"Pure and undefiled religion before God and the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their trouble, and to keep oneself unspotted from the world." (James 1:27, NKJV).

Islam and Christianity Compared

Christianity and Islam are two major religions in our world today. Many of the teachings of these religions contradict. We know they cannot both be right. If Christianity is right, then Islam is wrong and vice-versa. Jesus said, "And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" (John 8:32).

Christianity is based upon the Bible. We can prove the Bible is true. The Bible was written by about forty different writers over a period of about 1,600 years. Many of these writers did not know each other, yet there are no contradictions in the Bible. Even though the Bible is not a science book, it has many scientific facts in it. The Bible teaches us the earth is round (Isaiah 40:22; Proverbs 8:27). It also teaches us we cannot count all the stars (Jeremiah 33:22). There are about 1,000 prophecies listed in the Bible which were all fulfilled. Many of them were prophecies concerning the Messiah.

The Bible is the source of truth. Jesus said, "Sanctify them by Your truth. Your word is truth" (John 17:17). It cannot be destroyed. Peter wrote, Since you have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit in sincere love of the brethren, love one another fervently with a pure heart, having been born again, not of corruptible seed but incorruptible, through the word of God which lives and abides forever.... But the word of the Lord endures forever. Now this is the word which by the gospel was preached to you" (1 Peter 1:22,23,25). Jesus said, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will by no means pass away" (Matthew 24:35).

The Bible teaches us Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God. We can prove this is true. Jesus was born of a virgin, lived a sinless life, performed miracles to prove His words were true, died on the cross, was buried, and rose from the dead (Matthew 1:22,23; Hebrews 4:14,15; Mark 15:16-28,42-47; Romans 1:4; I Corinthians 15:1-19). Islam denies that Jesus is the Christ. Islam denies the resurrection of Christ. It teaches that Jesus was a prophet, but not the greatest prophet. It teaches Jesus was a great man, but He was not the Son of God. Jesus taught people He was the Son of God. If He was not, He was a false prophet and a liar!

The Bible reveals God's eternal plan to save man through the church (Ephesians 3:10,11). Salvation is in Christ (John 14:6; Acts 4:11,12; Ephesians 1:3). Those who are saved are in the body, the church (Ephesians 5:23; 4:4). Islam denies the way to be saved is through the church of the Bible.

Islam teaches that Mohammed was the final spokesman for God, but the Bible says Jesus is (Hebrews 1:1-3). Mohammed was only a man who died and awaits the resurrection. Jesus died and rose again never to die again (Revelation 1:18).

There are many religions in the world which claim to be from God. Islam is one of those religions. This religion cannot be from God because its teachings contradict the Bible, which is the Word of God. Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me" (John 14:6).

How long has it been since you have complimented someone on doing a good job? We certainly do not want to be those who "flatter with the lips" and do not mean what we say (Pr. 20:19; 26:28; 28:23; 29:5). However, never underestimate how valuable a word of encouragement is to someone who is striving to do good. "A man has joy by the answer of his mouth, And a word spoken in due season, how good it is!" (Proverbs 15:23, NKJV). Just think of all of those who are working for the Lord: the elders, the Bible class teachers, the song leaders; the bus drivers, etc., etc., etc., etc., etc. Give them a pat on the back!

Am I A Legalist?

Recently a preacher remarked during his sermon that those who are conservative are legalists! Well, I consider myself to be very conservative so I was curious concerning this category that I obviously fit into. Since "legalist" or "legalism" is not found in the Bible I had to go to a dictionary for the definition. Legalism is thus defined: "strict or literal adherence to a law, moral or religious code" (The American Heritage Dictionary of the English Language). Given this definition, there are those in the Bible who fit into this category.

God was a legalist. After creating man, God told him that he was forbidden to eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil and that "in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die" (Genesis 2-17). That was strict! God expected obedience from man. God's strictness is again seen when Nadab and Abihu "offered a strange fire before the Lord, which he commanded them not. And there went out fire from the Lord, and devoured them..." (Leviticus 10: 1,2). On another occasion God told Moses to speak to the rock and water would come forth (Numbers 20:8). Instead, he struck the rock and was denied entrance into Canaan. God required strict adherence to His instructions. Many other examples could be cited.

Christ was a legalist. In Mark 16:16 Jesus said, "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved, but he that believeth not shall be damned." Strict adherence to the words of our Lord is required if one is to become a Christian. Some would call us legalists when we impart the Lord's teaching on marriage, divorce, and remarriage in Matthew 19:9. I am aware that some say that non- Christians are not amenable to this law. However, "whosoever" means whosoever and the Lord expects strict adherence to His law. Jesus also said, "He that rejecteth me and receiveth not my words hath one that judgeth him, the word that I have spoken, the same shall judge him in the last day" (John 12:48). Friend, that tells me that I had better give strict adherence to the words of Christ.

Paul was a legalist. There are many among us who have digressed and no longer hold to the truth. So it was in Paul's day as well. He instructed Timothy to "charge some that they teach no other doctrine" (I Timothy 1:3). He declared, "If any man preach any other gospel unto you than that ye have received, let him be accursed" (Galatians 1:9). He admonished, "Mark them which cause divisions and offences contrary to the doctrine which ye have learned, and avoid them" (Romans 16:17). Paul taught strict adherence to the doctrine of Christ.

Yes, I suppose I am a legalist in the sense that I strive to preach only what the Word of God authorizes me to preach and I refuse to compromise. Thus, if I am accused of being a legalist, I say, "Thank you for the compliment. I like the company I'm in!"



Preacher, Priest Or Pastor?

It occurs to me that some among us have a false idea of the role of the minister in the local congregation.

Since the beginning of the Restoration Movement, urging a return to primitive New Testament Christianity, we have insisted that there is no clergy-laity distinction among members of Christ's church. The minister stands on exactly the same level as any other member of the congregation and performs his work under the direction of the elders or pastors.

The Roman Catholic idea of the "priest" of the congregation is a departure from the New Testament pattern. The Apostle Peter taught that ALL Christians are priests (1 Peter 2:5). As a minister of the gospel, I am a priest only in the sense that every other member of the congregation with which I labor is a priest.

Though we have insistently taught this truth throughout the years, there is evidence that, subconsciously at least, the desire to make our ministers "priests" in the Catholic sense, or "pastors" in the denominational sense, is expressing itself in our thinking.

For instance, I attended a service at a church of Christ recently where an elder referred publicly to the minister of the congregation as the "lay-preacher!" To use such a sectarian expression denotes tacit acceptance of the denominational clergy-laity distinction. Even those who have a very simple knowledge of New Testament Christianity should realize that such a term is foreign not only to the organization, but also to the spirit of Christ's church.

Then, too, this tendency to think of our minister as our priest in the Catholic sense expresses itself in our attitudes. Not infrequently we hear of some members who are upset because the minister has not been to visit in their home in a month or so, or because he may have failed to shake their hand at the morning service.

The fact that the minister may have failed to visit in their home or may have failed to shake their hand should not worry them any more than if ANY member of the congregation should have failed to visit them or shake their hand. The minister, unlike the Catholic priest, is not a mediator between the believer and God. His relationship to each member is exactly the same as that member's relationship to any other member of the congregation. Furthermore, the fact that he may have failed to visit in some member's home or have failed to shake some member's hand is not one bit more serious that the fact that that member may have failed to visit some other member or to shake that member's hand.

In fact, because the minister is expected to spend much of his time teaching the truth to the lost and erring, it obviously means that he cannot have a great deal of time to visit with "the faithful."

The local minister is not the member's priest; he is not their pastor. He is simply an evangelist working under the direction of the elders or pastors or bishops of the congregation. His work is summed up in Paul's instruction to the young preacher Timothy "Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season, reprove, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and doctrine... Do the work of an evangelist", (2 Tim. 4:2, 5). By divine command, this is the task of every minister of the gospel. May God help us to fulfill it.



