





"Take Heed What Ye Hear"

This was the warning by Jesus. (Mark 4:24) John, writing by inspiration, also warned, "Beloved, believe not every spirt..." and told why, "... for many false prophets are gone out into the world." (I John 4:1) This is excellent instruction not only pertaining to religious views expressed, but in other areas of information. And how we are bombarded with information, news, stories, reports, studies on TV, radio, newspapers, etc.!

There was an in-depth survey made by two prominent pollsters reported in the journal *Public Opinion*, that uncovered some interesting and sobering material that surely, at least, ought cause us to be cautious in swallowing what we are told. Some two hundred forty journalists and broadcasters were interviewed in hour-long inquiries. They were from CBS, NBC, ABC, PBS, the *New York Times, Washington Post, Wall Street Journal, Time*, and *Newsweek*, sources from which Americans get so much of their "knowledge" on current events.

The survey shows 90% agree that abortion should be legal, 54% believe adultery is not wrong, 76% believe homosexuality is not wrong, and 85% believe homosexuals should be permitted to teach in our schools, and many of them openly support the idea of teaching homosexuality as an acceptable lifestyle in school.

Fifty per cent have no religious affilation, 86% seldom or never attend religious services, and only 8% go to church or synagogue weekly. What a fine and honorable element in our society!

In 1972, 81% voted for the liberal candidate even as the nation went in landslide proportions the other way. AND YOU ARE WILLING TO TAKE THEIR WORD FOR ANYTHING?

Next time you listen to these "experts" who claim a monopoly on wisdom, you might remember the cesspool mentality from which most is coming. Indeed, "Take heed what ye hear."

"In God We Trust"

The motto "In God We Trust" owes its presence on U.S. coins largely to the increased religious sentiment existing during the Civil War. Salmon P. Chase, then Secretary of the Treasury, received a number of appeals from devout persons throughout the country urging that the Deity be suitably recognized on our coins as it was on the coins of other nations.

The approved motto first made its appearance on the two-cent coin, authorized by Act of Congress (April 22, 1864,) but its use has not been uninterrupted. In 1866 the motto was introduced on the double eagle, eagle, and half eagle gold coins and on the silver dollar, half dollar, and the quarter dollar pieces. It was included in the nickel five-cent design from 1866 to 1883, when it was dropped and not restored until the introduction of the Jefferson nickel in 1938. The motto has been in continuous use on the penny since 1909 and on the dime since 1916.

A law passed by the 84th Congress and approved by the President on July 11, 1955, provides that "In God We Trust" shall appear on all United States paper currency and coins.

By a joint resolution of the 84th Congress, approved by the President on July 30, 1956, "In God We Trust" was declared to be the official motto of the United States.





Your Influence as a Teenager

Even before his outstanding years as Harding's quarterback, Tom Ed Gooden was noted by the Arkansas Gazette as being the best high school quarterback in his district. The paper ran a picture of Tom Ed with the caption "Not on Wednesday." It seems that another school had tried to schedule a game with his team, Carlisle, Arkansas, on Wednesday evening. But, his coach replied that they couldn't do it. "My quarterback is a member of the church of Christ," he said, "and he goes to church on Wednesday nights. He won't miss for any reason. And I can't win without him."

Teenagers, whether you like it or not, your life is a walking sermon! Your good deeds and faithfulness to the Lord testify that God's grace is the core of your life, and that it is available to others. Jesus once described this tremendous influence as "the light of the world" and "a city on a hill." (Mt. 5:14) And as Paul penned his first letter to young Timothy, he emphasized the influence of youth by exhorting him to be "an example of the believers in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity." (I Tim. 4:12) By your godly life, you can lead others to the Lord.

Of course, the opposite is true, also. Unfaithfulness to Christ suggests to your friends that there is no difference between the Christian life and living without God. After all, if you see the same movies, use the same language, tell the same jokes, dress the same way, listen to the same "music," and so on, what's the difference?

Your obedience to Christ must be conditioned primarily upon your love for Him. It must be so great that it "leaves us no choice" (II Cor. 5:14) but to follow Him. And it must reflect an inner yearning to seek first the kingdom and righteousness of God. (Mt. 6:33) But, as you consider the questions of drinking, sexual morality, attendance at services, involvement in church activities, smoking, etc., be sure to remember that your decision will go beyond your life. They will be felt in the lives and destinies of others.





Oil the Machinery ...

"... a word spoken in due season, how good is it!" (Prov. 15:23)

"Genuine praise, like the rare jewels and metals of earth, draws its true value from its scarcity."

Three observations should be made concerning appreciation:

- 1. Psychologists tell us that one of the deepest urges in human nature is the craving to be appreciated. Thus, we contribute immeasurably to the happiness and success of others when we express appreciation for their work and worth.
- 2. Psychologists also advise that the giving of sincere praise brings outstanding benefits to the one who gives it. Thus, we contribute immeasurably to our own happiness and success when we express appreciation to others.
- 3. Observation teaches that the most successful people have mastered the art of giving praise.

Giving honest praise is like "saying grace" at the table . . . very difficult to start if it hasn't been our pattern. Here are some guidelines to get you started:

- 1. Look for little things for which you can express appreciation. Too often we overlook the little things which should be praised. We tend to wait for a colossal achievement before uttering one word of commendation or encouragement. Rare and refreshing is the person who goes on a "treasure hunt" for little things that slip by most unnoticed.
- 2. Look for things close at hand for which you can express appreciation. The human tendency is to see defects in things close at hand and glamour in things at a distance. It doesn't take much sense to find fault with things and people close by. Conversely, it requires sensitive perception to detect the genuine worth of nearby treasures.
- 3. Look for the right moment to voice appreciation. It isn't that we don't appreciate others . . . it's just that, for some unknown reason, we are hesitant to voice that feeling. It is necessary to say nice things to have them do good . . . not merely think about them. By not acting quickly to praise one for his work the impulses often fades away.

Genuine appreciation requires an understanding and generous heart. It is a fruit of careful cultivation. It is the "sign of noble souls," said Aesop. A great business builder says: "Appreciation is the oil that keeps the machinery of human relations running smoothly." Look around! You probably need to oil the machinery.

