

The Formula For Success

I was waiting for the oil in my van to be changed the other day when I picked up a magazine called "Success." Always looking for advice on the topic, I began flipping through the pages. In it was an article written by the popular motivational speaker Zig Ziglar on the three keys to success. They were:

Purpose. One has to have a goal in mind and a way to reach that goal to truly achieve. Too many people wonder around aimlessly and then wonder why they never succeed. A purpose gives us something to strive for - something to achieve.

Passion. One must greatly desire the purpose to be attained - so much so that it drives him to do whatever is necessary to reach it. A purpose will rarely be realized unless one is truly passionate about it.

Performance. Purpose and passion are worthless without good, old-fashioned hard work. That's what it takes to get from point A to point B - success doesn't come to you, you must go to it.

What struck me as I read the article was the fact that these are exactly what it takes to succeed in Christianity, as well. Christian, consider the following:

- * Do you have a purpose to your Christianity? Do you set Christian goals to grow in the grace and knowledge of the Lord (2 Pet. 3:18)? Is every decision on earth made with the ultimate goal of attaining heaven in mind (Col. 3:1-2)?
- * Do you have passion for your Christianity? Do you have a zeal and fervor for serving the Lord (Titus 2:4)? Do you have a driving love for the Lord, and are you always joyful and excited to be a Christian (1 Pet. 1:8)?
- * Do you have performance in your Christianity? Do you labor daily for the Lord (Heb. 6:10)? Do you harmoniously involve yourself with the church in every way possible (Eph. 4:11-16)?

Let Paul's words in Phil. 3:12-14 inspire us to heighten all of these in our Christian lives: "Not that I have already attained, or am already perfected; but I press on, that I may lay hold of that for which Christ Jesus has also laid hold of me. Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended; but one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead, I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."



The Lord Waits

Jacob wrestled with God all night before getting a blessing from the angel. When the poor woman from Syrophencia cried out to Jesus on behalf of her daughter, she was at first not answered with a single word. Paul prayed three times that his thorn in the flesh would be removed, but instead of removing his

ailment, he was told "my grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."

There are multiple examples in scripture of God making people wait for the answers to their prayers. However, we don't always know or understand why God makes us wait. Perhaps God makes us wait so that we will cry out more fervently for God's deliverance, as in the case of Israel crying for freedom from Egyptian slavery. Perhaps God makes us wait so that we will better understand how to use our blessing to serve Him, as in the case of Hannah praying for a son. Perhaps God makes us wait so that we will have a greater appreciation for our blessings once we receive them. Maybe God makes us wait so that we will learn to "trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding."

So if it seems like God isn't answering your prayers, don't grow discouraged. Keep praying. Keep trusting. Keep serving. Keep waiting.

From Tyler's Desk:

Have You Counted the Cost?

Luke 14:26-33 teaches the lesson that one must "count the cost." Jesus uses the illustration of a man who intends to build a building. It would be foolish for this man to start the project without first counting the cost, "lest, after he has laid the foundation, and is not able to finish, all who see it begin to mock him." Jesus then illustrates the same point by considering how foolish it would be for a king to go to battle against another king if he does not first sit down and consider whether or not his 10,000 men will be able to stand against the other army of 20,000 men.

Yes, there is a cost to being a Christian. Verse 26 tells that one cost of following Christ is putting Jesus before other relationships. The verse specifically mentions fathers and mothers, wives and children, brothers and sisters, and yes "his own life also." The cost for the rich young man in Matthew 19 was to sell all of his possessions and give to the poor. Part of the cost of being a Christian is to give one's old, sinful lifestyle. This cost includes completely giving up old sinful addictions, old companions who many cause a Christian to fall, or anything else which may interfere with the Christian lifestyle.

However, there is a much more severe cost for the decision NOT to follow Christ. That cost is found in Romans 6:23 which reads, "For the wages of sin is death." Colossians 2:13 reads "And you, being dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, He has made alive together with Him, having forgive you all trespasses. Therefore, unless a man is "made alive" spiritually in Christ while he is still living physically, he will after physical death be separated from God eternally in spiritual death in the lake of fire and brimstone (Revelation 21:8). Have you counted the cost?

In the Roman church, there were some Christians who weren't yet dressed for "spiritual success." In Romans 13:11-14, Paul instructed the church to "cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light." He goes on to define these "pajamas" we are supposed to cast off as various desires of the flesh. He tells us that we put on our "armor of light" when we "put on the Lord Jesus Christ."

As a whole, our world is not dressed for success. Many approach life with the attitude of "what will I get out of this" or "what will make me feel good". Sometimes this attitude is also present in the church. In fact, every one of us probably struggles with this attitude from time to time.

When we struggle with this attitude, we should remind ourselves of the words of Paul. "You know the

time, that the hour has come for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed."

Not only should we put off the works of darkness, but we need to dress ourselves in Jesus Christ. We need to take on his attitudes, his faith, his love, and live by his teachings. Being dressed in Jesus Christ excludes the possibility of being dressed in our own desires. Are you dressed for success?

Christianity on the Jobsite

What is Christianity?

For some, it is simply one piece of life. We can take it out, and it doesn't leave any effect on other aspects of our life. We can put it on when needed, or we can leave it at the church building when we desire to do something else.

However, that's not the Biblical picture of Christianity. As Jesus enumerated the two "greatest" commands, the first contained "all" four times. If we paraphrase it, Jesus taught that we should love God with all we have.

Paul continued the thought in Romans 12, where he told the readers to offer their bodies "as living sacrifices" (v. 1). To follow that directive, all we do must have God at the center.

Christianity, then, should be more like the center of an old wagon wheel. Every time the center of that wheel turns, everything turns with it. It holds every part of our life together. It provides stability to the whole.

As Paul continues his letter to Titus, he reminds the young preacher that some aren't the "boss" of their situation. Slaves, though often treated poorly (or extremely poorly in some cases), were still to follow Christ and show His light in their working lives.

In our modern society, we are growing ever more lazy and disillusioned with the concept of work. We go to work only to earn a paycheck, never thinking that our place of employment could be a mission field and a place to show the love of Christ.

Chances are, you work with someone who needs to become a Christian. Have you ever thought that how you work and your attitudes on the jobsite could influence that person towards (or away from) Christ?

Sure, bad days will come in any job, but Christians should continually be diligent in work, and should continue to show a shining light on the jobsite.

Let's think about that this morning.

From Tyler's Desk:

Christ Our Example

Imagine Jesus before he walked this earth. Imagine him working with the Father when the world was created. Imagine him enjoying the all of the praise and glory of God. Imagine him perfect, holy, and completely removed from all sin.

Now think of this same Jesus hanging on a cross. Think of the crowd mocking him. Think of your sins which he bore. Think of the shame he endured.

Now focus on the steps it took to bring Jesus from his holiness to his lowliness. Jesus had to first become a man. But not only was he a man, but he put himself into the role of a servant of all other men. He had a heart of humility. He was humble before God, and therefore willingly obeyed him; an obedience which eventually led him to the cross. He then endured the shame of the cross, so that one day, he could bring us with him into the glory of heaven.

In Philippians chapter 2, Paul reminds us of this journey of humility. But not only did Paul remind us of Christ's humility, he also challenged us to follow his example. In verses 4-5 he wrote, "Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus."

Paul encourages the church to think like Jesus thought. Don't look after your own interests. Don't be consumed with your own goals, and ambitions and happiness. Christians must be willing to lay aside every selfish desire so that we may become servants of others. We will never enjoy the glory of heaven unless we are first willing to carry his cross. Christians should be willing to do whatever needs to be done, even if it goes

unnoticed. We may not receive much glory in this life, but if we humble ourselves now, we will one day stand in the presence of the glory of God.

Facing Monumental Decisions

His master, Abraham, had given him total authority in the finding of a bride for Isaac. He swore to the patriarch that he would not seek a wife from among the Canaanites but would find one among Abraham's relatives in Mesopotamia. He promised that under no condition would he take Isaac back to Chaldea, for Isaac was to inherit the land God had promised to Abraham and his descendants.

It likely took several days, even weeks, before the unnamed servant reached his destination. One can only imagine what thoughts he had as he traveled. But when he arrived in Mesopotamia, he prayed fervently that God would give him success and thereby show kindness to Abraham.

God answered his prayer in a most remarkable way. Even before he had finished praying, the future bride was standing beside him.

As it became apparent that God had heard him, and he learned that indeed Rebekah was from Abraham's family, "the man bowed down his head and worshipped the Lord,"-Gen. 24:26. He was so thankful that God's mercy had been shown to him. There is more to the story (read Genesis 24), but think of the following lessons we can learn:

- Prayer should be a vital part of the selection of the person anyone is dating or contemplating marrying.
- 2. Prayer should precede every major decision we make. When faced with crisis, pray!
- 3. Prayer is heard in heaven and God answers.
- 4. Prayer that is answered should be followed by a prayer of thanksgiving that God has heard us.
- 5. Prayer should not be hidden. Don't be afraid to pray publicly because of what others might think.
- 6. Prayer shaped the destiny of Abraham's family and it affects the destiny of yours.

Marking Your Bible: Good Works

One of the best ways to study the word of God that this author finds very profitable is to mark the Bible so that you will remember why that is a significant point in that passage. Paul wrote some inspired letters to a congregation of Christians at Ephesus and to some young preachers named Timothy and Titus. One of the key phrases that Paul uses frequently is "good works". I would urge you to circle these phrases in your Bible. The "good works" phrase is found in Eph. 2:10; I Tim. 2:10; 5:10; 5:25; 6:18; Tit. 2:7, 14; 3:8,14. I would use Eph. 2:10 as my starting point in marking in my margin: "cf. ("good work" passages)."

