Barriers To Fellowship

Fellowship is such a pleasant word, isn't it? It expresses a common desire of two or more individuals to commune together and share with one another. Fellowship is an association had between those that agree and share common interest, activity, feeling or experiences. In 1 John 1:6 through 1 John 2:6, one gets a clear picture of not only the beauty of the fellowship that we can have with God but also the barriers that can block us from the sweetness of such fellowship with our divine creator.

INSINCERITY is a barrier to fellowship. "If we say that we have fellowship with him, and walk in darkness, we lie, and do not the truth" (I John 1:6). If we pretend to share the same interest with God but our walk exposes our hypocrisy, a barrier is erected that separates us from true fellowship with Him. The barrier of insincerity can be removed by walking in the light of the Lord (1 John 1:7).

IMPENITENCE is another barrier to fellowship. "If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.... If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us" (1 John 1:8,10). When we insist that our mistakes are not really sins, we build a barrier between us and our God. When we don't recognize our sin as God does, then the agreement needed for spiritual fellowship is forfeited. Truth is replaced with a lie. The barrier of impenitence can be removed if we confess our sins (2' John 1:9).

INDIFFERENCE also is a barrier to fellowship. "He that saith, I know him, and keepeth not his commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him" (1 John 2:4). When we are apathetic and show a lack of interest in faithfully following the Lord's instructions, we construct walls of separation between us and Him. The barrier of indifference can be removed only by keeping the words of the Lord (1 John 2:5).

If we are to tear down the barriers to fellowship and keep them from being erected in our lives, we must sincerely walk in the light, penitently confess our sins, and faithfully keep His Word. May God help us in this endeavor so that sweet and lasting fellowship can truly be enjoyed.

A.M	Passing The Torch Of Truth

Be An Example Of The Believers

by Jerry L. Martin

In Paul's first letter to Timothy, he instructs him to, "Let no man despise thy youth; but be thou an example of the believers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith and in purity" (I Timothy 4:12). He then tells Timothy to give attention to reading, exhortation and doctrine, and not to neglect the gift that is in him (vss. 13, 14). Timothy is also encouraged to meditate on things he has been taught and give himself wholly to them (vs. 15). We often emphasize that we are to be examples in the areas pointed out in verse twelve, but sometimes we don't spend enough time learning how. Yet, Paul did not leave us to guess as to how we can develop the ability to be such an example. Let's notice what he says it takes (vs. 16).

First, it takes PURPOSEFUL CONCENTRATION. "Take heed..." This lets us know we are to always pay attention and be aware of what we are seeing and hearing. In the parable of the sower, the Lord admonished, "Take heed therefore how ye hear..." (Luke 8:18). Peter warned, "Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour" I Peter 5:8). As an example of the believers, we must decide to be spiritually focused and alert at all times.

Secondly, it takes PERSONAL COMMITMENT. "Take heed to thyself..." If we make a personal determination to apply to our own life what we are trying to encourage others to apply to theirs, we can be an influential example. Paul said of himself, "But I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I my self should be a castaway" (II Corinthians 9:27). As an example of the believers, we must make personal applications of all divine principles.

Thirdly, it takes PLANNED CONSISTENCY. "Take heed unto thyself and unto the doctrine; continue in them..." To be a true example of the believers, we must heed Christ's directive. "If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed; And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" (John 8:31,32). As an example of the believers, we must determine to finish the course and keep the faith.

The PROMISED CONSEQUENCE of purposeful concentration, personal commitment and planned consistency is that you will be an example of the believers. Paul promises, "...for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself and them that hear thee" (4:16). Let's all determine to be an example.

Prepare To Meet Thy God

by Jerry L. Martin

The humble prophet, Amos, was sent to prophesy of the coming doom upon the enemies of Israel (chapters one and two). He then delivered God's warning to the nation of Israel in the following sobering words, "Therefore thus will do unto thee, 0 Israel: and because I will do this unto thee, prepare to meet thy God, 0 Israel" (Amos 4:12). What is often overlooked is the entire process of PREPARING TO MEET GOD that Amos describes for us.

First, one must prepare to meet God in his WALK. "Can two walk together, except they be agreed" (Amos3:3)? Walking with God takes preparation. We must determine to know what the Lord expects of us and then do those things in order to feel comfortable walking with Him (Genesis 5:22-24: I John 1:7-10). If we aren't obedient to the Lord's instruction, we find ourselves hiding from God rather than walking with Him (Genesis 3:8).

Secondly, one must prepare to meet God in his WORSHIP AND WORK. "Come to Bethel, and transgress; at Gilgal multiply transgression; and bring your sacrifices every morning, and your tithes after three years: And offer a sacrifice of thanksgiving with leaven, and proclaim and publish the free offerings: for this liketh you, O ye children of Israel, saith the Lord God" (Amos 4:4,5). Amos delivers God's rejection of Israel's worship because they had not prepared themselves to seek and do His will. Contrast Israel's lack of preparation to Ezra's spiritual readiness (Ezra 7:10).

Thirdly, one must prepare to meet God in the WAITING JUDGMENT. "Therefore thus will I do unto thee, 0 Israel: and because I will do this unto thee, prepare to meet thy God, O Israel" (Amos 4:12). Because Israel had not properly prepared themselves to walk, worship and work with God they would not be prepared to meet God when He came in His judgment. Many pleas had gone out, and were still being extended, for Israel to return faithful to God. Israel rejected each plea and thereby failed to prepare. Paul reminds us, "For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ; that every one may receive the things done in his body, according to that he hath done, whether it be good or bad" (II Corinthians 5:10).

May each of us be serious in our preparation to walk, worship and work with God so we will be prepared for the waiting judgment.

10 Reasons Why You Should Investigate The Church Of Christ

- 1. It is Biblical in Origin. It began in Jerusalem on the Day of Pentecost following Christ's death. (Luke 24:45-47; Acts 1:6-8; Acts chapter 2).
- 2. It was founded by Christ. Matthew 16:18-19.
- 3. It wears and Honors the Name of Christ. Romans 16:16; Matthew 10:32-33; Colossians 3:17; 1 Peter 4:15-16.
- 4. Christ is its only creed. The Bible is its only rule of faith and practice. 2 Timothy 3:16-17; Matthew 24:35; John 12:48; Revelation 22:18-19.
- 5. It is Scriptural in organization. - 6. It Worships according to the New Testament Pattern. On the first day of the week, it meets to partake of the Lord's supper, sing, pray, study, and contribute as the New Testament has commanded. (Acts 20:7; 1 Corinthians 16:1-2; Colossians 3:16; Ephesians 5:19; Luke 18:1). It rejects methods of worship not prescribed in the New Testament such as mechanical instruments of music, worship in a foreign language, "transubstantiation," "consubstantiation," mass, etc.
- 7. Its preachers refuse to wear arrogant and pompous religious titles. Matthew 23:1-12; 2 Thessalonians 2:1-4.
- 8. It teaches and practices the proper baptism. The Lord commands an immersion (Romans 6:4; Colossians 2:12) of penitent believers (Mark 16:15-16; Acts 2:38) in water (Acts 8:36-38; 10:47-48; 1 Peter 3:20-21) for the remission of sins. (Acts 2:38; 22:16). This is the only baptism commanded by the New Testament. (Ephesians 4:5).
- 9. It urges Christian Living. It upholds devotion to high moral standards, civil obedience, benevolence, and godliness. (Titus 2:11-14).
- 10. It pleads for complete obedience to Christ and peace and unity among all men on the basis of the New Testament. John 17:15-26; I Corinthians 1:10; Ephesians 4:1-6.

Religious error flourishes where people fail to investigate, study, and think. It was noble in God's sight when the Bereans "...received the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the Scriptures daily, whether these things were so." (Acts 17:11).



