"Crumbs Will Do"

Recently, my wife and I stopped at a local fast-food restaurant for hamburgers. As we ate in their outside eating area, I noticed that a beautiful blackbird, having midnight black body feathers, coal black tail, and wing feathers, landed in the empty space beside our car. Standing very patiently, I knew that all he wanted was for me just to toss him a piece of bread from my hamburger. He would look at me as if to beg for just one small piece. As I began to look at him more closely, I noticed that in all his God-created beauty, he was physically flawed. This species of bird normally has three toes that are spread evenly on the ground to give them balance. This particular bird, however, only had one foot to place on the ground. The other foot was deformed and turned back so that he walked on the joint where the foot and leg connects. As I watched, the beauty of this bird really stood out as dull colored grackles begin to land, and then some aggressive pigeons appeared. None of these birds, however, could draw my attention from the blackbird. He was struggling to stand steady as a strong wind blew. Yet, with great effort he never gave in to the wind but stood firm on his one good foot. The strength, courage, and dedication of this deformed bird really touched my heart. As he was standing there on one foot, not even indicating that he was so much as even thinking about giving in to his surroundings, it almost brought tears to my eyes as I thought about his dedication to life, how he stood tall among the other birds, and how he never gave up on what he wanted. But patiently he waited, just hoping for one small morsel of bread.

Everyday I see one and usually more than one of God's creatures standing on the street corners in the city where I live, "desiring to be fed with the crumbs which fall from the rich man's table" (Luke 16:21). As the blackbird, for them just "crumbs will do." I wonder why my emotions are not touched by these precious souls, who are created in God's image (Genesis 1:27), as much as by the blackbird that I observed at the fast-food restaurant. Instead of tossing them a "crumb", however, I try to judge them by thinking, "If that person really wanted money he could work. Why should I give him my hard-earned money for which I work 10 hours a day for?" Then I think, "Could he really work, or was he like the deformed blackbird only I could not see it?" Was he having as much trouble standing in the challenging "winds" (problems) of life as the blackbird? Was I missing the inward beauty of this person, or was I just not looking for the beauty, but only "seeing" the deformity?

All of this caused me to seriously think about the parable of Lazarus and the rich man in Luke 16:19-31. The text tells us that this beggar "was laid" (literally, "was thrown") or cast carelessly down by his bearers and left there. This beggar obviously suffered some physical malady which did not allow him to walk. The text also indicates that Lazarus was not fed from the crumbs, but only "desired" to be fed from the crumbs which fell from the rich man's table (Luke 16:21) Yet, the rich man could only see the undesirability of the man rather than the man's need. Perhaps our lives would be more spiritually blessed, fulfilling, and enriched if we were better able to "see" the physical and spiritual needs of our fellow man rather than the "deformities" in their lives and at least be willing to feed them the "crumbs" which fall from our table.

Sunday's high noon sounds the gun for the Indianapolis 500 to the local restaurants; beating the Baptists to the drumstick has become a sporting event.

One brother said, "When the sermon goes overtime, I turn it off." Rest assured he never said that about his favorite television program. One can easily discern Sunday's time of day by taking note of the activity in the pew. Proceeding past the "allotted time" is like scraping the top of an ant bed. Overtime is no man's land where preachers void of stout hearts fear to tread.

Castles In The Sand

A few years ago I saw a special news film showing a couple that had made a great castle on the seashore out of sand. It spread out several feet, and was truly a masterpiece of art. In that same film, they showed a tidal wave that rolled across the castle turning it into a pile of sand.

This reminded me of those who live their lives without God. They put all their skills into winning fortune and fame, but one day the tidal wave of death makes its sweep and they must face eternity without God.

The God of heaven has made it possible through the sacrifice of His beloved Son, to build our lives on a rock. When we build upon Jesus as the Rock of Ages, there is no tidal wave big enough and powerful enough to destroy. Even the most powerful wave of all (death) is helpless.

Because of David's relationship to God, he could sing: "Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me" (Ps. 23:4). In the Christian age in which we are living today, the proper relationship to Christ gives us this same assurance. Therefore, the faithful Christian can sing: "On Christ the solid rock I stand, all other ground is sinking sand." Some may inquire, "How does one build his life on Jesus as the Rock?" Millions miss the way by feeling that it is enough simply to learn of Jesus and to believe that He is the Christ. This certainly is very important, but it must not stop here. When Jesus delivered His sermon on the mount, He closed it by giving the following warning: "But everyone who hears these sayings of Mine, and does not do them, will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand: "and the rain descended, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house; and it fell. And great was its fall"" (Mt. 7:26, 27).

In the verse before, He described a wise builder who built upon a rock, as one who hears and does. Thus, to build upon Christ as a rock, one must DO what Jesus taught. Before giving these illustrations, Jesus said, "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven" (Mt. 7:21).

Would you take a moment and ask about your life? Are you building a castle of sand that will NOT withstand eternity, or, on Jesus the Rock that will stand forever?

"Busy Here and There"

A study of 1 Kings will lead one to examine the wickedness of Ahab, and also to see the real power behind

him, that wicked and idolatrous Jezebel. These two had a real, powerful and spiritual adversary in God's servant, Elijah. There were other men of the prophets whom God used in bringing Ahab to the end his behavior demanded.

In a second period of conflict with the Syrians, God had promised to deliver them into the hands of Israel. God's people were greatly victorious, and the Syrian king then made a plea for the sparing of his life, and Ahab, calling him a "brother," spared him. God's words of rebuke were brought to Ahab in the form of a story wherein a man charged with keeping a prisoner safe, allowed him to escape. Ahab responded to the story in the enforcing of the penalty upon the guard; whereupon, the point turned against Ahab, who had the Syrian

king in his grasp and let him live. Of importance to us just here is the point, in the story, that the man on guard allowed his prisoner to escape because "I was busy here and there" (1 Kings 20:40).

"I was busy here and there" has other forms: "This and that" "taking care of things" "seeing to business" "getting straightened out", etc. It all boils down to failing to put the things of God first in our lives (Matthew 6:33). Those who do visitation and personal work every often will hear this given as a reason for non-attendance, non-participation: "Well, we've been so busy, we're going to do better as soon as we get straightened out." BUSY HERE AND THERE, AND LETTING THE THINGS OF GOD BE IGNORED.

It so happens that our times are such that anyone can "be busy here and there" and with "this and that," and never find time for God's things! Time is there on the calendar and on the clock, but it is MADE for God! I'll have time for no spiritual thing unless I MAKE IT! Let's plan to not lose our souls because we were "busy here and there!"

"Other" Crucifixions

Speak of crucifixion, and we immediately have our minds on the death of our Lord, and that's as it should be. However, the New Testament speaks of some "other" crucifixions. In our obedience to the gospel, the old man of sin, now dying, is said to be "crucified" (Romans 6:6). One who turns from the truth, and now is in the hardening processes of sin is said to be "crucifying the Son of God afresh" (Hebrews 6:6). But we especially now speak of Galatians 6:14, where Paul refers to the proper place of glorying, and in focusing on the Christ, he says, "By whom the world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world." Two "crucifixions" here: The world is crucified to the child of God is crucified unto the world.

In Romans 6:11, the apostle sets forth a mark in attitude that should now possess the Christian: Dead unto sin, but alive unto God. This is the idea in Galatians 6:14. Now, in obedience to God, the death taken place in obedience is a death "to the world," and its appeals, lusts, enticements. The Christian will not now let the world attract him. The Christian does not now live in that sphere! Indeed, the command now is this: "If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above....set your affections on things above, not on things on the earth" (Colossians 3:1, 2). The command is there, but the action must be taken by the individual, for there is no automatic work going on here. In fact, all of Christian living and Christian attitude involves the individual at work!

Are You Balanced?

Balance, Balance, Balance. Almost everywhere we turn we hear about the importance of balance. My wife says eat a balanced meal. My mechanic says to balance those tires. My banker says to balance that check book. My sons and their coaches stress a balanced attack. My brethren request balanced preaching. Balance is important. It's necessary. Without it we are not nearly as successful, healthy, safe, or prudent. Without balance we end up teetering on an extreme and leaning toward disaster. Nowhere, however, are the results of balance more seriously addressed than in 1 Timothy 4:16. Here the apostle Paul told Timothy, a young evangelist, to fix attention upon himself and his doctrine for in so doing Timothy would save both himself and those that would listen to him.