If you look up these passages, you will notice remarkable aspects that are part of doing good works as a Christian. The first aspect is that in Eph. 2:10 and Tit. 2:14 we learn that God from all of eternity set apart those in His Son's church to walk in good works. Why do Christians walk in good works? Good works lead to glorifying God (Matt. 5:16)! We must earnestly desire to pursue them! (Tit. 2:14). The second aspect in the contexts of 1 Tim. 2:10 and 5:10 is relating to women in how they can promote good works by performing the duties of a servant as Christ, the ultimate Servant, would have done good (Acts 9:36; 10:38). The third aspect of good works in 1 Tim. 5:25 is shown in the context of selecting men who are qualified for the eldership. There are some men who sadly continue in a life of sin that would hinder them from the office, but there are also some men who have a great character that would shine in the community that would be wonderfully qualified for the office and other men who have an attitude of godliness that is hidden that would be qualified also. The fourth aspect of doing good works in 1 Tim. 6:18 is related to giving and sharing. Christians are to work so that they may have something to give to those who are in need (Eph. 4:28). The fifth aspect of good works in Tit. 2:7 would be to show an example of good behavior in both life and in teaching the word of God. The sixth aspect of good works in Tit. 3:8,14 would be edification and

fruitfulness. It relates to building up the community of God to growing spiritually to conform to the image of Christ and helped the vineyard of the Lord to bear spiritual fruit for the harvest for the coming day of God (Matt. 13:24-30; Jn. 4:35). Are you promoting "good works" as a Christian? This author did not put Heb. 10:24 because we do not know whether Paul wrote it or not. It is a fitting admonition for us to consider: "And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and **good works**." In Eph. 2:10, write beside the margin, predestined to do them (cf. Tit. 2:14). Then besides Tit. 2:14, write: earnest pursuit of them! In I Tim. 2:10 and 5:10, write: service! In I Tim. 5:25, write: helps in qualifying for an elder. In I Tim. 6:18, underline "giving" and "sharing". In Tit. 2:7, write: good behavior. In Tit. 3:8, write: edification. In Tit. 3:14, write: fruitfulness!

From Tyler's Desk:

Follow the Leader

As Isaiah wrote of the coming Messiah, he referred to him as "a leader and commander of the peoples" (Isaiah 55:4). About 700 years later, Jesus fulfilled the roles of "leader" and "commander" perfectly.

As our leader, Jesus marched ahead of us, blazing a trail through life, through death, and ultimately to glory. In Hebrews 2:10-11 we read, "For it was fitting that he, for whom and by whom all things exist, in bringing many sons to glory, should make the founder (NKJV "captain") of their salvation perfect through suffering. For he who sanctifies and those who are being sanctified all have one source. That is why he is not ashamed to call them brothers."

Christ did not command us to go where he would not first go. He showed us a life of obedience. He showed us how suffering is that which makes us perfect. And now, having suffered, he has now been resurrected from the dead – glorified. Having lived, suffered, and died as a human, he can lead us as our brother.

As our commander, Jesus expects for us to follow him. Just as he submitted to the Father, so should we. Just as Jesus was willing to suffer for his faith, so should we. And if we follow Jesus in this way, we too will be brought to glory.

We must follow Christ, and not ourselves. We must live for his desires, and not our own. This will require sacrifice. This will be difficult at times. But if we are willing to sacrifice, to suffer, and even die for our faith, we too will be led to His glory.

Marking Your Bible Five Portraits of Grace

It is very important to mark our Bibles since we live very busy lives so that whenever we have the golden opportunity to evangelize to someone we may be able to point them to some scriptures that can benefit both them and ourselves.

The word "grace" (charis) is used frequently in the Bible in various manners. This author would like for us to focus on five different portraits of grace that would help us to see it in a new light than we have previously before in our studies. The first portrait of grace that can be gazed upon is I Peter 3:7. In this context, we understand that the husbands are commanded to do the best they can in keeping constant, open, and intimate communication with their wives. They are to share that type of communication with them on a deeper level. They are to show kindness, courtesy, and respect towards them. They should listen to the insecurities and fears they hold. If the husband will "dwell" in understanding with her, the relationship will be the type of relationship that will be firm and strong. God will not cut off a husband's prayer if his relationship with his wife is seasoned with spirituality. They both share the same inheritance and hope that

God has bestowed freely upon them. Circle "grace" in the "grace of life" and underline "dwell" and "giving honor" and then put it in the margin: *a stronger, spiritual marriage*.

The second portrait of grace that can be gazed upon is I Peter 5:5 along with James 4:6. God is proud of His children who realize the necessity and dependence upon Him fully. Spiritual children realize they cannot live self-sufficiently on their own. The grace of God can motivate them to live a life that the cross that they bear will one day be put down and glory will await them. Circle "clothed with humility" in I Peter 5:5 and draw the line to the word "grace" and circle it. Then place in the margin: humility allows grace to keep working in one's life.

The third portrait of grace that can be gazed upon is Romans 5:21. This type of grace is shown throughout the Bible frequently because all of us have sinned and fallen short of God's glory (Romans 3:23). We are all in need of salvation! God has allowed that access to salvation appear through the death of His Son for all mankind if man will render faith and obedience to the gospel message (Titus 2:11-14). In Romans 5:21, circle "grace" and then place in the margin: God's reign occurs through faith and obedience that will give access to His grace (cf. Rom. 5:1,2).

The fourth portrait of grace that can be gazed upon is Ephesians 4:29. It is when we produce sayings that build up rather than tear down that we are able to produce a spiritual springboard from the words that proceed from our mouths. Circle "grace" and place in the margin: edification imparts grace.

The fifth portrait of grace that can be gazed upon is Hebrews 4:16. We as Christians are weak and need constant help from heaven. We need the Lord to help guide us through our lives. He is ever willing to impart His favor toward those who are walking in the light. Circle "grace" and write in the margin: *Grace continues about when we will depend upon God.* Some of these portraits this author prays we will gaze upon because it will help motivate us to become more conformed to the image of our Lord Jesus Christ.



Marking Your Bible

Joseph Was Not The Only One Who Fled Away

As we study through the word of God, we come across what we might call "great heroes of the Bible." We think about heroes such as David who slew the great giant, Goliath (I Samuel 16). We think about heroes such as Gideon who trusted in the Lord to deliver the Midianites into the Israelites' hands (Judges 6-8).

One of the great heroes that this author admires is Joseph, the son of Jacob. More than a fifth of the book of Genesis is devoted to his account. Everyone knows the story of Joseph and how he was sold by his brothers into slavery and was taken down to Egypt. We also know the account of how Potiphar's wife tried to seduce Joseph into having a sexual relationship with him. Yet he asked one of the most courageous questions of our time, "There is no one greater in this house than I, nor has he kept back anything from me but you, because you are his wife. How then can I do this great wickedness, and sin against God?" (Genesis 39:9) Day by day, this temptation was being pushed on loseph as we see in verse 10. Look at the account in verses 11-15: "But it happened about this time, when Joseph went into

the house to do his work, and none of the men of the house was inside, that she caught him by his garment, saying, "Lie with me." But he left his garment in her hand, and fled and ran outside. And so it was, when she saw that he had left his garment in her hand and fled outside, that she called to the men of her house and spoke to them, saying, "See, he has brought in to us a Hebrew to mock us. He came in to me to lie with me, and I cried out with a loud voice. And it happened, when he heard that I lifted my voice and cried out, that he left his garment with me, and fled and went outside."

This author is graciously thankful for the account of the encounter that Joseph had because he wants to have the mindset that Joseph possessed in dealing with temptations that tend to be hurled at a child of God. One of the most remarkable lessons this writer learned that he never realized before was that loseph was not the only one that ran away. Why would this author say that? Look at James 4:7: "Therefore submit to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you." What occurs when the Christian resists against the devil's snares? The devil turns out to be a coward and retreats! When Joseph fled from Potiphar's wife, the devil fled away from Joseph! What a great spiritual truth that we can impart to our lives as we go about through the struggles in this life when the world bombards us with all kinds of temptations! Let us remember that when we resist temptation, we will not be the only ones who flee, but our great archenemy will too! Circle the word "fled" in Genesis 39:13 and put in the margin: Joseph was not the only one who fled away (cf. James 4:7).

My Favorite Bible

Through the years, I have owned quite a few Bibles. I have two shelves in my office containing nothing but Bibles. They differ in size, translation, and binding. But of all the Bibles I own, one is particularly treasured by me. It is a little black Red Letter New Testament (3"x4.5") that I have had for the past 39 years. You've seen some like it before. It's the kind of Bible given to little children, and it is small enough for them to hold it in their little hands. The print in this Bible is just about too small to read. There are no study notes in it. And it only contains the New Testament. So what makes this Bible so special to me? Allow me to read the inscription on the first page:

"This New Testament is being presented to Steve Higginbotham for being the first in his Bible Study class to be able to say from memory all the 66 books of the Bible. Keep up the Good Work. God Bless you always. Your Bible Class Teachers, Mrs. Hester Shultz & Miss Sandy Wilson"

Isn't it amazing the impact that a few words of encouragement can have on a person's life? I was just four-years-old when this Bible was presented to me, but thirty-nine years later, I still treasure, and have this little Bible in my possession. My guess is that Hester (who is now deceased) and Sandy have no memory of the presentation of this Bible, or the message they inscribed in it. I'm sure they have no idea that something done so long ago, and something that cost so little, and took only but a moment of their time, would be so treasured by the little boy to whom they presented it.

My point? There is life-time lasting power and influence in encouragement! What takes us only a moment to say or do, can impact another person for the rest of his life. Be an encourager! Take the time and the little extra effort to compliment, commend, and encourage another. Chances are, long after you've forgotten your words of kindness, they will be lockedup, and cherished as a prize possession in the store room of someone's mind.

Only paths as ancient as the New Testament are old enough to require that we walk therein.

Marking Your Bible

The Miracle of the Pot

How many of you have ever eaten something that tasted awful? How many of you have ever eaten something and felt like you were going to die? In the text that will be studied that is what these prophets felt like... they were going to die! This is certainly a strange text of the Bible. How can we apply it today?