Can A Child Of God Fall From Grace?

One of the most damnable doctrines conceived in the mind of men is the doctrine of *Once Saved*, *Always Saved*. Those who espouse such say that once a man is saved there is NO sin that can remove that person from eternal salvation. Surely, God will forgive sin when one allows the blood of Christ cleanse that sin. On the other hand, will God forgive sins that one is unwilling to admit, unwilling to confess, and a sin for which one is unwilling to repent? Let's ask a few questions and seek our answers from the word of God. Can a Christian fall from the grace of God?

IF A CHRISTIAN CANNOT FALL, WHY HAS GOD WARNED HIM AGAINST FALLING?

1 Corinthians 10:12 "Wherefore let him that thinketh he standeth take heed lest he fall."

Hebrews 3:12 "Take heed brethren, lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief, in departing from the living God."

Hebrews 4:1 "Let us therefore fear, lest a promise being left us of entering into his rest any of you should seem to come short of it."

IF CHRISTIANS CANNOT FALL, WHY DOES THE BIBLE SAY SOME DID FALL?

Acts 1:25 "That he may take part of this ministry and apostleship, from which Judas by transgression fell that he might go to his own place."

1 Corinthians 10:8 "Neither let us commit fornication, as some of them committed, and fell in one day three and twenty thousand."

IF CHRISTIANS CANNOT FALL, WHY DOES THE BIBLE REVEAL THEIR DUTY WHEN THEY DO FALL? Revelation 2:5 "Remember therefore from whence thou art fallen and repent and do the first works; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will remove thy candlestick out of his place except thou repent."

WHY DOES THE BIBLE TEACH CHRISTIANS TO AVOID THINGS THAT WOULD CAUSE THEM TO FALL? James 5:12 "But above all things, my brethren, swear not, neither by heaven, neither by the earth, neither by any other oath: but let your yea be yea; and your nay, nay; lest ye fall into condemnation."

2 Peter 3:17 "Ye therefore, beloved, seeing ye know these things before, beware lest ye also being led away with the error of the wicked fall from your own stedfastness."

WHY DOES THE BIBLE DOES TEACH THAT A CHRISTIAN CAN FALL FROM GRACE:

Galatians 5:4 "Christ is become of no effect unto you, whosoever of you are justified by the law; <u>ye are fallen from grace</u>."

THE BIBLE TEACHES THAT PUNISHMENT IS WORSE WHEN WE FALL AWAY THAN FOR THOSE WHO NEVER WERE CHRISTIANS:

2 Peter 2:20-21 "For IF AFTER they have escaped the pollutions of the world through the knowledge of the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, they are entangled therein and overcome the latter end is worse with them than the beginning. (21) For it had been better for them not to have known the way of righteousness than after they have known it, to turn from the holy commandment delivered unto them."

These verses hardly need explanation. The Bible could hardly be any plainer than what it already states. God's people are not magically secure in their salvation. Only a <u>dishonest</u> person would deny the meaning of the forementioned verses.

"Points & Briefs" on Women's Role

Those who seek to overcome the prohibitions against women leading prayer or preaching in the assembly of the church sometimes point to I Corinthians 11:5. "But every woman that prayeth or prophesieth with her head uncovered dishonoureth her head: for that is even all one as if she were shaven." From this it is assumed that Paul authorizes women praying and prophesying in church. Aside from the fact that such would be a plain contradiction of what is taught in I Timothy 2:8ff and I Corinthians 14:34f, this passage itself shows the impropriety of their praying or prophesying.

The issue in this section is the woman honoring her head and the covering as a symbol that she does. In chapter 14 he will address the impropriety of their speaking "in the church." It appears that some women in the Corinthian church were advancing themselves by publicly praying and prophesying. To further assert their new position, they had also removed the covering. To remove the covering was, in their society, to dishonor their head. Their praying or prophesying "in the church" (I Cor. 14:33-35), whether covered or uncovered, would be an exercise of authority, which would further demonstrate their failure to be in subjection (I Tim. 2:12). Paul was rebuking the twin improprieties of both praying and prophesying where it was not acceptable and of being uncovered while doing so. A woman who wore the covering symbol would be one who recognized her proper role. Such a sister, when properly instructed, would not seek to elevate herself by praying and prophesying where it was not allowed.







Self-Will

Are you a self-willed person? Some people think they are being scripturally steadfast when in reality they are simply being self-willed! To be self-willed means to be dominated by one's own interests, to arrogantly assert one's own will. The Bible speaks frequently of those who are self-willed and has nothing commendable about them! The Bible indictment against self-will ought to be considered by those who preach the gospel of positive thinking! Much of their philosophy revolves around the idea that what "I" want is what ought to be the norm.

There were people even in Old Testament times who thought that their will should supercede even that of God Himself. This is the height of self-will. "This evil people, which refuse to hear my words, which walk in the imagination of their heart, and walk after other gods to serve them, and to worship them, shall even be as this girdle, which is good for nothing" (Jer. 13:10) In the next verse, God called upon them to be His glorious people, but "they would not hear" (verse 11). There is a vast difference in "can't hear" and "won't hear"!! Earlier in his book, Jeremiah called the people to the way of rest and peace, "But they said, We will not walk therein" (Jer. 6:16). WE WILL NOT WALK THEREIN. How fatal those words were! And they are as fatal today as when first uttered.

Those to whom Jesus spoke were self-willed. One could not find a more pathetic cry than that which Jesus prayed for His beloved and "holy" city. "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, thou that killest the prophets, and stonest them which are sent unto thee, how often would I have gathered thy children together, even as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, AND YE WOULD NOT!" (Matt. 23:37). The ultimate fate of that city was terrible: "Behold, your house is left unto you desolate" (verse 38). Think of all those years in the past when God called unto His Old Testament people for them to repent and turn to Him, yet they would not! Think of those who, in the days of Ezra and Nehemiah, chose their captive lands rather than the return of their divinely given land! They simply "would not" hearken to God. How tragic!

God said he had stretched out His hands "all the day" to a rebellious people (Isa. 65:2). Paul shows that because of their self-will, they continue in their unbelief and are lost (Rom. 10:21). No matter what God has done, they refused Him. Has the world today done better?



Miracles, Providence, And Randomness

It is the contention of this article that these three ways are the ways in which God has operated or operates in the world. it is all important in discussing these matters that we define, as much as we can, our terms so we will know what we are talking about. This is often neglected in our Biblical discussions and as a result our statements are not on point.

As it is being used in this article, **miracle** means a sign or confirmation from God that He has spoken through a particular person or group of persons.

Providence, so far as I am able to determine, is the same act of God, but hidden behind His natural law, so that we cannot know when or even if He has acted. We say, as Mordecai said to Esther, "Who knoweth whether thou art not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?" (Esther 4:14). We pray in faith and leave the answer of our prayer to God. We should always pray, "Thy will be done." This prayer He will always answer.

Randomness is sheer chance, the sheer accident of natural law. This surely is how God deals with all men most of the time and the very reason for His natural law. It is objective and impartial toward all.

As an illustration let me use a quotation of an article from an incident that is now some years in the past. Some of us remember the tragedy that struck one of the congregations in Garland, Texas. During the Sunday morning worship service, the roof collapsed from the accumulated snow killing a little girl and injuring several other people. One of the elders of that congregation was quoted in the paper as saying, "It was a miracle more were not killed. God was with us." While sympathizing with those who were suffering and realizing that many people are prone to overstatements, there are several things I find disturbing about that remark.

Was it really a miracle? The disaster, like most disasters, could have been worse. Does this make it a miracle? I can find no place in the Bible where a limited disaster is called a miracle. Was it a miracle when the Sanhedrin didn't stone Philip to death as well as Stephen? All miracles were wonderful and extraordinary occurrences, but not all wonderful and extraordinary occurrences are miracles. If many great and wonderful events are not miracles, how much less this disaster in Garland?