"Gays" in the Military

President-elect Clinton has voiced his support and intention to allow "gays" to serve in the military. This was a pre-election promise and he now vows to keep his promise. This has sparked some controversy among the Democratic party, Republican party and military leaders throughout the country. Colin Powell, the head of our armed services, has openly spoken out against a change in the present policy. Many questions have been, and no doubt will continue to be, raised on this issue. These discussions lead to two thoughts.

First, it would be good if men everywhere would begin using the term "Sodomites" and not "Gays." Many want to use the term "gay" because it has a much better connotation than "sodomy." No sodomite wants to be reminded of Sodom (Genesis 19) and God's attitude toward such sinful behavior. Certainly God loves these sinners, but he hates and condemns their sin and will consign them to Hell if they do not repent. It should infuriate us to be told that these are "born that way." Such a statement blames God with their sin and teaches inborn sin. Sodomy is acquired, not inherited!

Finally, God does not allow sodomites into the military unless they repent and turn from their sin! Paul said there were those in Corinth who had been sodomites. He said, "Know ye not that the unrighteous shall not inherit the kingdom of God? Be not deceived: neither fornicators, nor idolators, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor abusers of themselves with mankind, nor theives, nor covetous, nor drundards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God." (I Corinthians 6:9,10) The military to which we refer is the Lord's army and only those who have ceased their sodomy can enlist. No one can be a good soldier of Jesus Christ and continue to sin. Paul said these Corinthians who had enlisted in the army had ceased their sins — "And such were some of you." (I Corinthians 6:11) This is past tense. Present tense sins (sodomy included) refuse one a place in the kingdom. Paul said God gave the Gentiles up to their vile affectins, "for even their women did change the natural use into that which is against nature: and likewise also the men, leaving the natural use of the woman. burned in their own lusts one toward another; men with men working that which is unseemly. and receiving in themselves that recompense of their error which was meet." (Romans 1:26.27) Sodomites may be gay (happy) now, but they will not be happy in the life to come unless they repent. May they do so.



Good Worship Manners

The God we worship in our assemblies is not a God of confusion, but one who wants everything done decently and in order. (I Corinthians 14:33, 40) I believe that with a little more consideration for this principle, for one another, and for some of our behavior we can improve our "worship manners," for example:

- 1 Arrive a few minutes before time to begin (Bible class or worship.) Some folks are late every time because they wait too late to start getting ready. Consistent tardiness can and should be overcome. Late arrivers always cause some distraction.
- Watch and follow the song leader. Nothing is as frustrating to a song leader and as distracting from the praise being sung as to have a loud voiced member or two drag a word or two behind the leader. With a little attention to this matter our combined voices can be one voice of praise.
- 3 If you have a baby and it begins to cry, take it to the cry room. I would never knowingly say or do anything to discourage parents of little ones from bringing their babies to worship at the earliest possible age. I deeply admire and encourage those who do. However, when an innocent baby (or a toddler who is old enough to be disciplined) starts to scream, it should be taken to the cry room promptly, thus keeping disturbance of the assembly to the minimum.
- 4 Do not leave before the closing prayer unless absolutely necessary. Also, do not let your children parade in and out unless it is necessary. Take care of their water and rest room needs before worship and help them understand that they will leave the assembly only for correction or misbehavior. Every person who leaves during any part of the worship distracts others.
- 5 If you arrive late, if possible wait until there is a pause between activities to enter (between songs or between a prayer and a song, etc.) Otherwise, enter and take a seat with as little distraction as possible.
- 6 Read appropriate Scriptures during the Lord's supper (e.g. Matthew 26:26-27:28) to help keep your mind from wandering. Have your contribution check or cash prepared before you come to worship.
- 7 Stay awake (retire at a decent hour Saturday night.) Bring your Bible, paper, and pen. Follow the Scriptures cited and take notes on the sermon.
- 8 Sincerely sing the invitation song and refrain from distracting behavior while it is being sung (talking, putting on your coat, etc.)

Change, Transition, Abandon

On one hand we hear voices calling for change and those who are becoming involved in the movement for transition. On the other hand there are those who fear that the proposed changes will result in abandoning the "old paths." We can understand full well why some people are disenchanted with political, economic and educational leaders and systems and are advocating changes in the way local, state and national governments are being administered. Certainly our tax structure needs overhauling and our education programs need reforming. These are all parts of our social system and subject to the will of the democratic electorate. However, the gospel of God and the Church of our Lord Jesus Christ are sacred institutions and are not subject to the whims and wishes of our modern society. Just because drastic changes are being wrought in the social order is no valid argument for changing the church that Christ purchased with His own precious blood or that the gospel which came as the will of God should succumb to change or be abandoned.

We hear and read much from those who contend for change in the status quo of the economy of grace. But some of us have difficulty in understanding what it is that they really want to change. What changes must be made in the church to bring it from the first century, when it was established into the twenty-first century where the "baby boomers" will hold forth? Do the advocates propose to perfect change and accomplish transition from the traditions which we have followed through the years? Are these traditions which limit our effectiveness to evangelize or the way we conduct worship when the saints have gathered together? Many of our traditions have proved profitable, while there are others which could be eliminated with no ill effects. However, we do not believe that the churches of Christ are victims of traditions to the extent that the purposes of the Lord are being stymied. If we stripped the church of all of its "innocuous traditions," it should not change the mission, the organization, the purpose, the doctrine and the direction which God gave to the church when He made Christ head of the "body the fullness of him that filleth all in all!"

I would raise a number of basic questions about changing the administration of the church, the pattern of worship, the conditions of salvation, as stipulated in the gospel, and the relationship between the church and religious denominations in a clamor for unity.

Do the proponents of change really think that God has or needs to change? (Mal. 3:6) Do they think that Christ has or needs to change? (Heb. 13:8) Do they think that the church was lacking when the Lord presented it unto himself? (Eph. 5:27) Do they think that truth is timeworn and outdated? (I Peter 1:25) I admonish those who are dead set on leading a movement for change, within the brotherhood, to read and accept the proposal by the Apostle Paul to the Thessalonians (II Thess. 2:15): "Therefore, brethren, stand fast, and hold the traditions which ye have been taught, whether by word, or our epistle."

When I was baptized and began to preach (1928) we never heard a preacher, elder or editor propose to change the church, prepare it for transition or accept a new way to interpret the scripture. N.B. Hardeman, A.B. Barrett, G.C. Brewer, I.A. Douthitt, H.L. Calhoun, Alonzo Williams and Coleman Overby, for whom I led singing in gospel meetings, were never afraid nor ashamed to preach the commands of God, point out the approved apostolic examples and the great truths of the Bible based on necessary inferences.

