakedness (Genesis 3:6-9). Instead of God saying, "nakedness is alright," he "made for Adam and Eve coats of skins, and clothed them" (Genesis 3:21). From that day forward nakedness was considered shameful and in rebellion against God and his law.

Read Genesis 9:20 and following concerning the nakedness of Noah. Then turn to Exodus 20:26 and consider the reason for the priests not to climb the altar. If you truly desire to know what the Bible teaches about nakedness, peruse an exhaustive concordance and read the verses with the word "naked" or "nakedness" in them. It doesn't take a certificate of graduation from elementary school to figure out that nakedness is shameful and sinful (Revelation 3:18).

Jesus said, "Whosoever looketh on a woman to lust after her hath committed adultery with her already in his heart" (Matthew 5:28). From this verse it is obvious that if a man lusts after a woman, he has sinned. The opposite is true when a woman lusts after a man. When a "dresser" dresses in such a way to cause another to look and lust, the "dresser" shares in the sin. The "dresser" is as guilty for provoking the evil thoughts as is the individual who has them. "It is impossible but that offenses will come: but woe unto him through whom they come" (Luke 17:1). It is not forgotten that there are some who will have immoral thoughts regardless of the apparel, but those instances are not the fault of the "dresser".

God gave special counsel to women concerning their apparel because he knew the effect it would have on the opposite sax. Paul said that women should wear "modest apparel" which can be worn "with shamefastness and sobriety" (I Timothy 2:9). Women who follow the standards set by the world and pretend to be unaware of the evil effects had on men are rebelling against the beauty that God intended for them to have - inward

This principle has never changed, regardless of fashion.

After having been fully clothed during the cold months, have you ever noticed that when you first put on your "swim suit" and go outside, you feel "naked"? That's because you are! But as you continue to dress like that, you begin to feel more and more comfortable about the way you dress, or should I say undress. Before long, you "feel" there is nothing wrong with this apparel! Brethren, before you put off your clothes this summer and your heart is hardened by the deceitfulness of sin, think on these things and just how ridiculous that it is to attempt to defend "fashionable nudity".

THE "GRANNIE" ARGUMENT

In his epistle to the Romans, Paul reminds the saints of that city that they had been buried with Christ in baptism and subsequently were raised to walk "in newness of life" (Rom. 6:3,4). In the same context, the apostle describes this process as their "obedience unto righteousness" (16). Further, he observes that this obedience to that "form of doctrine" had been rendered "from the heart" (17). The expression "from the heart" denotes that these people had understood exactly what they were doing when they obeyed the gospel plan. By way of contrast, note how the Lord rebuked certain Jewish leaders who did not "understand with their heart" (Mt. 13:15). Biblically speaking, the term "heart" is frequently used of the intellect (cf. Rom. 10:9,10). Since the stated design of water baptism is "for the remission of sins" (Acts 2:38; cf. 22:16; Mark 16:16; 1 Pet. 3:21), it should be clear to any informed person that if one's baptism is to be valid, he or she must understand the purpose of the ordinance when submitting to it.

Occasionally, however, there are those who argue that so long as one submits to the ritual, whether the significance of it is understood or not, the blessing of salvation will be received. The following is a recent defense of this position. For lack of a better descriptive, we shall simply call it the "Grannie Argument."

"In her eighties, Grannie is ordered by her doctor to take several kinds of medication. She gets confused about the purpose of the various pills. She may think the pill given to relieve her dizziness is the one to ease her arthritis. Will her confusion and misunderstanding make the pill ineffective in relieving her dizziness? She follows the orders of the doctor who understands. She only has to obey him. So when a penitent believer obeys his or her Lord, though that person may be confused as to when the Lord fulfills His promise, it will not cause the Lord to withhold the promised results" (Cecil Hook, Free In Christ, 1984, p. 77).

It is not Grannie who is confused; it is the author of this erroneous analogy who is disoriented! Let us analyze this argument as to its soundness. In the first place, the argument draws a comparison between dissimilar situations. It is hardly appropriate to compare the reception of a pill, which produces an automatic physical response, with lucidly obeying a divinely-given command. Comprehension is not necessary in the former instance, but the Bible makes it quite clear that understanding is required in spiritual matters. Learning precedes obedience to God (cf. John 6:45).