In examining the miracles described in the Bible, we discover that the miracle (as opposed to providence or coincidence) was the **direct** and **obvious** intervention of God

into the chain of cause and effect we call natural law. Notice that the words "direct" and "obvious" are in bold print. In a miracle God makes it obvious that He is the One Who has done the thing. As Trench said, "The unresting activity of God, which at other times hides and conceals itself behind the veil of what we term natural laws, does in the miracle unveil itself it steps out from its concealment, and the hand which works is laid bare" (Richard Trench, *Notes on the Miracles of Our Lord*, p. 13). If in the tragedy at Garland, God obviously intervened, where is the evidence? Why was not the building spared? Why was not the lifte of the little girl spared? To ascribe such a lame "miracle" to God is strange indeed.

I understand the relief and gratitude at escaping from such disaster and the desire to express one's gratitude to God, but "miracle" is an overstatement. God works much of the time by allowing His natural law to run its course. Is there no such thing in the life of some people as the natural or coincidental? Must we attribute everything either to the providential or to the miraculous activity of God."

We live in a fallen and cursed world—a world of pain and sorrow and death. A world which is designed by God to allow us to make a free choice to serve Him or reject Him. It is a perfect place for soul growth. But it is not a perfect place. Unless we wish to ascribe to the deliberate and direct action of God all of the evil and suffering in the world, we must acknowledge that randomness exists. There are random sufferings and there are random causes for pleasures and lack of suffering. The wicked suffer, but the righteous suffer, too. The righteous sometimes prosper, but the wicked do so as well. We must also recognize that God's Will for this world allows for the free will of man with all of its possibilities for good and evil.

The expression, "God was with us," in the context of the tragedy in Garland, is fraught with difficulties. Such a statement can be true in only one of three ways:

- 1. It could be true in the sense that God is the ultimate source of everything and thus allows everything that exists to exist, and everything that happens to happen. But we cannot conclude that we should therefore attribute everything that happens to the purposeful action of God. God through His natural law sends sunshine and rain on the just and unjust. However, such is not a sign either to the just or to the unjust that God is with them. Every false religion in the world attributes the random good things its adherents receive as proof that God favors them. The true Christian has no need or excuse to fall into such nonsense. "And hereby we know that we know him, if we keep his commandments" (I John 2:3).
- 2. Or it could be true in the sense that what happened was a miracle. But the miracles of the Bible were signs. They were confirmation that certain ones were God's spokesmen. A miracle was therefore the **purposeful**, **direct**, **and obvious** intervention of God into the chain of cause and effect He put into place when He created this world. We call that chain of cause and effect natural law. The miracles of the Bible were the result of extraordinary gifts from God. They were for the purpose of revealing and confirming God's Will. "And they went forth, and preached everywhere, the Lord working with them, and confirming the word by the signs that followed" (Mark 16:20). "How shall we escape, if we neglect so great a salvation? which having at the first been spoken through the Lord, was confirmed unto us by them that heard; God also bearing witness with them, both by signs and wonders, and by manifold powers, and by gifts of the Holy Spirit, according to his own will" (Hebrews 2:3-4). They were to cease when God's Word had been completely revealed and confirmed (I Corinthians 13:8-13). To use the word "miracle" carelessly is to confuse ourselves and others and to compromise the integrity and authority of the Scriptures.

It could be true in the sense of providence. This, like the miracle, is the 3 purposeful intervention of God into the chain of natural law, but unlike the miracle it is not **direct** or **obvious** and, thus, is not a sign. Providence is hidden behind the veil of cause and effect. When God acts providentially, we cannot know at what point in the chain of cause and effect God has intervened, or in any particular instance, if God has intervened. If we could know these things, it would not be providence, but a miracle—a sign.

There are those in this 20th and 21st century, when science is almost universally worshiped, where man is ridiculously proud of his knowledge and his puny control of the material world, and where he is so ignorant of his own ignorance, who claim that they cannot believe in the miracles of the Bible, because they were contrary to the laws of nature. But the miracle was not anti-natural. It was super-natural. It was the intervention of a higher law and a higher power, perhaps the same power that is hidden in the exercise of the providence of God today.

We today believe in God, His Word, and His power. It is "alive and active" (Hebrews 4:12).

Self-Will

Are you a self-willed person? Some people think they are being scripturally steadfast when in reality they are simply being self-willed! To be self-willed means to be dominated by one's own interests, to arrogantly assert one's own will. The Bible speaks frequently of those who are self-willed and has nothing commendable about them! The Bible indictment against self-will ought to be considered by those who preach the gospel of positive thinking! Much of their philosophy revolves around the idea that what "I" want is what ought to be the norm.

There were people even in Old Testament times who thought that their will should supercede even that of God Himself. This is the height of self-will. "This evil people, which refuse to hear my words, which walk in the imagination of their heart, and walk after other gods to serve them, and to worship them, shall even be as this girdle, which is good for nothing" (Jer. 13:10) In the next verse, God called upon them to be His glorious people, but "they would not hear" (verse 11). There is a vast difference in "can't hear" and "won't hear"!! Earlier in his book, Jeremiah called the people to the way of rest and peace, "But they said, We will not walk therein" (Jer. 6:16). WE WILL NOT WALK THEREIN. How fatal those words were! And they are as fatal today as when first uttered.

Those to whom Jesus spoke were self-willed. One could not find a more pathetic cry than that which Jesus prayed for His beloved and "holy" city. "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, thou that killest the prophets, and stonest them which are sent unto thee, how often would I have gathered thy children together, even as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, AND YE WOULD NOT!" (Matt. 23:37). The ultimate fate of that city was terrible: "Behold, your house is left unto you desolate" (verse 38). Think of all those years in the past when God called unto His Old Testament people for them to repent and turn to Him, yet they would not! Think of those who, in the days of Ezra and Nehemiah, chose their captive lands rather than the return of their divinely given land! They simply "would not" hearken to God. How tragic!

God said he had stretched out His hands "all the day" to a rebellious people (Isa. 65:2). Paul shows that because of their self-will, they continue in their unbelief and are lost (Rom. 10:21). No matter what God has done, they refused Him. Has the world today done better?



The Anger of Jehovah

"The Lord was angry with Solomon." (I Kings 11:9)

No more tragic statement can be found to describe Solomon's relationship to God in the closing days of his life than, "The Lord was angry with Solomon." It is a revelation of the anger of God which we do well to ponder. The reasons for it are found in the story of Solomon in the eleventh chapter of First Kings. In this chapter we have the account of Solomon's degeneracy and doom. The nature of this great man had a strong, evil side. His commercial enterprises led him into alliance with surrounding nations, and following Oriental custom, he allowed his heart to go after strange women. The wrong thus began to invade higher realms, and he built temples for these women. Inevitable there followed the demoralization of king and people, until at last, "Jehovah was angry with Solomon."

It is indeed a tragedy that the man who had built the Temple and in priestly dignity had presided over its dedication, crying to God for his abiding presence, should, seduced by the lower side of his nature, turn from his loyalty to Jehovah and break the covenant. One of the most promising characters in the Bible and the wisest mere man that ever lived had no more stability of character and intelligence of mind than to go awhoring after other gods.

The anger of Jehovah was not merely passive. "Jehovah raised up an adversary unto Solomon, Hadad the Edomite" (v. 14). "God raised up another adversary unto him, Rezon the son of Eliada" (v. 23) "And Jeroboam . . . he also lifted up his hand against the king" (v. 26). All this was Divine judgement, and yet it was but the natural outworking of the evil heart which had possessed the king. David had learned that one cannot sin and get by without repentance. Now the lesson was to be learned again. The kingdom was to be rent for the hand of Solomon, and though it was not done until after his death because of his father's sake, it was accomplished because the "Lord was angry with Solomon." His was a life of promise, but it ended in failure and gloom, because his heart was turned from loyalty to God, in response to the seductions of his sensual nature.