A similar course of change being proposed by modern "scholars" was introduced by the Christian Church which resulted in the formation of the Disciples of Christ denomination and the abandonment of the Restoration Plea by the College of the Bible advocated by John William McGarvey for over forty-five years. Brethren, we must profit by the mistakes of those who abandoned the pleas of the early restorers under the guise of a new theology ;and commit ourselves to "hold fast the form of sound words which thou hast heard in faith and in love which is in Christ Jesus," (II Tim. 1:13)

As early as 1829 Thomas Campbell proposed that "nothing should be admitted into our churches (congregations) either as to doctrine, or practice, or manner of teaching, or terms of communion, or ministerial qualifications, or government, but what we find taught, enjoined, and practiced in the primitive churches. Now this is the very thing we plead for, neither more nor less!"

Let us be careful that changes and traditions do not result in abandon.



The Truth About The Madalyn Murry O'Hair Petition R.H. 2493

On different occasions (some recently) I have been contacted about or handed a petition with the request that I make copies and distribute them to the brethren here so as to enable them to voice protest against petition R.H. 2493. Supposedly, petition 2493 has been submitted to the Federal Communications Commission in Washington, D.C. by Madalyn Murry O'Hair, along with 27,000 signatures. The petition allegedly would call for all religious broadcasting to be removed from the public air-ways. The elders asked me to contact the FCC and inquire about the validity of the petition. When I went through the proper procedures, a representative of the FCC (Mary)telephonedmewiththefollowinginformation.

- 1. There is NO VALIDITY to the petition.
- 2. The petition was not submitted by the famed atheist, O'Hair, but was submitted by two men some 15 years ago. It got nowhere.
- 3. Madalyn Murry O'Hair does not have any petition before the FCC, NORHASSHEEVER SUBMITTED A PETITION TO THE FCC.

Brethren, zeal in opposing wrong is a good thing. However, make sure that your information is accurate before involving the brethren. The credibility of the church is at state if we mass a campaign against something that does not exist. Furthermore, a person note or letter will prove far more effective in any effort than a standard form signed by an individual. But should you submit a standard petition, be sure the quality is such that it is readable and representative of the cause of Christ. It is hard to get a second chance to make a first impression. Should you have any question about this or any other alleged petition, feel free to call the Federal Communication Commission in Washington, D.C., at (202) 632-7000.

The following appeared in the TENNESSEAN Letters to the Editor on January 19, 1993. The author is Michael Greene, former minister at Dorris Chapel, in Trenton, Tennessee. Brother Greene is now preaching in Columbia, Tennessee. One could only wish the TENNESSEAN employed such capable editors.

We learn that an Appeals Court has ruled it unconstitutional for Gideon International to hand our Bibles in the public schools in Indianapolis.

It is all right to hand our condoms to 13 year-olds in our schools. It is all right to graphically instruct junior kids on how to have safe sex. It is all right to give out free abortion counseling to children as young as 14 without parental consent—but wrong to give them a Bible in America. However, you can give them out in Russia.

Now to an extent I can understand why our children need to be protected from the dangerous doctrines contained in the Bible. Have you looked in it lately? It has such dangerous concepts as "love your neighbor as thyself," and "do not covet your neighbor's wife." And, of course, young ears should never hear such words as "do not commit adultery," or "flee fornication."

Oh, no we cannot, even under the principle of academic freedom which says that all competing ideas have a right to be heard, allow someone access to the Bible. Why they might read and believe, and live by some of those "dangerous" concepts.

If that were to happen, the world as we know it would come to an end. Parents would be respected and obeyed, as would teachers. We wouldn't need policemen in every school. Hatred and bigotry would soon die. Teen-age pregnancy and the perceived need to hand out safe-sex materials would soon be gone.

By all means protect us from such a fate.

Numbers

Numbers! Are they anything, everything, or the only thing? I guess it depends on your personal perspective. Humans are impressed with numbers. Some are obsessed with them. Numbers are often used to gauge success or failure in various fields of endeavor. Numbers can be valuable statistical tools, but they can also be misleading. Numbers don't always tell the whole story. They are not always decisive, especially in the spiritual realm.

God has sometimes shown great interest in numbers. Witness the numbering of the Israelites in the Old Testament book called, not surprisingly, but the same name "Numbers." At other times numerical strength seemed to be the least of God's concerns. Witness Gideon's 300 horn-tooting, pitcher-smashers, whipping 135,000 marauding Midianites (Judges 8:10). Or, fathom if you will the amazing statistical feat of 12 simple men, and one converted persecutor, "turning the world upside down" (Acts 17:6), with the "good news" of the Nazarene carpenter.

Yes, we would have to say that God is interested in numbers, in as much as numbers represent souls. But, we are also forced to conclude that God can do more with one faithful disciple, than with a thousand lukewarm pew-warmers.



Now we know why the call for change has become popular in some churches of Christ today. Brethren, the call did not originate with our brethren. The call comes from the influence of Television, via the media and denominationalism.

The idea did not originate with our brethren that drama is more effective than a proclamation of God's Word, or that the Lord's Supper can be enhanced by having someone walk down the aisle carrying a cross. These are manifestations of the secularizing of religion. Don't you think it is a little incongruous for someone to walk down a carpeted aisle in a building with controlled temperature to supposedly emphasize the suffering of our Lord?

Worship services today, where people who know and love God are honored to sing His praise, may not be as "moving" to a world that neither knows nor loves God, but these services are times when God's people are bringing glory and honor to Him.

The simplicity of worship revealed in the life of the early church may not be as "spiritual uplifting" as listening to a group mimicking instruments of music, or an orchestra playing *Handels' Messiah*, or an expensive pipe organ playing "How Great Thou Art," but God is looking for sincere hearts and dedicated lives to undergird true worshippers who understand that the power of worship is not in performance, but in sincere participation. (John 4:23,24)

The new approach to worship is actually a rejection of the Biblical nature of worship. "Worship" means acts of reverence paid to God. True worship is not performance for consumers, but participation in honor and praise of God. The late Dean Sperry of Harvard University said, "Worship is the adoration of God." Our Lord said that true worshippers worship God. (John 4:23,24) When so-called worship caters to the whims of the world - it ceases to be worship to God.