I venture to say, however, that the advocate of the foregoing position will scarcely be willing to follow his argument to its logical consequence. Let us reflect upon this momentarily.

First, it is contended that so long as the doctor understands, and administers the proper medication, poor Grannie, even though confused, will be alright. If the comparison to baptism is proper, shall we then conclude that as long as the administrator understands the purpose of the command, the comprehension of the candidate is irrelevant? The has been the position of paedo-baptists for centuries; infants are baptized upon the basis of the parents! faith. Surely we are not ready to contend for infant baptism! (Cf. Christian Courier, May 1985, p. 1).

Second, for the sake of further exploration, let us assume that our "Grannie" is a bit obstinate. She decides that she just does not want to take her necessary medication. As the case sometimes is, we may find it necessary to gently "force" the dear lady to receive her medicine. Will the fact that she was coerced negate the effect of her pill? Of course not. Might we thus assume that baptism will be valid even though forced upon the subject? With a couple of strong-arm fellows we could surely swell the membership of the church!

Third, what if Grannie should slip into a coma, yet still need medication. Would the fact that she is unconscious cancel its effect? Certainly not. Then might we join the Romanists and administer baptism to those who are unconscious? Such would hardly be conceded.

But let me make an argument similar to the one under review. Instead of Grannie, consider the case of Junior. Junior is six years old and sick, but doesn't want to take his medicine. His mother promises that if he will take it, she will give him a dollar. He grabs the money and takes the pill. Now tell me, will the medication work? Surely. If the argument advanced above is thus legitimate, could we not offer \$100.00 "a head" for all who would submit to baptism? Don't bother to answer the question.




What Does Lour Letter Say?


 Let no man despise thy youth; but be thou an ensample to them that believe, in word, in manner of life, in love, in faith, in purity" I Timothy 4:11,12.

All of us have things of value to us. Some find that they cherish some things more than others. This is a part of life. However, there is usually something that we often over look that is truly valuable to us. It may be our body or our family, but we usually do not see the true value of many things in our life. It often takes someone to jog our memory to get us to see that we need to be more aware of what is of true value.



One of the things that evidently many people do not see great value in is the Bible Classes. On Sunday morning we generally have 50-75 less at Bible Classes than v do at our Worship Service. And, on Wednesday evening we lose another 50-75 who evidently do not appreciate the value of the Bible Classes. We recognize that some of the number who leave on Sunday Morning are those who visit with us so they can g an early start on the "trip to the lake." People who build church around their social activities rather than arranging social activities around their commitment to the church generally have a much deeper problem, that will have to be dealt with at another time What is a problem is those who do not "stay" for Bible Classes on Sunday or "return" for Classes on Wednesday evening. Many people will use as an excuse that they do not feel well or they cannot drive at night, but then you see those same people in toy just after the classes. All of you know that this is so! What this leads one to believe is that many feel that the Bible Class is just not that valuable to them.

Then one must address the issue of how valuable is the Bible Class. Attending Bible Classes is just like being fed. The more one feeds on the Word of God, the greater his spiritual strength. How many feel that they could survive physically on 1 out of every or 4 meals. How does one expect to be a Christian, growing in the grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ (II Pet. 3:18), and only be fed 1 out of every 3 or 4 spiritual meals? In the days of Amos the people were guilty of neglecting to study God's Wo and God's reply to them was: Behold, the days come, saith the Lord Jehovah, that / will send a famine in the land, not a famine of bread, nor a thirst for water, but of hearing the words of Jehovah. And they shall wander from sea to sea, and from no h even to the east; they shall run to and fro to seek the word of Jehovah, and shall not find it. (Amos 8:11,12). The old cliche, "use it or lose it." T.L.





Solomon said. Cast thy bread upon the waters; for thou shalt find it after many days. (Ecc. 11:1). The point Solomon was trying to emphasize was essentially one that is found throughout the Bible, that is, a man will reap what he sows. The Law of God relative to sowing and reaping has both its negative and positive aspects.