"Fantastic, that's good for two more points," he says.



Gambling And The Devaluation Of The Christian Work Ethic

Without a doubt, gambling destroys proper work ethics. As God was pronouncing Adam's punishment for partaking of the forbidden fruit, He said: "In the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread, till thou return unto the ground..." (Genesis 3:19). From that time, it has been God's will that human beings work so that they may enjoy the good things of life. Even when man was still in the garden of Eden, he had a job (Genesis 2:15). The gambler's philosophy of life is to circumvent work by gaining a great reward in return for little or no effort. This is a violation of every principle of the Christian work ethic!

In Colossians 3:22-25, the apostle Paul discussed God's pattern for relationships between slaves and their masters. Today, those same guidelines apply well when discussing relationships between employees and their employers. Paul wrote: "Servants, obey in all things (your) masters according to the flesh; not with eye service, as men pleasers; but in singleness of heart fearing God" (Colossians 3:22). Although we may not be happy doing the work that we do, or with the wages that we receive for our work (slaves seldom were), we still owe our employers an honest day's work. We should not be content with only the appearance of hard work, but rather with genuine labor for our wages. Paul also wrote: "And whatsoever ye do, do (it) heartily, as to the Lord and not unto men" (Colossians 3:23). Christian workers ought to take pride in a job well done, for it brings honor and glory not only to them, but to God as well (Matthew 5:16). Later, Paul would write of eternal rewards which are reserved for those who live by the Christian work ethic (Colossians 3:24) and would then give them a warning: "But he that doeth wrong shall receive for the wrong which he hath done; and there is no respect of persons" (Colossians 3:25).

Gambling lures us with the promise of "easy money." The idea of "getting something for nothing" and "getting rich quick" appeals to our fleshly lusts. But, "take heed, and beware of covetousness" (Luke 12:15), 'for the love of money is the root of all evil" (ITimothy 6:10). Because there is no sense in which money gotten from gambling has been earned, neither has it been freely given, it is quite logical to conclude that gambling is very much like stealing. In Ephesians 4:28, the Scripture says: "Let him that stole steal 110 more: but rather let him labor, working with his hands the thing which is good, that he may have to give to him that needeth. "The gambler's credo of "maximum reward for minimum effort" is anti-Biblical. The covetousness which drives gamblers is nothing less than "idolatry" (Colossians 3:5).

All Christians should shunthe "siren song" of the casino, the lottery, and the betting pool, for the treasures that they promise to deliver are not enduring (Hebrews 11:25b). Knowing that "we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain that we call carry nothing out" (I Timothy 6:7), we had better "lay up for yourselves treasure in heaven... for where your treasure is, there will your heart be also" (Matthew 6:20, 21). Living and working in accordance with the principles of the Christian work ethic is one way for us to invest in eternity. Attempting to get around these principles through gambling earns only the wages of sin (Romans 6:23). The apostle Paul wrote to the church in Thessalonica: "For even when we were with you, this we commanded you, that if any would not work, neither should he eat" (II Thessalonians 3:10). Sadly, there are many who cannot eat because they have gambled away their money. Don't let this happen to you.



Sabbath Violations

Some asked for the thirty-nine things that the Rabbis said that one should not do on the Sabbath. Below is a quotation from C.K. Barrett's *The New Testament Background: Selected Documents*, p. 154.

"The main classes of work are forty save one: sowing, ploughing, reaping, binding sheaves, threshing, winnowing, cleansing crops, grinding, sifting, kneading, baking, shearing wool, washing or beating or dyeing it, spinning, weaving, making two loops, weaving two threads, separating two threads, tying [a knot], loosening [a knot], sewing two stitches, tearing in order to sew two stitches, hunting a gazelle, slaughtering or flaying or salting it or curing its skin, scraping it or cutting it up, writing two letters, erasing in order to write two letters, building, pulling down, putting out a fire, lighting a fire, striking with a hammer and taking out aught from one domain into another. These are the main classes of work: forty save one."







ZAPPING

It seems to be a fairly typical scene within the average household today. The television viewer sits watching the screen with the remote control glued in hand, continually flitting from channel to channel in a fidgety flight away from a stream of TV commercials or otherwise uninteresting programs.

Such "zappers" have caught the eyes of commercial advertisers, and their recent conclusions are rather interesting. First, people are not sitting as they did 25 years ago, eyes transfixed to the TV, watching everything that comes across without moving. Avid zappers can click past a dozen channels in only seconds. One household studied changed to a different channel 1,045 times in a single day.

The Zapper profile breaks down into three categories—Light Zappers (switching channels only once every 20 minutes), Moderate Zappers (switching one to three times every six minutes), and Heavy Zappers (switching more than once every 2 minutes).

Television is having its influence upon us. The attention span of the average adult is being shortened by TV's rapid-fire news updates, sports breaks, rock video clips, and a growing number of 15-second commercials.

With all this going on in our world, picture a typical Sunday morning. Is it any wonder we can hardly sit for one hour? When the assembly is longer than 60 minutes we have to leave. When more than three verses of any one song are sung we start fidgeting. It requires great effort to listen to the sermon after the first 5 to 10 minutes; if it goes longer than 20 minutes, "Our preacher is boring!" The communion should be shortened to be more efficient (the last time it was calculated it took 15 minutes and 32 seconds). Meditation is out of the question:

"Just sit and think? Not me!"

No, the problem is not new. Jesus in Gethsemane finished his prayer, walked to his disciples to find them sleeping and said, "Can't you watch with me just one hour?"

Zapping is here. Many of us are Zappers. But if we recognize how influenced we are by our culture, maybe we can improve our level of discipline. And who knows? It might even put more meaning into our assemblies for each of us.





What Happens When A Christian Forsakes Worship?

The following tragic consequences occur when a Christian deliberately forsakes the assemblies of the church:

- (1) Despite what you may tell yourself and others, your example shows that God and Christ are not first in your life.
- (2) You claim to be like Christ, but there is one way you are unlike him. He loved the church e nough to die for it. You don't love it enough to sacrifice anything so that you might attend its services.
- (3) You tear down all the teaching of the new converts and become a poor example for them to follow. If they get to heaven some day, it will be in spite of you and not because of you.
- (4) You disappoint Jesus, who is present every time two or three gather in His name. He knows you aren't there, and He also knows why you are not there.
- (5) You leave no doubt in the minds of your faithful brethren that there are other things you enjoy more than worship and that there are earthly pleasures you prefer more than Christian fellowship.
- (6) You weaken your soul, put yourself on the side of Satan, hurt the church, discourage the preaching of the Word, and make it impossible to teach your children and neighbors how important the church is.
- (7) You disobey a plain command of God: "Not forsaking the assembling of yourselves together..." (Heb. 10:25). Can your neighbors willfully disobey the command to be baptized and be saved? If not, by what rule of logic can you willfully disobey the command to assemble and still expect to be saved?

The group went to Dollywood on Friday, Pigeon Forge and Ober Gatlinburg on Saturday and attended services at Sevierville on Sunday morning.

The Godhead

The Godhead (also commonly called "the Trinity," though this word is not found in the Bible) is one of the most difficult things for people to understand. The Bible teaches there is one God (Deut. 6:4; Is. 44:6; 1 Cor. 8:6). The Bible also refers to the Father as God, the Son as God, and the Holy Spirit as God (Eph. 1:3; Heb. 1:8; Acts 5:3,4).

The Bible uses the word "Godhead" or "Divine Nature" in three passages (Acts 17:29; Rom. 1:20; Col. 2:9). In the Old Testament, the plural pronoun "us" is sometimes used when referring to God (Gen. 1:26,27; 3:22; 11:7; Is. 6:8). In the New Testament, there are several Scriptures which mention the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit all in the same passage (Mt. 3:16,17; 28:19,20; 2 Cor. 13:14; 1 Pet. 1:2).