There is a sacredness of worship that must not be sacrificed on altars of superficial spirituality, fads of the day, emotion-rousing hand clapping, and entertainment-oriented quartets and choirs. The profound dignity of worship should not be sacrificed to shallow, sensational displays of drama.

Don't be surprised by anything you hear that brethren are doing in worship. Once brethren get on board the old ship of subjectivity, there is no shore line.

The world has plenty of entertainment to offer. But let God's people come together to worship in spirit and in truth because, in this true worship, our God is glorified and we are truly edified.

Can Worship Be Vibrant and Meaningful Without Becoming Faddish and Unscriptural?

The current demand for change in worship among churches of Christ is more than a clash between the baby boomer mentality and the so-called "Traditionalist" approach; the demand is not merely a rural church versus city congregation clash; the demand is basically a challenge from the world to dictate to the church the kind of worship that will be appealing and worthy of applause.

The call for change in worship is a demonstration of the relevant nature of God's warning when He, through Paul's inspired pen, said, "Be not conformed to this world." (Romans 12:2) The word translated world means age. Every period of human history has certain salient characteristics. Competent historians can identify these characteristics.

If the Lord delays His coming, (II Peter 3:15) for another century and historians assess our era they will surely record that in the closing part of the 20th century the United States had produced the most entertainment-oriented age that the world had ever known.

To discover the real cause of the demand for change in worship may save some of us from faddism and practices foreign to God's revealed will for our worship to Him. We shall consider the entertainment mentality, the impact of this mentality on the denominational world, and how all of this is creating confusion and turmoil among some churches in Christ.

Dr. Reo M. Christenson, in an article entitled, "Shame, Shame on the Entertainment Industry," said that no force has greater influence on young people than the entertainment industry. He further observed, "The major cultural difference between today's world and that of an earlier period is the involvement of the young in a vastly greater amount of mass entertainment than previous generations ever experienced.

Any informed person knows that television is number one force shaping American thought. The Canadian scholar, Marshall McLuhan, observed that television can burn images into the brain. The opportunity television has to influence people is appreciated when it plays about 7 hours each day in most American households.

Television is full of action. Studies reveal that the average length of a shot on network television is only 3.5 seconds, "so the eye never rests, always has something new to see." Neal Postman devoted one chapter in his book, Amusing Ourselves To Death, to a discussion of television and religion. The chapter is entitled, "Shuffle Off to Bethlehem." Although he watched 42 hours of television and religion, like everything else is presented, quite simply and without apology, as an entertainment." (emphasis mine, TH) The second conclusion Postman reached concerned the loss of the "religious atmosphere." He observed, "The television screen itself has a strong bias toward a psychology of secularism." In fact, he declared, that religion on television is "so deeply associated with the commercial and entertainment worlds that it is difficult for it to be recreated as a frame for sacred events."

The influence of television on religion in America has been studied by Quentin in J. Schultze. He said, "It appears that televangelism does not compete as much as it subverts the local church." He observed, "While televangelism alters Americans' concept of the church, it also transforms their notion of worship... local congregational worship seems more and more like a Hollywood production... The key words used by advocates are "relaxed," "informal," "interesting," and "relevant," but the inevitable result is TV-styled services. Televangelism has helped submerge worship into popular culture, and the effects have been mostly negative.

John McAuthur, Jr. has explained the changes being seen in denominational worship services. He wrote, "churches zealous to attract the unchurched have baptized virtually every form of amusement." He observed, "More and more churches are eliminating preaching from their worship services and opting instead for drama, variety shows, and the like."

In discussing the way some churches relegate Bible teaching to a midweek service and other drop it althogether, he set forth the rationale for the change: "They say the church must adopt new methods and innovative programs to grab people on the level where they live."

Does any of this sound like things that are currently being said by some who claim to be preachers of the gospel?







The "Change Generation" Ask: "Is It Fun and Exciting?"

For a growing number, and even some who wear the name Christian, the only qualification for acceptance or rejection of any behavior before God is expressed in the words "is it fun and exciting?" This is heard and somewhat expected in conversation of the young, but it is disappointing and less excusable in the lives of the many who are older and should know better, but who have not yet matured in Christ! With Paul we must say these are "yet carnal" or worldly. (I Cor. 3:3)

This attitude is certainly affecting the church for which Christ died. (Acts 20:28) In many localities there are those who refuse to attend Bible classes because they say it is "dullsville." This is a bad reflection on this one instead of on the Bible, the class, or the teacher! Others do not attend each worship period (unless some special entertainment is announced) because they "do not get anything out of it," and especially when there is something "more exciting" to do. These seem to ignore many passages of scripture about putting God and His kingdom first, not forsaking the assembling of the saints, and that worship must be directed to God in spirit and in truth. (Matt. 6:33; Heb. 10:25; Jn. 4:23-24)

Marriages are strongly affected by this attitude. Some after only a few months divorce their mates, rending many hearts, because one of the participants feels things just are not "fun and exciting" anymore! Then these look for a preacher who will deny the Lord's simple teaching on marriage, divorce, and remarriage, (Matt. 19:8-9) so they may feel good about finding another mate who is more "fun and exciting." The tragedy is, some of these hireling preachers can be found!

Vows do not seem to mean much to these people! Not only are marriage vows soon "forgotten," but many seem to also take lightly their vow to serve the Lord. The good confession that "I believe that Jesus is the Christ the Son of the living God" is suppressed and flies quickly from the mind of some, when they are "choked with cares and riches and pleasures of this life, and bring no fruit to perfection." (Lk. 8:14) When these are urged to live pure lives, teach a Bible class, serve at the Lord's table, visit the sick and needy, prepare the building for worship services (or close it afterwards), teach a neighbor or invite them to services, speak to visitors, or a host of other small but important duties of Christians, they respond in word or attitude, that is not "fun and exciting" to me anymore. These have left their first love and need to repent. (Rev. 2:4-4) Their promise (vow) to serve the Lord has to be "some great thing," never difficult, and always "fun and exciting" or they will defect from the Lord's army!

Of course, for those who study and believe the Bible, it is known that there are responsibilities legislated by the Lord for which we are accountable. (Matt. 28:20) These come as a result of our abilities and opportunities given by God. He has the sovereign right to call us into account for the use of that which He has given to us. Paul's words must continually ring in our ears, "So then every one of us shall give account of himself to God." (Rom. 14:12)

Let us take a close look at our own attitude about the work of the Lord. Let us "walk in the light" that we may have pure fellowship with other faithful Christians. (I Jn. 1:7-9) "Am I a soldier of the cross, a follower of the Lamb . . ." or do I live in subjectivism of searching only for that which is "fun and exciting?"