To understand the background of 2 Kings 4:38-41, we have to realize that this event was during the reign of Jehoram. He was a wicked king of Israel that allowed the nation to be influenced by idolatry. Elisha, the prophet, spent a lot of time within the schools of the prophets. It was important for the prophets to know that the departure of Elijah was not the end of God's work among Israel. One of these prophetic schools was in Gilgal. There was a famine in the land so food was scarce. One of the prophets had brought gourds from a wild vine and it was cut up into the pottage to be prepared for the meal. When they ate of the pottage, they thought they were going to die! Elisha was able to calm the situation by performing a miracle. The immediate purpose of this miracle was to stop the fear of the prophets for their lives and make the meal edible to eat. The ultimate purpose was to assure the prophets that Elisha was the spokesman for God now instead of Elijah. Keith McCasin made a very wise observation on this passage in his book, What the Bible Says About Miracles: "If God could work through Elisha to make spoiled food good, He could work through Elisha to bring spiritual flavor in a land spoiled with idolatry" (272). So if you want to mark in your Bible, mark 2 Kings 4:38-41 and put: Miracle showed that Elisha was a true prophet.

The application for this lesson is that God can use us to help feed people spiritually. We can change a person's spiritual appetite by helping them to come to know Jesus Christ. The devil wants us to spiritually die. He wants us to feed on poisonous food. God wants

us to know that Jesus is that healthy, spiritual food that we should desire to eat instead (John 6:35-51; Matthew 5:8). We should have the desire to share that spiritual food with others around us who are dying spiritually.

The Silence of Scripture

The well-known Bible expositor Leon Morris once said the silence of the Scriptures are just as much due to inspiration as are its statements (commenting on Hebrews 7:3). This is an important recognition by him (many other Bible students have recognized the same). For unity to be maintained by God's people, they must go to the Scriptures and be unified on what is said, not on what is not said. Unfortunately, many want people to be unified when they go beyond what the Scriptures reveal. It can't be done.

What this great Bible expositor said did not originate with him; it was true long before he lived. In Hebrews 7:14, the Scriptures said that Moses spoke nothing concerning the priesthood of Jesus. Under the old covenant, God's priests came from Levi. When God said the tribe of Levi would be His priestly tribe, He did not need to say who was excluded—it was understood (cf. Leviticus 10:12 and strange fire). We, on the other hand, seem to want God to specify that which is forbidden before we accept it as something to not be done. Many feel as if man has not enough information to make good judgments. Evidently, the Lord thought He said all He needed to say on particular topics. For us to go beyond what He said is to be presumptuous.

When God has revealed Himself on a topic, He is obligating us to follow His lead. He has not given us the prerogative to lead where He did not express himself, that is, in things religious.

From Tyler's Desk:

The Light of the World

In our culture we are not accustomed to darkness. At night there are always lights on. Street lights automatically come on at dusk. Our homes become well lit with just a flip of a switch. Many of us have motion-censored floodlights which turn on as soon as we pull in the driveway. On the rare occasion of a power outage, we scramble in the dark to immediately find a flashlight. If a flashlight can't be found, we will resort to using at least the dim light provided by a cell phone so that we can see the few inches in front of us. We rarely experience what its like to be in complete and utter darkness.

This has not always been the case. In Bible times, there would have been very little artificial light. For the most part the day was divided into two profoundly different sections; twelve hours of light, and twelve hours of darkness. When it became dark, you couldn't do much. You would have to wait until day to accomplish your work. You could not travel at night; it would be too dangerous. Night was the time when criminals would be out. Often at night, wild animals would prowl the streets. The difference between day and night was profound. Darkness was dangerous. Darkness was overwhelming. Everything became more difficult in the dark.

In John 8:12, Jesus boldly claims, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in

darkness, but will have the light of life." In a world of darkness and sin, Jesus was the light. In a world overrun with the terrors of Satan, Jesus was the daylight. He enlightens us. He guides us. He exposes errors which are hidden by darkness. He shows the correct way!

But just as light cannot mix with darkness, if we are to walk in the light, this excludes the possibility of walking in the darkness of sin. But through our avoidance of sin, and our dedication to righteousness, we too can have the light of life.



Jesus: The Master Teacher

In John 3:2, Nicodemus made a simple, yet profound observation concerning Christ: "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him."

His observation was simple in that his conclusion was obviously clear. There could be no other explanation. At this time, lesus' reputation as a miracle worker was quickly spreading. He had recently turned water into wine at a wedding feast. And this was just the start. From Cana to Capernaum, to Jerusalem, everywhere Jesus went, he performed signs. Nicodemus clearly followed the logic: If Jesus is doing things that no man can do, God must be with him, and if God is with him, then his teachings must be from God.

Although the conclusion that Jesus was from God was clear to see, its impact was tremendous. Being sent from God, his teaching was not like that of other teachers. Following the Sermon on the Mount, the crowds were astonished, "for he was teaching them as one who had authority, and not as their scribes" (Matt. 7:29). His words mirrored the graciousness of God (Luke 4:22). And while his message was from God, lesus was still able to connect it to the common man through parables so that his listeners could understand (Mark 4:34).

In response to Nicodemus' observation, Jesus

taught Nicodemus about the kingdom of God - which was the purpose of his preaching (Mark 1:15). As we strive for this spiritual kingdom, we must follow the teachings of the master teacher - lesus.



From Tyler's Desk:

Does Jesus Recognize You?

Its often easy to tell where a person is from by simply observing their style of dress, language or accent. Jesus opened the Sermon on the Mount by listing various characteristics by which a citizen of his kingdom could be recognized. This section of Scripture is most often referred to as the beatitudes (Matthew 5:2-10).

Citizens of His kingdom should be easily recognized, for they are poor in spirit; they have a humble opinion of themselves. They mourn, but not in the same way others mourn; in their mourning they seek comfort from God. They are meek; their strength is under control. Their great desire for righteousness can be described as "hunger" and "thirst." They extend mercy, even towards those who don't deserve it. They are pure in heart; someone who is sincere, honest, and without hypocrisy. They are peacemakers, having devoted themselves to making peace, just as their Father has done. And finally they are willing to be persecuted for righteousness' sake.

As a unit, the beatitudes make one point very clear. A citizen of the kingdom of heaven is different from others in the world. A person cannot enter into God's kingdom without allowing themselves to be changed.

Do you exhibit the characteristics of a Christian? Are you different from others in the world? Based on this description, can Jesus recognize you as a citizen of His kingdom?

From Tyler's Desk:

Jesus Teaches About Righteousness

"You shall not kill (but its ok to hate!)"

"You shall not commit adultery (but its ok to lust!)"

"You shall not swear falsely (but if you're not swearing, its ok to lie!)"

"You shall love your neighbor (but hate your enemies!)"

These were some of the teachings of the Pharisees. Sometimes the teachings were vocalized; other times they went unsaid. But they were always clearly taught through their hypocrisy.

Sometimes we forget that the Pharisees were LOOKING for the kingdom of God. In fact, the Pharisees prided themselves on being the most holy of all the Jews. They followed God's commandments strictly. They gave to the poor. They prayed and fasted often. Its no wonder so many of them flocked to the man called "Jesus" when he came preaching about the kingdom of heaven. They had hoped to find a warrior, a revolutionary, and a great king who would restore Israel to its former greatness!

But the sermon they heard was not what they expected. Yes, they found a warrior, but his weapon was not a sword. Yes, they found a revolutionary, but the Romans were not his enemies. Yes, they found a king, but his kingdom was not of this world.

As he taught, his sword of truth destroyed their teachings. He led a revolution against the idea that following God was simply an outward act. The Pharisees quickly found their own sinful ways to be his enemies.

"Therefore whoever relaxes one of the least of theses commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." – Matthew 5:19-20

The "righteousness" of the Pharisees was in fact not "righteousness" at all. Its easy to attend church. Its easy to be listed in the directory. Its easy to memorize the steps of salvation. Its easy to label ourselves as "Christians." But we cannot be a part of His kingdom unless we are changed in our hearts. We must be fully devoted to following him. When our hearts hunger and thirst for righteousness, an obedience to all the commandments will naturally follow. Only then can we truly claim citizenship in His kingdom.

Garbage

Many years ago while a student at Freed-Hardeman University in the class "Preacher And His Work" brother Tom Holland stressed the necessity of the preacher being a faithful and godly man. This was such a practical class but one rich with memorable moments. I recall one of those classes vividly.

While enumerating several things which preachers must avoid he specifically stated that no Christian and especially no preacher should ever go see a "dirty movie." One student quickly responded to brother Holland with this question: "But, brother Holland, have you ever been to a dirty movie? If not, how do you know what is in them?" To which brother Holland offered a classic answer: "No, I haven't, but I don't have to stick my head in a trash can to know what garbage is..." That response became an oft repeated phrase by many of us who were in that class.

Many times I have reflected upon the profundity of that answer. Does one have to experience sin to know how bad it really is? Obviously not. In Revelation 2:18-29, lesus addresses the church at Thyatira. Among the problems that existed at that church was a seductive woman in the mold of the Old Testament woman lezebel. She was seducing people to commit fornication and eat things sacrificed to idols. When prescribing what the church should do he said, ""Now to you I say, and to the rest in Thyatira, as many as do not have this doctrine, who have not known the depths of Satan, as they say, I will put on you no other burden." (Revelation 2:24 NKJV). Key on the phrase, "have not known the depths of Satan, as they say." Evidently those following this modern day Jezebel were saying, "don't knock it until you have tried it." Peter described them by saying, "they promise them liberty, they themselves are slaves of corruption;" (2 Peter 2:19 NKJV).

You don't have to try sin out for yourself. Read the Bible and you will know what is the garbage. "Through Your precepts I get understanding; Therefore I hate every false way." (Psalms I 19:104 NKJV).



From Tyler's Desk:

Jesus Teaches About Finances

Matthew 6:34 is often considered one of the most difficult commandments in the Bible to follow. It reads, "Do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble."

This commandment was given by Jesus as a conclusion to a section written about money management. In the previous verses, Jesus compared two lifestyles: a life of worry and a life of trust. Jesus admonished us to consider the birds of the air, and the lilies and grass of the field. Since God takes care of these, we can know he will take care of us.