The whole story of King Solomon is full of the most solemn value. May we be careful to *maintain loyalty to Jehovah* and not be led away from him through our sensual desires. The sinner will receive his due and it is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God.



Responses

Again, last week we neglected to report the responses during the previous week. We rejoice that Melinda Martin was baptized into Christ and Mark Martin and Eva Henderson requested prayers to be restored to faithfulness to our Lord. Please pray for these.

"DO YOU REALLY WANT TO GO TO HEAVEN?"

You may be thinking, "What a strange question to ask of those of us who are assembled here on this first day of the week to worship and praise God. Our presence demonstrates our attitude toward and interest in going to heaven." But, do you know that the Lord said more people will miss heaven than will go there (Matthew 7:13,14). How tragic, because there is no reason for any to be lost seeing that God desires for all men to be saved and through the death of Jesus made provisions for the debt to be paid and full satisfaction given (I Timothy 2:4; II Peter 3:9; John 1:29; 3:16; Romans 5:8-1 1). The simple yet sobering truth is that the only thing that will keep us from going to heaven is a lack of desire on our part. The following points will help us determine whether or not we really want to go to heaven.

First, we must be willing to <u>LEARN</u> ABOUT HEAVEN. To <u>learn</u> means, "to gain knowledge or understanding." Let me remind you that God desires "all men to be saved and to come too knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:4). Though God has extended His grace toward all men that they might be taught how to live properly in this life and thus inherit an eternal home, many don't have a willingness to learn (*Titus 2:11,12; I Peter 1:3,4; John 14:1-3,6*). Are you willing to learn more about heaven?

Secondly, we must YEARN FOR HEAVEN. To yearn is "to desire, to long persistently for something or someone." God has filled His book of Holy Writ with reason after reason for us to yearn for heaven. First of all, heaven is where God dwells (*Ecclesiastes 5:2; Daniel 2:28; Matthew 5:45; 6:9*). Add to that knowledge the assurance that Christ our Savior now sits at the right hand of the heavenly Father (*Mark 16: 19; Acts 2:33; 5:31; 7:55; Colossians3: 1*). To further deepen our yearning for heaven, the Lord promised to prepare us a place in His Father's house and to come back to take us there (*John 14:1-3*). Do you have a deep seeded yearning in your heart for heaven?

Thirdly, we must <u>TURN</u> TOWARD HEAVEN. To <u>turn</u> means, "to change course or direction." The Bible word describing this action is <u>repentance</u>. Once again we start with heaven's desire for us. Peter states that the Lord is "not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance" (II Peter 3:9). Following the dictates of the world will lead to spiritual death and separation from that heavenly home while turning to the Lord will lead to life everlasting (Romans 6:23; John 6:68; 10:10; 14:6). The way to heaven is strait and narrow; we must be totally focused to find it and walk therein (Matthew 7:13,14; I John 1:7). Are you turning in heaven's direction?





A Queen Who Would Not Dance At The Ball

"Let no man despise thy youth; but be an example of the believers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity," I Timothy 4:12.

To be selected queen at a high school basketball homecoming and to lead the group in the first dance at the royal ball is the dream of many high school girls. But not so with Olivia Wolfe, a senior at Neosho (MO) High School and a member of the Hillcrest Church of Christ.

When Olivia was nominated to be queen, she had some misgivings because she knew that it was traditional for the queen to participate in the dance that followed the game. She talked with the sponsor of the activity and told the sponsor that she had religious convictions that would not allow her to participate In the dance and that if dancing were a requirement of being elected queen, she would need to refuse the nomination. The sponsor assured Olivia that if she were elected queen, she would not be required to participate in the dance in any way.

However, word soon spread that Olivia would not participate in the dance If elected queen. When a fellow student told Olivia that her parents thought it was terrible that Olivia's parents would not allow her to attend the dance, Olivia made it clear that the decision not to dance was based upon her own convictions and not upon orders from her parents.

Other students discussed whether they should vote for a queen candidate who would not be at the dance. When the ballots were cast and counted, Olivia was the successful candidate. On February 23, 1 998, Olivia Wolfe was crowned Neosho High School Homecoming Queen, and true to her conviction, she did not attend the dance.

Olivia is an outstanding example for others to follow—both young and old. She was willing to give up the honor of being queen if it required her to violate her convictions. And her experience demonstrates that it is not necessary for a person to compromise convictions and go along with the crowd in order to be popular with the crowd. She was elected queen because of the respect her peers had for her, and—no doubt—one reason her peers had respect for her was the fact that she was a young lady of conviction, someone they could admire and be proud to claim as their homecoming queen.

We salute you, Olivia, for having the courage to stand by your convictions and to be an exceptional example to us all.

The Anger of Jehovah

"The Lord was angry with Solomon." (I Kings 11:9)

No more tragic statement can be found to describe Solomon's relationship to God in the closing days of his life than, "The Lord was angry with Solomon." It is a revelation of the anger of God which we do well to ponder. The reasons for it are found in the story of Solomon in the eleventh chapter of First Kings. In this chapter we have the account of Solomon's degeneracy and doom. The nature of this great man had a strong, evil side. His commercial enterprises led him into alliance with surrounding nations, and following Oriental custom, he allowed his heart to go after strange women. The wrong thus began to invade higher realms, and he built temples for these women. Inevitable there followed the demoralization of king and people, until at last, "Jehovah was angry with Solomon."

It is indeed a tragedy that the man who had built the Temple and in priestly dignity had presided over its dedication, crying to God for his abiding presence, should, seduced by the lower side of his nature, turn from his loyalty to Jehovah and break the covenant. One of the most promising characters in the Bible and the wisest mere man that ever lived had no more stability of character and intelligence of mind than to go awhoring after other gods.

The anger of Jehovah was not merely passive. "Jehovah raised up an adversary unto Solomon, Hadad the Edomite" (v. 14). "God raised up another adversary unto him, Rezon the son of Eliada" (v. 23) "And Jeroboam . . . he also lifted up his hand against the king" (v. 26). All this was Divine judgement, and yet it was but the natural outworking of the evil heart which had possessed the king. David had learned that one cannot sin and get by without repentance. Now the lesson was to be learned again. The kingdom was to be rent for the hand of Solomon, and though it was not done until after his death because of his father's sake, it was accomplished because the "Lord was angry with Solomon." His was a life of promise, but it ended in failure and gloom, because his heart was turned from loyalty to God, in response to the seductions of his sensual nature.

The whole story of King Solomon is full of the most solemn value. May we be careful to *maintain loyalty to Jehovah* and not be led away from him through our sensual desires. The sinner will receive his due and it is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God.

Take Advantage of Every Opportunity

"As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith." Gal. 6:10

Webster defines, "opportunity" as, "Fit time; a favorable juncture of circumstances; a good chance." A similar word is the word, "opportune" and means, "Fit; ready; hence; seasonable; timely." Christians ought to be "opportunistic" people, that is, "ready" "fit" to teach the Gospel, do benelovence, restore the erring!

The Lord gave the charge to the apostles to, "Go into all the world and preach the Gospel . . ." This admonition is also given to the church today because it is the "pillar and support of the truth" (I Tim. 3:15). The church of our Lord should be busy about "sowing the Seed of the Kingdom" (Lk. 8:11), the "Word of God!"

