## Making Simple Things Hard

We are great planners. We like to spend many hours drawing up complex organizations, carefully constructed diagrams, and in-depth plans for building the church. Most of these never come to fruition. Many are just "pipe dreams."

Would you be interested in a simple, yet profound, plan that will help you build the church? Listen to the simple formula for a growing church set out by Mack R. Douglas in his book, *How to Make a Habit of Succeeding*:

1. **Set a Goal.** That's logical. You can never know if you've arrived at the place you wanted to go unless you first had your target pinpointed. Right? Set your goal for numbers, baptisms, visits, etc.
2. **Get a Plan.** Planning is drawing a map as to how you are going to reach your goal. Ever have someone try to tell you how to get to some place and have them say, "Get me a piece of paper." He draws you a map that tells you how to get from where you are to where you want to be. That's what we mean by planning.
3. **Goto Work.** Somebody always has to foul up a good idea. This is our biggest stumbling block. We've got lots of goal setters and planners, but are short on workers. But this is where the "rubber meets the road." No church is going to grow unless we've got people working! Jesus felt this pain during his ministry, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few" (Matt. 9:37). Douglas then adds this fourth point: "Don't be discouraged by anything or anybody."

Let's build great churches for the glory of God!

## Ten Guidelines for Effective Prayer

1. Set aside a few minutes everyday. Do not say anything; simply practice thinking about God. This will make your mind spiritually receptive.
2. Then pray orally, using simple natural words. Tell God everything that is on your mind. Do not think you must use stereotyped, pious phrases. Talk to God in your own natural language. He understands.
3. Pray as you go about the business of the day. Utter minute prayers by closing your eyes to shut out the world and concentrating briefly on God's presence. The more you do this everyday, the nearer you will feel God's presence.
4. Do not always ask for something when you pray. Spend most of your prayer time giving thanks for God Himself and His blessings.
5. Pray with the belief that sincere prayers can reach out and surround your loved ones with God's love and protection.
6. Never use negative thoughts in prayer. Only positive thoughts get results.
7. Always express willingness to accept God's will. Ask for what you want, but be willing to take what God gives you. It may be better than what you ask for.
8. Practice the attitude of putting everything in God's hands. Ask for the ability to do your best and to leave the results to God.
9. Pray for people you do not like or who have mistreated you. Resentment is guaranteed to short-circuit spiritual power.
10. Make a list of people for whom to pray. The more you pray for others, the more positive results you will note from your prayers.

## Don't Worry—It's Only Your Soul

There are many situations encountered during a lifetime that are viewed as being sad and even unfair. When a young person loses his or her life, when parents lose a small child, or when lifelong mates are separated by death, people often take it upon themselves to question God. The sadness of physical death, however, does not even compare to the pain that will eventually come after a spiritual death. Ironically, people still place a far greater importance upon physical health and presence than they do spiritual health and eternal life.

Most people in the world have developed an attitude of indifference toward God. Many members of the church refuse to realize that the correct relationship with God and Christ is far more important than any physical ties that might exist (see Luke 14:26). A study of Jesus' healing of the palsied man in Mark 2 reveals how our Saviour felt about the importance of spiritual health when compared to physical health. Having the opportunity to heal the man of his physical ailment, Jesus chose instead to heal the man's spiritual disease first. He said, "Son, thy sins be forgiven thee" (Mark 2:5).

People today, however, would rather not worry about their spiritual life if they can help it. Too often, congregations are more worried about how many members that they can pack into their buildings by being "luring" (that is not a misprint—CR) and nonconfrontational, than they are about whether God's Word is upheld. It is usually the case that the leaders of those congregations have already been lured into Satan's trap, and spiritual sickness has set in on both them and the members.

It is a sad situation indeed when people choose to ignore their spiritual emergencies. Too many brothers and sisters have gone astray because they have chosen to follow what a man has said instead of what God has said. God sent His Son to lead all who would follow Him to salvation (John 3:16,17). When people who are blinded by physical ties, however, follow others who have long been blind, it is no wonder that the whole lot falls into the ditch. We must all decide to pick up our crosses and follow Jesus rather than men (Matthew 16:24), because our souls are in danger.

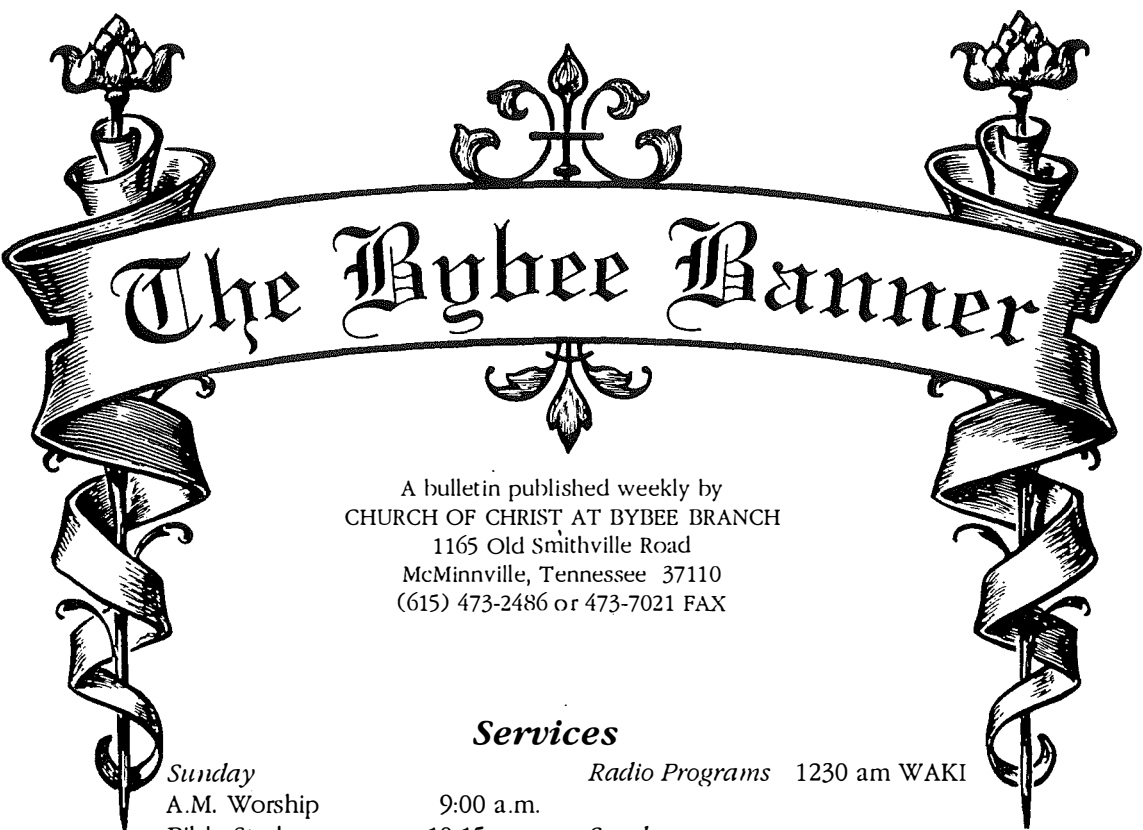

The Importance of Just “One”

If one spark plug burns out on your engine, you don't say, “I'm glad the other three (or five, or seven) are still firing.”—and keep driving! If you have a flat tire on one wheel, you don't say, “Oh, well, it's just ONE that is flat!”—and keep going. If cancer is discovered in only one member of your body, you don't say, “Well, Doc, someday I may have something done about that:—but not now: I'll just wait and see what develops.— The truth is, it is confined to that one part of my body!” If you smell smoke, and discover a blaze in only one closet in your house, you don't sit back and say, “Maybe it soon will burn itself out! I'll just wait and see what happens!—After all, it's just in that one little closet!” No, my friends: You take immediate action in each of these cases! One bad thing is important!

Similarly, ONE good thing is also important! The story you are about to read is true and no names have been changed!! During the War Between the States (no war has ever been “Civil”!), a young woman—whose name I have not learned—at Centerville, Tennessee, left denominationalism and became a simple New Testament Christian. (What other kind of “Christian” can there be?” Her sweetheart, a member of the same denomination she had left, was in the Confederate Army. His name was J.H. Halbrook. Captured by the Union Army, he was held a “Prisoner of War” in Michigan. At the end of hostilities, he was released, and given a railroad ticket to Nashville, Tennessee, plus (as I recall) two dollars and a half (\$2.50) “mustering out” pay. I have not learned if he rode the stage-coach, or walked, or how he got from Nashville to his home. But he arrived there, and found what was left of his family—and his girl friend. Their courtship soon blossomed into marriage.

His wife showed him from the Bible the difference between what he and she formerly had been taught, and what the word of God says, It was (and still is!) so simple and plain that he thought anybody ought to see the truth. He did see it, and “obeyed the gospel” (Rom. 10:16) of Christ. Soon he was sharing with his neighbors respect for the word of God, the gospel plan of salvation, the Bible church, what name we should wear in religion, how to worship, etc. He baptized one neighbor after another. Ere long he was preaching publicly!

After he preached for several months, he recognized that he needed to study the Bible systematically; so they sold out at Centerville, and moved to Florence, Alabama. He enrolled in Mars Hill Bible School to study under T.B. Larimore, a great gospel preacher. Upon completing his studies there, instead of going back to Tennessee, they moved farther south, coming into Walker, Marion, Fayette and Lamar Counties in Alabama. I do not know how many hundreds (or thousands?) he converted to Christ. Neither do I know how many of those he converted began also to preach the gospel in its ancient simplicity and purity.

But let me tell you about ONE! Charley Alexander Wheeler learned to read after he married. His wife taught him to read—out of the Bible! It was his only textbook! I knew hem when he was an old man. When he visited my father and wanted to know what is in the local newspaper, I read it to him—for those words were unfamiliar to him! But he could read the Bible! (I was one of six gospel preachers who served as his pall-bearers in 1937). He and his wife, both members of a denomination, heard bro. J.H. Halbrook preach. Along with his wife, C.A. Wheeler obeyed the gospel and soon began preaching it to others. His tombstone at the Dutton Cemetery (near the Midway Church of Christ, Jasper, Alabama), proclaims that this one man— C.A. Wheeler—started more than one hundred congregations, and baptized six thousand people! Is ONE important?? Remember the chain of events: One girl in the 1860's became a Christian and taught her husband (J.H. Halbrook) the gospel. J.H. Halbrook converted hundreds (maybe thousands) of others besides C.A. Wheeler! But that ONE baptized six thousand others, as we have seen.

—But wait! The story is not ended! ONE of those six thousand baptized by brother Wheeler was my father, the late Gus Nichols! And twelve thousand people were baptized under his preaching! — I ask again: Is ONE important??

Among those baptized by Gus Nichols, no one knows, nor can know, how many began to preach “the glorious gospel of Christ” (II Cor.4:3-4); but I personally know several. I, Flavil Nichols, myself am ONE whom he baptized and whom he encouraged to preach the truth. And under my preaching, about three thousand have been baptized. A few among them preach the gospel also!

Only eternity can reveal the total results of the conversion of that one girl nearly one hundred fifty years ago. The results are not yet all in! But this shows that TWENTY-ONE (21,000) people have become Christians through this single thread in the fabric of her influence.

“Go, and do likewise” (Luke 10:37). YOU are important, too! Dear reader, if you go to heaven, others probably will be saved by you! “What knowest thou, O wife, whether thou shalt save thy husband? or how knowest thou, O man, whether thou shalt save thy wife?” (I Cor. 7:16). “Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven” (Matt. 5:16). Each ONE is very important!

## Thai Trip Report

Brother Thurman Bennett called from Thailand this past Sunday morning to report on the Gospel Meeting held this past week in the Northeast. There were 330 at the meeting with 5 baptisms Sunday morning. The group gave the largest contribution in the history of the work. They gave \$822 with the farmers bringing 5 bags of rice. This week will begin a week of training for the preachers and their wives.

## Do We Mean What We Sing?

The Bible emphasizes that we are to teach and admonish one another as we sing with grace in our hearts to the Lord (Col. 3:16). Do we follow inspiration's admonition: "I will sing with the spirit, and I will sing with the understanding also" (1 Cor. 14:15)? Have you ever failed to pay attention to the words of the hymns we sing? Do we mean what we sing? The longer I live, the more I am convinced that the way we praise God in song is really a reflection of our spirituality. We either incriminate ourselves by the words we sing if we do not mean them, or we exhort others as well as ourselves to life on a higher, holier plane, Do we mean what we sing?