A worldly society without and liberalism within the church are wreaking more havoc than did the threatenings and slaughter of Saul, as recorded in Acts 8:1-3.

What persecution am I speaking of, you ask? It's the persecution of our identity as pure, unadulterated, New Testament Christians. It's the general decay of the moral fabric of society which has begun to make definitive inroads into the thinking, character, and practice of our brotherhood. It's the persecution of tremendous peer pressure upon us and our children to live worldly lives. It's the wholesale acceptance of error and the headlong plunge into the liberal philosophies of humanism and situation ethics, which are undermining the basic values and principles of morality and righteous living.

Why is this persecution so dangerous? It's because of its subtlety. It has snuck up on the church so slowly, one insidious step at a time, that a lot of brethren don't even realize we are being persecuted. While our guard was down, Satan crept into our midst unawares. In the past persecution hit the church square in the face. It was a life and death matter, and you either chose to be a faithful Christian no matter what the cost, or you denied Christ, nice and simple, cut and dried! But now it seems as if some brethren believe you can be a Christian and still live like the world. Some have perverted Christianity by trying to make it a "no cost religion."

We read of Rubel Shelly, at the recent "Nashville Jubilee," advocating changing the church by looking to Hollywood for tips on gaining and retaining members. We see the precious name of our Lord's church dragged through the mud in the local papers because the leadership of the Bellwood congregation here in Murfreesboro blatantly disregarded the Holy Spirit's injunction on going to law with our brethren. (I Cor. 6:1-8) Continually we read of our supposedly "Christian" universities loosening restraints and allowing all sorts of things to be practiced and taught on campus, which must cause their founding fathers to "turn over in their graves." We are witnessing a generation of children being raised in the church, many of whom are being taught that they can be Christians without dressing or acting any differently than their worldly peers.

But listen to what Paul states in Titus 2:11-12, "For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men, teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world; looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Savior Jesus Christ; who gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works. These thing speak, and exhort, and rebuke with all authority."

Please brethren, before it's everlastingly too late, let's stand up and be counted for God, no matter what the cost. As Christians, we must be different from the world. We must train our children to be different from their peers. We need to quit spending so much time trying to smooth the road for our children and start spending more time preparing our children for the road. Let's insist that our leaders, preachers, teachers, and "Christian universities" speak, and exhort, and rebuke these things with all authority, and that only by the Word of God. Let's be God's peculiar people!





Purposes Of Vacation Bible School

Vacation Bible School serves as a great teaching tool in the church. The local church must utilize every means of reaching its community with the Gospel of Christ. VBS offers one of the finest opportunities to do this.

The success of VBS depends upon how successfully a congregation takes advantage of vacation time to offer a combination of Bible teaching and correlated interesting activities at a time when such a program is most welcome to parents and pupils alike.

VBS was started to meet a definite need. As you consider the place of VBS in the church, it is well to keep in mind what you expect it to accomplish. Consider the purposes of VBS by noting some features generally credited to it.

VBS has a unique vacation-time ministry. VBS takes advantage of the leisure time available in the vacation period. VBS literally "buys up" this time for Christian teaching—time that is not available during the rest of the year.

VBS greatly increases the total teaching impact of the church. The normal amount of teaching provided for church youth is pitifully small. If a child attends Sunday school every Sunday, he receives fifty-two hours of religious instruction a year. VBS offers ten hours of teaching opportunity a week.

VBS provides a thorough educational opportunity. First, an extended period of teaching time is available for presenting Biblical truths and correlated activities. Second, VBS provides opportunity for day-by-day teaching impact. Bible truths, reenactment activities, and other learning experiences may be reviewed day by day with resulting increase in learning and retention. Finally, VBS provides a more life-like setting for Bible teaching by presenting a variety of activities for relating Bible truths to daily living.

VBS has special community appeal. VBS by its nature is basically and informal program. Parents who might normally hesitate to send children to church for Bible teaching will often allow them to attend VBS. Likewise, parents who would not attend a church service will often be attracted to VBS.

The Pope, The Catholic Church, And Change

The head of the human organization known as the Roman Catholic Church recently made a visit to the U.S. The news media has made much of this visit and the unrest among many Catholics. Specifically, the "American Church" is calling for change of the celibacy restriction, the prohibition of artificial birth control, the male-only priesthood, and for some the church's pro-life stance. Newsweek magazine, among others, have polled American Catholics to ascertain their views regarding these issues.

A couple observations are in order:

- (1) The Catholic Church is a human organization with a human head. It is not divine and has no authority from God. Thus, the words of Jesus are very applicable: "But he answered and said, Every plant, which my heavenly Father hath not planted, shall be rooted up." (Matt. 15:13). The Catholic Church should not be surprised that so many Catholics are challenging some of the Church's teachings and calling for change, for the Catholic Church has a history of changing Church Doctrine to fit the whims and fancies of the people.
- (2) The clamor for change which is being heard from the "American Church" sounds strikingly similar to what is being heard among some of our brethren. They are saying that we are losing the young and the "baby boomers" by our strict adherence to doctrine and that we must "change" some of our views to make them more palatable to them. However, the Lord's church has one major difference (among others) from human organizations we must follow God's directions given in the Bible. When man starts attempting to change the sound doctrine from God's Word then he is in direct violation of God's word (Deut. 4:2; Jer. 26:2; Gal. 1:6-9; 2 Jn. 9-11; Rev. 22:18,19; et. al.).

Popes will come and go. Catholic doctrine will vacillate back and forth. God's word remains "settled" in heaven (Ps. 119:89).

"Understandest Thou What Thou Singest?"

Paul indicated that we should sing both with the spirit and understanding as we praise God and His Son (1 Cor. 14:15). The context of this passage shows that some were singing in a language not understood by others, hence they could not all sing with understanding. Sometimes we sing words that may as well be in a foreign tongue for all of the understanding we have of their meaning. Such misunderstandings are caused by several factors, including figures of speech, archaic terminology, terms that are not archaic, but that are seldom used, failure to properly read a word and ignorance of Bible teaching alluded to in a song. Hopefully, the following will help us better understand what we are singing.