Although the logic is sound, practical application of this principle can be much more difficult. It can be difficult not to worry about money when friends are losing jobs, gas prices are increasing, the car is breaking down, and the kids want to go to the movies with their friends. However, if we can remember and apply the principles written in the previous verses, it can make "not worrying" a little easier to do.

Beginning in Matthew 6:19, Jesus made three comparisons (all of which are closely related). He compared two treasures, two sets of priorities, and two masters.

Two Treasures

"Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and dust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal." (Matt. 6:19-20)

The first principle is to remember what's really important. Money may come, and money may go, but heavenly treasure will last forever. If we are right in our relationship with God, we will have treasure and security which cannot be taken away from us.

Two Sets of Priorities

"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. The eye is the lamp of the body. So, if your eye is healthy, your whole body will be full of light, but if your eye is bad, the whole body will be full of darkness." (Matt. 6:21-23)

When taken in context, Jesus' second point is more clearly understood. If our eyes are focused on God, we will always be filled with the comfort of light. But if our eyes are focused on earthly wealth, we will be filled with the fear of darkness.

Two Masters

"No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate one and love the other, or he will be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money." (Matt. 6:24)

We must decide what is most important. Only when we have the right treasure, the right priorities, and the right master, can we truly avoid worrying about finances.



The Fallacy of Inherited Sin

There is nothing in the Bible which teaches that men inherit the sin of Adam, or that men are born in a state of sin. A person becomes a sinner when he commits sin, and he commits sin when he transgresses Gods' law."Whosoever commits sin transgresses also the law: for sin is the transgression of the law." (I John 3:4) A baby cannot be a sinner because he or she has not transgressed God's law. The prophet Ezekiel said, "The soul that sins shall die. The son shall not suffer for the iniquity of the father, nor the father suffer for the iniquity of the son; the righteousness of the righteous shall be upon himself, and the wickedness of the wicked shall be upon himself." (Ezekiel 18:20) Hence, sin is not transferred from one generation or person to another. All men are sinners, not because they have inherited sin, but because "...all have sinned..." (Romans 3:23). And since we stand or fall based upon our actions, we are not responsible for others. As Paul said, "...each of us shall give account of himself to God." (Romans 14:12)

An infant is completely innocent. God says in Ezekiel 28:15, "You were perfect in your ways from the day you were created, till iniquity was found in you." So we see that an infant is born perfect and without sin until he becomes of an accountable age and then begins to sin.

The doctrine that teaches that infants are born sinners and must be baptized in order to be saved is a perversion of God's word because it contradicts God's word. In Ezekiel 18:4 the word of God says, "Behold, all souls are Mine; the soul of the father as well as the soul of the son is mine: the soul that sins shall die." So we see from this passage that God is telling us that children do not inherit sin from their parents, their grandparents, or any of their forefathers, all the way back to Adam. God's word says, "The son shall not bear the guilt of the father." Each person is responsible for his or her own sins. According to this verse, it is "The soul who sins shall die." Does it say that the soul that inherits sin, it shall die? No. It says the soul who sins.

So what is sin? I John 3:4 says, "Whoever commits sin also commits lawlessness: and sin is lawlessness." We do not inherit sin; we commit sin; and we commit sin when we commit lawlessness. An infant has not broken any law of God and thus has not committed any sin. One who has not committed sin is not separated from God, for it is our sins that cause us to be separated from the Father in the first place, not our birth: "Behold, the Lord's hand is not shortened, that it cannot save, or His ear dull, that it cannot hear; but your iniquities have made a separation between you and your God, and your sins have hid His face from you so that He does not hear." (Isaiah 59:1-2)

From Tyler's Desk:

Jesus Teaches About Judging Others

Matthew 7:1 is one of the most frequently used (and misused) Bible verses. It quotes Jesus as having said, "Judge not, that you be not judged." However, this verse is most often quoted to suggest that we should never judge anyone. Is someone living in sin? "Judge not!" Is someone teaching something contrary to the Bible? "Judge not!"

Was Jesus suggesting that no man EVER has any right to pass any sort of judgment on anyone else? For just a moment, lets examine what Jesus was not teaching, followed by understanding what Jesus was teaching.

What Jesus Was Not Teaching:

Jesus was not making a blanket statement that we should never judge another person. Consider the

context of Matthew chapter 7. In verse 6 Jesus said, "Do not give dogs what is holy, and do not throw your pearls before pigs." Does this not imply a judgment? We must be first judge to discern who are the dogs and pigs.

A few verses later, Jesus warned "Beware of false prophets!... you will recognize them by their fruits" (vs. 15-16). Again, Jesus instructs us to be wise enough to judge who is teaching what is true and who is teaching what is false. He continues to explain that their "fruits" are whether or not they are doing the will of their Father (v. 21).

The logical conclusion is we are permitted and instructed to judge others in comparison to God's word. This principle is taught in various other scriptures as well (John 7:24; I Corinthians 5:9-13; I John I:4)

What Jesus Was Teaching:

Although the verse is often used to defend teachings Jesus never intended, we must not miss the important point Jesus was making.

First of all, Jesus instructed, "With the measure you use, it will be measured to you." Do you want others to be loving, forgiving, patient, and merciful with you? If so, you must be forgiving, patient and merciful in your judgments of others.

Secondly, Jesus condemned the judgment of others without first examining ourselves. "Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye?" (v. 3). It is so easy to study the Bible or listen to a sermon and think, "I really wish 'so-and-so' would listen to this!" As we study God's word, our primary concern should be our own lives and our own improvements.

To say we should never pass judgment is an abuse of Jesus' teachings. However, a failure to apply the truth Jesus was teaching would be equally sinful.







Hello from New Zealand!

We've had a productive week this week in New Plymouth, New Zealand. We started the week by stuffing 8000 mailboxes with invitations to a marriage and family seminar. The church held the Seminar on Monday-Wednesday night. We had one visitor who attended every service. She was a member of a denomination. but kept coming back. She said, "I love the way you really dig into the meat of the Bible. I wish my church did this more."

On Tuesday we followed up by beginning our door knocking campaign. We have knocked 540 doors (about half of which were home). Of these contacts, 7 studies were established. Of those 7 studies, 3 have since lost interest. But the other 4 studies have become continuous studies, where we stop by for an hour long study each day. Those four studies are going very well, have been very encouraging and have made the entire trip worthwhile.

I have been involved with one particular study with a 35 year old man named Nathan. He has been asking smart, and sometimes difficult questions, but he always accepts truth and sound reasoning without further argument. We have now had four days of study with him. I ended the last study by asking him what it would mean to him if he knew without a doubt that lesus had risen from the dead. He responded, "I would have to regard him with the utmost respect, and submit myself to whatever he says." His mother was also present, and although she was less receptive, in response to the same

question she said, "I guess that is the most important question we can ever ask." I will be continuing my study with them on Monday. Please keep Nathan, and all the other continuing studies in your prayers.

Tomorrow morning we will begin another week of door knocking and Bible studying. This Thursday we will be heading out of town to host a youth and young adult camp for Christians from all around New Zealand. This camp will last through Monday, and I will be flying back to Tennessee on Tuesday, June 8th. Please keep all of the work here in New Zealand in your prayers. I am looking forward to seeing you all soon. In Him, Tyler

What A Word This Is!

(LUKE 4:36)

Hosanna! — hosanna — hosannah' — Of Hebrew origin; oh save!; hosanna (that is, hoshia-na), an exclamation of adoration: - hosanna. (Strong's, #5614)

This word is used six times in the New Testament. It occurs in each of the records of the triumphant entrance by the Lord into the city of Jerusalem (Mt 21:1-17; Mk 11:1-19; Jn 12:12-19). When the people cried out "Hosanna!" it was a plea for salvation but more specifically it was a exclamation of praise to the one who could provide help in a time of need. In modern times the word "Hallelujah!" would express a similar sentiment.

Today we should proclaim "Hosanna!" to Christ because it is he who still offers salvation to all who obey him (Heb 5:8-9). As the angels proclaimed at his birth "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, and good will toward men." (Lk 2:14) so we should herald praises to God for having sent Christ to die for us (Rom 5:). "Hosanna!" to the Holy Spirit who provided us with the knowledge of this great salvation (2 Tim 3:16-17).

"Hosanna!" What a word this is!

New Zealand Campaign Review

Due to the support and prayers of so many of you, I was blessed with an incredible opportunity to participate in a campaign for Christ in New Zealand from May 18 – June 8. The campaign led by Kevin Moore of Henderson, TN. Brother Moore is a former missionary to New Zealand and is currently planning on returning in December for two more years of work.

Twenty-two of us participated in the campaign. We split into three groups, and spent a majority of the time in three different towns. As a result of God's work, approximately 12,200 pieces of literature were distributed, 2,500 homes were personally visited through door-knocking. Thirty-four studies were established. About a third of those whom we studied with have since lost interest, while the church has been working hard to follow up on the remaining twenty to twenty-five studies. Several of these individuals are showing very serious interest in becoming Christians.

In addition to the evangelistic efforts, I was also blessed with the opportunity to deliver 3 sermons and teach a bible class each week. The church in New Plymouth, NZ also hosted a 3 day marriage and family seminar.

The final weekend we held a weekend camp. Christians from all over the north island of New Zealand attended, plus a couple who made the flight all the way from Australia to be with us. The theme of the camp was "How To Live Right, In a World Gone Wrong."

From almost the moment we set foot in New Zealand, the campaign was a success. NZ Christians were strengthened and given a morale boost, thousands of NZ households were given the opportunity to hear the gospel, and those of us who participated have returned home with a renewed zeal for the Lord. Even more results are expected in the months to come. Thank you to everyone who helped in providing me this opportunity, and for your prayers while I was gone.



From Tyler's Desk:

A Persecutor of Christians

Who came to mind when you read the title of this article? More than likely, you thought of Paul (formally called Saul). But this article is not about Paul. It's a story that happened not too long ago. It's a true story of a man I met and studied with in New Zealand.