Is it "I want to be a Worker," or is it "I Want to be a Shirker?" Is it "More Holiness Give Me," or is it "More Worldliness Give Me?" Is it "Amazing Grace," or is God's grace "Amazing Waste" in our lives? Is "A Charge to Keep Have I?" really "A Visa Charge to Keep Have I?" Is "Count Your Blessings" really "Complain About Your Burdens?" Is "Have Thine Own Way, Lord" really "Have Mine Own Way?" Is "I Surrender All" simply "I Surrender Some?" Is "Sweet Hour of Prayer" really "Sweet Second of Prayer?" Is "We Gather Together" merely "We Gather Together When Ball games, Fishing or Anything Else I'd Rather Be Doing Does Not Work Out?" Is "O Sacred Head, Now Wounded" just a description of how our head aches after the preacher's sermon? Is "Blessed Assurance" better called "Fire Insurance?" Is "What A Friend We Have In Jesus" more appropriately, "What A Friend We have in TV?"

It is not my purpose to be irreverent in any way, but I do want to make the point-Do We Mean What We Sing? A spiritually minded congregation is a singing congregation! A believer's practical theology may well be his hymnology. Do we mean what we sing?

*Hymns breathe the praise of the saints, the visions of the prophets, The prayers of the penitent and the spirit of the martyrs. They bring solace to the sad, assurance to the perplexed, faith to the doubter and comfort to the oppressed. Study them to be pure in heart, sing them to be joyful in spirit, store them in the mind to possess a treasury of worship.*

## The Move To Unite With Denominationalists

"Now I urge you, brethren, note those who cause divisions and offenses, contrary to the doctrine which you learned, and avoid them. For those who are such do not serve our Lord Jesus Christ, but their own belly, and by smooth words and flattering speech deceive the hearts of the simple (Romans 16: 17 - 18).

In the Spiritual Sword (October 1996) Alan Highers quotes William S. Banowsky, Rubel Shelly and Max Lucado advocating an inclusive fellowship with denominationalism. Perhaps the most telling quote is this one from Rubel:

"We will not lose our separate denominational identities, we will not give up our particular heritages and histories, we will not have to give up our distinctive practices with regard to our different organizational structures, worship, and so on. I see no need for that. But we will have to decide that there is something that matters more than those things, and we will have to quit being idolaters who give those things such priority that we divide over those and refuse to recognize one another as brothers and sisters in the Lord."

The move to unite with denominationalists is "closer to home" than some realize. In a newspaper article, Lynn Anderson, "Senior" Minister of the Preston Road Church of Christ in Dallas, commended the Northwest Bible Church, Park Cities Presbyterian, Park Cities Baptist and Highland Park Presbyterian with these words: "Hats off to those massive life-changing churches and outstanding Christian leaders. Giants all!"

Right in our own backyard on March 3, 1996, Rick Atchley, Pulpit Minister of the Richland Hills Church of Christ, delivered a Sunday evening speech embracing denominationalists of all kinds and their ministers as brothers and sisters in Christ, "... Christians of all colors and stripes. " He further makes it clear that anyone who refuses to go along with this is divisive to the church and we are to "have nothing to do with him...we are not to fellowship with those...we must recognize who the real enemy is." According to Rick, "the real enemy" is not the false teachers of denominationalism, but those of us who refuse to unite with them.

Whoever transgresses and does not abide in the doctrine of Christ does not have God. He who abides in the doctrine of Christ has both the Father and the Son. If anyone comes to you and does not bring this doctrine, do not receive him into your house nor greet him; for he who greets him shares in his evil deeds (11 John 9-11).

And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather expose them (Ephesians 5:11).

The perverted gospel of denominationalists corrupted by human dogmas and traditions cannot produce true Christians in the Lord's church (Matt. 15:1-13; Gal. 1:6-10). Only the pure gospel "seed" planted in good and honest hearts will produce the church of Christ (Luke 8:11). Whenever and wherever that Word is preached, without human additions and subtractions, and hearers respond to it by believing, repenting and being immersed for the remissions of sins, upon their confession of faith that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, Christians are produced and the Lord adds these saved ones to His church (Mark 16: 15-16; Acts 2:36-47; 8:35-39; 18:8; 22:16). All true disciples of Christ will call men out of denominationalism and into His church.

## The Sword of the Spirit

The word of God (the Bible) is the instrument the Holy Spirit uses to operate on the mind/heart of man. In conviction, conversion, and sanctification the Holy Spirit operates only through the Word of God.

### CONVICTION

In John 16:8, Jesus promised that the Holy Spirit (also called the comforter and the Spirit of Truth in these chapters-John 14-16) would "reprove" (convict) the world of sin. The manner by which He would do this is found in John 16:13. Here the Lord states that the apostles would be guided into "all truth" by the Holy Spirit. The book of Acts records the preaching of the truth of the Gospel. Note the following verses: *And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance, Acts 2:4. Now when they heard this, they were pricked in their heart, and said unto Peter and to the rest of the apostles, Men and brethren, what shall we do? (Acts 2:37). When they heard that, they were cut to the heart, and took counsel to slay them (Acts 5:33).*

These verses clearly show that the Holy Spirit convicted sinners through the word of God that these inspired men were preaching. No one was ever convicted of SIN apart from the power of the Word of God.

### CONVERSION

The Holy Spirit never operated on anyone directly (apart from the Word) in order to create faith within. The Holy Spirit never operated on anyone directly to bring about the new birth. The Holy Spirit never operated on anyone directly in order to save them. All of these were (and are) accomplished by the power of the Word of God (the sword of the Spirit). Please note: *Wherefore lay apart all filthiness and superfluity*

*of naughtiness, and receive with meekness the engrafted word, which is able to save your souls (James 1:21). Seeing ye have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit unto unfeigned love of the brethren, see that ye love one another with a pure heart fervently: Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, the word of God, which liveth and abideth forever (I Pet. 1:22-23). So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God (Rom. 10:17).*

### CHRISTIAN GROWTH

After conversion, the Holy Spirit operates in the Christian to produce growth and fruit. How does the Holy Spirit produce growth? How does the Holy Spirit produce fruit in the life of the Christian? The Bible answer is clear: *For the hope which is laid up for you in heaven, whereof ye heard before in the word of the truth of the gospel; Which is come unto you, as it is in all the world; and bringeth forth fruit, as it doth also in you, since the day ye heard of it, and knew the grace of God in truth; (Col. 1:5-6). But that on the good ground are they, which is an honest and good heart, having heard the word, keep it, and bring forth fruit with patience (Luke 8:15). As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby: (I Pet. 2:2).* The Holy Spirit operates on the mind/heart of the Christian only through the Word of God.

### FALSE DOCTRINE IN THE CHURCH

Here are some quotes from brethren who advocate a direct operation of the Holy Spirit (i.e. apart from God's written word):

**Furman Kearley** (editor of the Gospel Advocate)

"It is perfectly consistent with God's word and free moral agency for the Holy Spirit to help us arrange our thoughts and to bring to our remembrance information that will be of help to us in making the right decision in the right situation" (**God's Indwelling Spirit**, pp. 43, 46).

**Steve Flatt** (preacher at the Madison Church of Christ in Madison, Tennessee)

"... how are we led by the Spirit of God? Well we are led by the Word if we will spend time there. But folks, it goes beyond that. I have become a great believer in my life that the Holy Spirit will lead us in all kinds of decisions and attitudes and emotions when we stay with him in the Word and in prayer. In fact, I think that is part of what is meant in Jas. 1:5 ..... Do you believe that God will give you wisdom?" You say, well he only does that through the Word. Oh, I believe He does it through the Word but I don't believe He does it only through the Word. I believe he does it through the Holy Spirit living in our heart. I believe that is part of the way we are led by the Holy Spirit." (Jubilee speech-1993)

Present Work of the Holy Spirit — Tract by **Jimmy Jividen**, p. 12.

"The indwelling of the Holy Spirit gives one power. The power that the Holy Spirit gives is beyond the written word of God."

It would be interesting to hear these brethren explain the difference between their position and the position held by Oral Roberts, Pat Robertson, Billy Graham, and other denominational preachers who advocate the "direct operation" theory.

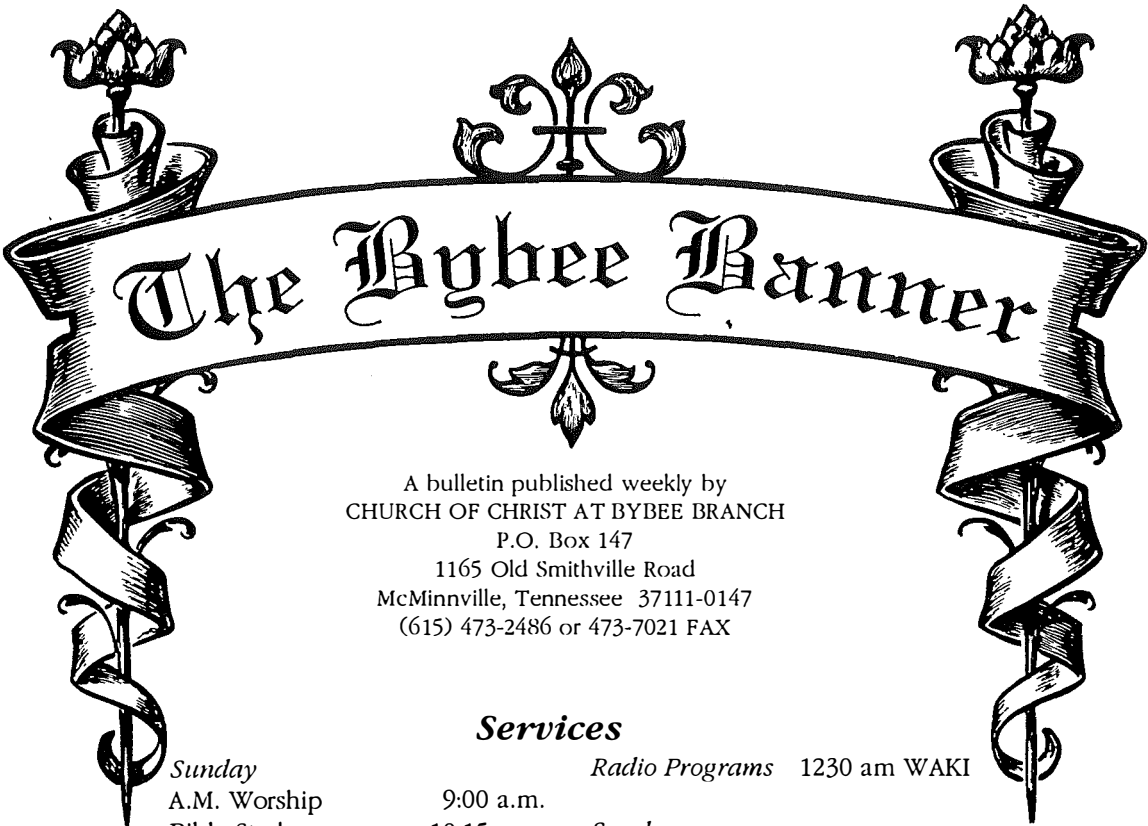

3. In November of 1994, Disney announces its Fifth "Annual Gay and Lesbian Days" at Disney World in Orlando.
4. Disney has announced a new TV cartoon that will feature some animated characters from, Lion King as the first homosexual characters on screen.
5. Hyperion, another Company owned by Disney, is publishing a book titled, *Growing Up Gay: From Left Out to Coming Out*.