A proper balance between both doctrine and Christian living are essential for not only an evangelist, but for all that would name the name of Christ. It is not enough to just pray, worship regularly, visit the sick, or give to the poor.Attention must also be given to right doctrine about Christ (2 John v.9), the gospel (Galatians 1:8), marriage, the eating of meats (1 Timothy 4:1f), the resurrection (2 Timothy 2:16f), worship (Matthew 15:3) etc... If we profess to be a disciple of Christ, then we must continue in the word of Christ (John 8:31). If we teach for doctrine the commandments of men, then are we not imbalanced and unacceptable in the sight of God (Mark 7:6f)? Likewise, are we not imbalanced if we profess fidelity in doctrine yet lead lives that are full of extortion, adultery, lying, cruelty, drunkenness, slothfulness, gossip, hatred, and ill will (Galatians 5:19f)? Are we not dangling precariously if our speech is impure, we neglect our family, and our love is for money? Are we not teetering on the brink of disaster if we fail to visit the sick, feed the hungry, and take in the stranger (Matthew 25)? Indeed, both right doctrine and right living are demanded of those seeking to follow Jesus.





The "D" Generation

First it was the "baby boomers" (1942-53). Then came "Generation Jones" (1954-65). Next in line was "Generation X" (1966-77) followed by "Generation Y" (1978-1998). The question now is, *"To what shall I liken this generation" (Matthew 11:16)?*

I think I know. We are now living in the "D" generation. The prophet Isaiah knew this generation all too well. "Therefore the Lord said: 'Inasmuch as these people draw near with their mouths and honor Me with their lips, but have removed their hearts far from Me, and their fear toward Me is taught by the commandment of men'" (Is. 29:13).

What had occurred in Isaiah's time is alive once again. True religion had degenerated into ritualism. God's people looked the part. They came to worship. They offered sacrifices. They observed the feasts. But their hearts were not in it! I see the same things in many people each week. The church has become "consumer friendly." Programs have replaced Bible studies. Many people feel the church is lucky to have them on Sunday morning if at all. And if we don't meet the "needs" of the individual, the individual will find a group who will.

My friend, please understand what true religion is! Jesus said that the greatest commandment was to love the Lord your God with ALL your heart, soul, mind, and strength (Matthew 22:37). If we look at what the Bible is telling the church, we will see that our worship is a heart issue. We have obeyed from the heart (Romans 16:17). Therefore we should be worshipping with our hearts (Ephesians 5:19).

If our hearts are involved, attending the services of the church won't be a question, but a privilege. We will not be looking for a church that meets our needs, but we will seek to please God and meet the needs of others. We will not go through the motions of worship, but we will give our hearts to God in humility and praise His name each time we approach His throne.

I don't want to be part of the "D" generation. I want to be a part of a people who will turn the world upside down. I want to be a part of a people who will change the hearts of men. I want to be a part of a people who will be *"the church of the living God, the pillar and ground of the truth" (1 Timothy 3:15).*

Being Successful

Recently while flying on board an airplane, I ran across an advertisement in one of the magazines provided by the airlines. The ad was for a life insurance company and had a photograph of a boy standing near a chalkboard with the handwritten phrase "Treat others the way you want to be treated". The company who placed the advertisement had purported that the principle revealed in this slogan had helped to make their one hundred year old company what it is today. Indeed it is a great slogan to live by. I am certain that any company who follows that principle will have a higher likelihood of being successful. For that matter, any club, church, team, relationship, etc... will most certainly be successful and well thought of if this principle is genuinely applied. I wonder, however, if the company running the ad knew that the phrase came from the Bible?

It was Jesus of Nazareth who said, "Do unto others what you would have them do unto you" (Matthew 7:12). Six hundred years earlier Confucius said, "Don't do unto others what you don't want them to do unto you." While the phrases are similar, they are not the same. The former promotes and requires involvement, activity, and concern for our fellow man. The latter, while noteworthy, fails to have the same societal and familial impact. It is a message of inactivity. Jesus said, "Do unto others."

Like with so many things, Jesus has taken humanity to a higher level. Doing unto others what we want them to do unto us has made the world a better place. Reaching out to the needy, speaking a word of encouragement, holding the door for someone, visiting the infirmed, helping a neighbor, and comforting the bereaved are some things that most people would want done to them if they were needy, sick, infirmed, or bereaved. While these may seem obvious to most, the principle of doing unto others must also be carried into our homes, schools, and politics. Let us talk to each other with kindness. Let us give a listening ear to those with whom we disagree. Let us love our enemies and let us pray for those that persecute us (Matt. 5:44). If we are willing to do unto others what we would want them to do unto us, we can cause even our enemies to glorify God at the coming of His Son Jesus Christ (1 Peter 2:12). If indeed this becomes our motto, in God's eyes we will be successful, and His is the only approval that will ultimately count.





The Sky Isn't Falling

Last weekend, I had the opportunity to attend a presentation on the campus of Freed-Hardeman University. The Christian Higher Education Foundation, representing colleges and universities affiliated with Churches of Christ, commissioned Dr. Flavil Yeakley to study the post-high school years of our young people related to their spiritual growth. (Dr. Yeakley's presentation, along with his PowerPoint slides will be made available for download on Freed-Hardeman's website in the near future).

Dr.Yeakley presented several interesting facts that I wish to share with you. Not only did he share information about our young people, but about churches of Christ in general. Here are some of the statistics that he shared:

- Churches of Christ constitute the 12th largest religious group in America.
- · Churches of Christ are the 6th fastest growing church in America.
- Churches of Christ rank 4th in the nation in total number of congregations.
- Churches of Christ rank 5th in the nation in number of counties in which there is a congregation.
- Churches of Christ rank 1st in the nation in distribution of congregations.
- · Churches of Christ rank 1st in the nation in weekly attendance among its membership.

That's a far cry from the gloom and doom propaganda that some have been preaching. So much for the talk that we must embrace certain innovations if we want to grow and be remain relevant.

Another interesting tid-bit from Dr.Yeakley's research was that the greatest retention rate of young people following graduation from high school comes from congregations who are described as "middle of the road," whereas the worst retention rate of young people comes from congregations who are described as "much more liberal."

Friends, while we certainly have room for improvement, these statistics prove that we're doing some things right. While we need to be warned and sometimes criticized, we also need to be encouraged, strengthened, and patted on the back. Take a child from the time he is old enough to understand words, and give him constant criticism. Tell him how he is no good, and how other children are better than him. Tell him that he is worthless, and that he has not and cannot achieve anything worthwhile. What impact do you think this would have on the self-image and productivity of that child?

Likewise, take a church, and for an extended period of time, do nothing but criticize it. Tell it how it is no good. Tell it how other "churches" are better than it. Tell it that it is irrelevant, legalistic, and graceless. Tell it that it cannot achieve anything worthwhile. Now what kind of impact do you think this would have on the self-image and productivity of that church? I would suggest the same.

These statistics aren't given so that you will have something about which to brag, but rather are given to encourage you to "keep your hand to the plow" and help you to realize that you are making a positive impact in the world.





Canceling Church

Dan Williams tells the story of two preachers who were visiting over a cup of coffee. The first preacher said to the second, "I cancelled our Sunday night services about five months ago." "You did?" the second preacher replied, "What do your church members think?" The first preacher said, "I suspect they'll be pretty upset if they ever find out about it."

The meeting times for worship, study, and edification are not meant to be arbitrary requirements that test the spiritual discipline and commitment level of Christians. Rather, these opportunities are intended to be functional; to encourage, inform, and strengthen those who are trying to walk worthily in an ungodly world.

Why is it that some people will say with exasperation, "Oh no, we have church services tonight, and I've had such a bad week," instead of saying, "Wow I'm thankful it's Wednesday night and we have church services tonight because I've had a bad week?"

The difference in the two is the difference between "form" and "function." If one views church services simply as a "form" that must be checked off our "to-do list," he will see that assembly differently than the one who acknowledges the "function" and purpose of the assembly.