There is one Divine Nature, but three different persons who have this nature. Dalton Key wrote: "While the word 'God' may be used to refer to the Father exclusively (Phil. 1:2; Col. 1:3), it is most often used as a family name, referring to all three members of the Godhead.... There is but one divine family of God in heaven.... Just as husband and wife may be one in purpose, in desire, in unity, in direction; yet still remain as two distinct personalities (Gen. 2: 24; Mt. 19:5) - so the Godhead, comprised of three distinct Divine Personalities, is One."

The Father is God (Eph. 1:3). The Son is God (Heb. 1:8). The Holy Spirit is God (Acts 5:3,4). Several Scriptures show the Father and the Son are not the same person (Jn. 8:16-18; Mk. 13:32; Acts 2:33,36; 7:55). However, the Father and the Son are one in doctrine (2 Jn. 9); one in protection (Jn. 10: 27-30); one in word and work (Jn. 14:8-11); one in purpose (Jn. 14:16-28); and one in fullness and grace (Col. 2:8-10), but not one person.

Jesus tells us that the Holy Spirit is a person (Jn. 16:7-16). He can teach, instruct, testify, and be lied to (Acts 5:3,4). He also appointed people to preach (Acts 13:2). These are all attributes of a person. The Holy Spirit had work to do. The Old Testament prophets spoke by the power of the Holy Spirit (2 Pet. 1:20,21). In the New Testament, the Holy Spirit revealed and confirmed the truth (Mk. 16:20; Heb. 2:3,4; Jude 3). He told the apostles what to say (Mt. 10:19,20; Jn. 14:26; 16:13).

The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are the three persons in the Godhead (Jn. 1:1-3,14). Jesus was Immanuel, "God with us" (Is. 7:14; Mt. 1:22,23). Jesus was not "a god," but GOD, one of the Divine Three.

There is one God, who is revealed in three persons—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. "God" is the family name.

Report From Tarentum, Pennsylvania

Dear Brethren:

Greetings from the brethren here in Tarentum, PA. Cathy and I are beginning our 17th year with the congregation here. Our attendance is presently running in the fifties and sixties. We have a large and active group of young people (many of which were not yet born when we first arrived). We have been averaging two to three baptisms each year. Last month my eldest daughter Hannah obeyed the Gospel. That's three down and three to go for our children. Our youngest, Caleb, is 14 mos. old and keeping us all entertained and busy.

Our summer is already in full swing. Last week we had a Gospel meeting with Steve Smithbauer from the Weirton Heights congregation in Weirton. WV. We continue to publish our Gospel Paper, Life Resources and had a few readers show up at our meeting. We averaged about 50 people each night.

There will he at least 10 adult members from Tarentum working with me that week besides some of the younger people. Our camp draws many children who are non members from the Pittsburg area.

Cathy and I continue to homeschool five of our six children and it is going really well. There are four families in our congregation who homeschool.

We appreciate your faithful support in helping us remain here and would welcome your visit anytime. We are standing for the New Testament faith and getting the Gospel to over 2,000 people every month through our paper and through Bible Correspondence courses. Please keep our work in your prayers as I know you already do.

What Can Be Done and Called "Worship"?

Three recent articles - Time 4/5/93; Newsweek 8/9/93; Tennessean 11/14/93 - echo the latest religious news on the national and local scene: Doing Strange Thing Called the Worship of God. All indicate these activities are used in the name of what is called relevance or "luring" the crowds. Whether is the name of trendy churchanity, reaching the "Baby Boomers," or connecting with the unchurched, the menus are virtually the same all over and the only real distinction seems to be what is the most outlandish thing a church can/will do in what is called worship to top the last "act."

On the outer fringes of the unusual, several vie for the top honor. Which is your pick from the following: Have communion for 1,000 worshippers in just five minutes; have the actress of the year do a skit "in the sanctuary;" have a room remarkably empty of religious paraphernalia in which, on a riser, behind the pulpit, a giant teddy bear sits in the background better to connect with the present generation; have the preacher sit on a stool instead of standing behind a pulpit or have him/her change clothes between the first and second services to identify better with the people? My own pick varies between the church which offers a "pet ministry" for adopting stray animals, the one where the songs run the gamut from "Oh, What a Beautiful Mornin" to "Danny Boy," and - perhaps best - the one whose preacher, clad in sneakers, closed the service with a round of hugging by the audience, raised his arms high in deeper spirituality, and boomed, "Hey, God, make my day! Go for it." Then, again, I've read all three articles.

One is not required to know many Bible verses to realize these or other weird efforts have nothing to do with the worship of God revealed in the New Testament.

What is one to make of such doings in the alleged name of "reaching this generation?" Perhaps Martin E. Mary, prominent American church historian, summed it up best: "To give the whole store away to match what this year's market says the unchurched want is to have the people who know least about faith determine most about its expression." There's more than a clever turn of phrase in that statement.

AN "OUTRAGEOUS" PRAYER

Perhaps this prayer should be uttered before every State Legislature.

On January 23, 1996, Joe Wright of Wichita, Kansas, was the guest chaplain for the Kansas House of Representatives. He was asked to open their session that day with its customary prayer. However, after the prayer, three house members jumped to their feet in a rage and indignantly shouted, "He can't talk like that!" What was it he said that was so terrible? Listen in:

Heavenly Father; we come before you today to ask your forgiveness and to seek your direction and guidance. We know your Word says woe to those who call evil good but that's exactly what we have done. We have lost our spiritual equilibrium and inverted our values. We confess that we have ridiculed the absolute truth of your Word in the name of moral pluralism. We have worshipped other gods and called it multiculturalism. We have endorsed perversion and called it an alternative lifestyle. We have exploited the poor and called it a lottery. We have neglected the needy and called it self-preservation. We have rewarded laziness and called it welfare. In the name of choice we have killed our unborn. In the name of right to life we have killed abortionists. We have neglected to discipline our children and called it building esteem. We have abused power and called it political savvy. We have coveted our neighbors' possessions and called it taxes. We have polluted the air with profanity and pornography and called it freedom of expression. We have ridiculed the time honored values of our forefathers and called it enlightenment. Search us, O God, and know our hearts today. Try us and show us any wicked way in us. Cleanse us from every sin and set us free. Guide and bless these men and women who have been sent here by the people of Kansas and who have been ordained by you to govern this great state. Grant them your wisdom to rule and may their decisions direct us to the center of your will. We ask in the name of your Son, the living Savior Jesus Christ, Amen.

I am sure that it took a good deal of courage to offer this prayer before the Kansas House of Representatives. Perhaps it should be offered in every state legislature. Solomon said, "Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin is a reproach to any people," Proverbs 14:34.

We need to pray for our public officials. They have a Godgiven responsibility as God's ministers to serve the people for righteousness' sake (Romans 13:1-7). We need to pray that God will grant them wisdom to make decisions that will encourage the nation to serve God's will.

Sincerely Wrong Is Still Wrong

"I verily thought with myself; that I ought to do many things contrary to the name of Jesus of Nazareth (Acts 26:9). Paul said those words to Agrippa concerning his former zeal as a devout follower of the Jewish religion. Would anyone say that Paul could have continued in such activity toward Jesus Christ, being sincere and devout in his religion, and be pleasing to God? Look at what Paul said about his actions in that religion. "Who was before a blasphemer, and a persecutor, and injurious: but I obtained mercy, because I did it ignorantly in unbelief' (I Tim. 1:13). Can one continue in unbelief concerning Jesus and be right? "For I bear them record that they have a zeal of God, but not according to knowledge. For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and going about to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted themselves unto the righteousness of God. For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to every one that believeth" (Rom. 10:2-4). Paul knew the sincerity of his own nation toward their religion just as he knew himself in the same persuasion, but he also knew where they stood before God apart from Christ: lost. Sincerely wrong is still wrong. Look at some other examples of sincerity that do not excuse.