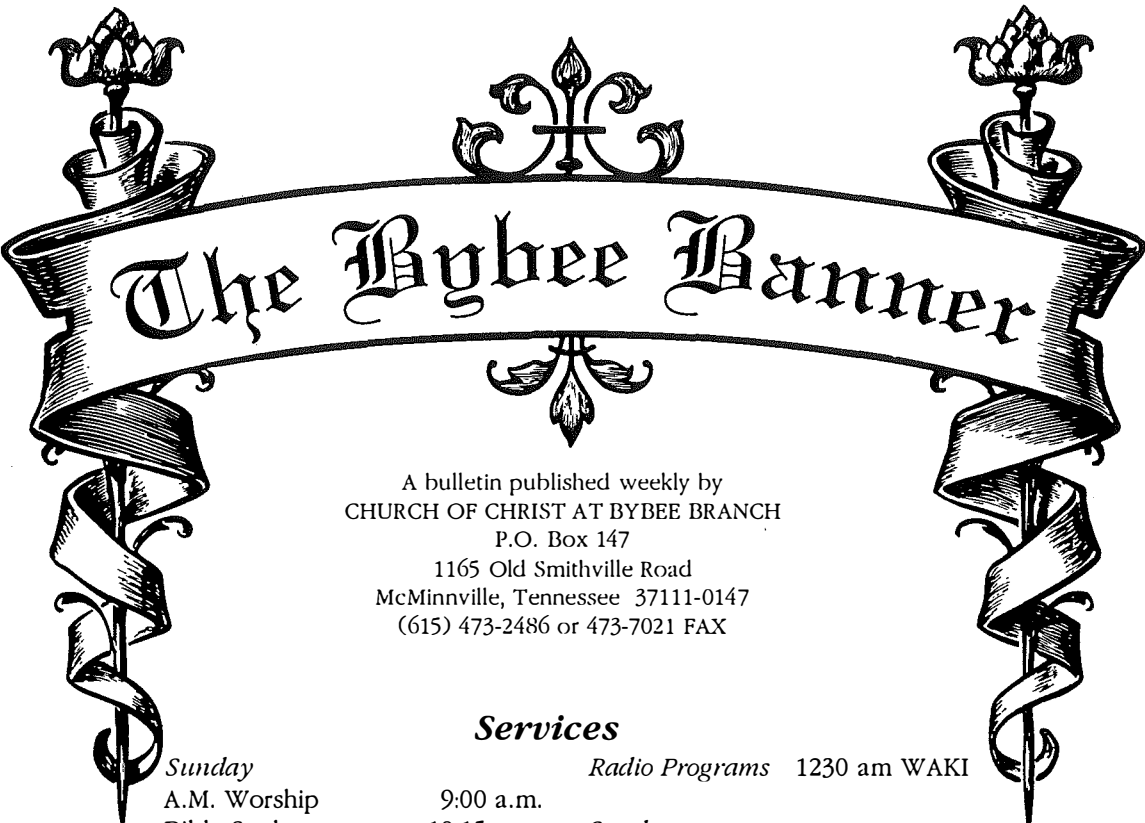

If you have any suggestions for how we might better reach our local community with the gospel please write these down and give them to one of the elders over the next month. After these are received they will be compiled and discussed as to which ones can work the best and how to best carry them out. Your input in this is can be very helpful. You might just be the person with the best suggestion.

## Some Suggestions for Teaching the Gospel

We all realize the necessity of teaching the gospel to the whole world (Mt. 28:19; Mk. 16:15), but when we approach someone to teach them the Gospel how are we to proceed? When one studies the Bible he observes that the Gospel was taught to different people with different types of methods but essential message remained the same.

When teaching our friends and neighbors, let me make the following suggestions:

1. **Teach with respect to your hearers.** No true salesman would ever insult his prospective client. Christians cannot afford to be arrogant nor disrespectful. After praying for God to open a door for the Word, Paul said, “Let your speech always be with grace, seasoned with salt, that you may know how you ought to answer each one.” (Col. 4:6, NKJV).
2. **Teach with a knowledge of your hearer and his background.** Such was the key to Paul’s lesson in Acts 17. He knew that the men of Athens were not knowledgeable concerning the Old Testament neither did they believe in it. Thus, Paul spoke with an understanding of their background and approached them regarding their altar to an “unknown god.”
3. **Begin to teach your prospect at the point where he is.** If the prospect already believes in the existence of God, the inspiration of the Bible, and the deity of Jesus Christ, then begin to show that the Bible teaches the one church. However, if one does not accept one of the previous points he would begin there. Too many times teachers either wear out their prospects with information which they already accept or they begin too far down the line. In the account of Philip and the Eunuch we see Philip first asking if the Eunuch understood what he was reading. Then he began at that Scripture and preached Jesus to him. Ultimately the Eunuch was baptized.
4. **Do your best and leave God the rest.** We can only plant and water, God gives the increase. When we have made an earnest effort to teach and it has been rejected, we should realize that the blood is off our hands and that we have fulfilled our mission for God. It is the job of a teacher to be a watchman. He is to warn of impending disaster of those who do not obey. If they do not heed the warning, it is their own fault! Many of the greatest men of God were unsuccessful in their attempts to get men to change their sinful ways, and in the same way many of us may be unsuccessful in getting men today to turn from their sinful ways. We can only do our best and leave the rest to God. However, we should make sure we are doing our best! “Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with your might...” (Ecc. 9:10, NKJV).

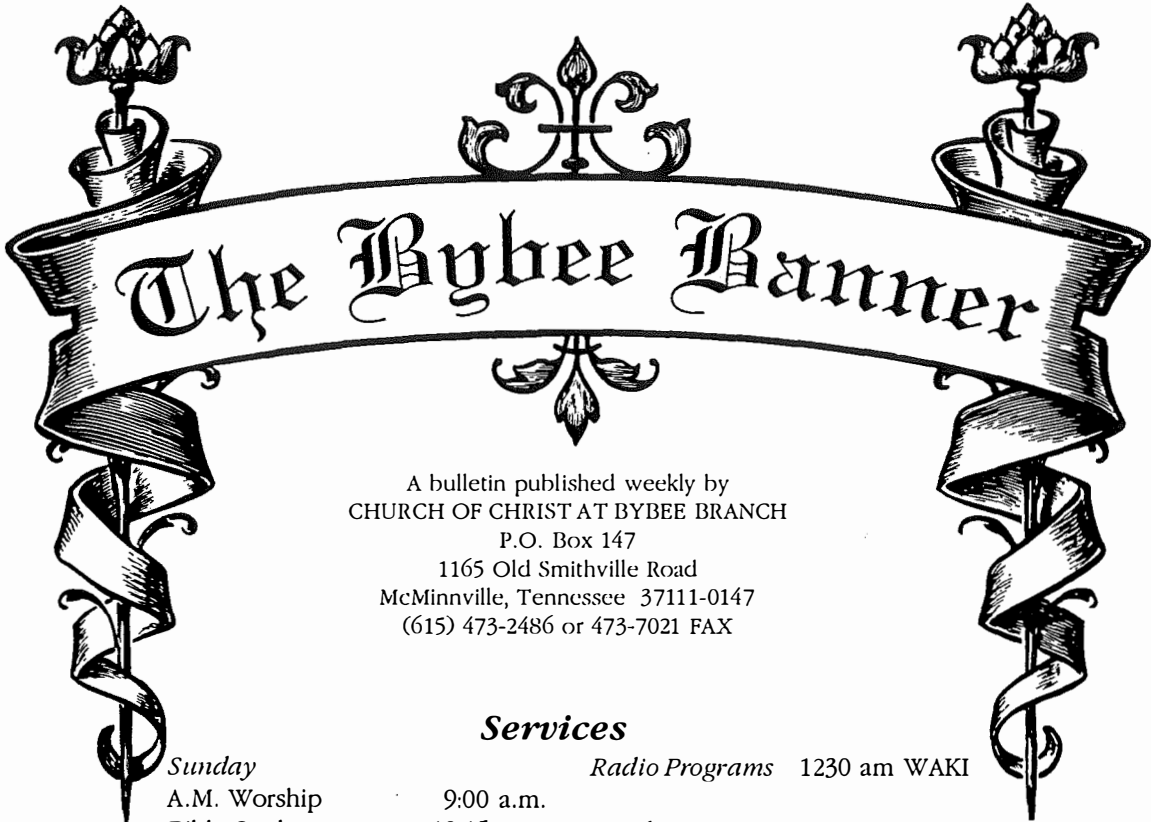

## "I Just Deliver Them"

Along our street I recently met our mailman at the box. I jokingly told him not to bring me any bills. He, in a very witty manner, quickly responded, "I don't make them, I just deliver them." The simple point he transmitted to me was clear. This is the same point that some need to understand about teachers and preachers of the Word. When a godly proclaimer of the truth broadcasts God's Word without compromise, he is not its source (II Peter 20, 21), just the messenger. When he preaches against the sins of the day (social drinking, denominationalism and false religion, dancing, immodest apparel, etc . . .), he may upset some people. This is not his intention. However, we must realize that he does have a duty to speak the whole truth in love:

1. Acts 20:26,27 — "Wherefore I take you to record this day, that I am pure from the blood of all men. For I have not shunned to declare unto you all the counsel of God."
2. Ephesians 4:15 — "But speaking the truth in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ."

The sincere preacher of the gospel has a love for souls who need the saving message of the gospel (I Timothy 4: 16; John 8:32). It is as useless to become upset with him as it would be to become upset with the mailman for bringing a bill or a letter containing unhappy news.

Whenever you hear God's Word and it "steps on your toes" or you are offended, don't become upset with the messenger. Instead, remember the mailman — "I just deliver them."

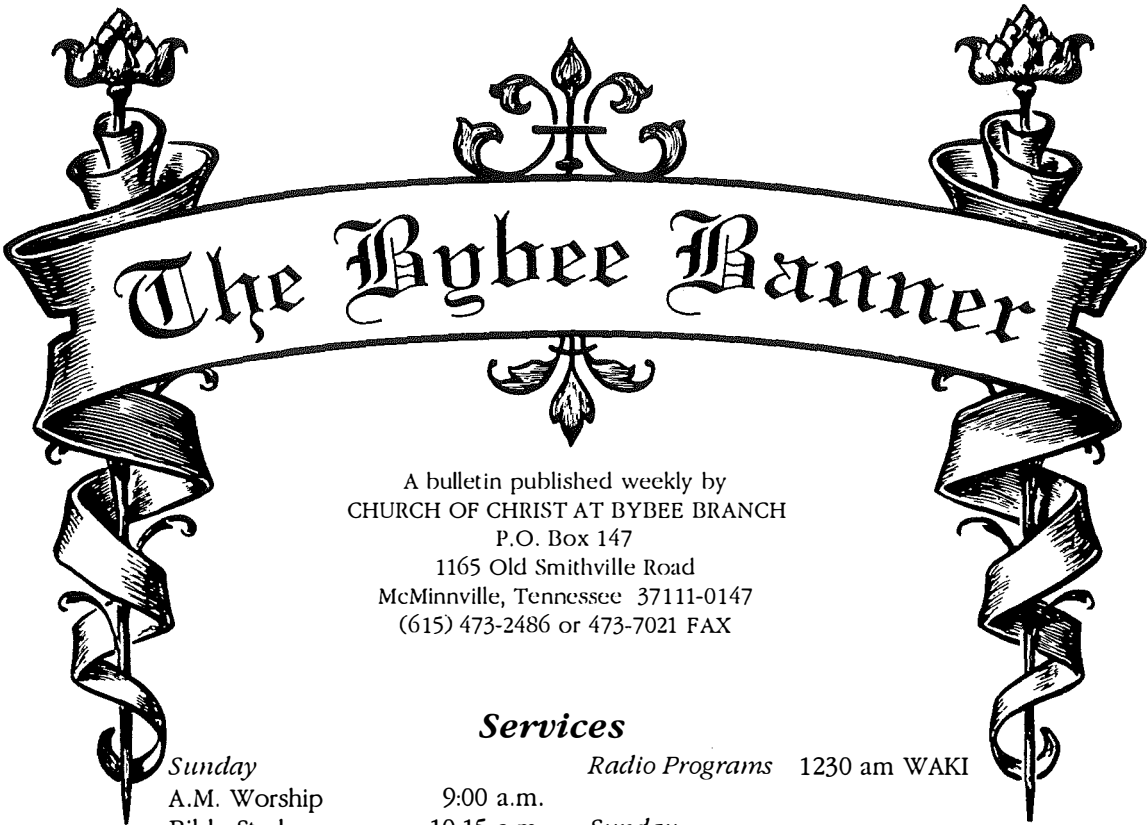

Satisfied and Stagnant

In the book, The Pyramid Principle of Church Growth, David Womack made the observation that churches tend to level off their growth at specific plateaus. He noted these are: 35, 85, 125, 180, 240, 400, 600, 800, and just under 1,200. He said he was challenged in this observation by George Elgerly, a statistician with the Assemblies of God Sunday School Department. So, he asked Mr. Edgerly to study their statistical records and find at what predictable size their churches stopped growing. He concluded it was at 50, 90, 120, 180, 230, 290, and 400. (You don't have to be much of a mathematician to see that the two are pretty close.)

But why is this true? Three things we must do to prevent stagnation:

1. REALIZE OUR WORK IS NOT DONE EVEN THOUGH WE'VE MADE PROGRESS. God gave Joshua the job of taking all the land of Canaan. For a while the people did good, but after they got enough for them to live comfortable on, the stopped. God said to Joshua, "you are very old, and there are still very large areas of land to be taken over" (Josh. 13:1) We've many more to win, and a city that needs to know about our Lord. We cannot stop just because we've enjoyed some success.
2. CONSTANTLY INVOLVE MORE PEOPLE IN THE WORK. This is exactly what God had Joshua do. He was told to take the land and "divide it as an inheritance" among the people (Joshua 13:8). The church can continue to grow only as leadership and responsibility are divided. Our biggest fault has been in thinking only a few ought to be involved in decision making and specific works.
3. LET THE LEADERS SHOW ENTHUSIASM. God told Joshua, "Be strong and courageous because you will deed these people to inherit the land . . . (Joshua 1:6) Our leaders must believe and act as if they are men of destiny. When we have faith in our God, in our being His people, then we can lead with enthusiasm. This is the magic quality that will keep the church pushing, dreaming, and growing.