Maybe church members need to re-evaluate the way they view these assemblies; and see them not as an arbitrary requirement, but as an opportunity. And maybe church leaders need to re-evaluate function of these assemblies to insure that the assemblies fulfill their intended purpose.





From Tyler's Desk:

Beware of Dogs!

Have you ever been out jogging, or just walking down the street, and suddenly, some huge dog, with big sharp teeth starts running after you as fast as it can. Scary huh?

Now imagine you were out walking one evening, and suddenly a huge pack of say 10 or 12 dogs started chasing after you. Big dogs. Mean dogs. Hungry dogs, who are clearly letting you know that you're not welcome in their territory. For most of us, if we found ourselves in such a situation, we would be terrified, looking for the quickest way to find shelter, and get away from those dogs.

Psalm 59 was written by David when his house was surrounded by men sent by King Saul; men looking for David to kill him (I Samuel 19:11-17). In this Psalm, David compares his situation to being surrounded by wild dogs. He says in verses 14-15, "Each evening they come back, howling like dogs and prowling about the city. They wander about for food and growl if they do

not get their fill."

David was constantly on the run from King Saul. As soon as he would escape from Saul's men, they would be right back, ready to kill him again. These dogs kept coming back "each evening". They were loud. They were terrifying. David knew his life was in danger. They were hungry for David's life, and would "growl" if they did not get what they wanted.

In the Old Testament, salvation had more of a physical meaning. David's life was physically being threatened. However, for us in New Testament times, our enemies from which we need deliverance are those of sin and spiritual death.

Isn't it true that sometimes it seems like Satan likes to keep throwing temptations at us. "Each evening they come back, howling like dogs". Like dogs, temptations seem to surround us. Temptations seem to howl at us, and tell us that they won't shut up until they "get their fill".

David escaped from these "dogs" by making God his fortress (verses 9, 17). Although David says he was surrounded by dogs each evening, he says "But I will sing of your strength; I will sing aloud of your steadfast love in the morning" (vs.16).

When we are surrounded by dogs, we should seek our refuge in God as our fortress. Then, once the morning comes, and the dogs are gone, we too can sing of God's strength and steadfast love.



From Tyler's Desk:

That's Amazing!

When Jesus was only 12 years old, when Jesus was in the temple, the teachers were "amazed at his understanding and answers (Luke 2:47). While Jesus was teaching in the Capernaum synagogue, he healed a man of his unclean spirit, "and they were all amazed" (Mark 1:27). Shortly thereafter, the people of Capernaum were again amazed when Jesus healed a paralytic, and boldly proclaimed the forgiveness of the man's sins (Mark 2:12). Jairus and his wife were clearly amazed when Jesus brought their daughter back from the dead (Luke 8:56). When Jesus healed a demon-oppressed man who was blind and mute, all the people were amazed, and began to question "Is this the son of David?" (Mathew 12:23). Even Jesus' closest disciples were amazed at his teachings (Mark 10:24).

Jesus was clearly an amazing man. He taught amazing things, and did amazing miracles to prove his authority. However, Jesus' amazing life, ultimately led to the most amazing thing of all: his death.

In Mark 11:18 we read "And the chief priests and the scribes heard it and were seeking a way to destroy him, for they feared him, because all the crowd

was astonished at his teaching." The chief priests and the scribes were the religious authorities during the time of Christ. They had money, they had power, and they had influence over the crowds, well, that is until Jesus came along. After violently overturning the tables of the money changes at the temple, and denying that they had the power to treat God's house however they wished, the chief priests and scribes started to see their power disappear. They feared, for they saw their influence over the crowds vanishing before their very eyes. They realized that if Jesus had his way, they would no longer be able to be the ultimate authorities when it came to God's word. When Jesus pointed out that God's teachings about his temple were more authoritative than their own desires, they reacted by plotting to kill Jesus.

When we sin, we, like the chief priest and scribes, choose our own desires above submitting to God's authoritative word. Jesus died because of our sins (I Corinthians 15:3), therefore when we choose to sin, we, like the chief priests and scribes, are plotting Jesus' death.

When Jesus was facing his horrible death, and Pilate gave Jesus an opportunity to defend himself against his accusers, Jesus remained silent "so that Pilate was amazed" (Mark 15:5). He was willingly crucified for us. However, the story doesn't end there.

Three days later, Jesus' apostles were once again amazed, when the women who went to Jesus' tomb came and testified to them that Jesus had risen from the dead (Luke 24:23-24).

We refused to accept God's amazing authority and sinned, we put God's amazing Son on the cross. However, if we are baptized into his death, then "just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life" (Romans 6:4).

Now isn't that amazing?

From Tyler's Desk:

Don't Quit!

He probably felt like his entire life had been a waste of time. Everything most important to him, everything he had worked so for, everything he had dedicated his life for had been in vain. In spite of everything he tried to do, he didn't see any results. He must have been frustrated, depressed; he must have felt worthless. He had had enough. He wanted to die. That's it. No more. I quit. He cried out "It is enough! Now, O LORD, take away my life, for I am no better than my fathers."

Those were exactly the words which came out of Elijah's mouth when he fled from Jezebel in 1 Kings 19:4. In the previous chapter, God had shown Ahab and Jezebel, along with hundreds of followers of Baal, His awesome power by consuming an altar soaked in water. God had just blessed the nation of Israel by ending a severe drought. But even after all of Elijah's hard work, and God's awesome power, the people of Israel still refused to follow God.

Instead of responding to God's dominance on Mt. Carmel with repentance, Queen Jezebel sent Elijah a death threat. It was then that Elijah became afraid, discouraged, and ready to give up.

In his fear, Elijah ran from Israel, all the way to Mt.

Horeb, the mountain where God appeared to Moses in the burning bush, and also the place where He gave Moses the Ten Commandments. When Elijah got to God's mountain, "the word of the LORD came to him, and He said to him, 'What are you doing here, Elijah?" Elijah answered God and said "I have been very jealous for the LORD, the God of hosts. For the people of Israel have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword, and I, even I only am left, and they seek my life, to take it away" (1Kings 10:9-10). Elijah felt like he was the only one left trying to do God's will.

After hearing Elijah's cry, God told him to return, and prophesied to him about how Hazel, the king of Syria, and Jehu, the future king of Israel, would destroy all of Israel, except for 7,000 whose knees that had not bowed to Baal. 7,000 people alone seems like a great number; however, even more impressively, "7,000" may even be symbolic of many more people because seven is a perfect number in the Bible.

Although Elijah was very discouraged, God assured him that in the end, He would not be defeated by the worshippers of Baal.

Perhaps you've felt like Elijah at times. Maybe you feel like no matter what you do, it seems like your Christian influence doesn't matter at all. Elijah was encouraged to keep going because of a guarantee of victory from God. We too have a similar guarantee. "And the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and so we will always be with the LORD." (1Thes. 4:16-17). So the next time you feel discouraged, thinking that all that you do is worthless, and you feel like quitting, remember Elijah...and keep going!



From Tyler's Desk:

Can We Interpret the Bible Differently?

The existence of so many denominations and sects of those who claim to be "Christian" has led to a belief that the Bible can be interpreted differently. Is this a true statement? Can the Bible be interpreted differently?

First we must understand that it is a truth that the Bible must be interpreted. But what does it mean to interpret the meaning? Does "interpret" mean to assign the meaning, or to learn the meaning? God has given us the His word, and His word has a meaning. There is only one meaning to God's word. There is "one faith" (Ephesians 4:5). Man does not have the authority to assign his own meaning to what God has said.

It is impossible to interpret the Bible differently. It is possible for someone to interpret the Bible, and for someone else to "misinterpret" the Bible. But because God's word has one true meaning, if two people disagree on the meaning, both cannot be correct. For example, it is a fact that the New York Giants won the Super Bowl in 2008. If someone were to say "the New York Giants won the Super Bowl in 2008," but I said, "the New England Patriots won the Super Bowl in 2008" we could not both be correct. I would not be interpreting the game differently, but rather I would be misinterpreting the game.