Paul stated it. Be not deceived: God is not mocked: for whatsoever man soweth, that shall he also reap. For he that soweth unto his own flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth unto the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap eternal life. (Gal. 6:7.8). We emphasize, and rightly so, that people must be careful not to unfairly treat others or else they will have to suffer the consequences of sowing bad treatment of others. In the same vein we emphasize to our young people that they should stay away from the defilements of the world because they will have to pay for their sins! Solomon tola his son. Can a man take fire into his bosom, and his clothes not be burned? Or can one walk upon hot coals, and his feet not be scorched? (Prov. 6:27.28). One will, sooner or later, reap what he has sown!

On the other hand, we have not emphasized enough the fact that one will real what he sows if it is good. The principle is found in several passages. An example of just one of these is found where Paul said relative to the government, do that which is good, and thou shalt have praise from the same. (Rom.13:3 Though Christianity is not a "merit" system, it is one based on "good works" (c Eph. 2:8-10). Christians must be taught that they will reap based on their sowing. In fact, the picture given in the Bible is clear, judgement will be a good thing for those whose lives have been filled with sowing good things (cf. Jn. 5:28,29; Il Co 5:10). For many this must be a sobering thought. Many are like the one talent man in Matthew 25, they bury what they could use. Others are like the five talent man and quickly develop what they have been given.

Let us now determine that we will sow that which is good and from that reap good things here and eternal life in the world to come. Let us also determine the we will refrain to doing that which is wrong, knowing that we will have to give a. account for those things. T.L.



Then n on the back cover (page 16) he says under the title "A Formula for Huma agislation " One brother writes, "We should do only that which is authorized and aught in the Bible and follow the principle of walking by faith-faith that comes by hearing the Word" That sounds almost right. ... this turns God's silence into prohibitic / believe... Can one imagine a man, supposedly a teacher of the Word, making suc statements? Certainly, by these quotes it become increasingly clear that they have no intention of giving up their instruments of music or any other practice which they wan for they have already rejected principle clearly laid down in scripture. God demand_ that we not go beyond the things written (I Cor. 4:6; II Jn. 9). He demands that we have His authority for everything we say or do (Col. 3:17). And, we must respect the silence of the scriptures (Heb. 7:13,14).

Yet, out of all of this one cannot help but notice the tone used by these people. The only good words he has to say are about those who have led in the compromise. He calls them some of the more spiritually minded Church of Christ preachers. It is usually true that those who speak so loudly about being loving and kind ar characteristically the most cruel and ugly when they are disagreed with.

The next time someone else talks with you about the mean and ugly spirit that i held by some of our brethren, ask them about men such as these who would rather fight than switch.


Making Sermon Plans For The Coming Year


90% FAITH


Fall Festival

Why I Cannot Smoke ...


I have been asked many times to say something about the Christian and smoking. When one says something he must be sure that he does so out of a right attitude. Sometimes people think that you are against something simply because you just don't like it yourself or that you have some "bone to pick" with others. What I say, I say with kindness with genuine concern for those who are members of the Lord's church. When you read the following, I ask that you consider what is say with an open and honest mind.

I cannot smoke because...

- 1. I value my influence on those round about me. The Christian's life is an open book for others to read (II Cor. 3:1-3). Our lives are to be examples to those round about us for good so that glory will be brought to God (Matt. 5:13-16). I doubt very seriously if I would have even been considered as a preacher for this congregation if I had been addicted to tobacco. Why? How could a preacher have any influence if he smoked? How then is it that a Christian can have influence while being given to smoking? You might say, "but no one told me." People generally do not tell us when they think that we are providing a bad example in any area.
- 2. I want to live. It is likely that not too many years ago that people had a legitimate doubt as to whether or not that smoking was harmful. We have many times been told this or that causes cancer, yet, today there is no doubt that smoking harms our body. God gave me a body and I am to take care of it, for it is the temple of the Holy Spirit (I Cor. 6:19,20). Why do so many family members plead with their loved ones to give it up? They want to keep them around longer.
- 3. I don't want to be wasteful. We are poor stewards in many areas. Some things that we do have no useful purpose at all. Smoking has no useful purpose. And, at today's prices, it is a very expensive habit. One who smokes two packs a day with today's prices, can expect to spend at least \$3,650 in five years just for tobacco, not to mention other things like lighters or matches.