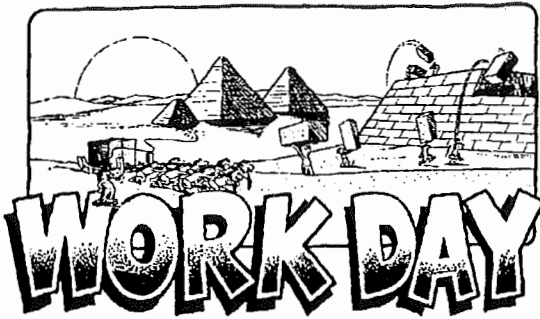

# The Woman Who Changed America

Her name became a household word. Madalyn Murray O’Hair. In 1963, she won the landmark lawsuit filed on behalf of her son, William, effectively banning prayer in public schools.

I have just finished the book, *My Life Without God*, by William J. Murray in which he tells of the tragedy of his upbringing as the son of America’s most famous atheist.

“Well, I’ll be. Where’s the stiff?”

“At the Memorial Hospital Morgue.”

Then she turned to her son and said, “Bill, call up some undertakers and find the cheapest one. Then have them pick up the stiff from Memorial.”

So much for love, and being a brother’s keeper! And time would fail to speak of her children born out of wedlock, her endorsement of perverse sex, the encouragement of homosexual activity, her debates with Bob Harrington, the “Chaplain of Bourbon Street,” and the 45/55 split of the proceeds after Madalyn got her \$1000.00 per night minimum (the debates sere making over \$10,000 per week). But why go on ad nauseam?

I thought William Murray’s change from atheism to a belief in God was interesting. He said, “There had to be good, because I had looked into the eyes of evil. There had to be a God, because I had held hands with the devil.”

# Invitation Etiquette

There is no time so crucial in our periods of worship as when the invitation of Christ is extended. This is a time when souls are being urged and persuaded to become obedient to Christ. The proper atmosphere is so very important. During the invitation we are trying to get those whose lives are out of harmony with the Gospel to make the emotional response, as well as the intellectual response, that is necessary to save their souls. We must do our very best to eliminate every distraction from the serious business at hand! A soul that is on the verge of responding, but who is discouraged from doing so by thoughtless behavior of those around him, may never be that near again. In fact, he may die and be lost because of our behavior! Everything the preacher, song leader, and every other member of the church does should be calculated to encourage those who need to respond to respond. PLEASE consider the following "invitation etiquette."

1. Sing the invitation song with interest and meaning. It is pitiful to see so many who gaze around and make no effort at all to sing. It appears that such people are just bored by it all! Those who are ashamed of their singing could at least read the words silently.
2. Don't move around nor allow your children to leave during the invitation unless there is some kind of emergency. That is, unless you need to respond. Then, by all means, move around sufficiently to come to the front! The devil can use innocent children to detract people from responding to the invitation if we don't properly control them. It is sad to see more people going out the back door than coming to the front when the invitation is extended.
3. Wait till after the closing prayer to get ready to go home. Some folks are more interested in putting on a coat or picking up a purse than they are in the salvation of souls during the invitation song.
4. Don't talk, giggle, write notes, nor elbow anybody during the closing remarks of the sermon or the invitation song. It breaks my heart to see this going on while I am pleading for souls. It is most commonly seen among young people. This is not appropriate for any time during worship.

Try to put yourself in the position of someone who needs to respond. You are about ready to step into the aisle when suddenly the lady next to you bumps you while struggling to get her coat on, and the kids in front of you are talking and laughing.

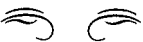
**Sheep Don't Wallow**

Christians don't wallow.

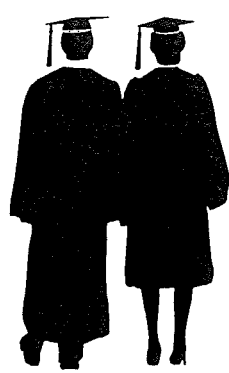

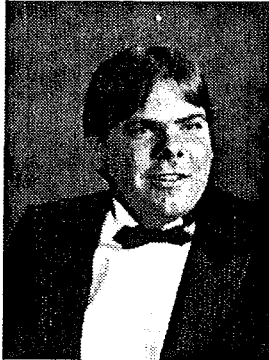

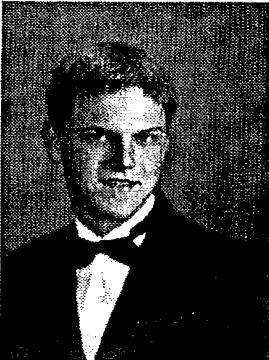

## Daddy and Discipline

My life of crime was nipped in the bud . . . my father saw to that. I remember well the day. Late in the afternoon, Daddy sent me into the grocery store to pick up a loaf of bread. Once inside my eyes fastened intently upon a barrel. This was no ordinary, run-of-the-mill barrel, mind you, but a whole barrel just brimming over with candy. In the evening sun those beautiful celephane wrappers took on as many shades as Joseph's coat. Now admittedly, I didn't know much about the devil, but when he told me to take some candy . . . I did. How was I to know my father was watching me through the plate glass window of the store. My first crime had been committed, and it was followed very quickly by conviction, confession and correction. My father's searching hand quickly convicted me of wrong doing. His stern voice demanded return of the theft to the checker. And I knew full well what kind of correction was to come. The drive home was ten blocks. It seemed like a million. Once there, a few well chosen sunflower stalks were uprooted and applied unsparingly to the legs of the young thief attired in short pants. I guarantee you that I learned my lesson. I have never cared for short pants or stealing since that day.

In our permissive society we have almost dropped the word "discipline" from our vocabulary. Is it possible that this is at the very root of many problems? Mr. J. Edgar Hoover once said that the two main contribution factors to juvenile delinquency are: 1. neglect at home and 2. lack of discipline.

Solomon, the wisest man, had much to say on this subject: "He that spareth his rod hateth his son; But he that loveth his chasteneth his betimes" (Prov. 19:18).

"The rod and reproof give wisdom: but a child left to himself bringeth his mother to shame . . . correct thy son, and he shall give thee rest; yea, he shall give delight unto thy soul" (Prov. 29:15,17).

## Evangelism Update

Many of you may remember about a month ago when the elders requested suggestions from the congregation for ideas of how to better evangelize our community. A number of you made several good and profitable suggestions. The elders weighed carefully all of the suggestions and here are some of the things that are in the works:

1. A Spring Gospel Meeting. It is too late this year to have a "Spring Meeting" but potential speakers are being contacted for one in 1998. The thrust of this meeting will be evangelistic. While we welcome our brethren from sister congregations, our purpose will be to bring in our non-christian friends for simple basic gospel preaching. The days of Gospel Meetings are not over!
2. A Newspaper Gospel Meeting will begin in just a few days. We will purchase approximately 3/4 of a page in the Southern Standard for 5 consecutive issues for printed sermons on basic Bible teaching. The purpose is to get the gospel into the hearts and minds of those that we might not be able to reach otherwise. In these not only will we teach the gospel but will offer Bible Correspondence Courses and advertise our Lectureship.
3. The elders are exploring the possibility of a Spanish Radio program. Brother Phillip Gray who works with Truth For The World along with Jim Dearman produces a 15 minute weekly radio program in Spanish. They offer Bible Correspondence Courses and etc. over the program. Time, station, cost, and etc. are being looked into but hopefully this may develop soon.
4. The ever-present need of one-on-one contact can never be overlooked. There will be those of our neighbors, family and friends that are interested in the Truth. The elders request that if you know those who might be interested in having a Bible study that you give their name to one of the elders or the preacher so that a study might be set up. During this time we also hope to be able to train others to do personal evangelism.
5. Other forms of mass media are also being explored. Prices and potential content of both Cable TV spots, direct mail, and etc. are being considered. Some of these are quite expensive and much thought should be given before entering into a long-term committment.

Your support and encouragement in these programs is greatly needed. Several of these programs will require significant funds. The elders determined that we would not slack off any of our on-going programs to do the work just completed on our building. We have now been presented with a new challenge which gives us an opportunity to give our best efforts to reach our community with the gospel. Why not determine that you will support and encourage these with your prayers, your participation, and your giving. While you are at it, why not commend the elders for their foresight and love for souls that prompts them to be so aggressive in these programs.

We are fighting no wars, only a relatively small number of our population is really suffering and we comfort ourselves in all of the pleasures that we can. In this there is true DANGER. Jesus taught that the attitude of the heart can become "overcharged" or "weighed down" with this type of lifestyle. It can consume the person. Hence, the warning of Jesus is still applicable. Not that we can expect a destruction like Jerusalem on earth but that the true "Day of the Lord" is ever before us.

If the Lord were to return today, no doubt there would be wives cooking, children playing, and many other "normal" routines of daily life going on. The fact is that what we are from day to day is what the Lord will find when He comes. What this means is that we must make sure that our daily lives are holy, just, and good. Christianity is not a "Sunday only" religion. Thus, we should ask ourselves, "Am I getting too caught up in worldly things?"