John 8:32 reads "And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." From this verse we learn two facts. The word "truth" is singular; therefore there is only one truth. We also learn that the truth is something we can know. From the preceding verse we learn we can know the truth by abiding in His word. When encounter difficult passages we cannot simply assign our own meaning, but rather we study to understand the true meaning. "Be diligent to present yourself approved to God...rightly dividing the word of truth" (2 Timothy 2:15).

From Tyler's Desk:

With God We Shall Do Valiantly!

When I played high school football, I learned to understand the meaning of the word "defeat." In fact, we only won one of our games. Every other game ended in defeat. Loosing gets old. It can be pretty discouraging. It's hard to get back out on the hot practice field on a hot Monday afternoon after working so hard and being defeated, again.

But that's football. It's just a game (the greatest game, but still just a game). The writer of Psalm 60 experienced defeat, on a much more severe level. This psalm was most likely written by David, who as the leader of the Israelite army, had just suffered a crushing defeat. The psalm begins "O God, you have rejected us, broken our defenses; you have been angry." The sinfulness of the Israelites had aroused God's anger, thus provoking Him to reject the Israelite army. God, in refusing to go out with the army had left them defenseless. They were horribly defeated. They had "seen hard things." They were in a state of confusion that could only be compared to a drunkard (vs. 3). What went wrong? Where did God go?

Have you ever felt like David did when he penned this psalm? Have you ever been horribly defeated? I'm not talking about being on a loosing sports team, or even something like loosing a job, but have you ever suffered defeat, spiritually speaking? Have you ever lined up in battle against Satan and been defeated? Have you ever tried to fight against temptation with your own strength, without turning to God in prayer



and study for help? As the psalmist says in verse 11, "The help of man is useless" (NKJV). Going to battle without God is going to battle with no defenses. We will surely loose every time. Defeat can be frustrating. It can be difficult to get back up to fight again.

Although we have all suffered defeat from Satan and often repeatedly, we have been blessed with a psalm in which the inspired author feels our frustration, and then provides us with an answer.

After suffering a crushing defeat, David turns to God. He acknowledges that God has set up a banner for those who fear Him (vs. 4). The word banner refers to a flag or symbol which we can all see, even from a long distance, and rally around for strength. Even when we are a long way from God, having suffered defeat, he is standing there holding a flag, ready for us to rally behind him and march to victory.

The psalmist reminds us that God, in His holiness has promised to fight with His people, and has promised victory over His enemies (vs. 6-8). Even after suffering a horrible defeat, David knows that with God, victory is a sure thing. David confidently asks God for help against his foes, and then boldly proclaims "With God we shall do valiantly; it is He who will tread down our foes" (vs. 12).

If we try to fight against temptation, on our own power, without God, we will surely be horribly defeated every time. However, we know that even after a crushing defeat, we too can turn to God, and can be confident that **"With God, we shall do valiantly"**.



From Tyler's Desk:

Don't You Wish VBS Lasted All Year Long?

Ok, so unless you're the seven year old boy who's darting to the front of the line downstairs to be the first to get a cookie, I would imagine most of you glanced at the above question, and answered to yourself with an emphatic "NO!" And well, after dealing with well over a hundred kids, and all the noise and excitement that goes along with it, I too would have to agree with you. When VBS comes to an end, most of us are in no hurry to rush through the next 360 days until next summer's VBS. But hey, the title got your attention, right?

Although I am in no way stating that I wish to spend every night for the entire year leading kids in "BOOSTER!" there are several very encouraging things about VBS, which I would love to see continue during every week.

One thing about VBS which we should strive to continue for the entire year is huge amount of involvement. During VBS and the weeks preceding, there are LOTS of people who dedicate their time and energy to making VBS as success. Ever since Wednesday evening Bible study last week, people have been at the building working on their rooms everyday, for hours at a time. Others helped those leading the learning centers. Others helped each night as "City Leaders". Others baked cookies, made costumes, or helped clean. There's probably jobs which people have done which most of us don't even know about! People of all ages have dedicated themselves to serving the LORD.

Paul, one of the great characters of the New Testament, didn't just dedicate himself to the LORD's work for one week during the summer. In 1st Corinthians 15:31, Paul wrote, "...by my pride in you, which I have in

Christ Jesus our Lord, I die every day!" He wrote again in Romans 12:1, "Present your bodies a living sacrifice." Sacrificing our time, our money, and our energy for the cause of Christ should be done every day, all year long. Here's a suggestion: make a list of specific ways in which you can serve the church throughout the year, and then do it!

Another great thing about VBS is that it seems to be a time in which the congregation gets busy inviting friends (especially the kids!). I've seen so many faces during VBS, which I have never seen before!

Matthew, another great character of the New Testament, did not keep the good news of Christ to himself.After Matthew found Christ, he planned a great feast, and invited a large company of others to come and meet Jesus (Luke 5:29). He continued his service as an apostle, and even wrote one of the accounts of the gospel of Christ, which was written for the purpose of showing Jews that Jesus was the Messiah of the Old Testament. Matthew never stopped inviting people to Jesus. Here's another challenge: make a list of 5 people who you would like to see come to Christ. Now throughout the rest of the year, make weekly efforts to engage these individuals in conversations about Christ.

Finally,VBS is a great time to teach our kids about the Bible! Some of my earliest memories of Bible stories come from VBS. Lets keep this going every day throughout the year!

In 2ndTimothy 1:5, Paul wrote concerningTimothy, "I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, dwells in you as well." Timothy was another great influential character in the New Testament. His strong faith was accredited to his mother and grandmother. Parents, Grandparents, do you want to see your children and grandchildren grow into faithful and influential Christians? Share your faith with them daily through your example and through your words!

Although we're all going to be glad when VBS is over, lets remember to continue to be active in the Lord's service, invite others to serve God, and bring our young people up to do the same... all year long.



From Tyler's Desk: Just a Spark

In I Samuel 14 there is a story told about two courageous men, and how their courage influenced an entire nation of people. In chapter 13 the Israelite army was threatened by the Philistines. Not only did the Philistines outnumber the Israelites by thousands, they also had equipment for war such as thousands of chariots and horsemen. With exception for King Saul, and his son Jonathan, the Israelites did not even have any swords. In the face of the threat, the Israelite army shrunk from 3000 down to 600, because most of the Israelites were afraid and went to hide in the mountains.

Chapter 14 tells of how Jonathan and his armor bearer retained a strong faith in God, even when things were looking hard. In vs. 6, Jonathan said to his armor bearer, "Come, let us go over to the garrison of these uncircumcised; it may be that the LORD will work for us. For nothing restrains the LORD from saving by many or by few." Although Jonathan realized that the LORD might not bless his efforts ("it may be..."), he also realized that God could not help Israel at all if Israel would not do their part and have courage.

To make a long story short, the Lord DID work for them. These two courageous men defeated twenty Philistines by themselves. This act of faith was like a spark which set the entire army of Israel on fire! In verse 21 we read about the Hebrews who were with the Philistines joining back up with Saul and Jonathan (probably those who had been taken captive). Then in vs. 22 then men who had hidden in the mountains of Ephraim followed them into battle. "So the LORD saved Israel that day..." (vs. 23). The entire army of Israel was saved by God, all because of the courageous action of only two men.

There is plenty of work to be done for the LORD today. There is work to be done at our jobs, at home, at school, at the ballfields, or anywhere else where we come in contact with non-Christians. Concerning this work, we can confidently say "it may be that the LORD will work for us." However we also must remember that the LORD cannot work for us, unless we work for the LORD. Let's have courage and get out and work for the LORD. We never know when our work might be the spark needed to accomplish great things.

Miracles in Mark: Attention to Authority

In Mark's account of the gospel, he tells of many of Jesus' miracles. However, he goes beyond merely describing the miracle itself, and goes on to emphasize the importance of each of the miracles. Beyond just learning "what happened" in Jesus' ministry, a study of Jesus' miracles can teach us many important lessons about who Jesus was, and what he should be to us. Over the next few weeks, I intend to write a series of articles looking at the miracles of Jesus and lessons learned from those miracles as seen in the book of Mark.

The first miracle of Jesus recorded in the book of Mark is found in Mark 1:21-27 (it would be helpful to take the time to read these verses before reading the rest of this article).