There are two fundamental problems that confront the church today in obeying the "Great Commission." These are: 1. Too many do not look for opportunities to do "good," especially to teach one the Gospel, and 2. Too many are not "fit" or "ready" to teach if the opportunity presented itself. The "Evangelistic Thrust" is but dead in too many hearts today, and as a result the number of baptisms is down.

A word in the definition for, "opportune" was "seasonable." Paul told Timothy to, "Preach the word, be instant in SEASON out of SEASON . . ." (II Tim. 4:2). The fact of the matter is that there is no season as such to preach the Gospel but it is always SEASONAL. True, there is a time to sow and a time to reap (Ecc. 3:7). A Christian is to be both "sower" and "reaper." When Jesus exclaimed, "The harvest is truly plenteous but the labourers are few," He was teaching that there are many that will receive the "Seed" if we will but go and "sow!" (Matt. 9:37).

Isn't it sad to have THE MOST POWERFUL SEED in the world and we aren't willing to sow it! May God help us to look for the "opportunities" and then seize that moment to teach the "Wonderful Word of God!"







What's Wrong With Being Tardy

Many congregations are grappling with a widespread brotherhood problem—tardiness. A brother who serves as an usher in a church of a thousand members in another state, recently made the comment, "If we were to lock the doors at 7:00 (the worship hour), one third would be inside and two thirds would be outside." Since it appears to be such a prevalent problem, let's ask the question, "What's wrong with being tardy?"

(1) IT"S DISRUPTIVE. One teacher stated that when the bell rang, one student was in the classroom. It was not till twenty minutes later that the last of the students finally arrived. How can effective teaching take place in such a setting?

(2) IT INDICATES WRONG PRIORITIES. How many of us would be late responding to a dinner invitation to the White House? How often do we allow our children to be tardy at school? Or at ball games in which they are playing? How would it have gone over with your husband or wife for you to have been late at your wedding? Are you late to work (in which case you may be docked?) The point is, we are on time to the events or occasions which are important to us. Since corporate worship should be among the most important times of our week, shouldn't we be on time?

(3) IT IS JUST PLAIN SLOPPY. Being tardy falls in the same category with the unprepared Bible class lesson or the unfulfilled assignment. It is demoralizing to those who are on time. Being tardy is just not consistent with the urgency of discipleship under the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

Being on time cost something. In the long ago it was David who said, "I will not offer bumt offering to the Lord my God which cost me nothing" (II Sam. 24:24). It takes effort to be punctual. It was the preacher of Ecclesiastes who admonished, "Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with your might" (Ecc. 9:10). As the hymn puts it, "Give of your best to the Master." Let's all make the commitment and put forth the effort to be on time for every occasion of the work and worship of the church.







Sent From Heaven

Jesus Christ told us that there is the living God in heaven (Matt.6:1) David said this God "looked down from heaven upon the children of men..." (Psm.53:2) He is the same God who created the heaven and the earth (Gen.1:1; Acts 17:24). Some times the father will not give what his children ask or what his children want because he knows what is the best for his children and this is the same thing that God did to us; He already knows and has always known what is the best for man. James said "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning." James 1:17, KJV. Sent from heaven is sent from God, there are three things that God sent to man: Christ, the Bible, and His kingdom.

The word Christ appeared 533 times in the New Testament, this word came from the Greek word *Christos* which means "the anointed one" which was used with Prophet, Priest, and King in the Old Testament. He is the same one in John 3:16 "the only begotten son of God." Christ is God who became flesh (John 1:14). Without Him all man will lost (John 14:6) God has given all authority to Christ to judge all men in the final day (Matt.28:18) Christ said "He that rejecteth me, and receiveth not my words, hath one that judgeth him: the word that I have spoken, the same shall judge him in the last day." John 12:48, KJV.

A person needs to be on the right flight in order to arrive the right destination, and the same thing is true with the matter of salvation. Man needs to be in the right place where God has commanded (Eph. 1:7). If the church name is not important why did God put Roman 16:16 in the Bible? If the place where God's church originated is not important what do Luke 24:47 and Acts 2:1-4 mean? It will be sad when God says "depart from me" to good people and intelligent people in the last day who are lost just because they were in the wrong place where there is no God.

Are you sure that your Savior is from God? Can you prove that the message that you have will help you go to Heaven? Are you in the right place where God will save you and bless you? If what you received is not from God it came from somewhere else. God 's message is one of consistency, it will be the same and it will never change (1 Pet. 2:25) Your destiny is in your hand, you are the one who will make a choice to go to heaven or hell. Make sure that your Savior is Christ, make sure that what you receive is the Word of God, and make sure that you are in the group of people that God wants you to be in. When you are sure that you sure that you received what God sent then you receive what God send from heaven.



Nobody!

The work of the church depends on the unity of the members working together as a body.

In fact, the devil has probably won more battles through dividing than by any other method. For example, the church at Corinth was losing ground fast as a church, because they were changing the word of God to please themselves. This caused division! To stop this problem, Paul wrote: "Now I plead with you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment" (1 Corinthians 1:10).

Instead of division, Paul wanted unity! He reminded the Christians at Rome: "For as we have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function, so we, being many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another" (Romans 12:4,5). Our physical bodies are successful because there is unity among our members. Each member works in behalf of the other members. This is the way it MUST be in the church.

However, there are too many members in the church today who isolate themselves from the other members. When there is work to do, these refuse to function as a member by saying, "Let someone else do it." Or, "If it's not my way, I won't do it!" This kind of attitude eats away at the unity of the body. There is great spiritual strength when we as a body—pray, work, serve, and cooperate together.

Sometime in the past, I found a selected article (author unknown) with the title: "Nobody!" This seems to sum up the point of this article:

"Fred SOMEBODY, Thomas EVERYBODY, Pete ANYBODY, and Joe NOBODY were neighbors, but they were not like you and me. They were odd people and most difficult to understand. The way they lived was a shame.

All four belonged to the same church, but you wouldn't have enjoyed worshiping with them. EVERYBODY went fishing on Sunday or stayed home to visit friends. ANYBODY wanted to worship, but was afraid SOMEBODY wouldn't speak to him so NOBODY went to church. Really, NOBODY was the only decent one of the four. NOBODY did the visiting. NOBODY worked on the church building. Once they needed a Sunday School teacher. EVERYBODY thought ANYBODY would do it; and SOMEBODY thought EVERYBODY would teach. Guess who finally did it? That's right, NOBODY!

It happened that a fifth neighbor (an unbeliever) came to live among them. EVERYBODY thought SOMEBODY should try to win him; ANYBODY could have at least made an effort. But guess who finally won him to the Lord? That's right, NOBODY!"

The East End congregation has begun a new program called "Bible Call." You can access hundreds of topics on Bible subjects simply by calling 473-2255 or 473-CALL. This service is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. To choose a topic all one has to do is have a touch-tone phone and know the three digit code for the topic that he wants to hear. A brochure with all of the topics and their corresponding codes is available on the table in the foyer. If you want to teach your friends the gospel, you can have them call the appropriate lessons. Do You Wear The "Right Name"?

The headlines on the front page of last Sunday's "Tennessean" was: "Churches dropping 'Baptist' from names." Ray Waddle (Religion Editor) stated that churches are turning into name-droppers by dropping their denominational name. What is the purpose? "They hope to attract new worshippers who are turned off by the word "Baptist" or "Presbyterian" or other old- time church names." Waddle pointed out that in the Nashville area four Southern Baptist churches, and three other local Baptist churches had dropped their name.

What is the purpose for this dropping of names? Is it because you can't read from Genesis to Revelation about a "Baptist or Presbyterian church"? No, this has never impeded such action before. Let the "leaders" answer. They now want to be identified as "Community church." Sound familiar? When asked why this transition is occurring in Davidson and Rutherford county, the response was: "...strong attendance their churches am enjoying today would be dampened if the word "Baptist" were in the name." But, there is more. Waddle states further: "The church has several "contemporary" traits, like informal dress and a band on stage." Now, it seems to me to be very simple - entertainment (with a capital E)!