Abimelech

Abraham so journed on one occasion in the land of Gerar where Abimelech was king. Abraham was afraid that the fear of God was not in that region, so he devised a plan to seek to spare his life by telling those who asked about Sarah that she was his sister, though she was a half sister by his father (Gen. 20:12) but also his wife. Abimelech took Sarah unto him to be his wife (Gen. 20:2). The text then reads, "But God came to Abimelech in a dream by night, and said to him, Behold, thou art a dead man, for the woman which thou hast taken; for she is a man 's wife. But Abimelech had not come near her: and he said, Lord, wilt thou slay also a righteous nation? Said he not unto me, She is my sister? and she, even she herself said, He is my brother: in the integrity of my heart and innocency of my hands have I done this" (Gen. 20:3-5). Abimelech had believed a lie and stood in a precarious state before God. He was completely sincere in his action, but he was sincerely wrong. Look at what he said to Abraham the next morning. "What hast thou done unto us? and what have I offended thee, that thou hast brought on me and on my kingdom a great sin? thou hast done deeds unto me that ought not to be done" (Gen. 20:9). Abraham then revealed the thinking of his heart in truth. Notice what Abimelech did. "And Abimelech took sheep, and oxen, and men-servants, and womenservants, and gave then unto Abraham, and restored him Sarah his wife" (Gen. 20:14). When he learned the truth having believed a lie, he did all that he could to make things right with God and man. Here is a lesson for all.

Apollos

Luke records of this man, "This man was instructed in the way of the Lord; and being fervent in the spirit, he spake and taught diligently the things of the Lord, knowing only the baptism of John" (Acts 18:26). Surely no one could challenge the sincerity of Apollos in his work here. However, the next verse gives some light on the matter. "And he began to speak boldly in the synagogue: whom when Aquila and Priscilla had heard, they took him unto them, and expounded unto him the way of God more perfectly (Acts 18:26). If sincerity is all that mattered in pleasing God, why would Aquila and Priscilla seek to teach him otherwise? The seriousness of this is seen in the next chapter. Paul met disciples of the Lord who knew only John's baptism. Paul preached unto them the way of the Lord more perfectly and Luke records, "When they heard this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus" (Acts 19:5). They knew that their sincerity was not enough. They were to obey what they were taught by Paul.

Agrippa

When Paul stood before Agrippa, he was standing before a man who wanted to hear Paul speak (Acts 25:22). Agrippa was also a man who knew something about the teachings of the Old Testament (Acts 26:3, 27). He sincerely listened to what Paul preached and made a comment known to all Bible students, "Almost thou persuadest me to be a Christian" (Acts 26:28). Agrippa even said to Festus afterwards, "This man might have been set at liberty, if he had not appealed unto Caesar" (Acts 26:32). Agrippa was sincere in his motives to listen to the case before him. Agrippa was moved by the message of the gospel. Nevertheless, Agrippa did not do anything about his spiritual condition ac-cording to the record. He was sincere and knew that he was not a Christian, but he was also sincerely wrong. He needed to follow through like others had done. Sincerity is a needed and commendable trait, but sincerity alone will still leave one in a lost condition. Almost is not acceptable with God.

What Would Noah Have Done With Today's Government?

If you ever want to take the pulse of today's happenings in the world, try reading church bulletins.

Most are written very down-to-earth in style and really have a lot of good information we all need to read. I recently was given one that told the story of what would happen if Noah was building the Ark today. It was written as a sunny story, but the sad thing is a lot of the facts mentioned could really happen. Entitled "The Great Flood of 1998," it was dedicated to a group of church Elders and a building committee who must have been having some of the same problems Noah would have if he were building an Ark under our government regulations.

It seems the Lord spoke to Noah and said, "I'm going to make it rain until the whole earth is covered with water and all the evil people are destroyed. But, I want to save a few good people, and two of every kind of living things on earth. Build ME an Ark."

Like a flash of lightning He delivered the specifications for an Ark to Noah. "Okay," said Noah, trembling and fumbling with the blueprints. "Remember, when it starts to rain," said the Lord, "the Ark is to be completed or learn how to swim for a very long time."

After awhile the skies began to cloud up and rain began to fall. The Lord saw that Noah was sitting in his front yard weeping. There was no Ark! "Noah," said the Lord, "where is my Ark?" A lightning bolt crashed into the ground next to Noah. "Lord, please forgive me," begged Noah! "I did my best, but there were big problems." Noah began to explain why the Ark had not been built. "First, I had to get a building permit for the Ark construction project, and your plans didn't meet the codes. So, I had to redraw the plans. Then I got into a big fight over whether or not the Ark needed a fore sprinkler system.

My neighbors objected, claiming I was violating zoning by the Ark being in my front yard, so I had to get a variance from the city's planning commission. Then I had a big problem getting wood for the Ark because there was a ban on cutting trees to save the spotted owls. I had to convince the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service that I needed the wood to save the owls because of the flood that would be coming, but they wouldn't let me catch any owls. So, I have no owls.

Next the carpenters formed a union and went on strike. I had to negotiate a settlement with the National Labor Relations Board before anyone would pick up saw or hammer. Now we have two dozen carpenter doing the work of a dozen.

I still don't have any owls so I started gathering up animals and got sued by an animal rights group. They objected to me taking only two of each kind.

Just when I got the suit dismissed, EPA notified me that I couldn't complete the Ark without filing an environmental impact statement on your proposed flood. They didn't take kindly to the idea that they had no jurisdiction over the conduct of a Supreme Being.

Then the Army Corps of Engineers wanted a map of the proposed new flood plain. I sent them the globe. I'm also running short on funds since the IRS seized all of my assets, claiming I'm trying to avoid paying taxes by leaving the country. The Federal government has classified the Ark as a yacht thereby making it subject to an exorbitant luxury tax. I really don't think I can finish your Ark for at least another five years."

Slipping Back In

What if your wife walked out of the house one day without even mentioning where she was going and, after four or five weeks, walked back in as unconcerned as ever? Would you not be anxious to know where she had been? And suppose that when you questioned her, she said, "Oh, just here and there." Wouldn't you be rather suspicious of where she had been? Certainly everyone would agree that some kind of explanation should be forthcoming.

The Bible teaches that we are all married to Christ (Rom. 7:4) and that we are all in one family, which is God's family (I Tim. 3:15). When a member of this family is absent all the other members should be greatly concerned. Furthermore, when one is absent because of being "here and there," acknowledgments to God and the church are in order. These should be made before the congregation of God's people. Although one does not have to bow down at the feet of the congregation, he should confess, as the Bible teaches (James 5:16), that he has sinned against God and the church by his negligence.

Some have the idea that it is not a sin to miss just one Lord's Day. If one can miss one Lord's Day in such a manner, why can't he miss fifty-two Lord's Days without sinning? The very reason people miss fifty-two Lord's Days is that they first miss one. A person who misses the Lord's Day need to realize he is in rebellion to God.

Brethren should quit slipping back in after such negligence, or, in some cases, running to another congregation and placing membership. They need to repent now. The judgment will be too late.

Can you imagine Paul being in Ephesus for five or six weeks without meeting with the brethren? Yet, people often move to new areas and are there for weeks or months without attending services. For Paul to have done this, he would have had to be so sick that he could not lift his head.

t was Thursday night and I sat alone in the guard room of our local jail. My Bible class had finished early and I was waiting on the other groups to finish so we could leave together. Every

person wishing to visit someone in the jail must pass through this room.