This miracle took place in the city of Capernaum, a fishing town on the Sea of Galilee. Jesus had just recently begun in his ministry, and was not yet well known. The Jews in Capernaum woke up on a Saturday morning, most likely expecting this Sabbath to be just like all the others. It was a day of rest. Instead of going out to their fishing boats, today was a day to go to the synagogue to hear someone give a lesson from God's word. Every Sabbath they would gather together and sing songs of worship and hear a reading from God's word. Instead of hearing a local preacher then give a lesson, they were accustomed to letting most any individual who wanted to present a lesson from God's word.

Although they were comfortable hearing form different speakers, they had grown accustomed to a similar style. Each week one of the scribes would teach them lessons, but they would do so by referring to another's authority. For us this would be like hearing a preacher make a point solely by referencing a commentary of respected brother rather than drawing his point straight from God's word.

This Saturday the Jews went to the Synagogue more likely expecting more of the same preaching. However this Sabbath turned out of be different... much different.

After arriving at the Synagogue and hearing a reading from God's word and worshiping God in song, their speaker stood up to speak. Today they were going to hear from a man named Jesus. Jesus was not a scribe. He was merely a carpenter from the town of Nazareth. They may not have been expecting much, but what they heard and saw that day left them amazed.

The theme of Jesus' lesson can be found in Mark 1:14, Jesus taught them "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel." Jesus did not reference some other respected scholar to make this assumption. He did not speak on any other man's authority. He just said it. He spoke solely on the authority of God's words.

Who was this guy? A carpenter? From Nazareth? What makes this guy think he can just speak with authority like this? The people were astonished at His teaching (Mark 1:22).

But Jesus didn't stop there.Verse 23 reads "immediately there was a man with an unclean spirit, and he cried out." After the people heard the man cry out they saw the most amazing thing of all. Jesus rebuked the spirit, and commanded it to come out of the man, and the unclean spirit obeyed Him!

"He commands even the unclean spirits and they obey him!" The people now knew that this was not just a normal carpenter from Nazareth. This Jesus spoke with authority, and he proved he had this authority by casting out a demon!

As we should model Christ in all things, we too should look to God's authority for our teachings. Commentaries written by well studied and respectable brethren can be a great tool, but they are not our authority. Jesus' words, as given in the New Testament by the apostles and prophets are the only authority we have (Heb 1.2). These were the only words proved to be true through miracles (Heb 2:4). Lets continue to grow in our submission to and respect for Jesus' teachings.

The Christian Can

Paul said, "I *can* do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me" (Philippians 4:13). The Christian must be careful with his interpretation of this verse. The Christian does not wish to do some things. There are other things which God has not placed in his power. What Paul is saying is that the Christian *can* do all things which God desires and expects him to do. In many cases this may be far more that the Christian ever dreamed he might be able to do.

1. THE CHRISTIAN CAN BEAR BURDERS THAT OTHER MEN CANNOT BEAR. He can do so because he is not bearing them alone. The Christian is to burden God with what burdens him (Psalm 55:22; 1 Peter 5:7). Christians help other Christians with their burdens (Galatians 6:2). When the Christian *yokes up* with Jesus Christ, his burdens become light (Matthew 11:30). The business of living the Christian life provides strength for burden-bearing unavailable from any other source. But above all, the Christian can shoulder burdens which would overwhelm any other person because he knows there is no burden which he has to carry alone.

2. THE CHRISTIAN CAN RESIST TEMPTATIONS THAT OTHER MEN CANNOT RESIST. The Christian lives a circumscribed life (1 Peter 2:9). The Christian never faces a temptation that Jesus Christ has not already examined and allowed to pass because He knows the Christian can face it and conquer it (1 Corinthians 10:13). The temptations of evil are strong, but the Christian has the power to resist and put Satan to flight (James 4:7).

3. THE CHRISTIAN CAN BEAR DISSAPOINTMENTS IN WAYS OTHER MEN CANNOT BEAR THEM. This world is not the "everything" of the child of God. When this world is gone, the Christian has another world that is far better (2 Peter 3:11-13; Revelation 21 and 22). This is not so with the "*worldly person.*" The worldly person either gets it here and enjoys it here or he does not enjoy it at all. When the Christian is risen with Christ (Romans 6:3-4), he has affections set on things above, not on things here below (Colossians 3:1). The realization that one day all things will be made right enables the Christian to bear earthly disappointments.

4. THE CHRISTIAN CAN BEAR SORROWS IN WAYS THAT OTHER MEN CANNOT BEAR THEM. Sorrows will come and there is no way to avoid them. Life must go on in spite of sorrows. The question is what effect it will have on the Christian.Will sorrows break him, leave him bitter and full of resentment, or will sorrows form and mold him so that God can better use him? With the grace of God, sorrows can be endured. Only the Christian is equipped to bear sorrows properly.



Miracles in Mark: Saved to Serve

I hate getting sick! A few months ago I remember getting sick. It was a Wednesday. During the day I felt a little achy. By that evening, when it was time for Wednesday evening devotional, I felt horrible. I suffered through my Bible class. After the devotional was over, I didn't hang around to visit with people. I left as quickly as I could. When I got home, I had just enough energy to collapse on my bed. I was in bed with a fever for about 12 hours that night.

Lucky for me, the sickness was only a 24 hour bug. The next morning my fever was gone, and I was feeling much better. But I was still completely exhausted. It took all the energy I had just to get out of bed and brush my teeth. It took another day or two to regain my full strength.

In Mark chapter one we read about Jesus casting a demon out of a man who was part of the synagogue. Through this miracle, Jesus proved he was somebody special. He proved He had authority. He proved he was more powerful than even Satan's demons.

The events of that day did not end in the synagogue. After Jesus left the Synagogue, he went to the home of Peter and Andrew. Upon arrival, Jesus was immediately made aware that there was a problem. Peter's motherin-law was ill with a fever. We don't know how serious her fever was, but we do know that it was bad enough to leave her depleted of the energy needed to get up

and serve the guests.

Jesus once again showed His power and authority when He came to Peter's mother-in-law, took her by the hand, and lifted her up. The text informs us that "immediately the fever left her, and she began to serve them" (Mark 1:31).

Did you catch that? When Jesus healed Peter's mother-in-law, her fever *immediately* left her. Her temperature did not just begin to drop back to normal; it was immediately back to normal.And that's not all. When Peter's mother-in-law was healed, she began to serve them. She did not have to wait around for two or three days for her strength to return. She was immediately and completely healed, and therefore she chose to respond by service.

When a person in saved by Jesus, they are completely saved. Psalm 103:3 informs us that the LORD "forgives all your iniquity." Ephesians 1:7 teaches that it is through the blood of Christ that our trespasses are forgiven. When we are baptized into Christ's death, burial, and resurrection, we receive immediate and complete healing from our sins.

It does not take God several months or years to save a person of their sins; therefore Christians should not wait several months or years to begin serving. Although more mature Christians may have developed more talents, Christians should find ways to serve the church just as soon as they are healed of their sins. Peter's mother-in-law immediately began serving when she was healed. She did not wait to serve, and neither should Christians today.

Miracles in Mark: Compassion for the Contaminated

Leprosy was one of the most horrific diseases of ancient times. Not only was leprosy often fatal, it also resulted in the infected person being considered unclean. A leper was required to live in isolation from all others. If a clean person were to come near then, a leper was required by law to cry out "Unclean! Unclean!" (Lev. 23:44-46). Living life as a leper would be one of the most depressing and lonely lives imaginable.

Through Mark chapter one we see Jesus' popularity quickly begin to grow as he began healing sick and casting out demons (vs. 32-33). In verse 40 we're introduced to a man who had this horrible disease of leprosy. From Luke's account we read that the man was "full of leprosy." His leprosy had progressed to a severe stage. It is possible that by the time he came to Jesus he may have even lost some of his toes and fingers as a result of this disease. As you would expect, this man had an incredibly great desire to be healed of this disease.