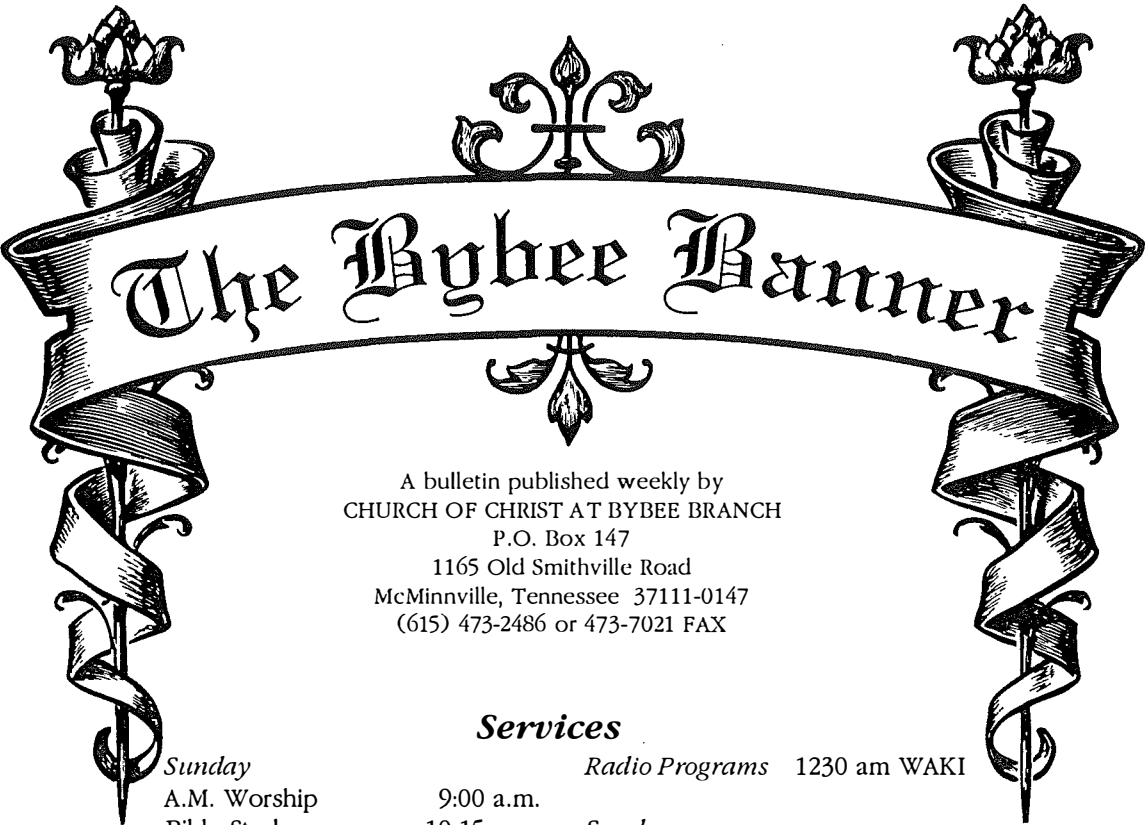

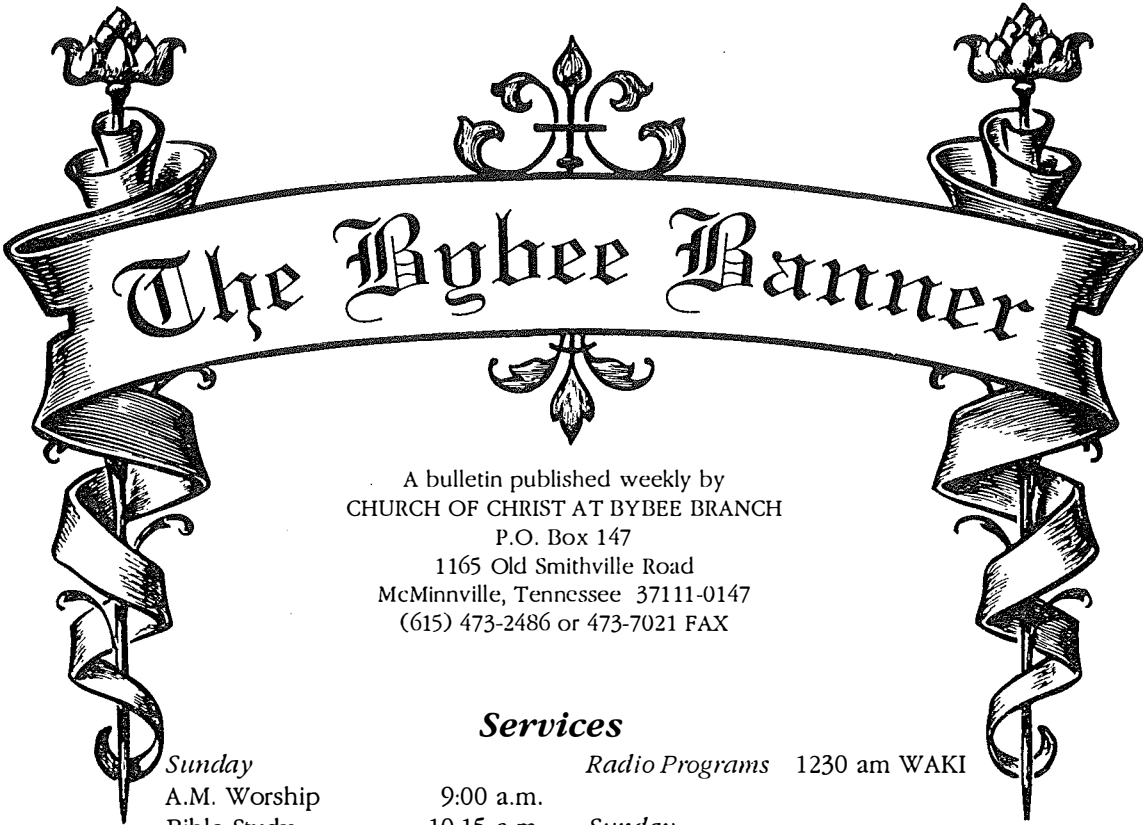

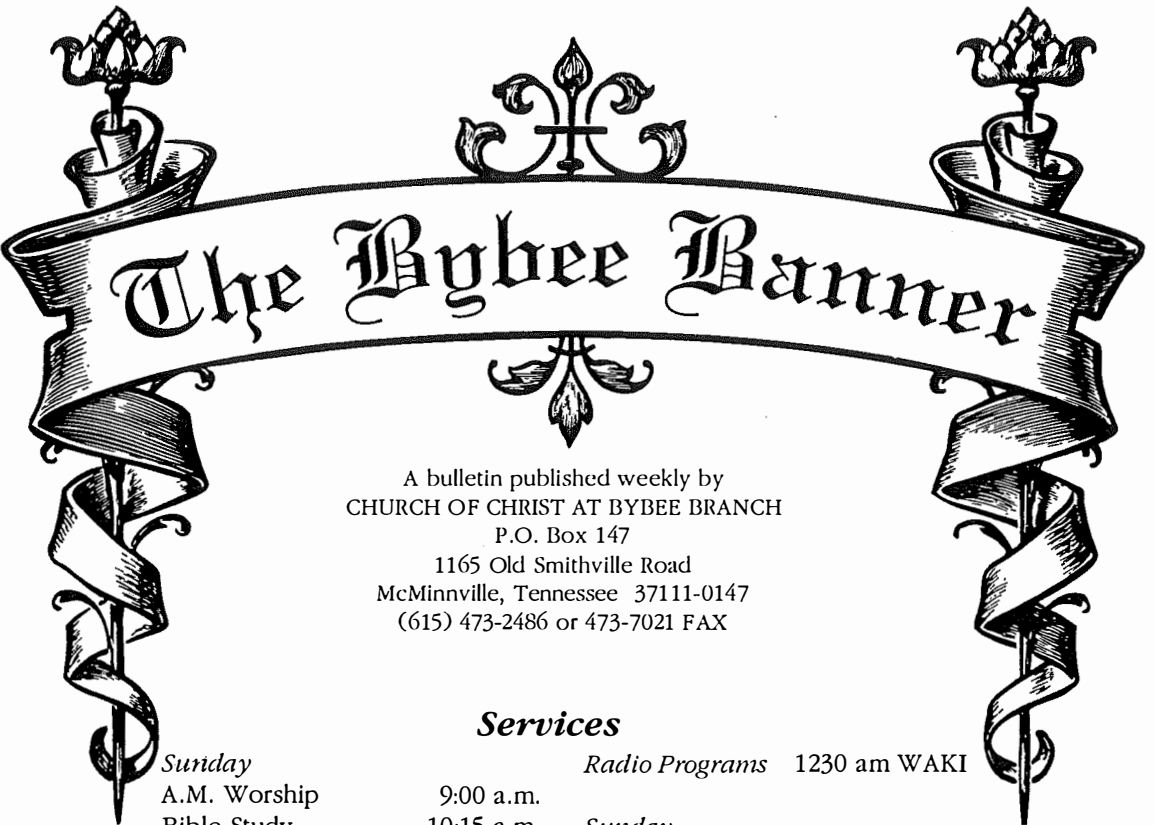

10. Contribute Christian books and videos to your public library and church library.
11. Put a Christian message on your telephone answering machine.
12. Have a fellowship in your home and invite Christians and non-Christians to your home.
13. Send a note through the mail to invite your friends to church services or church lectureship.
14. During the week while out driving with a friend, pay the church building a visit, which breaks down the fear of the unknown and "strangeness."

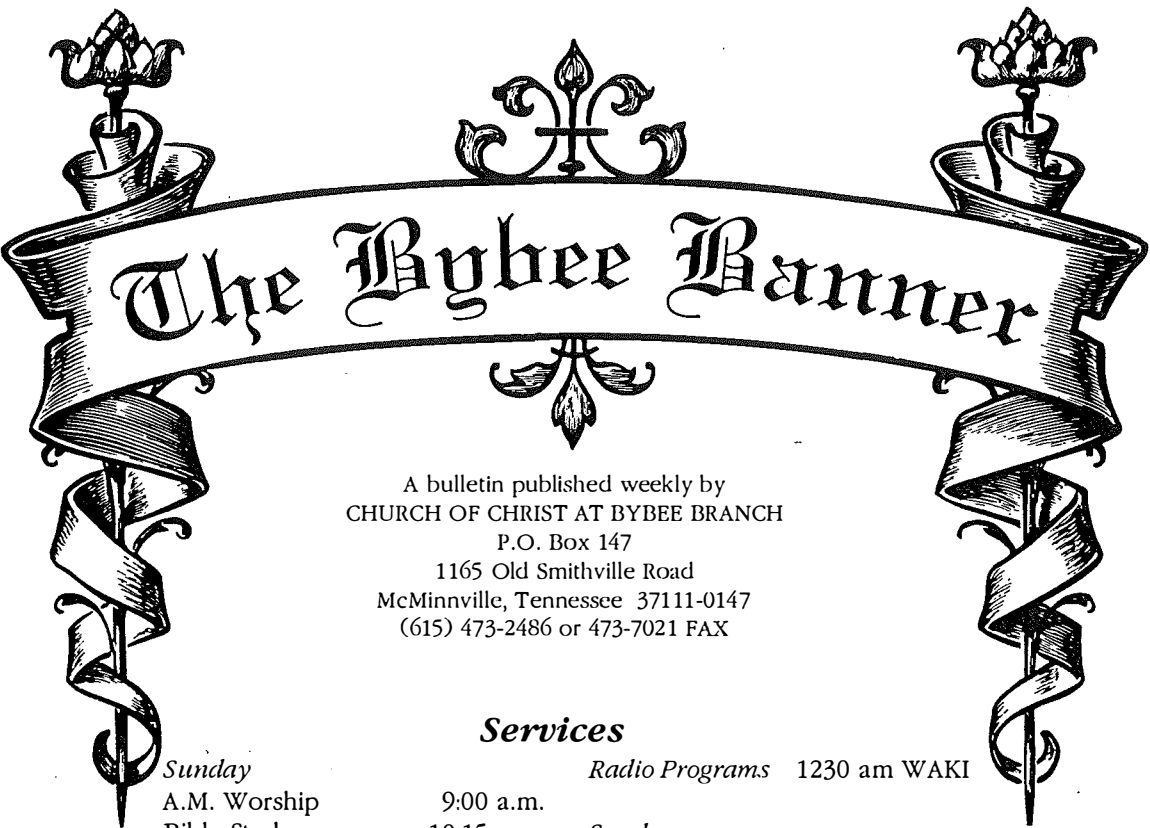

## New Sermon Series

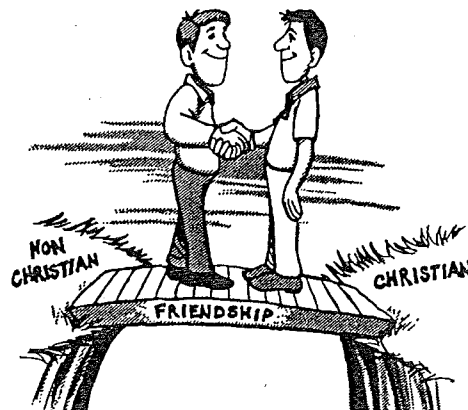

## Lessons Learned — From The Golden Calf

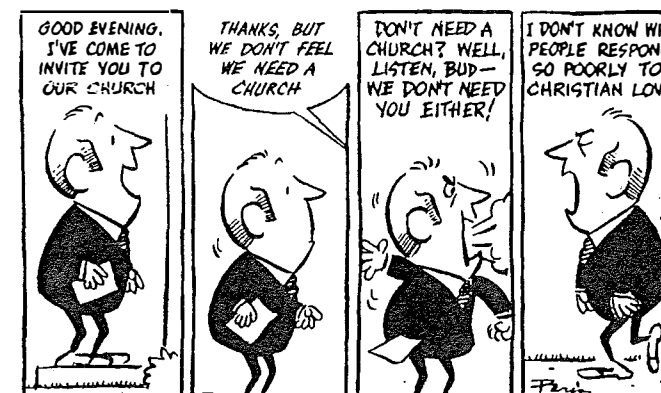
Worship is "in." Moderns worship worship! Excitement, feelings, "give them what they want." Bad theology makes for bad worship. The issue is God. A careless concept of God results in childish worship. Trying to please men rather than God results in blasphemy and idolatry. Read Ex. 32 ... Deut. 9! The Golden Calf! God through Moses is giving Israel the Law. God is giving specific regulations concerning worship. God can become uptight by the way we worship. Jesus said we could worship God in vain. Moses is up on the Mountain with God! The Israelites are down below with Satan. Aaron, the High Priest, flunked his test. Taking the gold they gave, he makes a calf (Egyptian bull) and worship begins.

God was angry, exceedingly angry. He threatened to destroy Israel to rebuild upon Moses. Moses interceded, pleaded, argued with God! Amazing! Moses won! More amazing! Man can impact God! Yet God never got over this sin. Read the entire OT! God brought it up time and time again. Israel never got over it, either.

The lessons?

- (1) Crowds don't make it right. Aaron had the crowd. Crowds came! "They must be doing something right!" "Success City!" We are into "Crowds." The biggest crowd wins! But this is not from God.
- (2) Giving people what they want fails! They wanted "new gods," new worship. Aaron gave them what they wanted. Notice — "no preaching."
- (3) Wonderful worship experiences may not be. They felt God (they did not know Him). It was a "mountain top experience."
- (4) Fun must not be confused with worship. They danced, sinned, became immoral, had a blast! While Sinai trembled Israel departed quickly for idols, performance, talent, concerts — FUN!
- (5) Meeting peoples' needs may not be worship! They got what they wanted! But they sold out their souls . . . made fools of themselves . . . disgraced God.