For years brethren have maintained that the churches of Christ have the right name (Rom. 16:16). However, upon closer examination one finds that the Lord's church does not have a name. It does have an identification, which shows to whom it belongs ("of" means belonging to). The church belongs to Christ; therefore it is the church of Christ (Matt. 16:18). It belongs to God (not man); therefore it is the church of God (1 Cor. 1:2). In "rank," Christ is the firstborn (Heb. 12:23). therefore it is the church of the firstborn. These are designations of the church. They identify to whom the church belongs. The Lord's church is also identified as the "temple of God" (1 Cor. 3:16); the "body of Christ" (Col. 1:24); the "household of faith" (Gal. 6:10); and sometimes simply "the church" ((Eph. 3:10). What makes the church scriptural is not a title fastened to a building, but the worshippers who live and worship according to God's will (Matt. 7:21).

If you are a member of the Lord's church (which you can read about in the New Testament) rejoice. But, we must realize our obligation to God. Our allegiance is to Christ and His word. "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God and the Father by him." (Col. 3:16-17). Not only should we be identified by the proper name of Him whose name we wear (Christ), but we must be willing to follow His divine precept in our coming together to worship God. Our worship must be "in spirit and in truth" (Jno. 4:24). Truth is according to God's word (Jno. 17:17).

The Lord's church may not grow in numbers due to our refusal to follow the "felt" needs of worshippers to be entertained However, our worship to the Lord, according to His pleasure will always be pleasing unto Him (2 Tim. 2:4). Now, is a "name" important? Yes, in two ways. First, it identifies to whom we belong. Second, it means we accept His (Christ's) authority for all we do in worship unto Him. Do you wear the "RIGHT" name?

May We Worship With Instrumental Music & "Calves"?

Several mentioned to me the article in last Sunday's Tennessean (Local News section) which read: **TEACHER QUITS LIPSCOMB OVER MUSIC DEBATE.** The subtitle read: *Minister's church uses instruments; school disapproves.* The article (written by Ray Waddle, Religion Editor) is in regard to another feature that appeared in April of this year concerning the Hendersonville "Community Church" using instrumental music in their worship on April 4th. (Easter Sunday). Five members (teachers at Goodpasture Christian School) left that church when this occurred.

Doug Vamado (a Lipscomb University Bible teacher, and a minister at the Community Church) has been compelled to resign from Lipscomb because he continues to support the use of recorded instrumental music used "periodically" as part of their Sunday worship in the Community Church. The policy at Lipscomb does not allow any teacher to be associated with a church that uses instrumental music. Steve Flatt (Lipscomb president) stated: "Our identity (D.L.U. w.l.) for the last 108 years has included a cappella, it still characterizes who we are, and Doug understood that. I don't know where Community Church is going - it's not my business. I don't run that congregation." Bro. Flatt further stated: "But I think the world of Doug Varnado."

The Community Church has now been meeting for some nine years. It began primarily from a split from the Hendersonville church. The article also states that this church "...has always positioned itself as a progressive congregation that draws worshippers from diverse spiritual backgrounds." The organizers discussed whether they should put "Church of Christ" on their sign when the church began. I have also been told (from some who have been present) this church uses a "choir" during their worship. This began by having "special singers" (a chorus) to sing between the Sunday School classes before the worship began (as was told to me by some who had been present during this time). Now (since they are a "progressive congregation") the "choir" has 'progressed' into the worship service, along with their instrumental music "periodically"!

Ron Cook (a former elder and class teacher at the church) stated: "God made music, God surrounds us with music every day. It's absurd to say we can't give music back to God" The article quoted Cook as predicting: "...the music issue in Churches of Christ will fade away once young churchgoers, awash daily in music, become church leaders." Cook further is quoted: "Instrumental music is already a part of youth events that happen at churches. Teen-agers love Christian music. Music is a fact of life. It's inevitable" (emphasis mine w.l.). Now, please observe carefully the above quote relative to God making music, and giving it back to God. To be consistent, would one agree with this statement: "God made "calves" (Gen. 1:24), and in times past commanded that such be offered for sins (Lev. 9:2), It would be "absurd" to say we can't give "calves" back to God? Would this church offer a "calf" in their worship "periodically"? Think about it?

The New Testament And Masonry

To many who are unaware, the Masonic Lodge is thought to be little more than any other civic group in our community. Masonry is known for several good works of which they are involved, such as the burn hospitals that provide care for victims free of charge. However, the truth of the matter is that Masonry is not just a civic organization but also a religion. Notice the following truths:

I. Religion Defined. Webster's dictionary defines religion as: "1. The service and adoration of God, as expressed in forms of worship...2. One of the systems of faith and worship...3. The profession or practice of religious beliefs." Masons may claim not to be a religion, yet they are clearly established upon religious principles. In a tract put out by the committee on Masonic education the following is stated: "Freemasonry is a fraternal organization, religious in character, based upon the principle of the fatherhood of God and the brotherhood of man." Concerning the Masonic system of worship the following from Masonic literature: "From the time a candidate crosses the threshold of the Lodge to the topmost degree in Masonry, the privilege and duty of prayer are urged upon him and every step is taken in a holy atmosphere of divine worship." Masons are then an organization which is established upon a system of beliefs in God and has it's own system of religious rituals and worship. These marks clearly identify Masonry as a religion unto itself.

II. The Oaths And Obligations Of Masonry. The taking of oaths and swearing by something play a very significant part in the secret organization of Masonry. In the early degrees of Masonic teaching the candidate is required to meticulously memorize and recite oaths. The following quote is taken from the Master Mason Oath: Binding myself under no less penalty than that of having my body severed in twain, my bowels taken from thence and burned to ashes, and the ashes scattered to the four winds of heaven, that no trace of remembrance may be had of so vile, and perjured a wretch as I." The Christian is taught in the Bible: Matthew 5:34-37 ... Swear not at all; neither by heaven; for it is God's throne: Nor by the earth; for it is his footstool: neither by Jerusalem; for it is the city of the great King. Neither shalt thou swear by thy head, because thou canst not make one hair white or black. But let your communication be, Yea, yea; Nay, nay: for whatsoever is more than these cometh of evil. (see also James 5:12)

II. Masonry And Salvation. Having already proven that Masonry is a religious institution unto itself, it stands to reason that Masonry would offer salvation to the faithful lodge member at the end of life. A few years ago I attended a funeral service performed by the Masonic chaplain. The Mason is given a white apron upon reaching the level of "Master Mason". A symbol of innocence and the badge of a Mason this apron is buried with the body in the belief that it is essential to receiving entrance into the "celestial lodge above." All of which is foreign to the teachings of the New Testament.

Some Closing Remarks: We are not debating the morality or good deeds of masons in this article. The subject is doctrine and the truth of the matter is that Masonry and New Testament Christianity are not compatible. The Masonic lodge, it's the oaths, the rituals it requires and its promises of heavenly reward are totally foreign to the teachings of the New Testament. The only way to heaven is through the blood of Jesus (John 14:6, Acts 22:16) and we contact that blood by obedience to the gospel (John 12:48, Acts 2:38). No other organization or lodge on this earth can save you!

"The Lies of Satan"

In the book of Genesis, following creation, the Lord showed Adam and Eve the garden of Eden. The Lord warned them saying..." Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat: But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the the day that thou eatest of thereof thou shalt surely die" (Genesis 2:16-17). THAILAND REPORT

October 4, 1999

Dear Thailand Supporters:

I first want to thank you for your prayers while I was in Thailand. This time, I was there for nearly five weeks and traveled about 4,000 miles. I love the Thai work, but it is still a long way from home, and I am thankful to be back safely with my family.