As I waited, I glanced over the signs which were posted to give visitors various warnings and cautions. One sign caught my attention because it was posted at least four different

times in key locations. All of the other signs were posted only once. Obviously this was

a message they wanted to make sure all visitors understood. What message do you think a jail would want to make sure it got across to visitors? It wasn't about bringing in anything that could be used as a weapon. The sign is copied to the right.

Why would this be such an important notice to visitors of a jail? Obviously they are aware that the way someone is dressed could have an adverse impact on the people

they are charged with housing and controlling. They are aware of the problems that improper dress can create and they want to avoid them with the people they are responsible for.

> Shouldn't Christians be even more concerned when it comes to the way they dress? Our dress is to portray an image of godliness. We should be concerned with the problems our dress may cause in the minds of others. Should a jail be more concerned with modesty

than a Christian?

- 2. No tank tops
- 3. No short dresses
- 4. No sundresses
- 5. No shirts with obscene language or pictures
- 6. No see-through clothing

Any person that cannot abide by these rules will be refused visitation (no exceptions)

I couldn't help but think of some that if they left worship on Sunday to go visit the jail, would not allowed admittance! Imagine having to first go home from worship to put on something modest in order to be allowed into the jail! Immodesty is sin!

Sin produces negative effects. Even the jail keepers know this! Let's love the Lord so much that we would never do anything to jeopardize our soul or others! Let's be modest for righteousness sake!

The Promise Keepers Come To Town

All around town there are numerous posters announcing the Promise Keepers Rally to be held at the McMinnville Civic Center on August 29, 1998. The speakers listed were: Earl Dickson of Trinity Baptist Church, Lebanon, TN; Basil Phillips of Victory Christian Center, Monterey, TN; William E. Bain of Bryan College, Dayton, TN; and Rubel Shelly of Woodmont Hills Church of Christ, Nashville, TN. I wondered how many people know that Rubel Shelly and this movement does not represent the Church for which our Lord died?

Many people revel in the hoopla of the Promise Keepers Rallies that take place all across the country. What is distressing is that some of brethren have joined in some of these events. Some have mistakenly believed that the Promise Keepers were nothing more than a social organization designed to encourage men to be better husbands and fathers. Such is what many would like for us to think. Like the Masonic Lodge their literature betrays them and their intentions. I have several objections to this movement based upon Scripture. I offer just a few of these for your consideration. For a more detailed study I would recommend the series of articles published in Power (by Southaven church of Christ, Southaven, MS) written by B.J. Clarke. For those with Internet access these can be found at: http://www.vantek.net:80/pages/southavencoc/faqs.html

I object to the strong denominational influence that pervades the whole PK movement. Consider just two of the Seven Promises of Promise Keeper. #5 "A Promise Keeper is committed to support the mission of his church, by honoring and praying for his pastor and by actively giving his time and resources." Where does one get the idea of "his church?" Then "praying for his pastor" betrays the denominational misunderstanding that calls the preacher a "pastor." #6 "A Promise Keeper is committed to reach beyond any racial and denominational barriers to demonstrate the power of biblical unity." The PK movement clearly equates racial barriers with denominations. While God made "red, yellow, black, and white," He did not make the various denominations. In fact, Jesus said that He would uproot them (Mt. 15:13). This movement was started by those in denominations and is perpetuated by them to this day. And, there will be denominational innovations as a part of the "worship" offered at the rally here in McMinnville also.

I object to the plan of salvation they teach. From page 10, of Seven Promises Of A Promise Keeper we find: Are You Sure You're a Christian? "You need to do five things to become a part of God's family. If you haven't already done this, I urge you, if you're sincerely ready, to do them now: (1) Admit your spiritual need. "I am a sinner." (2) Repent. Be willing to turn from your sin and, with God's help, start living to please Him. (3) Believe that Jesus Christ died for you on the cross and rose again. (4) Receive, through prayer, Jesus Christ into your heart and live. Pray something like this from the sincerity of your heart: Dear Lord Jesus, I know I am a sinner. I believe You died for my sins and then rose from the grave. Right now, I turn from my sins and open the door of my heart and life. I receive You as my personal Lord and Savior. Thank you for saving me. Amen. (5) Then tell a believing friend and a pastor about your commitment."" Their "plan" totally leaves out the command of Jesus to be baptized (Mt. 28:19; Mk. 16:16). PK doctrine was not what Ananias was sent to tell Paul (Acts 22:16).

There are many other false teachings that are promoted by this group which we do not have time to survey in this article. These few details are given just to let you know that faithful Christians cannot and will not support such things. "I marvel that you are turning away so soon from Him who called you in the grace of Christ, to a different gospel, which is not another; but there are some who trouble you and want to pervert the gospel of Christ. But even if we, or an angel from heaven, preach any other gospel to you than what we have preached to you, let him be accursed. As we have said before, so now I say again, if anyone preaches any other gospel to you than what you have received, let him be accursed." (Galatians 1:6-9, NKJV).

Three R's

Ronnie Rogers

Remove

While I did not live on a farm as a child, I did grow up in a rural area of the county and since I now live on a working farm, there is one thing I have noticed which all farmers do before planting the season's crops. They all prepare their fields for the receiving of seed from clearing the ground to disking. As we grow into adults, our lives become cluttered with all kinds of worldly ideas and acts and we can become so influenced by the world that we can get to the point of being confused as to what is really important. In Matthew 13:1-23; Mark 4:1-20, and Luke 8:4-15, our Lord teaches us that our hearts fall into one of four kinds of soil the way side, the rocky ground, the thorny ground, and the good ground and that the Word of God is the Seed being sown. If we are ever going to have a chance at receiving the inheritance of salvation promised by our Lord, we must prepare our lives, our hearts, for the receiving of the Word by removing from our lives all of the worldly ideas which will hinder us from having hearts of prepared, good soil.

Receive

Some of my most pleasurable childhood memories center around the summers when I stayed with my grandparents. As I now look back, I remember with fondness the hours I would spend with my grandfather working in the family garden, even though at the time I thought it was cruel and unusual punishment and would wonder what I had done wrong to be treated in such a way by these people who were my Granny and Pa and were supposed to love me. But, I learned many lessons during those summers not the least of which is the law of the harvest. I learned that what we plant, sow, is what we reap and we reap many times more than we plant. We can have the best prepared garden spot and the best seed, but if the ground never receives the seed, there will be no fruit for the harvest. If the Word of God is ever going to have an influence in our lives, we must receive it; our hearts must be susceptible to It, and we must meditate upon It day and night. If we will be patient and follow God's plan, we will bare much to God's glory.

Replace

Everyone who has ever planted a garden knows fully well that maintaining that garden is a lot of work, much of it daily. If we don't continue to work the ground, all sorts of unwanted weeds will reclaim that garden spot and the fruit baring plants will be overcome and choked out. So it is with our lives. We are not only to remove from our lives "all filthiness and overflow of wickedness" but we are also to replace those worldly ideas with doing good works of faith. Ours lives can not remain empty. If we don't work consistently and steadfastly filling our lives with good works, we will be overcome by these worldly ideas and our latter state will be worse than our beginning. Ever see a garden "grown up" with weeds from neglect? Matthew12:43-45; II Peter 2

Let us be diligent in keeping the good soil of our hearts by removing from our lives all worldly ideas which are contrary to salvation, and receive with meekness the Word of God which is able to save our souls, and work steadfastly filling lives with good works of faith thereby producing good fruit.

Betraying Our Youth!

"If I had said, "I will speak thus," Behold, I would have been untrue to the generation of Your children." (Psalms 73:15, NKJV). ""But whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in Me to sin, it would be better for him if a millstone were hung around his neck, and he were drowned in the depth of the sea." (Matthew 18:6, NKJV). "I marvel that you are turning away so soon from Him who called you in the grace of Christ, to a different gospel, which is not another; but there are some who trouble you and want to pervert the gospel of Christ." (Galatians 1:6,7, NKJV).