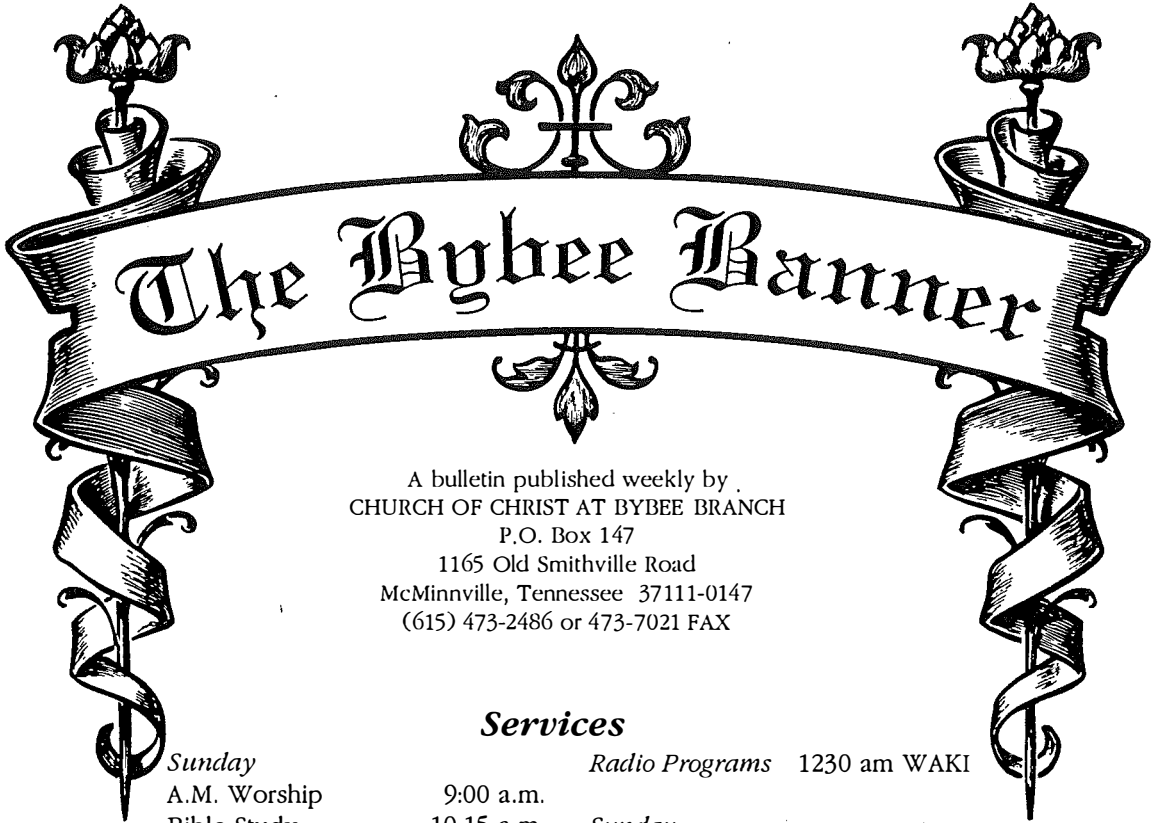

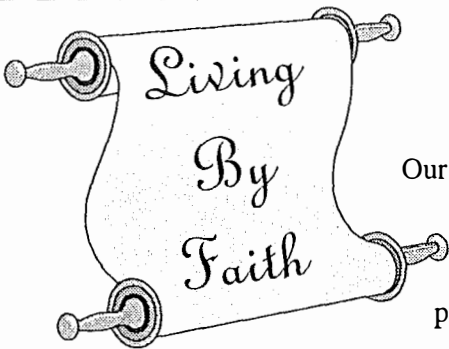

## Lectureship In Review

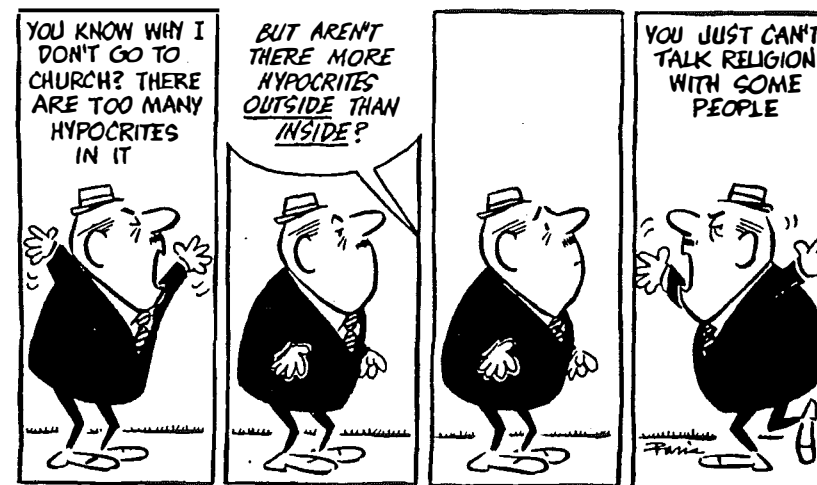

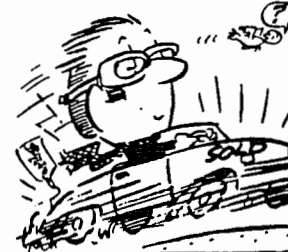

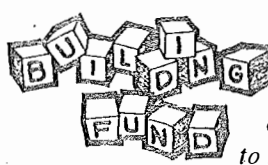

Serious Concerns Over Departures From The Faith

Anyone today who reads the periodicals, books or even listens to the T.V. has to realize that there has been a marked change in the attitude of some within the Lord's church toward its nature and function. The human side of the church has never been perfect. However, like the children of Israel under the period of the Judges, faithfulness to God fluctuates up and down. When I see the seeming disregard for the sacredness and purity of the Lord's church I am grieved to the heart. This is not that I believe that the Lord's church will not continue, it will! (Dan. 2:44). It is not that I believe that man can destroy the Word of God, he can't! (Isa. 55:11). It is I realize that souls will be led astray in this current digression. The Lord takes note of those who are concerned with such things. "and the LORD said to him, "Go through the midst of the city, through the midst of Jerusalem, and put a mark on the foreheads of the men who sigh and cry over all the abominations that are done within it."" (Ezekiel 9:4, NKJV).

Exactly what are some of these departures. The now infamous Nashville Jubilee heads the list of defections from the faith. I read in the September 1997 issue of the Christian Chronicle a letter by Don Edwards of Houston, TX. He said, "I have attend Jubilee two times. I have listened to the main speakers and many class teachers. I have yet to hear 'false teaching.'" I must assume that (1) either he is deaf, or (2) that he has lost his ability to listen and discern error when he hears it (cf. Mt. 16:3; Heb. 5:12-14; Mk. 4:24; Lk. 8:18). The errors that have been taught at Jubilee are legion. There has been a disregard for the uniqueness and nature of the Lord's church, the plan of salvation, and even the advocating of outright pentecostalism. If you have any doubt, I would like for you to hear the three tapes of Joe Beam's lessons on the Holy Spirit in 1996.

It the past few days the direction that some have gone seems to be even more brazen. David Lipscomb University sent the church here an advertisement for the upcoming Youthworker University. It will be held October 24,25, 1997. Among the participants are a number of known liberals like Jeff Walling. Doug Varnado, Professor of Bible at Lipscomb is now the minister for the Hendersonville Community Church. Also included on the program is Brewster McLeod. He is the "student minister" for the Southland Christian Church in Lexington, KY. This church is well-known in their area for patterning themselves after the Willow Creek church. If people want to know where Steve Flatt is going to lead Lipscomb they have a pretty good indicator because he also is on the program!

Something that even shocks us regarding the liberal occurred in a past couple of weeks at the Woodmont Hills church in Nashville. Rather than having their evening services they had a concert to raise money to build a playground. They brought in as many "stars" as they could find and set up this in their auditorium on Sunday evening. This event even garnered the notice of the Nashville T.V. stations. We know that our Deity can be grieved (Eph. 4:30). How must God cry when He sees the abominations of men more concerned with merry-go-rounds and tetter-totters than in the gospel of Jesus Christ. Jesus did not die for the swing set.!

When I see these things I am concerned. Paul was also had anxiety for the churches (2 Cor. 11:28). Returning to the thought of the period of the Judges, it took people crying out to God in prayer and great men of faith to rise up an do the Lord's will. Pray and stand!

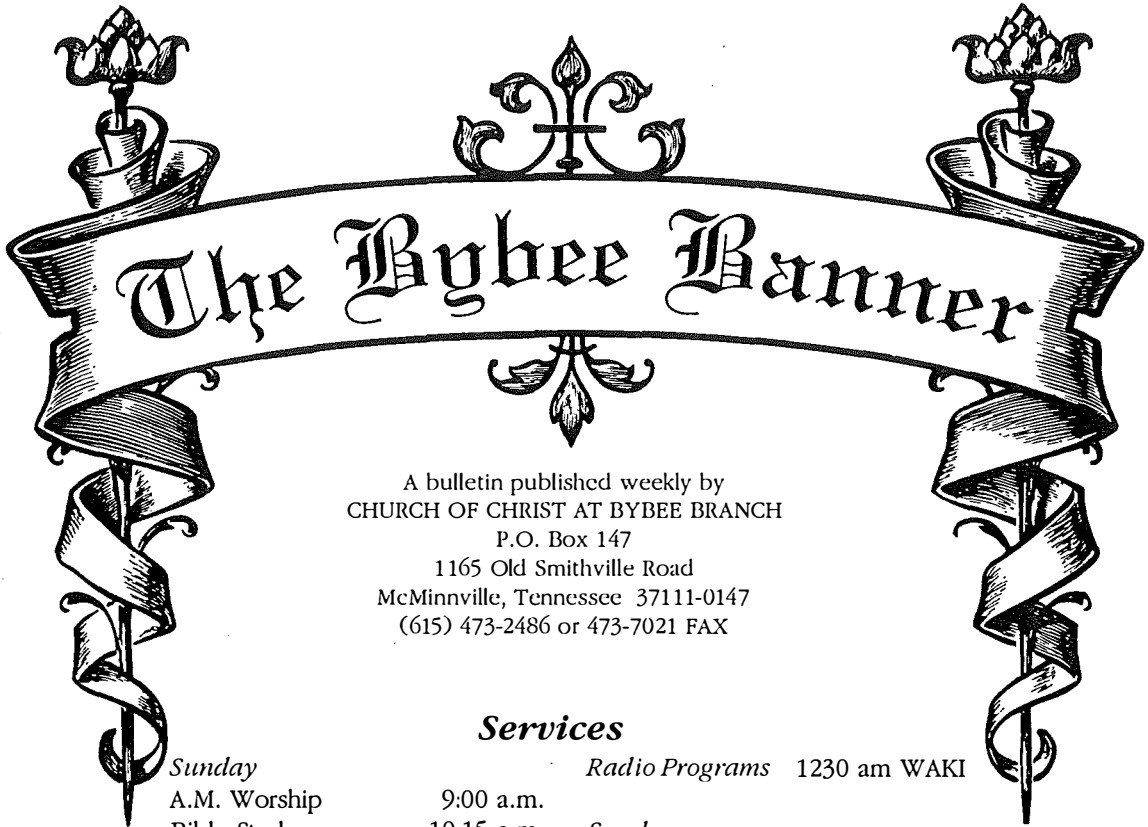

## It Costs To Carry A Grudge

The visitor leaned on the rail fence, watching an old farmer plow. "I don't like to tell you how to run your business," the visitor finally said, "but you could save yourself a lot of work by saying 'gee' and 'haw' to that mule, instead of just pulling on the lines." The old farmer pulled a big handkerchief from his pocket and mopped his brow. "Reckon you're right," he agreed, "but this critter kicked me five years ago and I ain't spoke to him since."

This little illustration may bring a smile to you, but doesn't it illustrate the price that many pay when they carry a grudge! Have you ever figured up the real price of a grudge? Well, first of all, it will cost you your soul if such is carried to death without repentance. Jesus put it this way, "But if ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses." (Matt. 6:15). He wanted us to continue to forgive. To Peter, Jesus said to forgive "until seventy times seven." (Matt. 18:22). Our Lord believed and taught that we should make all efforts to make things right between brethren. Again we listen to his words: "Therefore if thou bring thy gift to the altar, and there rememberest that thy brother hath ought against thee; Leave there thy gift before the altar, and go thy way; first be reconciled to thy brother, and then come and offer thy gift." (Matt. 5:23-24).