When I knocked on Kyle's door, I wasn't impressed. His shirt was dirty. His house was full of flies. He had a 4 year old boy, who didn't look like he had ever taken a bath. He didn't have a job. He didn't appear to be making much of his life at all. BUT, he was interested in studying the Bible, so we arranged a time to come back and study with him.

When I met with him later in the week, we started studying the Sermon on the Mount. As we looked through the Scriptures, we observed how Jesus taught that becoming a part of his kingdom demanded living with a changed heart. It didn't take long before we read Matthew 5:11-12; "Blessed are you when others revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven."

Kyle then proceeded to tell me a little bit of his past. Since 1990, he had been in and out of jail for various crimes. During one particular stay, another man was put in prison for 2nd degree murder. Nothing too unusual here.

But then the murderer changed. He started reading the Bible, and claiming to be a Christian. Kyle, along with the other prisoners couldn't comprehend this."What right does a murderer have to be reading a good book like the Bible!? He should be crying himself to sleep each night for what he has done!" Kyle told me these were his and the other prisoners' thoughts exactly.

So they beat him. Severely. But after beating him, this man did the most astonishing thing of all. He went back to reading his Bible. So they beat him some more! Each time they beat him, he always returned to reading his Bible.

Kyle told me he noticed something about this man. "He had something. He has what I want." The reason we were able to study with Kyle, was because of the example he had seen. The church is continuing to study with Kyle, and he has been regularly visiting worship since we left. Please keep him in your prayers.

I hope none of us are ever put in that man's position. But if we are ever persecuted for our faith, I hope our example will impact others the way this prisoner impacted Kyle.



Maybe you think this is poor timing. I know, I've been here less than two weeks; but I really do want a raise.

Now that I have your attention, and before you have heart failure or start a petition to impeach this presumptuous preacher, let me explain: I'm not talking about my salary! That's not the kind of "raise" I have in mind. But seriously, I really do want a raise.

I want a raise in <u>attendance</u>. Of course there is much more to Christianity than just attending Bible classes and assemblies. But attendance is essential! There is more to living than just breathing, too, but how long can you survive without air? Attendance was up this past Sunday – the morning count was 99! Why not have triple digits from now on?

The early Christians "continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine, and in fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers" (Acts 2:42). Let us do the same. No doubt some of us ought to improve our attendance habits. Will you accept the challenge? I want a raise!

I want a raise in <u>enthusiasm!</u> Years wrinkle the skin, but lack of enthusiasm wrinkles the soul. Did you know our word enthusiasm is composed of two words meaning "God in us"? What greater motive could we have for being zealous than the knowledge that the Lord dwells within us? Jesus "gave Himself for us, that he might redeem us from every lawless deed and purify for Himself His own special people, zealous of good works" (Titus 2:14).

May each of us be consumed, as Jesus was, with zeal for God's house (John 2:17). If enthusiasm were as easy to arouse as suspicion, just think what could be accomplished. I want a raise!

Tools In God's Box

Romans 6:13 tells us our body is an instrument, and we choose to use it for righteousness or unrighteousness. The Greek word translated "instrument" there means "tool or weapon." What kind of tool or weapon are you? Are you an instrument God holds in His hand to do His will?

Are you a battering ram? The ancients would use a log or some other hard object to break down a wall or door. Have we filled our hearts with the Word to the degree that we can, speaking the truth in love (Ephesians 4:15), break down barriers keeping the honest-hearted from God?

Are you a crowbar? Crowbars pry objects apart. There are things we should separate from our thinking and lifestyle. Are we trying to pull away from worldliness? (cf. James 4:4)

Are you a chisel? This is a tool that does meticulous, detailed work. Its blade carves or cuts hard materials. Do we have the tenacity and trust needed to use God's Word and benefit from His providence to remake our lives into the image of Christ? (2 Corinthians 3:18)

Are you a level? We live in not only a dishonest world but also a corrupt world. So many call good evil and evil good (cf. Isaiah 5:20). Can people find in us a reliable standard of right and wrong, as we reflect the principles of God's Word? Levels are used to determine whether something is true and as it ought to be.

Are you a plane? The plane makes rough surfaces smooth by repeatedly moving it back and forth across the surface. All four Gospels (Matthew 3:3, Mark 1:3, Luke 3:4, John 1:23) speak of John the immerser's work as making ready the path of the Lord, making His paths straight. We are not fore- runners of Jesus; we follow in His steps (cf. I Peter 2:21). As we do follow Him, we are going to forge a path safe for others to follow (cf. I Corinthians II:1).

Are you a magnet? A magnet is an object that draws and holds another object disposed toward such attraction. Magnets can be used as tools themselves, but they are often made a part of other tools, such as hammers and screwdrivers. By living like Jesus, you will draw people to Him.

Paul also referred to "tools" or "weapons" when talking to the Corinthians. He mentions "armor of righteousness" and "weapons" of our warfare (same word). In both cases, the tools or weapons are spiritual and figurative, yet with them we can help shape and build up those around us.







Be Honest. Is Your God A Burden?

I may be wrong, but from my perspective, most people feel that God is a burden. I think most people realize they have a need for God, but they struggle with it. For them, God often gets in the way of life, and especially the fun things. God seems to be more tolerated than enjoyed. And there seems to be a lot of guilt and fear and dread in connection with God. Religion that has been reduced to ritual and obligation has become burdensome. People feel obligated to go to church, but they don't really enjoy it. They've fulfilled their duty, but that's about it. It's the same with giving and evangelism and just about anything else God expects. They are just heavy burdens to be borne, more like slavery than freedom.

That kind of a god is not much different from the gods Isaiah wrote about close to 3000 years ago: "the images that are carried about are burdensome, a burden for the weary" (Isaiah 46:1). We don't have images of wood, stone and metal to tote around, but we do have false concepts of God that are heavy and tiring. Instead of allowing God to carry us, we feel like we have to carry him. A god like that robs us of the joy that the true God intends for us to experience. They think, "There are so many rules and restrictions. How can anyone possibly keep them all?! And if you did, what a miserable life that would be!"

God, any god, is a burden if we make them ourselves. If our concepts of God are restricted to what we can visualize and design, our god is way too small to lift our burdens, and, in fact, becomes a burden himself.

How grateful we must be to learn that our God is much greater than our concept of him. He can do more than we can imagine (Eph. 3:20-21). He knows more than we can fathom (Deut. 29:29). He didn't begin when we first thought of him, but is eternal (Heb. 13:8). A God like this is not a burden, but instead invites us all to "come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matt. I 1:28). A God like this doesn't rob us of life's pleasures, but instead has "come that they may have life, and have it to the full" (John 10:10). A God like this does not make rules that are a burden, but instead guides us to victory (I John 5:3-5)! A God like this fills us with love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control (Gal. 5:22-23).

When you get out of the way and let God be God, he is never a burden!

Give Me This Mountain

When the children of Israel were wandering in the wilderness Moses sent out spies to survey the situation in Canaan (Numbers 13). Among these spies was one named Caleb. Caleb was one of only two who returned and reported that they could take the land.

According to Joshua chapter fourteen the Lord, through Moses, promised Caleb that he would receive a certain portion of the promise land for his faithfulness in carrying out his responsibility when spying out the land. Forty-five years later, when Joshua was the leader, Caleb reminded Joshua of the Lord's promise and Joshua gives him the land of Hebron.

Caleb received this land because of the qualities he had within him.

- Commitment: Caleb was committed to serving the Lord "the land... shall be thine... because thou hast wholly followed the Lord my God." (14:9).
- Character: Caleb was a man of integrity and faithfulness. He said "...I am as strong this day... as the day that Moses sent me:as my strength was then, even so is my strength now..." (14:11).
- Confidence: Caleb showed confidence by telling Joshua to "...give me this mountain..." and he knew that the Lord wanted him to have the land (14:12).
- 4. **Courage**: Caleb trusted the Lord. Even though the land of Hebron was occupied by the enemy, Caleb was confident that, with the Lord's help, he could drive them out and he had the courage to do so (14:12).

We need to be people who are committed (Rev. 2:10), who have character (I Cor. I3), confidence (Php. 4:13) and courage (2Tim. I:7). The Lord has promised a land for us (Jn. I4:I-4) but only those who remain faithful in carrying out the Lord's work will get to live in this land. This land is Heaven.

God's Thoughts, God's Ways

"For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, declares the LORD. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts." (Isaiah 55:8,9)

It is interesting to watch sporting events on television and hear the broadcasters comment on various plays and circumstances. One familiar scenario comes when a player fails to execute properly and the comment is made that he needs to work on fundamentals. Whether it is tackling (football), pitching (baseball), or putting (golf), they all have the common factor of fundamental execution. If proper technique is not used, the proper result will not be produced consistently.

By the same token, if a person is going to have a consistent, godly life, attention must be given to the fundamentals. If we are going to act as God's people (Titus 2:14; I Peter 2:9), we absolutely must think God's thoughts.

To people who were languishing in immorality and despair, Isaiah sent forth the admonition, "Seek the LORD while he may be found; call upon him while he is near" (Isaiah 55:6). Then, as now, many people felt the need to seek God and wanted to do so on their own terms. The seeking and the calling could not and would not consist of just looking for God in the places and ways they chose to seek him.

Therefore, Isaiah added these words, "Let the wicked forsake his way and the unrighteous man his thoughts"

(Isaiah 55:7). The requirement comes clearly into view: a man who seeks God must be willing to change. That change must begin within. The fundamental requirement for living and acting like God is thinking like God.

Micah, another prophet of God, put it this way: "He has told you O man, what is good, and what does the LORD require of you, but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" All three of these necessary things require thought on the part of the follower of God. Not only do they require thought, but they require sustained effort to maintain the thinking and actions. A man will only be as just, as kind, and as humble as he willfully requires himself to be.

We won't have God's ways until we think God's thoughts. We won't know God's thoughts until we spend time with His word (Psalm 1:2).