I have been astounded recently with the great apostasy that is occurring within the Lord's church. It is coming so fast and going so far from the truth. What is so insidious is that our young people have become the target. In recent days we have learned of three separate events that are aimed at young people where digression is the readily apparent.

First, there is the "YouthWorker University" to be held October 23-24, 1998 at and sponsored by David Lipscomb University. Among those who are scheduled to "train" youth workers are Rick Bundschuh. He is the *pastor* of the Kauai Christian Fellowship in Hawaii. Also on the program is Brewster McLeod, the *student minister* of the Southland Christian Church in Lexington, KY. There may be other non-Christians on the program but these two are know *not* to be.

Second, there is the program at the University Church of Christ in Tuscaloosa, AL. Annually they have a program known as "Youth In Action." This year the program is to be held at the Civic Center in Birmingham on December 27. The program has been notorious in the past for inviting false teachers like Jeff Walling and Buddy Bell. This year they have invited Tony Campolo, a prominent *denominational* preacher.

Third, this past week we received a notice for a youth rally and college day from the Walnut Street Church of Christ in Dickson. The title of their program is "Miracles In Music" and their featured singing group is "Full Access." By the way this is the same group that appeared at Westwood Youth Rally back in May. In March of this year this group performed for the Lyncoya Hills Baptist Church in Donelson, The next day after appearing at Westwood they performed for the First Christian Church in Madison, and the next week were at the New Covenant Methodist Church in Jackson, MS. This group does sing A Capella (without instruments) when requested, but as their web site (www.fullaccess.com) clearly shows, most of their concerts are mixed with both A Capella and instrumentally accompanied religious songs.

What is one to make of all of this? First, it is obvious that elders and preachers are not doing their job. Elders are to *stop* those who teach things they ought not (Titus 1:10,11). Preachers must expose and warn (Eph. 5:11; Acts 20:31). Second, we have a large segment within the Lord's church that really do not understand the non-denominational character of the Lord's church. Evidently they do not understand such basic passages as 1 Cor. 12:13; Mt. 16:18; Eph. 4:4-6. Third, they do not understand the gravity of what they are doing. As the verse quoted in the beginning shows, one will give account for leading young one's (as well as older) astray. There are some things you just can't take back. Leading a child astray in his youth is something that can never be reclaimed. We must stand strong and not allow our youth to be taken captive by the Devil. (1 Pet. 5:8).

Ordain Preachers, Dedicate Babies?

Where in the Bible does it teach about ordaining preachers and having services for dedicating babies? Are these things to be practiced today?

There is no Bible authority for either practice. Christ told his servants, "Go ye and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them into the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I commanded you: and to, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world... Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature. He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved" (Matt. 28:19-20; Mark 16:15-16)". In this commission, Jesus appointed, or ordained believers to preach and teach His gospel until the end of time. That is all the authority we need to proclaim His truth with power (Titus 2:15). Human hands cannot intervene in that arrangement. No council or synod or hierarchy countermands heaven's decree.

Nowhere in the Scriptures do you find the practice of "dedicating babies" as a religious rite. Parents are told, "Ye fathers, provoke not your children to wrath; but nurture them in the chastening and admonition of the Lord" (Eph. 6:4). No religious ceremony is necessary or commanded to "train up a child in the way he should go" (Pro. 22:6). We are told, "Whatsoever ve do, in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord" (Col.3:17). How can we do something in the name of the Lord which He never authorized? Too many people desire display and ostentatious ceremony rather than personal responsibility.

What If King David Had Been A Baby Boomer?

He says my family will always experience contlict and that I will be humiliated "in broad daylight" for what I did "in secret." All this after I replaced a failed king, united the country, defeated its enemies, and moved the ark to Jerusalem. What kind of man is this?

Enough is enough. This matter is between me and my family and our God. It is not the business of the prophet or anyone else. It will be settled within our family and in the privacy of our personal consciences. I'm sure you agree. Which of the elders of Israel or which of you could stand up under the scrutiny of a prying prophet like Nathan?

Citizens, and yes, even kings, have a right to privacy. It is time to move on. My family and I need time to heal from the tragedies we've experienced and from the unmerciful probing of this prophet. As a nation we need to deal with the current threats of the Philistines and Ammonites, to deepen our national unity, and to build on the prosperity I've brought you during my reign.

I am confident of your understanding and support. You and I are flawed people. What we need is not confrontation and condemnation by priggish prophets. Let us forgive each other, feel each other's pain, and sympathetically help each other deal with the many arbitrary and unwelcome providences that disturb our personal peace.



Bible Lands Trip Final Call



CHURCH ATTENDANCE

By Dub McClish

"Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching" (Heb. 10:25).

There is surely more to being faithful to the Lord of heaven and earth than "church attendance," but can one be faithful to him without it? Is it necessary (to please God, to grow spiritually, to be saved) for one to assemble faithfully with the saints? If the New Testament teaches anything, it answers "yes"! We are obviously not speaking of the sick and shut-ins and others who are hindered beyond their control, but those who are able to come. We aren't merely asking if the preacher or elders care, but does God care? Consider the following:

Lord's Day assembly. Saints are commanded to partake of the Lord's supper to remember Christ (1 Cor. 11:24). The apostolic example (Acts 20:7) and uninspired early church history confirm that the church ate the Lord's Supper on the first day of the week. To provide the money needed to do the work of the church, the saints were commanded to give of their money every first day of the week (1 Cor. 16:1-2). These things were to be done "everywhere in every church" (1 Cor. 4:17). To willfully miss the Lord's Day assembly is to disregard these commands.

Other assemblies. What about Sunday evening, Sunday morning Bible school or Wednesday night? Are such meetings scriptural or unscriptural? Various meetings besides Sunday were held in the early church with apostolic approval (Acts 2:46; 4:23; 12:12, etc.). It is certain that such additional meetings for study, worship and fellowship (gospel meeting series, vacation Bible schools, workshops, etc.) greatly strengthen those who attend them and do untold good. In spite of scriptural precedent and practical need for these meetings, some still weakly cling to the "Lord's Supper only" approach to church attendance.

A direct command. As clearly as the New Testament teaches not to commit adultery, not to steal, or not to murder, it teaches "not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together" (Heb. 10:25). To forsake is not the same as merely being absent. The sick man will be absent without forsaking the assembly if he would have been there except for sickness. To forsake is to abandon for something deemed more important. It is mere speculation to limit this command only to the Lord's Day assembly. Whenever there is a meeting of the saints at which we could be exhorted to pure living, we ought to be there. Moreover, we ought to want to be there!

Miscellaneous principles. Lovers of God have always cherished worship and study opportunities (Ps. 42:1-4; 84:1-2, 10; Mt. 5:6). Can one "seek first the kingdom" while forsaking its assemblies? (Mt. 6:33). Does God care where we are when the saints meet?

"SON, WE DON'T WANT THE CHURCH TO GROW INTO WHAT WE LEFT" Alan Highers

Some time ago I heard Leroy Brownlow speak on "WHY I AM A MEMBER OF THE CHURCH OF CHRIST." The name and title were both familiar to me, as they would be to most members of the church. Brother Brownlow is the author of the book by the same name. My oldest copy of his book is the ninth edition. My most recent copy is the forty-second edition. It numbers into the hundreds of thousands.

Brother Brownlow is beyond three score and ten, but he has lost none of his power and effectiveness as a proclaimer. He enunciated his points with clarity, simplicity, and good humor. In the course of his remarks, he pointed out that many people are what they are religiously, because they grew up that way. He said this is not true, however, in his case. He and his parents studied their way out of prominent denominational bodies in order to become undenominational New Testament Christians.

He spoke of how his father gave up his creed book when he obeyed the gospel. He carried his New Testament with him thereafter, wherever he went. He described the excitement, happiness and joy his parents experienced in becoming members of the New Testament church. They were thrilled to wear no name but Christians, to have no creed but Christ, and to hold membership in no institution except the church revealed in the New Testament.