Smoking is something that many people have done almost all of their lives and is not easy to give up. But, we beg you, try to give it up. I have never known a person who gave it up who thought he was worse off, either physically or spiritually.




Do You Know Why You Believe?

The church in Warren County has been around for a long time and most of the prople who are Christians are the children of parents who were Christians. In this tare is a great danger that we follow what our parents were without considering for ourselves whether or not the churches of Christ is the one church taught in the Bible. In though it may be, there are many today who call themselves Christians who do ret know why we do not have fellowship with the denominations. 

Paul said, "If then ye we raised together with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated on the right hand of God, set your mind on the things that are above, not on the things that are upon the earth." (Col. 3:1.) His point was that our minds should be tuned in to the spiritual things and not the earthly things. You what do we spend most of our time thinking about? Do you give more thought to the new car you would like to have or to the soul you would like to save? Do you think more about that new dress or about the person who needs your help? The point is simple. We do what we think about all of the time. Or, we Solomon so eloquently said, "For as he thinketh within himself, so is he" (Prov. 23:7).

When you have some time to set back and think, say to yourself, "I will think on some spiritual things." The more you do so, the more you will find yourself like Abraham and Sarah whose mind was directed toward that heavenly country. The goal of Christianity was stated well by Paul to 1 c. Corinthians. He told them that the type of warfare they used was one of, "casting down imaginations, and every high thing that is exalted against the knowledge of God, and bring every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ." (II Cor. 10:5). Where is your mind at?

How long will it be ere they attain to innocency?" God wants His people to follow Him and His Word!



The Religion of Excitement and the Excitement of Religion


In the present day we seem to have more of the religion of excitement than we have of the excitement of religion. The ancient and apostolic plan of the first enlightening the understanding by declaring and illustrating the testimony of God, seems to be both too rational and slow for the ardent demands of the proselyting spirit of the age. Saviour and his Apostles spoke plain good sense to the understandings of men, knowing it to be God's chartered way to the heart. Paul teaching that "faith came by hearing" -- that "hearing came by the word of God" -- and that as he "preached so the people believed," was only anxious to declare the whole testimony of God, with its innate and eognate evidences of the divine authenticity. His preaching being first understood and then believed, he knew could not possibly fail to seize the heart with omnipotent power, and turn it to Christ, and God, and heaven. Therefore, he never made an effort to excite the feelings of any audience until he had "declared to them the whole counsel of God." He threw no artificial exciting circumstances around them: he

never thought of "an anxious seat," n-r of "a mourning bench," (nor of turning out of the lights, holding hands, etc.--Editor) and never called up convicted and trembling sinners to pray for the These are all of the greenhouse or hotbed appliances of the present dy. Our mushroom Christians sometim grow to perfection in a night, and wither They have no root h in a day. themselves. They are born in the mic t of excitement -- they live in the midst of excitement, and soon as it wanes they generally sicken and die. They have the taste for religion that demands both reading and meditation as food of s devotion, and greatly prefer thouse feelings which a warm exhorter can produce, to all the moral feelings a d refined and purifying sentiments and sympathies, which the truth believed and read, and pondered in the heart, c awaken within us. They are deluded by the idea that religion is the effect, and not the cause of feeling. Religion, wi them, is the fruit of excitement, ranther than the root and reason of it. Herce such converts display little or nothing if that constant and powerful excitement to love and good works, which to visibly and constantly attended te profession of the faith in the New Testament age. The faith of Christ and the consequent hope and joy which simutaneously arise in the heart of a true convert, like the mainspring of a watch, or the primum mobile of a y

complicated machinery, set our whole ame in motion, and excite to every praiseworthy deed both towards God and man.

The Christian religion is, indeed, a religion of the purest, noblest, and most refined feeling and excitements of which our fallen nature is susceptible. It exerts a constant power upon all the ffections and moral sensibilities of our earts; but it is itself the offspring not of fancy, but of faith; not of excitemen, but of reason; not of visions, dreams, or xtraordinary impulses, but of the testimony of God, developed and onfirmed by the Holy Spirit. It is, in ne word, the effect of the Christian truth believed, and not the cause of aith: for it is faith, and not feeling, that vorks by love and purifies the heart, and that overcomes the world.