In the second place, a grudge will cost you your happiness. There is no room in the human heart for both love and hate - for a grudge and happiness. God's word teaches that as Christians we should rather take suffering. Just be sure you are right with God, and no person can really harm you. The Apostle Peter writes, "But and if ye suffer for righteousness' sake, happy are ye. . . ." (I Pet. 3:14). Or again, "If ye be reproached for the name of Christ, happy are ye . . ." (I Pet. 4:14). Therefore, the fastest way to become unhappy is to hate someone.

Then in the final place, a grudge will cut you off from others. You will be afraid to let go for fear that someone else will hurt your feelings. Thus you may crawl into a shell with your grudge and close all others out. Your countenance will reflect hate which will make it impossible to worship and enjoy fellowship with others. Since Jesus could look down upon a mob of murderers who were enjoying the torture they were giving him and say: "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do," surely we can, as His followers, refuse to hold grudges. Yes, it does cost a lot to carry a grudge! And this is something to think about.

### What Would It Take To Get You To Come Back Sunday Night?

Statistics don't lie, more people love GOD on Sunday morning than Sunday night. There will be, generally, one third fewer Christians lifting voices in praise at 6:00 PM than at 10:00 AM. Shepherds pray about it, preachers preach about it, Christians are concerned about it, and children wonder about it, but it happens anyway.

The question is often posed in elders' meetings, "What would it take to get everybody back Sunday nights?" They "jazz" up services by appealing to fleshly lust with giveaways, jokes, food, music and singing groups. This is the wrong approach. But what is the right approach? What would it take to get "Sunday morning Christians" to come back and worship in the evening?

**MORE LOVE FROM GOD?** If only GOD was more generous toward His children, they would feel more like expressing love for Him. “Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights...” (Jas. 1:17). (see also Jn. 3:16; Rom. 5:8).

We do not need more love **FROM** God, but more love **FOR** God (Matt. 22:37-38).

**MORE SACRIFICE FROM CHRIST?** If Christ had given more, Christians would surely feel a debt to worship “...And when he had scourged Jesus, he delivered him to be crucified ... and they stripped him ... and when they had platted a crown of thorns, they put it upon his head ... and mocked him ... and they crucified him” (Matt. 27:26-35; 20:28; Rom. 5:6; 2 Cor. 8:9).

We do not need more sacrifice **FROM** Christ but more sacrifice **FOR** Christ (Matt. 6:33; Rom. 1:14).

**A BETTER GOD TO WORSHIP?** If only Christians had an object worthy of their worship, they would “get more out of Sunday nights.” “Among the gods there is none like thee, O Lord; neither are there any works like unto thy works” (Psalm 86:8). “To whom then will ye liken me, or shall I be equal? Hast thou not heard, that the everlasting God, the Lord, the Creator of the ends of the earth, fainteth not, neither is weary? there is no searching of his understanding” (Isa. 40:25,28).

We do not need a better God, but better Christians.

**A BETTER GROUP WITH WHICH TO FELLOWSHIP?** Since Christians are washed in the Lamb's blood (Rev. 7:14), called out of the world (2 Cor. 6:17), and forgiven of sins (Acts 2:38), they are the best people in the world! They are not perfect, but they are better as a group than whoever one would spend his time with during the period when worship takes place.

We do not need a better group, but more desire to encourage the group.

Have these words been erased from our Bibles: “And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works; not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much more **as ye see the day approaching**” (Heb. 10:25)? Do we no longer believe that deliberate transgressions will cause one to be lost (Heb. 10:26; Rom. 6:23)?

We better take God seriously. Those who deliberately skip worship services will be lost.

## THE PLEASANT PROSPECT OF ONE LESS SLEAZY SHOW

According to a recent article in *The Commercial Appeal* (10/10/97), one of Hollywood's most popular promoters of sexual perversion, Ellen DeGeneres, has threatened to resign from her filthy television show if ABC follows through with their announced intentions to precede the program with an on-screen advisory declaring that the show has adult content and warning parents to use discretion in allowing children to view it. The chagrined DeGeneres is reported to have declared "This advisory is telling kids something's wrong with being gay. While such a conviction obviously is not ABC's primary motivation for this proposed advisory, there definitely is something wrong with 'being gay'".

What is wrong with "being gay" is that such behavior is sinful and sin is that which separates people from God (Isa. 59:1-2). The Bible plainly teaches that homosexuality and lesbianism are despicable sins. Because of the practice of the "very grievous sin" of homosexuality in those cities, the "Lord rained upon Sodom and upon Gomorrah brimstone and fire from the Lord out of heaven" (Gen. 18:20; 19:24). Under the Law of Moses, the sin of homosexuality was punishable by death (Lev. 20:13). In the New Testament, homosexuality and lesbianism are termed "vile affections" and those who commit such sins are described as among those who are "worthy of death" and who "shall not inherit the kingdom of God" (Rom. 1:24-32; I Cor. 6:9-10).

The attitude toward sin exhibited by a militant homosexual or lesbian, such as DeGeneres, is spiritually fatal. Whether or not anyone discontinues acts he knows to be contrary to God's will depends largely upon his attitude toward sin. Jesus said, "Blessed are they that mourn; for they shall be comforted" (Matt. 5:4). Rather than purportedly "taking pride" in their perversity, homosexuals, like all other sinners, should be mourning over their wicked behavior and seeking God's forgiveness in His appointed way!

It is no more "gay bashing" to truthfully state the sinfulness of homosexuality and lesbianism than it is "murderer bashing" or "thief bashing" to truthfully state the sinfulness of murdering and stealing. Those who refuse to turn from sin and to the Lord in His appointed way will forever regret it "in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone" (Rev. 21:8; Jno. 8:24; Lk. 13:3; Rom 10:10; Acts 2:38).

We should hope and pray that ABC's proposed warning to parents will be implemented, that DeGeneres will resign and that her disgusting show will be discontinued. We realize that such a development would not signal any sort of major improvement in the overall content of television programs, which grow more morally decadent every day. Nevertheless, the world would be better off without this sleazy show and the circumstances surrounding its demise might prompt Ellen, or someone like her, to face the fact that there is something dreadfully wrong with "being gay."

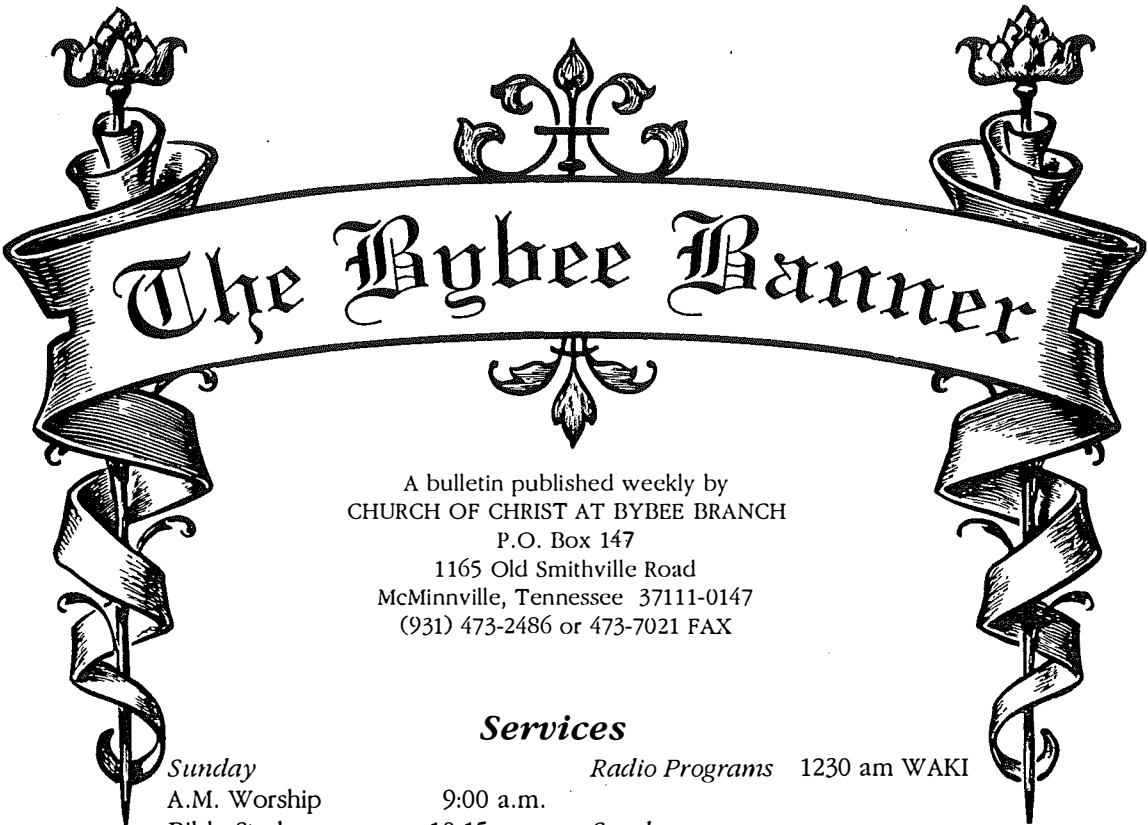

What Is The Name Of Jesus' Church?

When Jesus declared that He would build His church (Matthew 16:18), He never attached to His church some human designation. The church was and is the possession of God and Christ. Therefore, any time the word church is used in the Bible to identify the body of baptized believers, it is identified as belonging to Deity. It is called "the church of God" (I Corinthians 1:2; Acts 20:28); the "church of the living God" (I Timothy 3:15); the "churches of Christ" (Romans 16:16). However, most often in the Bible it is simply called "the church" (Acts 5:11; 11:26; et.al). Never is the word church used in a denominational sense to designate any made-man organization calling itself a church.

The denominational mind set is that "Church of Christ" is the official name of "our denomination." But the church which belongs to Christ is not a denomination; it is part of nothing. The church is not divided into parts, nor part of any division. The church is the whole of all saved persons by the blood of Christ through faith and obedience (Ephesians 5:23; Mark 16:16). Now, the denominations have devised their humanly originated names to identify themselves according to their founders, doctrines or methods, but the church of the Bible, the one restored today, is identified as Christ's possession. Its official and specific name is not "Church of Christ" but it is the church of (possession of) God and Christ.

Now what is the name of the church? It is whatever Jesus authorized, and all He authorized were many general references like the "body of Christ" (Colossians 1:24), the "bride of Christ" (Revelation 21:2), and the "house of God" (I Timothy 3:15). After all, He built it, established it, and sustains it. He did not give it a proper or specific name. There is no exclusive name for the church, and one is not needed because there is only "one body" (Ephesians 4:4; 1:22, 23) and there is no authority from heaven for denominations.

Yes, we call congregations of Christians the church of Christ, but never have we taught it to have an exclusive name.