In the song, "Higher Ground," we sing of "heaven's tableland." This refers to a broad, level area, such as a plateau, which will be above this world and all its cares and trials.

In the song, "It Came Upon The Midnight Clear," the second verse speaks of "cloven skies," which does not refer to a spicy aroma, but to skies that are opened up and separated.

In "The Great Physician," we sing of the "seraph song." "Seraph" is an abbreviated term for "seraphim," high ranking angels (Isa, 6:2, 6).

When we sing of the "Rose of Sharon," we are not singing of a girl who has a thorny-stemmed flower. "Sharon is the name of the plain along the Mediterranean Seacoast stretching from Mt. Carmel northward and to Joppa southward. "Jesus, Rose of Sharon," is based upon the statement in Song of Solomon 2:1: "I am a rose of Sharon, A lily of the valleys." It is intended to figuratively convey the attractiveness of Christ.

If you shout and sing "Hosannas" to Christ, just what are you doing ("Just Over In The Gloryland")? "Hosanna is actually a Greek word spelled in English letters (transliterated), meaning, "Save, we pray!" It was the cry of acclamation that went up from the multitudes that accompanied the Lord into Jerusalem at His "Triumphal Entry" (Matt. 21:9).

A prophet whose pillow was a stone is mentioned in "Mansion Over The Hilltop." This "prophet" was Jacob who was fleeing from the wrath of Esau and pillowed his head on a stone at Luz (or Bethel), a place he passed through on his way to another land (Gen. 28:10-19).

In "Wonderful Love Of Jesus" we sing of raising "lays" to Jesus in praise. "Lay" is an archaic term for a song, thus, this hymn speaks of our attempts to praise Christ with spiritual songs.

When we sing "Ivory Palaces" we sing in the second verse that "aloes had a part" in Jesus' life. Aloes, a perfume made from the oil of a tree, was provided by Nicodemus to prepare the body of Jesus for burial. (John 19:39) and thus it symbolizes the sorrow surrounding His death.

What is an "Evenezer" ("O Thou Fount Of Every Blessing")? The word means "the stone of help" and it refers to a stone Samuel erected as a memorial of God's miraculous help to Israel in routing the Philistines (1 Sam. 7:10-12).

In "Give Me The Bible" we sing of the "glory gilding Jordan's wave" (some misread it as "gliding" instead of "gilding."). That which is gilded is overlaid with gold. "Jordan's wave" is a figurative reference to death; as Israel had to literally cross the Jordan River to enter the Promised Land, so we must all die to gain Heaven. Death holds men in fear, but the promises and comforts of God's word make even death attractive as though gilded for the faithful saint.

If you won a "Guerdon" ("Beautiful Isle Of Somewhere"), would you know what you had won? "Guerdon" simply means a reward and refers to the promise of God to reward His children in Heaven, that poetic "Beautiful Isle Of Somewhere."

"Tis Midnight And On Olive's Brow" has two expressions that some may miss. First, "Olive's brow" does not refer to the forehead of Popeye's sweetheart! Just east of Jerusalem, across the Kidron Valley, is the mount of Olives ("Olivet") upon whose side ("brow") is the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus retired there with His apostles and prayed His prayers of agony on the eve of the Crucifixion (John 18:1; Matt. 26:36). Second, the last verse of the song speaks of the "ether (not "either") plains," which is a figurative reference to the vast regions of space or Heaven.

What is "Ebon Pinion" in "Night, With Ebon Pinion?" "Ebon refers to the color black (as "ebony"). A "pinion" is the wing of a bird. The setting of this song is the betrayal and crucifixion of Christ. This series of events was so dark and somber that it was as though a great black bird, bearing doom, had cast its shadow over the Lord as He knelt in Gethsemane, was betrayed, tried and finally crucified.



"Look Around, Mr. President"

With all of our social, economic, and spiritual problems America is still a great nation. However, it would be well for our President and especially our Supreme Court Justices to take a look around Washington at some of the symbols of our nation's faith.

Senator Robert Byrd, two days following the Supreme Court declaring that prayer in the schools was unconstitutional (June 25, 1962), reminded his colleagues in Congress that "In no other place in the United States are there so many, and such varied official evidences of deep and abiding faith in God on the part of Governments as there are in Washington." Engraved on the metal cap on the top of the Washington Monument are the words: "Praise be to God." Lining the walls of the stairwell are such Biblical phrases as "Search the Scriptures," "Holiness to the Lord," "Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it." A bronze plaque in the Dirkson Office Building, over the seal of the United States, has in large letters "IN GOD WE TRUST," That same phrase appears opposite the President of the Senate, as well as inscribed in the marble backdrop to the Speaker of the House of Representatives. Above the head of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court are the Ten Commandments. At the Lincoln Memorial are inscribed his words, "That this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom..." At the north wall these words of Lincoln, "As was said 3000 years ago, so it still must be said, "the judgments of the Lord are true and righteous altogether." At the Jefferson Memorial are these prophetic words of Thomas Jefferson, "God who gave us life gave us liberty." Can liberties of a nation be secure when we have removed a conviction that these liberties are the gift of God? INDEED I TREMBLE FOR MY COUNTRY WHEN I REFLECT THAT GOD IS JUST, THAT HIS JUSTICE CANNOT SLEEP FOREVER" (empasis Ken's) (The Rebirth of America, pages 66-69)

In deed it is time that our officials look around and be reminded of what made our nation great, and go back to those Biblical principles openly believed by our founding fathers.


BINGO! That's our problem! We have become a people bored with the Bible!



The annual Firm Foundation Lectureship in the Greater Chattanooga area will be September 26-30 with the theme *God's Wonderful Word*. Lectures will be conducted at the East Ridge church of Christ. Lectures begin at 9:00 a.m. and conclude with the 8:00 p.m. service.

That's Just Your Interpretation

What do people mean by the statement, "That's your interpretation?" Many mean: "You've got your view of what the passage means and I've got mine — so who's to say mine's wrong and yours is right?" The matter is further muddled when one considers the fact that on any given religious question, there are knowledgeable, sincere authorities on both sides of the issue. Nevertheless, the Bible portrays a completely different picture.