Just like most everyone else in the region of Galilee, this man had heard about the great things Jesus was doing. He was convinced Jesus had the ability to heal him of his leprosy. The only doubt the leper had was whether or not Jesus would want to. In verse 40 we read the leper's words as he implored Jesus to heal him: "If you will, you can make me clean."

Our sin is a lot like leprosy. Both are fatal. Like leprosy left individuals in the Old Testament unclean, our sin leaves us unclean from God. And therefore, our sin forces us to live in isolation from God.

Throughout the gospel's we learn time and time again of Jesus' authority. Jesus had authority over Satan and his demons, authority over the laws of nature, and authority to forgive sins (See Mark 2:10). Jesus has the ability to cleanse us of our sins. He can make us clean. But does He desire to make us clean?

After the leper begs for Jesus' cleaning in verse 40, Verse 41 reads, "Moved with pity; he stretched out his hand and touched him and said to him, "I will; be clean". Instead of scolding the leper for endangering His health with the contagious skin disease, Jesus reached out his hand and touched the leper! Through the action of touching the leper's uncleanness, the leper was cleansed.

Jesus has the ability to forgive us of our sins, but does he desire to? After all, the word sin means "to miss the mark." Sin is rebellion against God's will. Sin violating what God has told us to do. Sure Jesus has the power to forgive our sins, but when we so often blatantly rebel against God, why would He want to?

Jesus had pity on the leper, and even touched his uncleanness to make him clean. We are reminded time and time again in scripture that Jesus has done the same for us. Romans 5:8 reads, "God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." In 1 Timothy 2:4 and 2 Peter 3:9 we read that God wants all men to be saved. Like the leper, Jesus cleansed us by touching our uncleanness, just as 2 Corinthians 5:21 reads, "For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God." Not only does Jesus have the ability to save all men, but he also has the desire to save all men – even the worst of sinners.

Jesus had pity on the leper and the desire to heal him. The leper knew Jesus had the ability to heal him. However, if the leper never went to Jesus, he would have died a leper.

We know Jesus can save us of our sins. The Bible tells us God desires for us to be saved. The leper hated his uncleanness, and therefore went to Jesus. Do you hate your sin enough to turn to Jesus and faithfully follow His will?



Does Jesus Know You Love Him?

One of the first spiritual songs most children learn is "Oh how I love Jesus." The song has a catchy tune and easy lyrics, making it a very easy song for children to learn.

In the same way, it is very easy for people today to claim "I love Jesus." I saw a statistic that 85% of Americans claim to be Christian. This is a vast majority who when asked about Jesus would respond, "I love Jesus." If such a majority of Americans claim to love Jesus, then why are we taught in Matthew 7:13-14 that many will go in by the way which leads to destruction, and few are those who choose the way which leads to life? The answer is found in verse 21. "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven."

Many claim to love Jesus, but the claim alone is not enough. Only those who back up their claim by their actions will enter the kingdom of heaven. In John 14:15 we read, "If you love Me, keep My commandments." And then again in John 15:14, "You are My friends if you do whatever I command you."



Miracles in Mark: Faith You Can See The use of the word "faith" in today's society has lead to much confusion. Dictionary.com defines the word "faith" as "confidence or trust in a person or thing" or "belief in God." Many individuals protestant circles will turn to passages such as John 3:16, Ephesians 2:8, Acts 16:31 and Acts 26:18 to suggest that the only thing required for salvation is a mental affirmation of the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Even among churches of Christ it seems that some to not understand the Biblical concept of faith.

This article is a part of a continuing series on the miracles of Jesus as recorded in the book of Mark. In Mark 2:1-5 we read of Jesus healing a paralytic. A close study of these scriptures, along with the rest of the New Testament will show that Biblical faith is far more than a mental affirmation. Faith, as portrayed in the New Testament is more than a mental affirmation of the truths about God. Biblical faith is more than a confession. Biblically speaking, faith is a belief which is strong enough to compel that individual to act on their belief.

I encourage each of you to take a moment and read Mark 2:1-5 in your Bibles before continuing with this article.

In these verses we see a story of a paralytic and his friends. Jesus had been in Capernaum previously. In his earlier stay, "he healed many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons" (Mark 1:34). The paralytic and his friends knew about Jesus. They believed in Jesus and his ability to heal, and they wanted their friend to be healed.

When Jesus returned to Capernaum, the friends of the paralytic jumped on the opportunity to have Jesus heal their friend. However, when they carried their friend to Jesus, they realized there was a problem. There was such a large crowd, that they could not get their friend to Jesus. They could have given up, but their friend would not have been healed. So they moved onto plan B – to lower their friend through the roof. They believed so strongly in Jesus that they refused to go home until their friend was healed.

After the men let their friend down through the room, we read in verse 5 "And when Jesus *saw their faith* he said to the paralytic, "Son, your sins are for-given." So what is faith? What did Jesus see? Why was the man forgiven of his sins, and later healed of his palsy (vs. 11)?

Let's say the story was different. What if the men had turned around when they saw the crowd and went home? Let's say once the men were home, they said among themselves "I believe Jesus can heal, but we don't feel like battling the crowd." Would their belief have been enough to have their friend healed? Certainly not!

What if the men went home, and once they were home they prayed "Jesus, we believe in you, please heal our friend" but were not dedicated enough to battle the crowds? Would their belief and their prayer have saved their friend? Absolutely not!

Jesus forgave the paralytic and healed him because he "saw their faith." What did he see? He saw that they believed so strongly in Jesus that they were willing to *act* on that belief. Jesus saw them carry their friend to the room and lower him down. Their actions of the paralytic's friends proved they believed in Jesus.

Often times I've heard the question asked "Are we saved by faith, by works, or by both?" This very question shows that the concept of faith is misunderstood. Faith and works are one in the same. Biblical faith is a faith that can be seen through one's actions.

Ephesians 2:8, "For by grace you have been saved through faith"

James 2:22, "(Abraham's) faith was completed by his works"

Miracles in Mark: Don't Make Jesus Angry! In Mark 3:1-5, Jesus posed the Pharisee's with an easy question with an obvious answer. He asked "Is it lawful on the Sabbath to do good or to harm: to save life or to kill?" The question was easy. The answer was clear. The reasoning was flawless.

Throughout the early chapters of the book of Mark, Jesus did amazing things. Jesus had the power to heal the sick. Jesus had the power to cast out demons. Jesus taught with authority. Jesus used reasoning which could not be denied. Common fishermen realized how great Jesus was. The crowds realized how great Jesus was. Even a tax collector realized how great Jesus was. Would the Pharisee's come to the same obvious realization?

Rather than thinking about Jesus' question and accepting their own error, the text says "but they were silent." Unlike the fishermen, the crowds of people, or even a sinful tax collector, the Pharisees were unwilling to submit to the truth which was placed right in their faces.

Jesus had done nothing wrong. Jesus had simply reasoned with them in truth.And yet, they still refused to accept him.Verse five tells us of Jesus' reaction to the Pharisees. "And he looked around at them with anger, grieved at the hardness of their heart." In spite of the hardness of their hearts, Jesus then turned to a man with a withered hand, commanded him to stretch it out, and restored his hand to full health. Jesus healed the man on the Sabbath. Of course this was not wrong, as Jesus had just shown with his question. But the Pharisee's hated it. Jesus had transgressed, not against God's law, but against the traditions and self-proclaimed authority of the Pharisees. In verse six we read that the Pharisees responded to this action by holding council with the Herodians against Jesus, to destroy Him.

The Pharisee's did not accept Jesus as many others did. This grieved Jesus and made him angry. Why did the Pharisee's not see the simple truth and accept it? Why do some today not accept the truth, even when it is clear? And more importantly, how can we keep ourselves from denying to submit to truth, and thus make Jesus angry with ourselves?

The Pharisees were known as authorities in their religious interpretations in the day. Whatever they said, the crowds would follow. However, throughout the book of Mark, we read of Jesus' increasing popularity (1:28, 33, 45, 2:12). The Pharisees desired popularity and authority more than truth.

In their desire to continue in their popularity and authority, the Pharisees weren't even interested in hearing what Jesus had to say in the first place. In Mark 3:2, we read that they were watching Jesus... "so that they might accuse Him." They already had their mind made up before they even heard what Jesus had to say.