Hallowed Be Your Name

In Jesus' great Sermon on the Mount he said, "In this manner, therefore, pray: Our Father in heaven, Hallowed be Your name." Matthew 6:9 NKJV. What does it mean to "hallow" the name of God, and is such being done today?

The original word from which "hallowed" is translated is found twenty-nine times in the Bible and rendered by five different words. sanctified (16); sanctify (6); sanctifies (4); Hallowed (2); and holy (1). God's name is to be held in high regard, it is above and beyond all names. This indicates that it is to be given a high level of respect. For instance, when one enters a court within our country he addresses the judge as "Your honor." Such is the idea expressed in the word "hallowed." "Holy and reverend is his name." Psalms 111:9 ASV.

God has not always received the respect and honor due to Him, even by those who claimed to be His servants. In response to the sinful and shameful way Nadab and Abihu offered their sacrifices God sent fire out of heaven and consumed them. What followed was a stark reminder to Aaron, "And Moses said to Aaron, "This is what the LORD spoke, saying: By those who come near Me I must be regarded as holy; And before all the people I must be glorified." So Aaron held his peace." Leviticus 10:3 NKJV.

One must ask if God is still be held in high esteem and respected today? The world takes God's name in vain almost constantly. The profanity that is spewed from the mouths of many on television, in the work place and at homes is deplorable! They will not escape the judgment of God for so doing. ""You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain, for the LORD will not hold him guiltless who takes His name in vain." Exodus 20:7 NKJV. Yet many more perpetuate this with a number of euphemisms. Many will exclaim, "Oh my God..." or "Gosh" when they are carelessly using the name of the Almighty. There are also euphemisms that have been created based on the name of lesus. When one says, "Gee," "for Christ's sake" or "Lordy" they belittle and devalue the name of our Savior. It has even invaded the acronyms that are used in text messaging. The letters OMG stand for "Oh my God" or TGIF (also the name of a restaurant) stands for "Thank God Its Friday." Christians who text or posts on the social boards should think twice before using (or repeating) things which are profane.

Some may think that this is a minor matter and is "making a much a do about nothing" but it is not! Our society has conditioned us to accept profanity as an acceptable means of communication. It has desensitized us to casually and carelessly using the great name of God. Perhaps this is the reason why the worship being offered in many places has become secular and profane. Now is the time to be reminded of the great and majestic name of God. "But the LORD is in His holy temple. Let all the earth keep silence before Him."" Habakkuk 2:20 NKJV.



When The Lord Names You

There are some interesting names in the Bible. Can one imagine parents naming their son Maher-shalal-hash-baz? But that is what Isaiah and his wife did at the instruction of God (Isaiah 8:1ff). The name was full of meaning regarding the deliverance of Judah from the oppression of Syria and Israel.

In the New Testament the Lord put names on some of the Apostles. For instance, he gave the name "Peter" to Simon and to James and John he gave the name "Boanerges." (Mark 3:16-17). Peter means "rock." Why would the Lord give Peter this name? Speculation may abound but the name means "rock." Given his vacillations and impetuous nature it would seem that this name was anything but appropriate. Perhaps the Lord saw in Peter the potential to be the one the others could count on. When the Lord informed Peter he would stumble and fall, he also revealed he would return. The significance is seen in the Lord's statement, "But I have prayed for you, that your faith should not fail; and when you have returned to Me, strengthen your brethren."" Luke 22:32. In a similar way, the Lord called attention to the two very volatile brothers by calling them Boanerges, which means "Sons of Thunder." They well exhibited this when a Samaritan village rejected the Lord. "And when His disciples James and John saw this, they said, "Lord, do You want us to command fire to come down from heaven and consume them, just as Elijah did?"" Luke 9:54.

However, it wasn't just the Lord who surnamed people. The Apostles did some surnaming themselves.

In Acts 4:36 one reads, "And Joses, who was also named Barnabas by the apostles (which is translated Son of Encouragement) ..." Acts 4:36. Barnabas, as he referred to hereafter was clearly an encouragement to the Apostles (and the church).

Have you ever pondered if the Lord or even the Apostles were here what name they might give you? What might your name mean? Grumpy? Complainer? Talker? Lazy? Fence-straddler? Worldly? Money-lover? Arrogant? Faithful? Diligent? Dedicated? Humble? Kind? Cooperative?

There is a name given by God which we should wear proudly. "You shall be called by a new name, Which the mouth of the LORD will name." Isaiah 62:2. What was that name? "And when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. So it was that for a whole year they assembled with the church and taught a great many people. And the disciples were first called Christians in Antioch." Acts 11:26. "but if a man suffer as a Christian, let him not be ashamed; but let him glorify God in this name." I Peter 4:16 ASV. When the Lord names you, wear it!

For the past twenty-five years I humbly say to the congregation, "Thank You!" Your kindness, patience and encouragement have been much more than was deserved. You have been such a marvelous group of Christians. From the very first you welcomed the Lawrence family into the church family at Bybee Branch. During the past twenty-five years we have seen times of great joy, and experienced times of deep sorrow. We have smiled and laughed as children were born, rejoiced as we saw souls baptized into the Lord, and grieved together as we laid to rest those we have loved so dear. The Old Bible

The first thirty-nine books of the Holy Bible are often referred to as the Old Testament, the Old Law, the Law of Moses, or the Old Bible. Each of these references is Scriptural and correct. The word Bible simply means "book" and because of the Holy Bible's place among other books it has become known as the Book of Books, the Bible. Since the first thirty-nine books are no longer binding upon men today they properly may be referred to as the Old Bible. "In that he saith, a new covenant, he hath made the first old" (Hebrews 8:13).

A Misunderstanding

In a *Christianity Today* Gallup Survey of Americans it was shown that 84% believe the Old Testament, specifically the ten commandments, to be valid today. This general misunderstanding in regard to the Old Law is alarming, "for if righteousness come by the law, then Christ is dead in vain" (Galatians 2:21).

The Purpose Of The Law Of Moses

The purpose of the Law of Moses is stated by Paul in Galatians 3:24-25, "Wherefore the law was our schoolmaster to bring us unto Christ, that we might be justified by faith. But after that faith is come, we are no longer under a schoolmaster." The Old Law "set the stage" for the coming Christ. The work of Moses and the prophets was to prepare the world to receive Christ. "Yea, and all the prophets from Samuel and those that follow after, as many as have spoken, have likewise foretold of these days" (Acts 3:24). Therefore, by his death Christ was "blotting out the handwriting of the ordinances that was against us, which was contrary to us, and took it out of the way, nailing it to his cross (Colossians 2:14).

Our Schoolmaster

If the first testament is old, having been fulfilled in Christ, then why is it still in existence? It is still in existence. It is still the "school master to bring us unto Christ" (Galatians 2:24). It was "written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope" (Romans 15:4). "Now all these things happened unto them for ensamples: and they are written for our admonition" (I Corinthians 10:11a). Of the 84% of Americans who believe the Old Bible to still be in force today over half cannot even identify five of the ten commandments! How well do you know the Old Bible?

The Window To The Soul

It is important READ ALL OF GOD'S WORD. Both the Old and New Testaments will build our faith if we would just READ THEM. The Bible has been called the "window to the soul." Perhaps one reason for this is because the Bible is the powerful word of God which can actually "discern the thoughts and intents of the heart" (Hebrews 4:12). Through an honest and sincere study of the moral and spiritual precepts of the Bible the condition of man's soul is laid bare. And, thus, the idea of the Bible being a "window to the soul."

The Law Of The Lord

David wrote about his devotion to God's law in Psalm 19:7-14:

The law of the Lord is perfect, converting the soul: the testimony of the Lord is sure, making wise the simple. The statues of the Lord are right, rejoicing the heart: the commandment of the Lord is pure, enlightening the eyes. The fear of the Lord is clean, enduring forever: the judgments of the Lord are true and righteous altogether. More to be desired are they than gold, yea, than much fine gold: sweeter also than honey and the honeycomb. Moreover by them is thy servant warned: and in keeping of them there is great reward.

A Final Exhortation

Let me encourage us all to READ ALL OF GOD'S WORD. Following a daily Bible reading schedule is a great way to start to discipline yourself to take time to READ. Paul taught, "Till I come, give attendance to reading, to exhortation, to doctrine" (I Timothy 4:13). - Gary McDade





Do You Know Me?

A small town prosecuting attorney called his first witness to the stand in a trial -- a grandmotherly, elderly woman. He approached her and asked, "Mrs. Jones, do you know me?" She responded, "Why, yes, I do know you Mr. Williams. I've known you since you were a young boy. And frankly, you've been a big disappointment to me. You lie, you cheat on your wife, you manipulate people and talk about them behind their backs. You think you're a rising big shot when you haven't the brains to realize you never will amount to anything more than a two-bit paper pusher. Yes, I know you."

The lawyer was stunned. Not knowing what else to do, he pointed across the room and asked, "Mrs. Jones, do you know the defense attorney?" She again replied, "Why, yes I do. I've known Mr. Bradley since he was a youngster, too. I used to baby-sit him for his parents. And he, too, has been a real disappointment to me. He's lazy, bigoted, he has a drinking problem. The man can't build a normal relationship with anyone and his law practice is one of the shoddiest in the entire state. Yes, I know him."

At this point, the judge rapped the courtroom to silence and called both counselors to the bench. In a very quiet voice, he said with menace, "If either of you asks her if she knows me, you'll be in jail for contempt within 5 minutes!"

We chuckle at stories like this ... and hope that they are not true.

Sometimes we think that we hide our sins and faults in a safety deposit box where we have the only key. Wouldn't it be alarming to have them broadcast in public like this story?! The truth is, others do see our sins and weaknesses ... often better than we see them ourselves. Remember the illustration Jesus used about the log in your own eye and the speck in your brother's eye (Matthew 7:3)? If we can see the sawdust in another's eye, don't you know that the larger problems are even much more visible? In James 5:16 we are told to confess our sins to each other. Some have refrained from doing this because they did not want others to know just how sinful they are. Well, maybe they already know!!