The church is growing and doing well. There were twenty-three baptisms while I was there.

Due to the generosity of a brother from West Tennessee, we were able to purchase a piece of property in Mukdahan. The plans are already drawn up for a church building, complete with classrooms, as well as a preacher's home. Mukdahan is one of the largest growing provinces in the Northeast. There are four large public schools within a mile or mile and a half of the property. We have been invited to hold an English Bible Camp in one of the schools the last of February or the first of March next year.

At the present time, one of the most pressing needs is for the replacement of an old two ton truck that is used in transporting the people back and forth to church functions in Udorn. It will cost about \$17,000 in U. S. money.

Another need is for help in the Bible Training School in Buriram. \$100 a month will take care of a student, including his books, clothes, food and lodging. There are seven students there now, and five or six young men who would like to begin right away. The course takes about three years to complete. Brother Christian Boonla does a fine job heading the school. When Bo finishes his studies at the Memphis School of Preaching in August 2000 he will be going there to teach at the Buriram school.

Again, I thank you for your prayers and for your love for God's creation in Thailand.



"Christianity & Halloween?"

Halloween has changed over the years here in America. Just few a generations ago, the holiday was primarily an evening of mischief, when teens often carried out "tricks" on neighbors and friends. I can remember my great grandfather telling me that on Halloween you always brought in your plants, lawn chairs, etc. from outside. Most folks stayed home on Halloween back in those days especially as the hours grew late. Over the years changing attitudes in communities has resulted in Halloween becoming an occasion for small children, usually in costume to go house to house for treats. The truth of the matter is that Halloween has not always been the innocent holiday for children that it is today. Consider the following...

The observances connected with Halloween are thought to have originated among the ancient Druids, who believed that on that evening, Saman, the lord of the dead, called forth hosts of evil spirits. The Druids customarily lit great fires on Halloween, apparently for the purpose of warding off all these spirits. Later the Celts also celebrated this same holiday. They believed that the spirits of the dead revisited their earthly homes on that evening. After the Romans conquered Britain, they added to Halloween features of the Roman harvest festival held on November 1 in honor of Pomona, goddess of the fruits of trees. Traces of the Roman harvest festival still survive in the of playing games involving fruit, such as ducking for apples in a tub of water. Of similar origin is the use of hollowed-out pumpkins carved to resemble grotesque faces and lit by candles placed inside.

Halloween has everything to do with fear and death: witches, ghosts, skulls, tombstones, graveyards, and nothing to do with life. Jesus is just the opposite. He came to give us life (Jn.14:6), to free us from our fears (Lk.1:74), knowing that He overcame death (Jn.10:17-18), and that we through Him might conquer every enemy of unrighteousness (Rev.2:10).

As Christians, we need to be very careful about such matters. We do not want to give a place of honor to the devil or to evil in this world. Parents should give careful attention to what costumes your children wear. Remember we are to be followers of righteousness each and every day God gives us life here on this earth.

WHAT ABOUT SOCIAL DRINKING?

The practice of drinking beverage alcohol has existed for thousands of years. Today, the alcohol industry is a multi-million dollar one. Beverage alcohol is available in hundreds of different forms, in varying degrees of potency. Millions of dollars are spent yearly in advertising these products.

As Christians who must live in the world, but not of the world, we must be aware of what God's will is regarding alcohol. For many years, not only members of the Lord's church, but also religious people in general have understood the drinking of alcohol in any quantity to be sinful. But that attitude is changing. Many in the Lord's church believe there is nothing wrong with so-called "social" drinking. But such is not true. The only Scriptural grounds for drinking beverage alcohol is found in 1 Timothy 5:23, but the purpose of Paul's instruction to Timothy is not for pleasure, but for the medicinal qualities of the wine. Scripture condemns the recreational use of beverage alcohol in any amount.

- 1. It is wrong because the Bible condemns drunkenness (Rom. 13:13; 1 Cor. 6:9-10; Gal. 5: 19-21). Advocates of "social" drinking often claim that since the Bible condemns being drunk, then one may drink as long as he does not become drunk. But the question must be asked, at what point is a person considered to be drunk? Is it when he has passed out from the alcohol? Is it when his coordination is hindered? Is it when his speech is slurred? Is it when he has had just enough to start "feeling good?" How "drunk" must one be in order to violate the command against drunkenness? Drunkenness is not a state that one enters suddenly. It is a gradual process that begins with the first drink. The following question should settle the matter about drunkenness: When one takes one drink, is he more "drunk" or less "drunk" than he was before he drank? Obviously he is more drunk. Drinking one drink puts one in violation of God's command against drunkenness.
- 2. It is wrong because the Bible commands self control (Gal. 5:22-23; 1 Pet. 1:6). A Christian must be in control of his passions and desires at all times. Overcoming temptation requires this. But alcohol breaks down one's inhibitions. It causes him to lose his self control. And it does not take a large quantity of alcohol to do this. Studies have shown that the higher functions of the brain (such as reasoning, judgment, and social restraint) are the first to be affected by alcohol, and this begins with the first drink. The "social" drinker needs to ask himself this question: Can a Christian, who has been commanded by Christ to exercise self control, willfully drink something that he knows will impair his ability to be self controlled, and be pleasing to God?
- 3. It is wrong because the Bible commands soberness (1 Thess. 5:5-8; 1 Pet. 1:13; 4:7; 5:8). It is true that when the Bible commands soberness it is speaking of watchfulness and sound-mindedness, and not necessarily of freedom from intoxicants. But it is interesting that one of the words the Bible uses (nepho), which is translated as "sober," according to Vine literally means "to be free from the influence of intoxicants." It is also interesting to study in 1 Thessalonians 5:5-8, the contrasts Paul makes: light and darkness, day and night, watchfulness and sleep, soberness (nepho) and drunkenness. Yes the force of the command is that the Christian is to be watchful and soundminded. But can a Christian truly be sober, even in the metaphorical use of the word, when he is under alcohol's dulling influence? Can he be watchful and vigilant and in his own right mind?
- 4. It is wrong because the Bible commands us to be separate from the world (Rom. 12:1-2; Eph. 5:17; 1 John 2:15-17). There is no doubt that drunkenness is of the world, an unfruitful work of darkness. There is also no doubt that one cannot be drunk if he does not drink. How then can a Christian even think of dabbling with something that will cause his soul to be lost? Is the Christian truly having "no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness" if he has "a little drink" now and then? Most certainly not.

Drinking beverage alcohol in any amount is wrong. Christians must have no part of it, no matter what the world may say. But if any still doubt the danger of it, answer this question: Is your soul worth it?



There are some things that are immediately apparent about this incident. First, I was careless and did not take the time to verify my information. Second, one often does not realize how far-reaching his actions or words may go. Third, people are often very quick to believe any "authority" is correct without any further corroboration. In other words, if it is in print, it must be true. The above makes me shudder when I think about the spiritual implications.

The truth is, if I with the best of intentions deceived and misinformed good and honest people on such a small issue as to when the time changes, how much more important is it that I be correct when I speak on spiritual matters? Carelessness on my part is inexcusable. This drives on the seriousness of the biblical admonitions. "My brethren, let not many of you become teachers, knowing that we shall receive a stricter judgment." James 3:1, NKJV. "Whoever guards his mouth and tongue keeps his soul from troubles." Proverbs 21:23, NKJV. The Bible is so clear that one must teach Truth. "If anyone speaks, let him speak as the oracles of God...." 1 Peter 4:11, NKJV. "Take heed to yourself and to the doctrine. Continue in them, for in doing this you will save both yourself and those who hear you." 1 Timothy 4:16, NKJV. Though I realized my mistake by Wednesday night and made a correction in the class there were still people who did not get the correction. What about the teaching of error in the pulpit or in a class?