God has given man a written revelation with the understand that it can be correctly comprehended. This means that for every teaching, there is a meaning that God originally intended to convey. It is our task to ascertain that one correct interpretation. There is only one such interpretation to any given passage — the right one, God's view! God made clear that we can arrive at the proper view. Jesus said, "Ye shall know the truth..." (John 8:32). Paul said, "Speak the same thing... be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment" (I Corinthians 1:10). Peter said, "If any man speak, let him speak as the oracles of God" (I Peter 4:11). Paul said, "Rightly divide (i.e. handle aright) the word of truth" (II Timothy 2:15). Luke said of the Bereans, "They received the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the Scriptures daily, whether those things were so" (Acts 17:11). Paul said to Festus, "I... but speak forth the words of truth and soberness" [i.e. things that are both true and reasonable] (Acts 26:25). John declared, "Believe not every spirit, but try the spirits whether they are of God" (I John 4:1). Notice that all of these passages are predicated upon the presupposition that individuals can, with proper study and logical reasoning, arrive at the conclusions that God intended to transmit.

So there is no such things as my interpretation and your interpretation. There is only God's meaning, and with diligent, rational study, we can arrive at the truth on any subject that is vital to our spiritual well-being. Rather than shrug off the conflicting views and positions on various subjects (e.g. baptism, instrumental music, divorce and remarriage) and dismiss religious differences as hopeless, unresolvable, and irrelevant, we must be about the business of studying and searching God's Book (cf. Acts 17:11; I Thessalonians 5:21). We must cautiously refrain from misinterpreting and misusing Scripture (cf. II Corinthians 4:2; II Peter 3:16). We must carefully consider both sides of every issue (I John 4:1; Proverbs 14:15). We must "take heed therefore how (we) hear" (Luke 8:18), i.e., make certain our hearts are genuinely receptive to the truth (Luke 8:15).

We must also realize that there are those who are "ever learning, and never able to come to the knowledge of the truth" (II Timothy 3:7 and not permit such to deter us from being convinced that we can know the truth. Having given sufficient attention to these important keys to ascertaining God's Will, we can be certain of our ability to come to the knowledge of the truth (I Timothy 2:3,4).





"Why Should I Place Membership?"

"Why do I need to place membership; I'm already a member of Christ's church?" "I'm a member of the church 'at large,' and I believe that it is enough," another proclaims. The question is a good one, surely deserving an answer.

In times past, when people moved from one congregation to another, they often took with them a letter of recommendation. It was a good practice, for it served to introduce one (or a family) to the new congregation, and informed the new congregation that the bearer was faithful.

Whatever happened to such a practice? If it was a good idea earlier, why is it not also a good idea today? Obviously, it would assist the elders to do their work in a better way. They are shepherds of the flock (Acts 20:28; I Peter 5:1-4; Hebrews 13:17), yet it is difficult, at times, for them to ever figure out who is in their flock, and who isn't!

Sometimes sheep (Christians) move into an area, worship with the local church for a while, then "shop around" for a few years for greener pastures. Are they a part of the local flock just by virtue of their moving into the area? Surely not. The fact is, some still consider themselves members of the congregation back home (perhaps in another state). Do the shepherds "back home" watch for their souls? The answer is obvious! Local elders may wonder, "Is that sheep in our flock, or does he belong in another local flock overseen by other shepherds?" Possibly some of these "suitcase" Christians just want to become lost in the crowd, which may explain their refusal to place membership with a local congregation.

A number of years ago, a family moved to a new city, and placed membership with the local church there. On the card submitted to be read to the congregation, they stated they desired to be a part of the local church there, and furthermore, they were placing themselves under the oversight of the local shepherds to watch in behalf of their souls. We recommend this practice as being worthy of emulation. If all members would follow such a policy, the first eldership would know that they were no longer responsible for these sheep, while the second eldership would know that their job of watching after the welfare of their sheep was greater now. But at least both would know which sheep were in their flock!

Suggestions For Congregational Singing

- 3. Sing in time. Watch the song director and follow his leading. Be especially careful not to sing too slowly. Sing as a happy, active alert person who sings who enjoys praising his God.
- 4. Above all, sing spiritually. Try to honor God in every word you sing. Aim at pleasing Him more than yourself or any other person.







Pulpit Preview

"Is This Appropriate?"

Last Wednesday when I came home from work, my girls were wearing new spring play-clothes. At the supper table, Amy (our two year old) asked in reference to the shirt she was wearing, "Is this appropriate?" She wanted to know if she could wear it to Bible study. The word "appropriate" had not been used during the meal until she brought it up. We could not help laughing at such a big word being pronounced so precisely by such a little girl. But she already knows that some clothing is appropriate and some is not for going to the services of the church.

Some bigger folks would do well to ask the same question as they choose what to wear to Bible study or worship. We all seem to understand the importance of wanting to look our best in most of life's activities. Appropriate dress is a requirement on most jobs. We dress for social functions by an understood standard. The reason dress is so important is that our attitude toward an activity in which we engage is expressed by the way we dress for it. We would not dishonor a bride and groom, or a dead loved one by dressing in an inappropriate way for the wedding or funeral. But God is entitled to our honor and respect above any other being. Does the clothing we wear to the assembly reflect the importance of honoring him? In view of what is customary in our society, each should ask Amy's question as he decides what to wear to worship: "Is this appropriate?"

But for a Christian, this is not just a Sunday and Wednesday question. A Christian should ask this same question with respect to whatever he wears daily. Both men and women would do well to ask, "Is what I wear appropriate for one 'professing godlines'?" (I Tim. 2:10) The fashions and standards of an ungodly world cannot be our guide. We are the "called out" (the literal meaning of the word for church.) We are "bis own special people." (Titus 2:14, NKJV)

The question of what is appropriate for a Christian to wear is not as difficult as some have made it. If we are in fact living by a different standard from the world, our wardrobe should reflect that difference. The world has lost its sense of modesty and propriety; it no longer blushes at clothing that is too short, too tight, too realing, too suggestive, or that calls undue attention to the wearer. Before Christians should blindly follow the trends of fashion, we should ask, "Is this appropriate?"

A Letter To The Congregation...

This past week we had one of the best Gospel Meetings since I have been here. Brother Edwards obviously prepared well and taught the Truth with his characteristic kind manner. There was one thing which was *very*, *very* disappointing — our attendance. We had the support and encouragement of several preachers and congregations in our area. The church at Morrison even brought a bus load of 21 on Friday evening. Why then was the attendance disappointing? The members at Bybee Branch did not attend like they should!