Submission to truth may result in us having to make changes. We may have to give up popularity, friends, or family. We must give God authority over our lives, rather than ourselves. We may have to accept things as truth we wish were not so.

Will you be like the fishermen, crowds, and tax collector who left everything to follow Jesus, or will you be like the Pharisee's, who grieved him and made him angry? *James 2:22, "(Abraham's) faith was completed by his works"*



Simple Thoughts From Scripture

Solomon's wisdom was exemplified in so many areas. One of these areas concerns interpersonal relations. The proverb found in 17:14 states a very simple but profound truth: *"The beginning of strife is like releasing water;Therefore stop contention before a quarrel starts."* Proverbs 17:14.

There are two simple but essential principles stated in this proverb. Strife has a way of getting out of hand. How many have not witnessed this very thing? Often words are said that can never be recalled. One simply gets caught up in the passion of the moment and finds it difficult or even impossible to stop. Strife often spirals out of control. The second principle that Solomon so eloquently observes is that one should stop contention before the quarrel. Prevention is always better! The challenge for each of us is to recognize this when contention begins and to be the smart one who stops it at that point. *T.L.*

From Tyler's Desk

Miracles in Mark: Resting in Storms What worries you? Your job? Finances? Your health? Your future? The well being of loved ones? The economy?

In Mark 4 verses 35 and following some of Jesus' closest disciples found themselves in a worrisome situation. I encourage you to read Mark 4:34-41 before reading the remainder of this article.

Jesus and his disciples had departed from Capernaum in a boat to escape the large crowds for a time. Jesus was exhausted. He had just finished preaching a series of parables to the large crowds, and answering the questions which arose from those parables. Before that, He had to answer some accusations from the Pharisees. This was a day which began with Him appointing his twelve disciples (and the book of Luke informs us he was up all night praying the previous night – Luke 6:12). Jesus was physically exhausted, and therefore fell asleep in the boat.

While Jesus was asleep, a storm arose. Mark 5:37 informs us that the boat was filling! The disciple's lives were in danger. They were afraid. Sure, they had heard the things Jesus had preached. They had seen

the miracles he had worked, but they were still afraid. In the midst of the wind, the waves, and the boat filling with water, all they could think about was that it seemed as if they would perish that night.

And yet, through the entire storm, Jesus remained asleep.Who was this man?Why was he not also fearful for his life? Not only was he not afraid, but he was relaxed, asleep! Who was this?

His disciples came to him in fear, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" Jesus awoke and rebuked the wind and the sea. "The wind ceased, and there was a great calm." (Mark 4:38-39).

The disciples responded by asking "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?" Even when the disciples were worried, and when it seemed like from their human perspectives that there was no hope, Jesus came through again.

Think about the things God has blessed you with in your life. Consider how He has taken care of you time and time again. Consider the lives of others, or the Biblical text. The evidence is clear: God has the power to help us in our seemingly helpless situations.

While the disciples were panicking in fear, Jesus was asleep. Jesus had faith that through the power of God they would be saved. He was not worried in the least bit. After calming the storm he asked his disciples, "Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?"

In our lives, we cannot see how things will turn out. When things get bad, it seems to us that God will not come through.Will you look at the storm around you, and worry with fear? Or will you be like Jesus, and rest peacefully, knowing that the power of God will take care of us.

"Therefore do not be anxious saying, What shall we eat? Or what shall we drink? Or what shall we wear?... but seek ye first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." (Matthew 6:31, 33).

Miracles in Mark: Who Should Be Afraid of Jesus?

Before reading this article, I encourage you to read the account of Jesus healing the demon possessed man in Mark 5:1-20. As we discuss this text, I encourage you to ask the questions, "Should I be afraid of Jesus?" and "Am I afraid of Jesus?".

When Jesus arrived in Gerasenes, he encountered a demon possessed man. In verse 7, we discover the fear the demon's had for Jesus. They said, "What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I adjure you by God, do not torment me." They continued to show their fear of Jesus in verses 10-12 when the begged Him not to send them out of the country, but rather to send them into a herd of pigs.

The demons had every right to fear Jesus. From 1 John 3:8 we know that Jesus came to destroy the works of

We too should be afraid of Jesus if we make a practice of sinning, and joining in those works of the devil. If you have not repented or been cleansed from your sins, you should be afraid of Jesus.

As we read on, we discover in verse 15 that the herdsmen and the people in the surrounding country were also afraid of Jesus. They saw the once demon possessed man, now clothed and in his right mind, and they saw how the demons had drowned the herd of pigs. They had discovered the awesome power of Jesus, and reacted in fear. They did not want to learn any more about him, and asked him to depart from their region.

We must not be afraid of Jesus' power. He has the power to free us from our sins. We should not be afraid to learn all we can about Jesus, and allow him to rule our lives.

Finally, we see the reaction of the once demon possessed man in verses 18-20. This man was not afraid of Jesus. We read that he begged to be allowed to stay with Jesus, and then in verse 20, "He went away and began to proclaim in the Decapolis how much Jesus had done for him, and everyone marveled."

We should not be afraid to learn about Jesus, follow Jesus, or tell others about Jesus. Jesus has done great things for us. He has freed us of our sins. We must not be afraid to spread the exciting news!

Simple Thoughts From Scripture

Solomon was exceedingly wise. However, his wisdom did not arise from himself. It was given to him by God (1 Kings 3:9-12). Much of this wisdom is recorded for us in the books of Proverbs and Ecclesiastes. One would do well to consider these simple thoughts and how they might impact one's life.

One important passage is "Death and life are in the power of the tongue, And those who love it will eat its fruit." Proverbs 18:21. Solomon stressed the awesome power of one's words. They have the ability to either destroy a person or they have the ability to lift that person up. Words have power. Some parents have so berated their children that they grow up feeling that they have no worth. Paul admonished the fathers at Colossae, "Fathers, do not provoke your children, lest they become discouraged." Colossians 3:21. Likewise many managers and employers dress down those under them to the point they do not aspire to give it their best. Words can kill the human spirit.

At the same time there are those who are able to offer encouraging words and bring out the best in others. "A man has joy by the answer of his mouth, And a word spoken in due season, how good it is!" Proverbs 15:23. Isaiah draws attention to the fact that one must have "learned" words to be helpful. "The Lord GOD has given Me The tongue of the learned, That I should know how to speak A word in season to him who is weary..." Isaiah 50:4. Many times coaches on various sports teams have great influence on young people because they know how to inspire and encourage by their words.

The last part of the verse, "...*those who love it will eat its fruit.*" is equally important. There is quote from Stephan Grellet that is likely based on this verse. "Keep your words sweet, you may have to eat them." Words have a way of coming back to us. One should give that which he wants to receive! *T.L.*

From Tyler's Desk

Miracles in Mark: Touching The Savior

As discussed in last week's article, Mark 5:1-20 describes some who were afraid of Jesus. The demons were afraid of Jesus, because they knew what He would do to them. The people of the country of Gerasenes were afraid of Jesus, because He had great power which they did not understand. In the second half of the chapter (verses 21-43), we read about two individuals who saw Jesus' power, and were not afraid. Today we will look at the miracle of Jesus healing a bleeding woman.

Mark 5:25-26 informs us of the past of the woman. This woman had dealt with an issue of blood for the past twelve years. She had spent the last twelve years of her life in physical suffering. She had spent the last twelve years of her life being financially drained as a result of seeing so many doctors (who were all unable to heal her). She had spent the last twelve years of her life as a religious and social outcast because of her uncleanness. Doubtless, she had spent the last twelve years with some very difficult emotional struggles in connection with everything else.

Today, Satan can so completely consume someone's life that they may spend years of their life stuck in sin. Sin leaves us suffering. Sin prevents us from growing in our relationship with the church. Sin leaves us as an

outcast from God. Sin can leave us in an emotional and spiritual (and sometimes by consequence, financial) wreck. Just as the woman had spent the last twelve years trying to find deliverance from her disease, we may WANT to be freed from sin, and even TRY to free ourselves from sin. However, until we follow the example of the bleeding woman, we too will never find peace and healing.