There is another great truth that must also be acknowledged, all men must be checked for the veracity of what they teach. Even the Apostle Paul, though inspired, was checked by the noble Bereans. 



Behave Yourself!

In today's society people often present the benefits of being popular and being respected as diametrically opposed. Popular thinking would also have us believe that morality must be sacrificed completely in order for people in the world to like us. Although it is certainly true that darkness hates light, it does not follow that God's people are therefore totally unlikable! First Samuel 18:5 provides a wonderful example for us when the inspired writer records, "And David went out whithersoever Saul sent him, and behaved himself wisely: and Saul set him over the men of war, and he was accepted in the sight of all the people, and also in the sight of Saul's servants." At this time Saul had already decided that David was a threat, and his plans to keep David from becoming king were well known to David as well as many other people. However, the most important point to learn is not from the attitude that Saul displayed but from the attitude exhibited by David toward Saul.

David did not let the attitude that dominated Saul's life change the way that he knew he ought to behave toward him. All too often we react quite differently when we are presented with similar situations. Saul's actions were plainly wrong, but this did not justify a change in David's behavior. David showed himself to be wise in his behavior because he did not let the actions of others cause him to be unfaithful to God. When we lash out without thinking or let our emotions control our lives-instead of controlling our emotions as we should, we have left God's plan for our lives out of the picture. David behaved himself in such a way as to convince the people around him, including those who were under Saul's direction, that he was not at fault. Many times we may make the mistake of assuming that people are going to believe the best of us regardless of our behavior. This cannot be further from the truth. We ought to follow David's example and live in a way that will demonstrate to people that we are not at fault and that we want to please God in spite of the circumstances.

David was under great stress, yet the Holy Spirit inspired the writer to record this statement concerning him. We should learn from David that our lives are open to the scrutiny of all and that only by living righteously will people ever learn the truth. Do not leave room for questions about your life. Answer them by living a Christian life that is an open book to the world. David was persecuted, but remained faithful to his ruler. David was slandered, but he did not lash out. David's life was put into question, but the people believed what they saw instead of what they heard. The problem many are having today with such actions has come about because they are well aware that what people have seen will confirm the report instead of showing its error. Be prepared. Some people will believe the worst about others no matter what. But let us live our lives so that we can withstand any attack and so that God will be glorified (Galatians 2:20; 1 Peter 2:21-25).

Marks Of Maturity

by V. Glenn McCoy

It is a tragedy when a person grows up physically but remains an infant mentally. We have all been saddened to see men of mature physical stature talking, acting, and playing as if they were of a much younger age.

These cases are indeed sad, but in view of eternity, there is something which must be much sadder to God. I am thinking of the person who grows up physically and mentally, and yet remains an infant spiritually. This is a spiritual abnormality and is cause for serious alarm.

The New Testament has much to say about infancy and maturity. One of Paul's great fears was that Christians might remain infants when the time for maturity had come. His letters are filled with exhortations to prevent that very thing. One of the words used in the New Testament to denote maturity is the Greek word "TELEIOS." In the KJV it is often translated "perfect." In some versions it is translated "mature." The meaning of the word is "mature, full grown." It is used as the opposite of infant, immature, or untaught. Adam Clarke says this word "TELEIOS" is used to signify an adult Christian, one thoroughly instructed in the doctrines of the Gospel." The only way that we can measure spiritual maturity is to use the standard set forth in the New Testament. Let's observe a few places where the word "TELEIOS" is used and notice what characteristics a mature Christian should have. I have capitalized the word translated from "TELEIOS."

1. WE WILL BE ABLE TO EAT SOLID SPIRITUAL FOOD.

1 Cor. 14:20 says, "Brethren, do not be children in your thinking: yet in evil be babes, but in your thinking be MATURE." In many ways these Corinthians were behaving as little children, and while they were to be childlike in attitude, free from malice, they were to discard their childish actions and act like full grown men whose understanding is mature. Paul used the same word in 1 Cor. 2:6 when he said, "We do speak wisdom among those who are MATURE." In Heb. 5:14 the same word is used. "But solid food is for the MATURE." Some today, like the Hebrews, have been members of the church long enough to be mature and able to partake of solid food but they still desire only the milk.

2. WE WILL BE ABLE TO DISCERN GOOD FROM EVIL.

Heb. 5:14 further states, "But solid food is for the MATURE, who because of practice have their senses trained to discern good and evil." Paul prayed for the Philippians that their love might abound more and more in knowledge in order that they might be able to approve what is excellent. This suggests that the ability to distinguish clearly the right from the wrong is a mark of maturity. The knowledge possessed by the mature person enables him to detect error when he hears it. The one who is still an infant spiritually will likely not have this ability.

3. WE WILL BE UNSHAKEN BY FALSE TEACHERS.

Eph. 4:13,14 "Until we all attain to the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a MATURE man, to the measure of the stature which belongs to the fullness of Christ. As a result, we are no longer to be children, tossed here and there by waves, and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, by craftiness in deceitful scheming." Mature men spiritually are men of conviction. They believe the gospel and their hearts are fixed and set. They are not wavering, vacillating, compromising characters who can be moved by every breeze that blows. They are not men of indecision, fickleness, and timidity, but they "know whom they have believed" and they are rooted and grounded in the faith of the gospel. Brother Raymond Kelcy describes those who lack spiritual maturity in this way. "Some are like ships that have many sails but no anchors. They move constantly and swiftly and they do nothing but move."

4. WE WILL BE ABLE TO CONTROL OUR TONGUES:

For the next usage of the word translated from the Greek 'TELEIOS," we go to James 3:2. "For we all stumble in many ways. If any one does not stumble in what he says, he is a perfect man, able to bridle the whole body as well." The Christian who is able to control his tongue is no longer a babe, but an adult spiritually. If he can bring his tongue under control he can also control his hands, feet, and even his entire body. In his letter James admonishes the mature use of the tongue by saying, "Swear not" (5:12), "Lie not against the truth" (2:14), "Speak not evil one of another" (3:11). We show our immaturity as Christians when we use the tongue to swear, lie, gossip, or to cut others to pieces with our sharp and hateful words. The mature Christian controls his speech.

There are many other characteristics of the MATURE Christian in the New Testament, but even in this short list we see the importance of growing in Christ. We must never be satisfied to remain spiritual infants.





200 Pianos

An elderly man who had led singing for many years in small country congregations went to the big city to visit family. While there, he had the chance to lead a group of about 350 on Sunday morning. Later that day as they ate lunch, his nephew asked him what it looked like from the pulpit with all those people out there. He replied, "Son, I saw 200 pianos." The elderly song leader went on to explain how disappointing it was to see all those people not singing.

While most members of the church would still protest the use of a piano, many violate the same law of God by stoically warming a pew with tightly clenched lips while the praises of God are being sung. Many members will turn to Eph. 5:18,19 and Col. 3:16,17 to show Bible authority for singing. The addition of mechanical instruments in worship to God is then condemned, citing the lack of authority for such. While these things are true and must always be taught "lest they slip", we MUST realize that these same passages COMMAND singing in worship to God. Anyone capable of "making a joyful noise" who fails to do so is committing sin and is in violation of God's pattern just like a person who adds the piano.

Brethren, we must understand that ALL of God's commands MUST be obeyed. When we refuse to obey the command to sing because we feel uncomfortable or self-conscious, we place our own pride above the will of God. When one chooses to add the instrument in worship to God he places his own judgment and will, above the will of God. Both are sin.

I implore you brethren to consider these things and resolve yourself to submit to all of God's laws. Until we do, song leaders across our land will continue to see 200 PIANOS in the assemblies of the Lord's people.