A short time before his mother passed, she began to observe the changes promulgated by some within the church. Once she said to him, "Son, we don't want the church to grow into what we left!"

What a powerful expression for the undenominational nature of the New Testament church! She had studied her way out of denominationalism. She knew the difference. She understood what it meant to be a simple New Testament Christian and a member of the church as people were in the first century.

When we see denominational trends and modernistic departure taking place around us, let us remember that fervent entreaty: "Son, we don't want the church to grow into what we left!"

Criticism is the one thing that most of us think is more blessed to give than to receive.

Constructive criticism is when I criticize you. Destructive criticism is when you criticize me.

Gambling

The November 1993 Mayo Clinic Health Letter dealt with gambling, "A pastime that can turn destructive. "It begins: "Weeknights you play bingo. Fridays you buy lottery tickets. Weekends, it 's the casino or the track Just simple pleasures? Maybe. They can also be symptoms of an illness that's both hidden and progressive. Compulsive gambling can start as an innocent pastime. But it can quickly turn into a habit that escalates to an addiction" (page 6).

Our society looks upon addictions as illnesses with no relation to sin or wrongful conduct. If a compulsion wears the "illness" label, it renders the user void of moral responsibility. He is a victim of circumstances or heredity, who is not to be held accountable for his choices and actions. In reality, however, sin is not so easily acquitted. A compulsion may become an illness, but it is still a sin, and therefore a sin-sickness.

There is no one who engages in sinful activity that for one moment thinks that he will be one of those who cannot walk away from it. There are many addictive enterprises, such as drinking, smoking, pornography, drugs and gambling. These, and other things, can take hold of a person physically and/or psychologically and render him captive in mind and body. Jesus would call him a slave to sin (John 8:34). Our society would call him a hapless, helpless victim who is enslaved to something perfectly legitimate.

The aforementioned Mayo Clinic Health Letter is interesting from the standpoint of dealing with something that is both sinful and addictive. It lays out the facts relative to compulsive gambling. Here are the statistics: "Age: the typical age range of compulsive gamblers was 30 to SS in the 1970's. Today: it's 17 to 70. "Number: in 1986, 3 million Americans were compulsive gamblers. Today: Gamblers Anonymous estimates 6 to 10 million." "Earnings: America's gambling habit has grown from about \$80 billion a year in 1986 to \$300 billion in 1991. Earnings continue to rise." "Prevalence: within states; 39 have lotteries, six have video gambling, nine allow casinos, and 16 have federally sanctioned casinos on Native American reservations."

The state of Arkansas is feeling the pressure of other southern states to join in the casino craze. News reports are looking at Tunica, Mississippi as a glaring example of the benefits to be had with casino gambling being legalized. The money-hungry and covetous around us are all for any means to solve economic shortfalls. To them the end justifies the means. Are Christians going to look the other way on this and ignore or deny the many Scriptural principles that make gambling, in any amount and to any degree, sinful? No matter what is said, there will be those who intend to gamble. Even some brethren. It is a shame and travesty against the truth for Christians to defend gambling.

WHAT IS PERSONAL WORK?

I would like to suggest eight different points that help to answer the question of our title. *First*, personal work is being **READY WORKMEN**. This takes preparation. Paul told Timothy to "study to show thyself approved" (II Tim. 2:15). We are to be "ready always to give an answer" for why we are Christians (II Pet. 3:15). Being ready workmen also takes willingness. We must have the attitude that Peter showed in saying, "We have left all, and have followed thee" (Mark 10:28). This will be proved by "the spirit of faith according to what is written, we believe, therefore we speak" (II Cor. 4:13).

Second, we must be AWARE OF THE NEED. There are so many lost, in fact, the vast majority (Matt. 7:13,14). There are well over 5 billion people in the world. Most have never heard of Christ, and most of those who have, have a false idea about what a Christian really is. If the number of true Christians is accurate (none can know for sure how many there actually are), at a generous estimate of 3 million, this means EACH CHRISTIAN must try to teach 1.6 million people THEMSELVES. This does not take into consideration the population increase.

Third, we must KNOW WHAT WE HAVE. It is the truth that makes men free (John 8:32). We have it and the lost world needs it. There is a great deal of unrest and dissatisfaction in the denominational world. Where are we when these people leave their "churches"?

Fourth, we must KNOW THE JOB. Our part is to plant and persuade (Acts 8:35; II Cor. 5:11). It may be ours, but it will likely be some other's job to reap (I Cor. 3:10). Finally, we must remember it is God's part to bring the increase—let us not become discouraged (I Cor. 3:5-7).

Fifth, we must KNOW WHAT WE ARE WORKING WITH. There are four kinds of "soil" with which we must work. According to what Jesus taught in Matthew 13, there is the hard soil, the rocky soil, the thorny soil, and the good soil. We cannot know which is which... sometimes not even after we have "reaped." Sometimes, the soil turns out to be bad, when we thought we saw good results from our teaching. Not to worry; God will take care of that; we will suffer no personal loss (I Cor. 3:12-15), though we may grieve for the person who has rejected the Gospel. Failure for people to listen and obey is to be expected. Remember the four soils (one out of four was good), and the ten lepers (only one out of ten responded to Jesus).

Sixth, we must HAVE CERTAIN TRAITS. We must avoid laziness. We will not convert all, not even most, but we shall be able to convert some. We will convert none if we do not teach! Consider the character traits of "the Lord's servant" as Paul describes him/her from II Timothy 2:24-26. Now, go and be likewise.

Seventh, we must AVOID HINDRANCES. We ought never to think, "Oh, they won't be interested" (Acts 8:31). Or, "Well, they'll never change" (Rom. 1:16).

Eighth, we must KNOW OURSELVES. There is a personal evaluation that each of us must administer. What do we believe about such questions as: "Are people really lost? Are my non-Christian friends really lost? Am I their only hope? Will I escape if I purposefully fail to tell them the saving Truth?" Be careful not to take rejection personally. When folks fail to listen, they reject Christ, not you. If preachers took this personally, there would be very few of us left to preach! Please read and meditate upon these next few Scriptures. They will help you to be brave and courageous in speaking to your friends and neighbors: Matthew 20:40; Mark 9:37; Luke 10:16; 1 Thessalonians 4:8. NEVER, never quit (I Cor 15 58, II Cor 4 7-9).

Is Everything We Do In Life, Worship?

Some try to argue that everything we do in life is worship. If you cut your grass or wash the dishes at home, this is worship. This question then is very important for us to understand and be able to answer anyone who might ask us about our hope (I Peter 3:15).

In the Old Testament we find God commanding Abraham to sacrifice his son Isaac to God (Genesis 22:2). The Lord told him that it would be showen him which mountain to carry Isaac to for this event. After three days journey Abraham saw the mountain "afar off" (vs. 4). Abraham told his servants to wait there for him. Abraham said to his servants, "...I and the lad will go yonder and worship..." (vs. 5). If everything I do is worship, then Abraham worshipped when he gathered the things necessary for worship and made the journey. If such is true, don't you think Abraham's statement about going to worship is somewhat confusing? The statement is not confusing, however, when we understand that everything we do is not worship.

Think about the Lord's statement about worshipping in spirit and truth (John 4:24). How can washing your dishes or cutting your grass, be in truth, that is according to the Lord's will? The blind man who was healed in John 9 declared that God hears only those that worship Him and do His will (John 9:31). If everything we do is worship, why use the phrase "...doeth His will"? No, everything we do is not worship, because worship must be regulated by God.

"I Want A Church That Meets My Needs"

The statement made in the title is not only the desire of many in the religious world, but is becoming the philosophy of many Christians, because many of us are seeking a religion that "meets our needs." The phrase itself has virtually become a new religious term. Many persons praise or blame a particular congregation because it is or is not "meeting my needs."