When Jesus returned to Capernaum, word quickly spread that Jesus was back in town. She had heard reports from others about what Jesus had done, and so she joined the crowd which thronged around Him. She joined the crowd, because she knew "If I touch even his garments, I will be made well" (vs. 26).

When she touched Jesus, she was immediately healed. Jesus, having felt his power go out of him, turned and said to the woman, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease." She was healed, because she had enough faith to touch Jesus, therefore she was healed of her disease and able to spend the rest of her life in peace.

Although people today cannot reach out and touch Jesus in the same way the woman did, faith is still required of us to be made well. We must have faith to put on Jesus in baptism (Galatians 3:27). We must have faith that through baptism, we can be united with His death, burial, and resurrection (Romans 6:3-4). When our faith is shown through being baptized, our sins are washed away by His blood (Acts 22:15; Revelation 1:5).

Like the woman, if we reach out and touch Jesus, we can be healed from our sin, and we can live our lives in peace.

Miracles in Mark: Touched By The Savior

Last week's bulletin article was entitled "Touching the Savior." It discussed the story of a woman with an issue of blood reaching out and touching Jesus. This woman was saved by this act of faith. Surrounding this story is another story of saving faith. Before reading the remainder of this article, I encourage for you to read Mark's account of these two miracles, as found in Mark 5:31-43.

Jesus had just returned to Capernaum. When he arrived, a great crowd gathered around him. Not only was the woman with the issue of blood among the crowd, but so was a man named Jairus. Jairus was a ruler of the synagogue. This indicates that Jairus had dedicated life to serving the LORD, and learning more about Him. We also read that Jairus had a daughter who was very sick. She was "at the point of death."

When Jairus saw Jesus he fell down and "implored him earnestly, saying, 'My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made well and live." Like the woman with the issue of blood, Jairus also believed in Jesus' great power.

However, before Jesus could make it to the home of

Jairus, we read about the woman with the issue of blood reaching out and touching Jesus. Apparently it was during this delay that Jairus' daughter died. It seemed to all around that all hope was lost. One of Jairus' servants is recorded as saying "Why trouble the Teacher any further?"

Jesus responded with the phrase "Do not fear, only believe." Several verses later we read that Jesus took the little girl by the hand and said "Little girl, I say to you, arise." Verse 42 tells us that immediately the girl got up and began walking around.

Is all hope lost? Are you so dead in sin that it seems to be impossible to ever live righteously again? Do you sometimes ask yourself, "Why trouble the teacher any further"?

From this miracle in Mark we learn that it is NOT too late for Jesus. Although Jesus does not literally touch us today, he can make us a "new creation" (II Cor. 5:17). If we "do not fear" and believe in his commandments, the Father will make his home with us (John 14:23). It does not matter how "dead" we are because of our sins; through baptism, Jesus can "make us alive together with him" and nail our record of debt to the cross (Col. 2:13-14).



Miracles in Mark: Feeding the Five-Thousand

Mark 6:30-44 contains a story which many of us have heard since we were very young; the feeding of the five thousand.

As Jesus and his apostles were in a deserted, grassy area, a large crowd of 5000 men, not counting the women and children gathered around Jesus. Being in a deserted area, there were no food venders near by. So as the evening drew near, the crowd began to grow hungry.

The New Testament is full of instructions concerning the needy:

- Galatians 6:10, "So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone..."
- James 1:27, "Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction..."
- 1 John 3:17, "But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him?"

Jesus' instructions to his apostles were in harmony with these commandments. He said to them "You give them something to eat."

Jesus instructs us to help the needy. But what do we do if we don't have the resources? With the economy struggling, and Christmas presents to buy, many of us are struggling to find any extra cash. We may tell ourselves "perhaps God will understand if I don't help just this time."

The apostles apparently had the same problem. There were only five loaves and two fish available to feed this large crowd. It would have cost over a half year's wages to buy enough food for a crowd this size. How could Jesus expect them to feed the needy crowd with such meager resources?

As we read, Jesus only needed the five loaves and two fish to feed the entire crowd. If we are willing to give everything we can, God can take care of the rest.

Over the next couple of weeks the youth group will be collecting money to buy Christmas gifts for the needy in our community. The Bybee Branch congregation has always been very generous in supporting this effort. Just as Jesus taught his apostles on that day, may we make every effort to have compassion on the needy.

Miracles in Mark: Learning Your Lesson

Many of us are very familiar with the story of Jesus walking on the water. Many of us have known this story from the time colored in the blue waves in our coloring books when we were five. When I think of the story, I readily recall the storm, the fear of the apostles, and their amazement when they saw Jesus walking to them on the water. I usually think of a cool story with a happy ending.

When I was preparing for this week's article, I read Mark's account (Mark 6:45-52), and compared it with Matthew and John's account.When I did this I noticed something I had not noticed before.

I always remembered the story ending with Jesus getting into the boat, and the apostles learning another lesson about Jesus' power. However, as I again read Mark's account, it stood out to me that this story does not have the "happy ending" I remembered. Mark ends the story of Jesus walking on the water in verses 51 and 52:

"And he got into the boat with them, and the wind

ceased. And they were utterly astonished, for they did not understand about the loaves, but their hearts were hardened."

The story of Jesus walking on the water is about more than another demonstration of Jesus' power.. The previous miracle about Jesus feeding the five thousand with only 5 loaves and 2 fish was a miracle about Jesus' power. The story of Jesus walking on the water is a story of rebuke because the Apostle had failed to learn their lesson.

Just as Jesus cared for the hungry multitude, Jesus would take care of his apostles when they were in need. Just as Jesus had the power to take care of the multitude, He would also have the power to protect his apostles. Mark says that the problem with the apostles was that "their hearts were hardened." Although they had some understanding and appreciation for Jesus' love and power, they were not yet willing to fully surrender their hearts and lives to Him.

I would imagine most of you reading my article already have some understanding and appreciation for how much Jesus has done for you. But have you fully let Him have control of your life? Have you learned from the past, or has the hardness of your heart prevented you from faithfully following Jesus all the time? May we learn from the apostles' mistake and let Jesus be our protector.



Miracles in Mark: Discouraged but Undeterred

As Mark recorded his account of the gospel, he gave special attention to the miracles of Jesus. Jesus proved his authority time and time again, but time and time again, people hardened their hearts and refused to accept Him.

In chapter 6, we read of Jesus feeding five thousand people with just five loaves and two fish. And yet, even after this amazing miracle, his apostles were still "utterly astounded" at His next miracle of walking on the water.

Following this night on the lake with the apostles, Jesus healed many sick from all over the entire region (Mark 6:53-56). Surely people would start to understand who He was... but no. Chapter seven begins with yet another discussion with the Pharisees, who continually refused to accept His evidence.

So what did Jesus do next? He left Galilee, and went to Tyre and Sidon (a region with a much larger Gentile population). Mark 7:24 indicates that he went here to get away from the Pharisees and be alone with his

disciples for a time.


While in Tyre, Jesus' next miracle stands in stark contrast to the previous chapter and a half. There was a Syrophoenician woman (a Gentile) who's daughter had an unclean spirit. When she heard Jesus was in town, she went to him and "begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter."

Jesus' didn't immediately heal the woman's daughter. In fact, his response could have been very discouraging for this desperate mother to hear. He told her, "Let the children be fed first, for it is not right to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs." Jesus used this illustration to point out that He had come first to the Jews, and therefore would not heal the Gentile woman's daughter.

But the determined mother refused to be deterred. She wittily retorted, "Yes, Lord; yet even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs." Because of this statement of undeterred faith in Jesus' power, Jesus then told the woman to go her way, because the demon had left her daughter.

The apostles, Jesus' closest followers, hardened their hearts to Jesus' miraculous power. The Pharisee's, the religious elite of the day, refused to give up their traditions to accept clearly demonstrated power of Jesus. But this Gentile woman, even when faced with discouragement, refused to deny Jesus as her only hope.

Jesus' blessings are not limited those who grew up going to church their whole lives. Neither are they limited to only the religious scholars in this world. Here in Mark 7, Jesus illustrated that He would be willing to bless anyone, regardless of their background. Jesus only requires that we remain undeterred in our commitment to Him, even when faced with discouragement.