It's for certain that God knows you inside and out. He knows what you do, what you don't do, what you think ... and He knows your motives for all of this. Nothing is hidden from God. So when He tells us to confess our sins, it is not to reveal information to Him; it is to acknowledge that we know how sinful we are. Is there something that you need to acknowledge to God and His people? If you do, lesus will acknowledge you. If you don't, lesus will say, "I never knew you." (Matthew 10:32-33; 7:21-23).

November 2,2010 will be election day. While many may want to participate in voting for or against certain candidates, there is something on this ballot that should draw



the attention of every faithful Christian. The city of McMinnville will be voting on whether or not to permit the sale of packaged liquor. This is a great opportunity to make a statement to the community that we honor God by respecting His word on the abuse of alcohol. There are numerous social and economic reasons for a person to vote "NO" but for the Christian the most important reason is the teachings of God's word. "Woe to him who gives drink to his neighbor, Pressing him to your bottle, Even to make him drunk, That you may look on his nakedness!" Habakkuk 2:15. "Wine is a mocker, Strong drink is a brawler, And whoever is led astray by it is not wise." Proverbs 20:1. Vote NO. Should We Preach Doctrine

Many today would say no. As a result, many "have a zeal for God, but not according to knowledge" (Rom. 10:1-2). Bill Hybels, leader of the mega-church movement recently said, "We brought in a lot of people, but we did not disciple anybody." Many today are attracted to a "feel-good" message but have very little knowledge of the Bible. Joel Olsten, the most popular preacher in America today, recently said on Larry King Live, "I wanted to reach the mainstream. We've reached the church audience. What I do is just try to preach practical principles; I may not bring the scriptures until the end of my sermon and I do not feel bad about that" (Joel Olsteen - Larry King Live). Olsteen preaches what is known as the "prosperity gospel" (an appealing and comforting message free from anything considered to be negative). Olsteen preaches to a congregation of about 16,000 and his services are watched by over 7 million every week in over 100 countries.

What does the Bible say about whether or not a preacher should preach doctrine? 2 Timothy 4:2 answers this question: "Preach the word! Be ready in season and out of season. Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching." Preach the WORD (Bible), at all times. Convince (+ or -), rebuke (-), exhort (+), with all longsuffering and DOCTRINE (teaching). Paul shows us that preaching is both positive and negative; it involves both correction and encouragement. The time has truly come when people do not want to hear the word, but as Paul told Timothy, we must preach it (vv.3-5).

I recall some advice given to me by an older preacher when he said, "you do not have to preach the wrong thing to lead others into perdition, all you have to do is not preach the right thing." Speaking the truth in love incorporates every aspect of preaching. If all we preach is "doctrine" we miss blessings the Bible teaches; if all we preach is "blessings" we are not preaching the whole counsel of God.

What "Bible" Means

I believe that the best definition I've ever read about what the "Bible" means was explained by a small boy. He approached his father and proudly declared, "I know what the Bible means!" You may be aware that the word "Bible" is a transliteration of the Greek word, Biblios, meaning "Book". However, it is no ordinary book. Most acknowledge there had to be a creator, yet fail to realize that the Creator has sought to reveal Himself to man-through nature, His Son, and the Book inspired by His Spirit (Psa. 19:1-9; John 14:9; 2Timothy 3:16-17). Indeed, the Bible does provide the information and direction we need-the Basic Information Before Leaving Earth! God has not left man without what is needed to prepare for eternity.

Trials of Abraham's Faith

Abraham is one of the greatest men who ever lived on earth. His life is discussed more completely and more fully than any other character in the Bible except the Lord Jesus Christ Himself. He was born in the Ur of the Chaldees near the north end of the Persian Gulf. It seems he was born when his father was 130 years old (Gen. 11:26, 32; 12:4; Acts 7:2-4). At the age of 75, he was called to leave his home and to go out to a new land. He was about 80 when he rescued Lot and met Melchizedek. He was 86 when Ishmael was born, 99 when Sodom was destroyed, and 100 when Isaac was born. When Abraham was 137 years old Sarah died. He was 160 when Jacob was born and he died at the age of 175—115 years before Jacob's migration into Egypt.

When God called Abraham, He did not give him a reason for leaving his home—He did make certain promises to Abraham. He promised him that his descendants would inherit the land of Canaan, that they should become a great nation and that through them all nations of the world would be blessed. This promise (Gen. 12:2-3; 22:18) is the foundation of the Scheme of Redemption. God first called Abraham in Ur (Acts 7:2-4; Gen. 11:31). He called him again when Abraham was in Haran (12:1-4). He called him again in Shechem (12:7) and in Bethel (13:14-17), twice in Hebron (15:5, 18; 17:1-8). This promise was repeated to Isaac (26:3-4) and also to Jacob (28:13-14; 35:11-12; 46:3-4).

Abraham was a believer in one God. He lived in a

world of idolatry. His countrymen were idolaters. His father was an idolater (Jos. 24:2). From a youth, he believed in one God. God trusted in Abraham. He selected Abraham to be the founder of a new nation of people who would worship the true God and from whom the Christ would come. Haran was about 600 miles northwest of Ur and nearly 400 miles northeast of Canaan. This was Abraham's first stopping place. He set out from Ur in search of a land where he could build a free nation. He did not know where he was going; God was leading him (Gen. 12:4-9; Heb. 11:8). Haran was already a well-settled region with roads to Babylon, Syria, Egypt, etc., along which caravans and armies constantly marched. After the death of Terah, his father, Abraham, under the call of God, moved on. Shechem was his first stopping place in Canaan. This is the center of the land in a lovely vale between Mount Ebal and Mount Gerizim. Soon he located at Bethel, 20 miles south of Shechem and 10 miles north of Jerusalem. This is one of the highest points in Canaan and gives a magnificent view in every direction. Abraham spent some time in Egypt (Gen. 12:10-20).

After returning to the land, he magnanimously gave Lot his choice of all the Land. Lot foolishly chose to pitch his tent toward Sodom. Abraham chose Hebron in the hill country of Palestine (Gen. 13).

Abraham, with 318 men of his own and some help by neighbors, made a midnight surprise attack on four famous Babylonian kings. He defeated their small armies (Gen. 14). One of these kings "Amraphael" is commonly identified as Hammurabi, the most famous of early Babylonian kings.

Abraham met Melchizedek (14:18-20) who was the king and priest of Salem (Jerusalem). Melchizedek, so

far as his priesthood was concerned, was without father or mother, beginning of days or end of time. He was a type of Christ (Psa. 110; Heb. 5-7). God renewed His promises to Abraham in Genesis chapters 15, 16, and 17. Abraham is called the "friend of God" and "the father of the faithful." All Christians are of the seed of Abraham (Gal. 3:26-29).

Abraham's faith was tested by:

- (1) Separation. God called him to go to a new home (Gen. 12:1-9; Acts 7:1-4).
- (2) Famine (Gen. 12:1-20).
- (3) Riches (Gen. 13).
- (4) Power (Gen. 14).
- (5) Delay. Waited many years for the birth of Isaac and the fulfillment of the promise which God had made to him.

Through all of these tests, Abraham was faithful to God. God blessed him. He reached the end of the journey looking forward to the city which hath foundations, whose builder and maker is God. The trials of Abraham's faith are the very same trials which most Christians have today.

Vote NOT TO PERMIT

There are times when people may not be able to give money. There may be times when due to various reasons one may not be able to make phone calls or solict others to vote on a moral issue. As Peter said to the lame man in Acts 3, ""Silver and gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you..." (Acts 3:6 NKJV). If you live in the city and are registered to vote, you ought to exercise your civic duty to vote. And, spiritually you ought to vote NOT TO PERMIT package liquor sales in the city.

Some want to make this simply a monetary issue. Statistics have shown that the sale of liquor is a losing proposition for revenue. Others want to make this a safety issue. Drunk driving kills and maims. About that there is simply no question. And even others see this as a social issue. The effects of drunkenness on children and families is atrocious. The physical violence and depravation that result from those who consume alcohol is well documented. But this is also a spiritual issue. This is an issue that not only affects one's pocketbook, one's safety, and one's family; it is an issue that affects one's eternal destiny!

""Woe to him who gives drink to his neighbor, Pressing him to your bottle, Even to make him drunk, That you may look on his nakedness!" (Habakkuk 2:15 NKJV).

"Now the works of the flesh are evident, which are: adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lewdness, idolatry, sorcery, hatred, contentions, jealousies, outbursts of wrath, selfish ambitions, dissensions, heresies, envy, murders, drunkenness, revelries, and the like; of which I tell you beforehand, just as I also told you in time past, that those who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God." (Galatians 5:19–21 NKIV).

The Greatest Call

Among the many memories of my childhood are the various calls that came from Mamma. When it was time to eat, she would call, "Dinner is ready," or "It's supper time." We would rush in to find food prepared on the table. If we stayed outside too long, she would call out, "You boys come on in it's getting dark!" Then there was another call that I didn't like to here. Those times when she had asked me to do something, but I got busy playing and neglected, I would hear the call, "Benny Brook you get yourself in here!"

These calls were important when we are growing up, but the calls of God are even more important. Let us at this time; look at some of His calls. (2)

The Call Of The Gospel

It is a fact, that all who live to the age of accountability commit sins; therefore, the most important call in the word of God, is the call of the gospel. The call of the gospel is the call to obey the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ (Rom. 6:1-4). Paul reminded the Christians at Thessalonica how they had been called:

"to which He **called you by our gospel,** for the obtaining of the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ" (2 Thes. 2:14, NKIV).

When Jesus sent His apostles to the world, they were to invite the lost to respond to the call of the gospel. He told them:

"Go into all the world and preach **the gospel** to every creature."He who **believes** and is **baptized** will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned" (Mk. 16:15, 16, NKJV).

Thus, the way they responded to the call, determined whether they would be **saved** or be **lost!**

The Call Of Holiness

When we answer the call of obedience to the gospel, we are also called to live a **life of holiness**. This is a call to sanctify our hearts and lives to the Lord. Paul also reminded the Christians at Thessalonica:

"For God did not call us to uncleanness, but in holiness" (I Thes. 4:7, NKJV).