I would like for you to consider very seriously what Paul said to the Colossians. "If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God. Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth." (Col. 3:1,2). I don't believe that many of our members could say that this past week-end they were seeking the things above. The actions speak much louder than words. It appears that worldly things have caught our attention.

Another matter which needs to be considered is what our influence says. The writer of Hebrews states that those who fall away "...crucify to themselves the Son of God afresh, and put him to an open shame." (Heb. 6:6). It is truly sad when people bring shame on their Savior and his body! I personally was ashamed to see so few of our people attending the services! After all, it was *our* Gospel Meeting. What do you answer to our visitors? Do you say that some must have things more important than supporting their own Gospel Meeting. I was left speechless.

There is another reason why I believe that the lack of attendance at these lessons was so serious. Brother Edwards was dealing with the main threats to the Lord's church today. The things he had to say were to warn and encourage us to stand fast in the Truth of God's Word. The support which was given to the Meeting you would think that most are unconcerned and uninterested in the future health of the Lord's church. Where will you be when it comes time to stand on the proper role of women in the worship of the church? instrumental music? marriage, divorce, and remarriage? the unity movement? Will you know where to stand?

It really is not important what I think or feel. The Lord knows the hearts of everyone and those who had good reasons for being unable to attend. He also knows those who are half-hearted and indifferent! I beg of each of you to think, consider, contemplate, and reason how important these matters are.

"Am I therefore become your enemy, because I tell you the truth?" (Gal. 4:16).





On Saturday his grocer made a mistake and did not charge him for a pound of butter. He did not correct the mistake. After all, it was the grocer's fault.

On Sunday he went to worship. He didn't join in the singing. His mind wandered during the prayers. He slept through the sermon, and was very relieved when the service was over. It was surprising to all that he could find so many things wrong with the service and those who conducted it, when he had seemed to pay such little attention to what was going on. That evening he stayed home and watched TV, or went to the movies.



Church of Tomorrow

Ten little classrooms, all in a row, For the church of tomorrow, ready to go.

But the sixth year classroom closed its door. "They're about to be baptized; teach no more."

The fifth year classroom, I'm sorry to relate, Suffered and died a very similar fate.

Third and fourth graders, still needing to grow. Rushed in bright eyed. Their teachers? No show.

Second year students studied and tried. "Too busy to teach," a church member cried.

First graders, just beginning to learn. "Not me, " said an adult, "It's not my turn."

Kindergarteners mix learning with play. Just give us a leader is what they say.

Four year olds, bright as can be. But someone needs to help us, you see.

Being three isn't what it's cracked up to be. Our teachers tell us they need time to be free.

"Terrrible two," you know about us. NO ONE wants to teach us, we trust.

One year babies. What's standing in our way? Not enough teachers was heard last Sunday.

So ten little classrooms closed their doors. The church of tomorrow? It is no more.

Teachers and Their Rewards

Teaching the Bible is the greatest task in the world. It demands the best of our time, talents, and means. It calls upon us to read, study, learn, obey and impart to others the greatest book in the world. It requires patient hearts and helpful hands in dealing with precious souls, young and old, from all walks of life. It is imperative that one love God, his word, and the souls of men. It is vital that one be faithful in life in order to teach God's word. It is critical that one teach with enthusiasm, and yet be longsuffering.

The sacrifices made by teachers is not seen by most. Some have the mistaken notion that all that teachers do is spend about 30 to 45 minutes in a classroom on Sunday morning or Wednesday night. A city-slicker watched a farmer unloading his bales of hay one day (This had to be a few years ago, because now farmers roll their hay.) and commented that the farmer did not have to do very much to get a good crop "laid by." The farmer's response was, "What do you mean? I'm just unloading it." That is the way it is in teaching or preaching. Just as the farmer must prepare the ground by plowing and fertilizing, then sow the seed and harvest the crop before he can lay it up for the winter, so the teacher must prepare his/her lesson by reading, studying, and researching. For the younger children there are lesson helps, visual aids and takehome material that must be prepared. Prayer is also a prerequisite to presenting the lessons.

Our teachers have a very important and indispensable role in the growth of the Lord's church here. No teacher should take his responsibility lightly. James wrote, "Be not many of you teachers, my brethren, knowing that we shall receive heavier judgment." No matter how good the material my be, if the teacher is unprepared or ill prepared, the lesson will not be successful. There is no substitute for preparation.

Do you remember the teachers who had the biggest impact on your life? Did they know their lessons well? Did they present them in an orderly way? Did they demand that you live up to your capabilities? Did they inspire you to live better? Did they set the proper example before you? Were they faithful in attendance to all the services? Were they sacrificial? Were they concerned about your welfare, both physically and spiritually, not only in the classroom, but outside the classroom as well? Did they command respect? Did they practice discipline in a firm, but kind way? Were they some of the best members of the church?

Bible teaching also has its rewards. There are some rich dividends that come to those who teach the word of God. First, one who faithfully imparts the word of God drives satisfaction in knowing that he or she is doing the will of God. The writer of Hebrews rebuked some because they had not developed to the point that they could teach others. "For when for the time ye ought to be teachers, ye have need that one teach you again which be the first principles of the oracles of God; and are become such as have need of milk, and not of strong meat. For every one that useth milk is unskillful in the word of righteousness: for he is a babe. But strong meat belongeth to them that are of full age, even those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil." (Heb. 5:12-14) So, conversely, Jesus said, "If ye know these things, happy are ye if ye do them." (Jno. 13:17) Second, there is also a feeling of accomplishment when one's student has grasped some soul-saving truth. There is no greater thrill than to see spiritual growth in one's students. "I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth." (III Jno. 1:4) Third, a teacher will learn from the studying he/she does in preparation for the class. Usually, teachers, because they study more than the students, learn more. Remember the maxim: One gets out of a lesson in direct proportion to what one puts into it. Fourth, a teacher grows spiritually as he or she exercises his/her talents and abilities.

There are not only rewards enjoyed in this life for teaching, but Paul spoke of a joy that his students would bring to him in the final day. "For what is our hope, or joy, or crown of rejoicing? Are not even ye in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ at his coming?" (I Thess. 2:19) "For ye are our glory and joy." (I Thess. 2:20) "As also ye have acknowledged us in part, that we are your rejoicing, even as ye also are ours in the day of the Lord Jesus." (II Cor. 1:14)