*Don't think that services have to be conducted differently to be meaningful.*

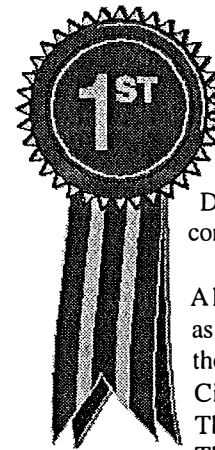
*Bring your Bible and run references during the lesson.*

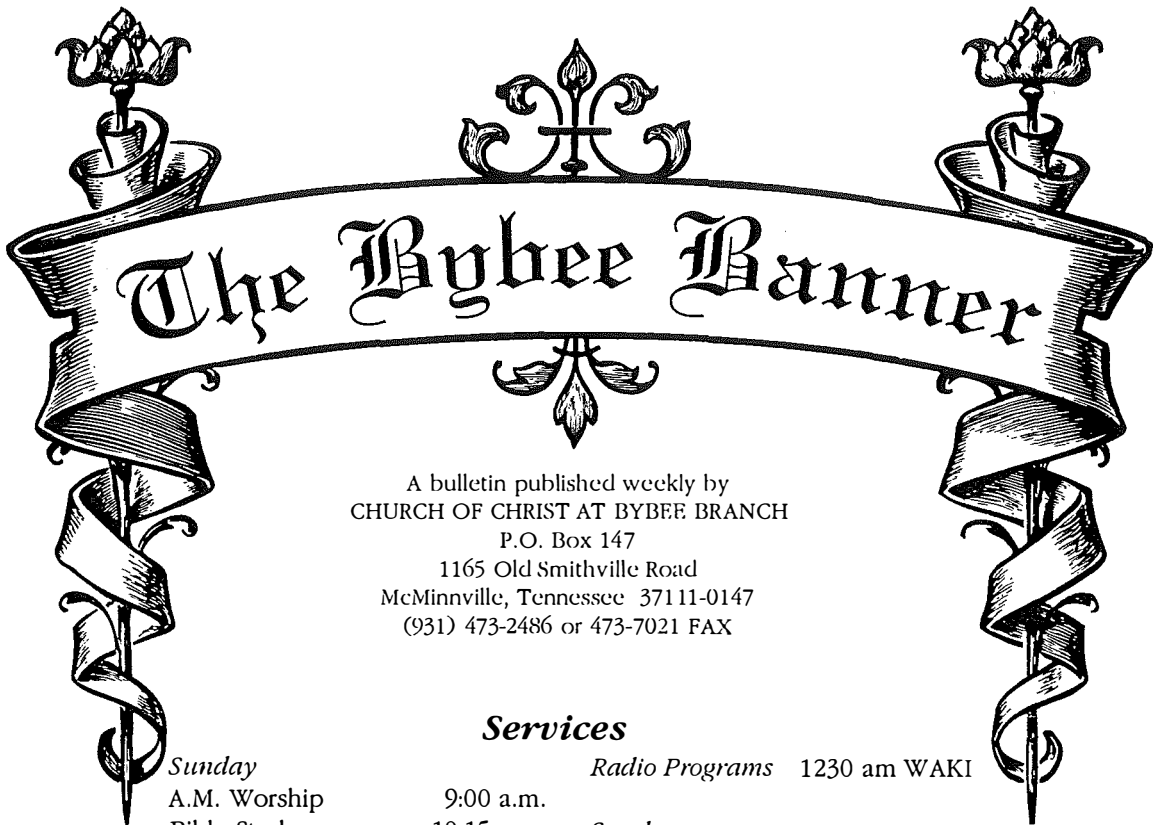

## ARE WE SPECTATORS?

A spectator is "one who looks on or watches" (Webster's, 1132). We are all spectators in some ways as we enjoy watching sporting events or fashion shows. But one place where we are not to be mere onlookers is our Christianity. Elijah, facing Jews who were nothing more than religious spectators, said, "How long halt ye between two opinions? If the Lord be God, follow him: but if Baal, then follow him. And the people answered him not a word" (1 Kings 18:21). We must be careful that we are always "participators" and not "spectators".

**ARE WE SPECTATORS IN WORSHIP?** Worship, as a part of speech, is usually a verb and each act requires mental energy. Jesus commanded His followers to worship "in spirit and in truth" (John 4:24). When songs are led, do we listen or sing? When the lesson is preached, do we study or daydream? When the plate is passed, do we participate or "observe the passover"? For worship to be worthy of God's good pleasure, it demands our best (Malachi 1:3).

**ARE WE SPECTATORS IN SERVICE?** Each Christian is to be active in serving others (Galatians 5:13). When the sick and bereaved are announced, do we pray for them, send cards, offer encouraging words and/or make visits? These things show our love to the world (John 13:34,35).

**ARE WE SPECTATORS IN SOUL WINNING?** Is teaching the lost something "they" do rather than something in which "I" am engaged? The command to "teach all nations" was not just given to preachers and elders but all men (Matthew 28:19).

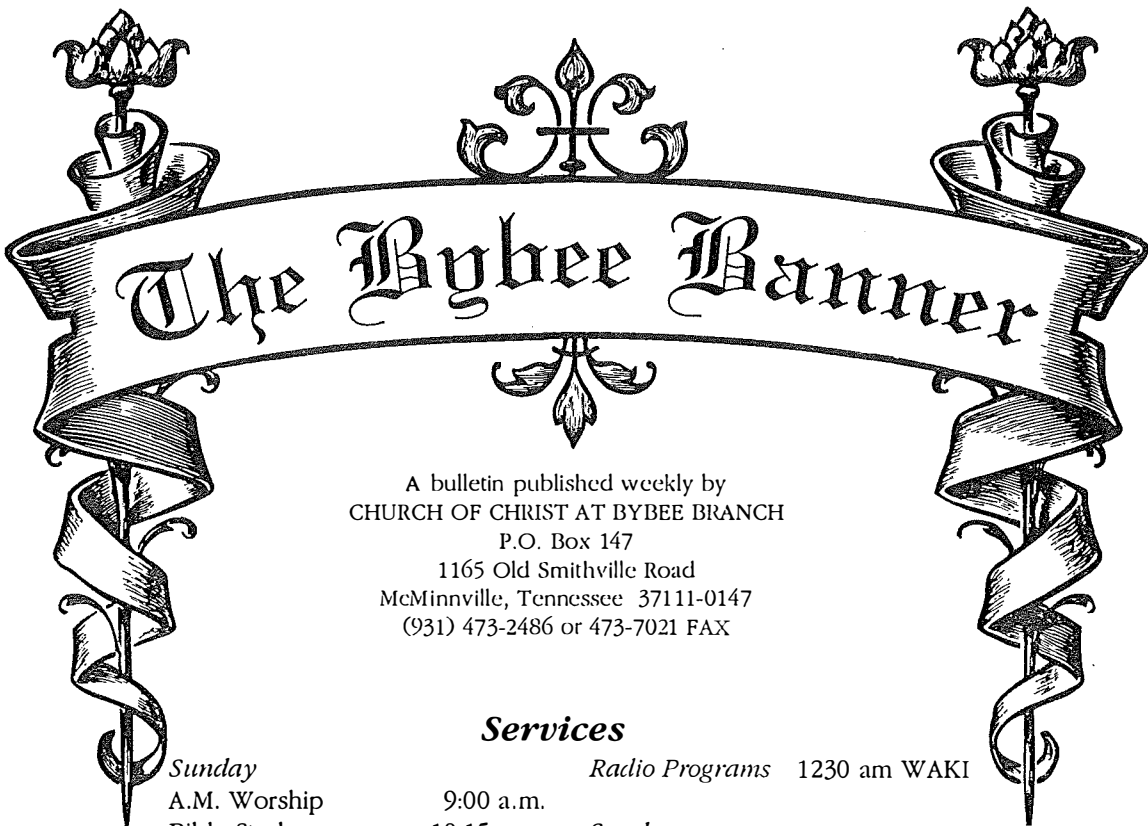

The congregation at White Mountain asked my family if we would be willing to come back after graduation from MSOP to work with them on a regular basis. We have agreed to take on the work and look forward to working with the brethren in Arizona.

They have about twenty people meeting now. They do have the potential for a lot of growth, for it is truly a mission field. One lady stated, "It was the first time in twenty years gospel preaching has been in this area." They also have potential to have elders in the near future which will be a great help. It will be a difficult work but with great opportunities for the Lord's church to grow in an area where it is weak.

We are looking forward to being back at Bybee Branch on November 30th.

The support the Bybee Branch congregation has given us has helped to make this work possible. I am thankful to God for your support. May God bless you.

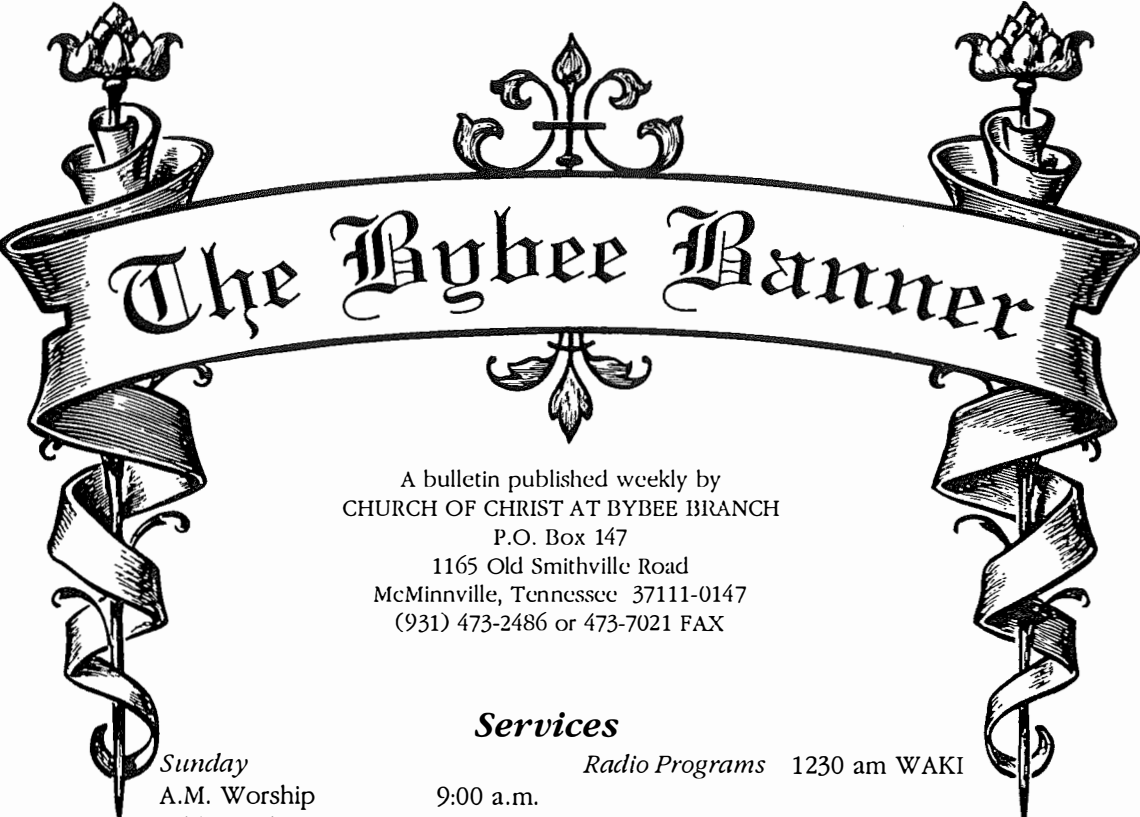

Reasons For Opposing Legalized Gambling

With moral, spiritual, physical, and eternal interest in the citizens of our city, state, and nation, we voice concerns and opposition to the evils of legalized gambling. Many have been the arguments of those who stand to gain riches from the "largest single industry" and who have money so strongly in their eye that those who suffer are considered as pawns to be moved and used. Without hesitation we call on our brethren, friends and all civic-minded individuals to **stand AGAINST gambling**. For the following reasons, we believe that every member of the Lord's church will continue to make the answer completely clear where they stand:

**1. Gambling is SINFUL** (against Bible principles) and **WRONG!** It is based on materialism and greed. The fruit of the gambling "tree" has produced only evil fruit (Matt. 7:16). Drinking, dope peddling, prostitution, neglected and abused children are just a taste of the "fruits" of legalized gambling! Also, it will most surely bring organized crime which feeds its organization from the main line source of income from gambling, both legal and illegal. Listen to one close observer, "Jimmy the Greek," "When you put legalized gambling into a community, you ruin the community around it."

**2. Gambling RUINS LIVES!** Those who think they will only "try," a little gambling find often times that it is to them as addictive as alcohol or dope! Even when they want to be finished with gambling, it is not through with them! The "Gamblers Anonymous" guidebook bears testimony to the devastating effect on human lives. "The greatest loss that resulted from our gambling was neither time nor money, which are gone forever, but our sense of values."

**3. Gambling is NOT A GOOD SOURCE OF REVENUE!** The "healthy stimulus to the economy" put forth by the legalized gambling propagandist is not to be trusted. The cost of regulation, law enforcement, and increased payments of welfare are always found to be more than the revenue gain. The claims are misleading and delusive!

**4. Gambling MAKES PARASITES!** it causes one to seek to live off the labors of others. Laziness and the refusal to carry out honest labor are products of gambling which never contribute to the betterment of mankind. God decrees, "*In the sweat of thy face thou shalt eat bread*" (Gen. 3:19). Paul, in the New Testament, commands, "*If any will not work, neither shall he eat*" (2 Thess. 3:10). Gambling is not a blessing to a man or a community. **It is a curse!**

For these and other reasons that could be presented, we believe these moral issues will be considered and accepted by the thinking person. Decency and sense of moral right for our community demands we stand against gambling in any form.

We, also, are very thankful for the men who served as ushers this year and those who agreed to serve in the upcoming year. Thank you, brethren, for a job well done.

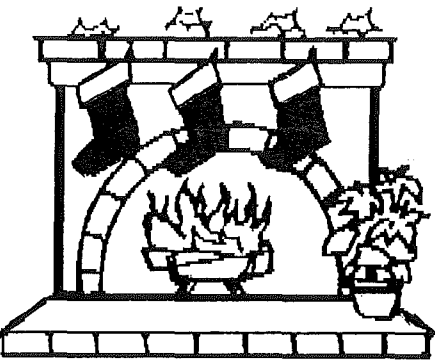