Let me hasten to say that if the phrase means that we need to satisfy spiritual hunger, then it is a good expression. For surely everyone ought to be in a Christian community where his/her deepest spiritual longings are being addressed. The voice of God needs to be heard through spiritual teaching, and we need opportunities to serve, love, and be called to repentance.

But being a part of the church to some means reaching for goals of "self-actualization." So if the church doesn't fulfill certain expectations, wants and preferences, then they must move on to another emotional department store with different merchandise more appealing to their "tastes."

Sadly, and probably without realizing it, many congregations have gotten into thinking that "we have to do all these things and plan all these activities to meet people's needs so they won't leave." Consequently, well-meaning leaders have turned God's church into a merchandising institution. So we promote this program and that program for this group and that group.

But, in my judgment, the system has become turned upside down from the way God intended it to be. Whatever happened to the attitude in a Christian's heart of "I'd like to be a part of this congregation because of what I can do to meet its needs?" When are we most fulfilled? When our needs are met? Or when we meet the needs of God's church on this earth? We ought to be a part of a congregation, not so that our needs can be met, but rather so that we may best meet the needs of God's work.

Christians need to recall the truth of the Scriptures that personal fulfillment is a great spiritual paradox. We are most filled when we empty ourselves and become filled serving others. Jesus taught us "whosoever will be great among you, let him be your minister (servant)....even as the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister (serve)" (Matthew 20:26-28).

Paul said of his own heart, "I am crucified with Christ. Nevertheless I live; yet, not I, but Christ liveth in me. And the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God who loved me and gave himself for me" (Galatians 2:20). And again, "I beseech you therefore by the mercies of God that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God which is your reasonable service" (Romans 12:1) "Reasonable service" is not being served (having your needs met), but serving (meeting the needs of others). We need to relearn the axiom "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).

Let's not demand that God's church be a place where people (leadership or membership) cater to our desires and preferences... Let's turn it right-side up again and be a part of a congregation, not for what it can do for us, but for what we can do for it.

I long to be a good example to my friends, but I also want to fit in with my peers. I enjoy Christian living, but the pull of the world is strong."

AS A YOUNG PERSON, I NEED FOR YOU TO . . .

"ENCOURAGE ME." You may not remember what it was like to be a teenager, but it is a discouraging time. Teenagers are very hard on themselves. When I make a mistake, I tend to make too much out of it. What I need is for the adults whom I respect to speak words of cheer and give me a pat on the back for the things I do well. I need to know that all people make mistakes.

"Even the youths shall faint and be weary, and the young men shall utterly fall; But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint" (Isa. 40:30-31). Paul wrote, "Fathers, provoke not your children to anger; lest they be discouraged" (Col. 3:21).

"TEACH ME." Yes, even though I sometimes act like I know everything, I realize that I am still learning! The greatest need I have is to learn the Bible. The basic truths which you have known for years. I still do not know. I want to know about Jesus and the love He has shown for me. I yearn to be free from the guilt of my sins. I want to know when I will be old enough to be baptized. I long to know what Christ wants me to do with my life. How does He expect a teenager to act? What is right and what is wrong?

"Wherewithal shall a young man cleanse his way? By taking heed thereto according to thy word. With my whole heart have I sought thee: O let me not wander from the commandments. Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee" (Psalm 119:9-11). Solomon wrote the Proverbs, in part, to give "young men knowledge and discretion" (1:4).

"SHOW ME." I appreciate your instructions, but I find it easier to follow your example. Your life is a better teacher than your lips. What I really want are role models. When I see adults adorning the gospel of Christ, it is easier to understand what the precepts mean. When I see the importance you place on worshipping God and studying His word, it motivates me to be interested. When you sacrifice to live right, it does not bother me so much when you ask me to sacrifice.

"My son, give me thine heart, and let thine eyes observe my ways" (Prov. 23:26). Jesus faced a young man who asked, "What lack I yet?" To which He responded, "If thou wilt be perfect, go and sell that thou hast, and give to the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven; and come and follow me" (Matt. 19:20-21). Jesus taught the lesson on priorities and exemplified how it applied.

"CORRECT ME." You did not expect to see this one, did you! I act as if discipline were the curse of my life, but it is important to me. It shows that you care about me. I need boundaries set. I must know the difference between right and wrong, truth and error, good and bad. I will test you here. I am curious and want to know what lies outside the boundaries you have set for me. If you remain steadfast in your restrictions, then I will understand your conviction and see it as love for me.

The Proverbs say, "Withhold not correction from the child . . . " (23:13); "Foolishness is bound in the heart of the child; but the rod of correction shall drive it far from him" (22:15); "He that spareth his rod hatheth his son; but he that loveth him chasteneth him betimes" (13:24).

Thank you for blessing my life and helping me through this difficult time.



Hindrances To Happiness

by Jerry L. Martin

Did you know that the approaching holiday season will be a time when more people will be depressed than any other time of the year? You might ask, "during a time when happiness should abound, why are so many unhappy?" First of all, one should realize that sometimes the cause of depression or unhappiness is caused by a chemical imbalance in the brain. One should never be ashamed to get medical help for such a condition. Yet, more times than not, happiness can be assured if one chooses to be happy and determines to avoid the hindrances to such. Note the depression experienced by the great Old Testament prophet Elijah (*I Kings 19*). He had accomplished many great things through the power of God for which he should have been happy, yet he became completely depressed because of evil Jezebel's threat on his life. His happiness was hindered by his focus, his fatigue, and his faith.

His FOCUS was self-centered. Listen to the description of Elijah's mind set: "But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a juniper tree: and he requested for himself that he might die; and said, It is enough; now, O Lord, take away my life; for I am not better than my fathers" (2 Kings 19:4). Elijah was involved in total self-pity. Happiness can only be obtained when we focus first, on the will of God and secondly, on the good of others (Matthew 22:37-40; Philippians 2:3,4).

His FATIGUE was self-induced. Notice from the passage above, "he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness." The fatigue that caused Elijah to lie down under a juniper tree was brought on by him going on a journey the Lord had not directed him to go on. In fact, the Lord asked him in verse eight, "What doest thou here, Elijah?" When we travel without God's direction and provision, the self-induced fatigue will be too great for us and happiness will be left behind (I Kings 19:7).

His FAITH was self-sufficient. Elijah became depressed and disheartened because his faith was not focused on what God could do through him but it was focused on his own strength and ability. Listen to his words, "...I have been very jealous for the Lord God of hosts: ...and I, even I only, am left, and they seek my life, to take it away" (I Kings 19:10,14). Our faith and trust must be in the Lord if we are to escape the hindrances to lasting happiness (Hebrews 1:6; 12:1,2; I Timothy 4:10; Philippians 4:13).

Central America Relief Update

Most of you are aware that the church at Bybee Branch sent \$5500.00 and several boxes of canned goods to Central America via the Forrest Park church in Valdosta, GA (as did several of our sister congregations in the area). The church there has sent the first update on the progress of the benevolent work.

The assistance is going through the local congregations in Honduras. Distributions were made in Tegucigalpa, Danli, La Esparanza, and Choluteca. The initial amount of food delivered was 33.5 tons of beans, corn, rice, cooking oil, soup, sugar, salt, and milk. There was also more than 3,000 gallons of purified water for drinking. In addition a shipping container filled with hospital supplies and clothes are on the way.

In Nicaragua food was dispensed at congregations in the Leon and Chinandega provinces. Delievered there were: 4.5 tons of rice, 1.5 tons of beans, 150 gallons of cooking oil, 1/2 ton of sugar, 100 lbs of salt, 1800 eggs, 500 packages of powered milk, and 1000 bananas.

More details will be given as they become available. Forrest Park said a fuller report would be coming soon.