This means that we have surrendered our hearts and lives to live for the Lord. We have turned our backs on the evil, lustful practices of the world, and with a renewed mind, are living for His kingdom and righteousness (Mt. 6:33).

Have you faithfully answered these two calls from God? If so, you have found "the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding" (Php. 4:7, NKJV).

Tests of Right and Wrong

The standard of measurement of right living is not (1) How many are doing this? (2) How does it make me feel? Or, (3) Will it provide material blessings? Here are some beneficial tests that should be used to determine right and wrong.

- (1) The Spiritual Test. Is this action or attitude forbidden in the Word of God? Am I aware of what the Bible teaches concerning this matter? Does my attitude indicate a willingness to let the teaching of the Bible be authoritative in determining my conduct?
- (2) The Prayer Test. Is this something concerning which I can seek both the approval and blessings of God? For example, drinking alcohol would fail this test for God would not smile upon such a practice to bless it.
- (3) The Personal Test. Will doing this action make of me a better Christian? Will it aid my spiritual growth and development? Will it cause me to be more Christ like?
- (4) **The Social Test.** Will my engaging in this activity influence others to be better Christians or will it provide a stumbling block before them? "Wherefore if meat make my brother to offend, I will eat not flesh while the world standeth, lest I make my brother to offend." (1 Cor. 8:13).
- (5) The Practical Test. What will the results be if I do this particular thing? Would this result be desirable or undesirable? Will this action produce happiness or unhappiness for others?
- (6) The Stewardship Test. Will I be fulfilling God's design and purpose for my life or will I be wasting that which God has entrusted into my care?
- (7) The Universal Test. If everyone I knew and respected did this, would I be happy? Would our nation and community be better or worse?
- (8) The Publicity Test. Is this practice one that I would be willing for everyone to know about? Will it stand the gaze of the public without causing me to blush?
- 9) The Evangelistic Test. Will this cause others to want to know the Lord? Will my practice cause others to lose confidence in Him whom I claim as my Savior and Lord?



The Value of Teachers

There is a beautiful legend about a king who decided to set aside a special day to honor his greatest subject. When the big day arrived, there was a large gathering in the palace courtyard. Four finalists were brought forward, and from these four, the king would select the winner.

The first person presented was a wealthy philanthropist. The king was told that this man was highly deserving of the honor because of his humanitarian efforts. He had given much of his wealth to the poor.

The second person was a celebrated physician. The king was told that this doctor was highly deserving of the honor because he had rendered faithful and dedicated service to the sick for many years.

The third person was a distinguished judge. The king was told that the judge was worthy because he was noted for his wisdom, his fairness, and his brilliant decisions.

The fourth person presented was an elderly woman. Everyone was quite surprised to see her there, because her manner was quite humble, as was her dress. She hardly looked the part of someone who would be honored as the greatest subject in the kingdom. What chance could she possibly have, when compared to the other three, who had accomplished so much? Even so, there was something about her the look of love in her face, the understanding in her eyes, her quiet confidence.

The king was intrigued, to say the least, and somewhat puzzled by her presence. He asked who she was. The answer came: "You see the philanthropist, the doctor, and the judge? Well, she was their teacher!"

It was James who wrote, "Brothers and sisters, not many of you should become teachers." (James 3:1, GOD'S WORD). He points out that teachers will

be judged more severely. He could just as easily have said that teachers have a greater responsibility, a greater challenge, a greater opportunity to affect the lives of people in a negative way. It is impossible to teach without using words, and with greater use of words comes a greater danger that the words will do harm.

But thanks be to God that there are those who face that challenge and assume that responsibility and make a diligent effort to use their words as an opportunity to affect the lives of people in a positive way. Those of you who are teachers -- who can begin to measure the tremendous effect that you are having in the lives of the children (and adults) in your classrooms? You may not see the results of your efforts for years. In fact, you may never get to see the results. But you do make a difference.

Those of you who are schoolteachers are teaching not only the basics of education, but you are teaching values and character. Those of you who are Bible class teachers are filling the minds and hearts of our children with stories of faith that will stay with them for the rest of their lives. Those of you who are preachers are strengthening the family of God and bringing salvation to the lost.

So, my hat is off to all of you who are teachers because you make a difference!

"We have different gifts, according to the grace given us. If a man's gift is prophesying, let him use it in proportion to his faith. If it is serving, let him serve; if it is teaching, let him teach." (Romans 12:6-7)



Willed To The Devil

Paul describes the Christian life as a battle against the devil. He asked the Ephesian Christians to:

"Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil" (Eph. 6:11).

However, it is wondered how many times we work for him by simply doing nothing. For example, the devil won the battle with Felix, when Paul taught him, because he put off obedience.

"Now as he reasoned about righteousness, self-control, and the judgment to come, Felix was afraid and answered, 'Go away for now; when I have a convenient time I will call for you'" (Acts 24:25).

The following story illustrates the dangers we face when dealing with the devil. In fact, one of his favorite methods is **neglect** and **procrastination**.

"A Finnish infidel died and left his farm willed to the devil. The courts, after deliberating on such a ridiculous set of circumstances, decided the best way to carry out the wishes of the infidel was to permit the farmland to grow up in weeds and briers, to allow the house and barn to remain unpainted and to rot down, and to permit the soil to erode and wash away. The court said, "The best way to let Satan have it is to do nothing."

Therein lies a common story. Few of us claim to be infidels, and few plan to will land or life over to the devil. However, we may actually do the same thing by procrastination, and putting off what we know we ought to do. We look for a convenient time, and postponement is the most popular method of avoidance. We say, "**Sometime** we will take care of that." And, as with the farm willed to the Devil, procrastination becomes the perversion of something good."

Here is Paul's advice to all Christians:

"Neither give place to the devil" (Ephesians 4:27).

Jesus knew the devil better than anyone did as he made every possible effort to deceive Jesus. Nevertheless, he totally failed! Why did the devil fail? He failed because Jesus knew his purpose and motive. Therefore, Jesus said to those who were refusing to believe in Him:

"You are of your father the devil, and the desires of your father you want to do. He was a murderer from the beginning, and does not stand in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaks a lie, he speaks from his own resources, for he is a liar and the father of it" (John 8:44).

Therefore, don't ever believe or obey anything that the devil suggests!

What About Christmas?

There is no proof that Christ was born on December 25. But the glorious good news is in the fact that He was born as our Saviour, that He came down from heaven to seek and to save the lost (Luke 2:8-12).

Christ should be just as precious to us as if He had been born on December 25. In fact, if He had been born only yesterday we would know nothing of His wonderful life, His miracles, His teachings, His death for our sins, His resurrection and ascension into heaven. We would know nothing about the New Testament church and the spreading of Christianity upon the earth, as in the Acts of the Apostles. In fact, if Christ had been born yesterday, we would not yet have the New Testament and Christianity.

Another fact worthy of consideration is the fact that we can rejoice in Christ, as Christians and believers in Christ, on December 25, just the same as on the other 364 days of the year. We do not have to cease to be happy in Jesus at "Christmas" just to be different from others. Paul says, "Rejoice in the Lord always" (Phi. 4:4). This would take in Christmas the same as all other days of the year.

Instead of revealing the date of the birth of Christ, God has revealed the day on which He was raised from the dead—the first day of the week (Mark 16:1, 9; Luke 24:1-47). God does want us to celebrate this day. It is a day called "the Lord's Day" (Rev. 1:10; 1 Cor. 16:2). In it we are especially rejoiceful and glad.

We should show our faith in Christ, in His birth, in His life, in all He did for us, and is doing for us, in every proper way; but we should not deceive others into thinking we are celebrating December 25 as the birthday of Christ, for there is no good reason to believe it is the date of His birth. But when all the facts are considered, there is nothing to prevent our enjoying the holiday season just ahead called "Christmas."

We may give and receive gifts in this season, or at any other season of the year, on December 25, or on another day of the year that we wish—on our birthday, or that of others. In fact, we should "rejoice with them that do rejoice" at Christmas or any other time. There is not enough happiness in the world any way. We can, however, do all this without celebrating Christmas as the birthday of Christ.

Finally, it is proof of the divinity of Christ to find Him so popular in the world nineteen hundred years after His birth that the civilized world wants to celebrate His birth, whether it knows the date or not. Thank God for our Lord and His coming into the world, regardless of the exact date of His arrival by virgin birth. We shall, therefore, go on teaching His truth, whatever is proper and fitting, regardless of "Christmas."

Resolutions

Due to the waxing of the old year as we are fast approaching the start of a new, this is the time in which we start making resolutions in order to improve our lives. I am all for doing whatever is necessary to improve our lives, but I am a strong believer that we should always remember to do what our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, said in Matthew 6:33:"But seek first His Kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things shall be yours as well." We should never fail to put God and His will first in our lives in everything we do.

The word of God is all about new beginnings: We have the Book of Genesis itself, whose very name means "beginning," and within its pages God shares with us the creation story and how, with just His word, the whole universe sprang into existence. We also see how sin first arrived in that perfect world, and how quick was God to offer a remedy for that sin by stating the very first prophecy of redemption regarding the Messiah in Genesis 3:15. A few chapters later we see the underpinning of the nation of Israel laid as God promises Abraham that from him would come peoples and nations and most importantly, the Promised Seed from Whom all the world would be blessed. At the conclusion of the Book of Genesis we see the foundation of God's chosen people being created as Joseph protects his family from the famine that had ravaged the land, his family who were direct descendants of Abraham, in the land of Egypt.

In the Book of Exodus we see the beginning of the nation of Israel, God's chosen people, come to fruition as God calls them out of bondage in Egypt as the Lord formed His covenant with them at Mt. Sinai. But shortly thereafter we witness the beginning of the long history of Israel's rebellion against Jehovah, but He is steadfastly loving and patient and kind in His longsuffering, always maintaining a remnant for Himself.
